Columbus Clippers RHP Trenton Denholm (1-0, 1.50) vs. Worcester Red Sox LHP T.J. Sikkema (0-0, 3.38)

Hello, Columbus – The Worcester Red Sox – winners of 5 games in a row - and the Columbus Clippers (AAA-Cleveland Guardians) begin a 6-game series this evening in the first night game of the season at Polar Park at 6:05 pm. This is the fourth straight year that Columbus has made a trip to Polar Park to take on the WooSox. Worcester has not yet played in Columbus and at superb Huntington Park in the capital city of Ohio. They won't until at least next year as this series marks the only meeting of the year between the clubs. Tonight's series opener can be heard on NASH 98.9 FM, The Pike 100.1 FM, and the rest of the WooSox Radio Network and seen on NESN+ on tape delay later tonight because the Boston Red Sox are on NESN at 6:45 pm and the Boston Bruins are on NESN+ at 7:00 pm.

This Series - This week/weekend marks Worcester's first extended series at home this season as the 6-game set includes games tonight, a weekday matinee tomorrow at 12:05 pm, games Thursday & Friday both at 6:05 pm (with rising temperatures each day), and then weekend games on Saturday at 4:05 pm and Sunday at 1:05 pm with pleasant weather expected.

Can We Say Goodbye, Columbus – The Clippers have largely enjoyed their visits to the Heart of the Commonwealth. Columbus has won 11 of the 17 meetings all-time here at Polar Park and in the process have out-scored the WooSox, 123-73 in those 17 games. About three years ago the Clippers took 5 of 6 from the Sox from April 11-16, 2023 scoring 54 runs total in their 5 victories that series. In 2024, Columbus and Worcester split a 6-game set from June 18-23. And almost exactly one year ago, the Clippers won 3 games of an abbreviated 5-game set here at Polar Park from April 8-13, 2025 during a week that was marred by weather issues.

One Year Ago – One day short of a year ago, these two teams (or at least a facsimile of each) played a series at the aptly-named Polar Park. The series opener on April 8, 2025 was postponed due to cold and brutal winds that made the game of baseball unplayable. The clubs exchanged last-inning 1-run victories the next day during a make-up doubleheader as Columbus scored 4 times on a 2-out, 7th (final) inning grand slam by Will Brennan to stun the Sox, 6-5 in the opener. In the nightcap, the Sox were walk-off winners, 5-4. The Clippers won the next two games by 2-1 and 9-2 scores. However, on Saturday, April 12, the area was hit with 4 inches of unexpected snow while the high temperature of only 33 degrees was the lowest ever in Worcester city history for that date. That game was cancelled and not made up as the clubs were not forced to play another doubleheader on getaway day on Sunday, April 13. The WooSox did win the single game that day, 8-5 to cut the Columbus series victory to 3 games to 2.

Minnesota Fats - The WooSox are coming off a 5-game sweep in St. Paul, Minnesota during an eventful week/weekend trip that will be the longest (in terms of distance) that the Sox take all year. Worcester battled the Saints and the weather in the Twin Cities (one game was postponed and another cancelled due to Minnesota "spring" weather), but when they did play it was all WooSox who won all 5 games by a combined score of 44-21. Sox batters hit .306 during the 5-game series (53-for-173) with 11 doubles, 12 HR, and 44 walks while WooSox pitchers went 5-0 with a 3.68 ERA (18 ER in 44 IP).

A St. Paul Sweep – Worcester's sweep of the abbreviated 5-game series in St. Paul (Friday night's game was cancelled and will not be made up since the teams do not meet again in 2026) is the third sweep of more than three games in Worcester's five+ year history. The WooSox swept one series all of last year – that a 6-game set at home vs. Rochester last June 3-8. That marked just their second 6-game sweep in club-history and their first-ever at Polar Park. Worcester's only other 6-game sweep came during their inaugural 2021 season when they swept a 6-game set at Rochester from August 31 – September 5, 2021.

Terrific Tuesdays - The WooSox won their first Tuesday game of the season last week at St. Paul, 19-3. Last year they finished with an outstanding record on Tuesdays going 16-6 on what was the first day of 22 series they played that began on Tuesdays in 2025. Last year the Sox went 13-11 on Wednesdays, 12-13 on Thursdays, 13-13 on Fridays, 9-15 on Saturdays, and 14-13 on Sundays in addition to their tremendous record on Tuesdays (16-6).

Rank and File – Worcester batters lead the league in both Walks (67) and On-Base pct. (.421). They are 6th in Team Batting with their .273 average, 3rd in Runs (58), and tied for 4th in the league with 13 HR. WooSox pitchers have done their part as they have a 3.42 ERA (3rd in the IL) while they have the 2nd lowest batting average against (.197) and the 2nd fewest Walks allowed (32). Sox pitchers are the only team in the league yet to throw a wild pitch.

Three-for-Three – The WooSox played each of their first three scheduled home games to begin a season from March 27-29 for the first time since 2023. It was also just the third time they have been able to do so since they began play at Polar Park in 2021. Last year the WooSox played their home opener on March 28, 2025 vs. Syracuse but then were rained out the next day. In 2024 they hosted Buffalo on April 2 for their home opener but then had their next two games postponed due to rain (April 3) and then snow (April 4). Worcester did indeed play three games in a row at Polar Park to open the 2023 season (from March 31 – April 2 all vs. Syracuse), but on a side note they then went to Buffalo and had three straight games postponed due to rain, snow, and unplayable field conditions from April 4-6. In 2022 the WooSox did not play their first home game until April 12, they then played the next game on April 13, but on April 14 their game vs. Lehigh Valley was rained out. Worcester's inaugural season in 2021 did not commence at home until May 11 (due to Covid-restrictions) but the club sure took advantage of the delayed start as they played all 12 games of their 12-game homestand to christen Polar Park. In fact, it took until their 28th home game that year before they finally had a home game postponed (July 2, 2021 vs. Scranton/Wilkes-Barre).

Series Matters – The WooSox are 1-1-0 in their first two series thus far as they dropped 2 of 3 at home to Syracuse on Opening Weekend (March 27-29) but rebounded to sweep a 5-game set at St. Paul last week/weekend. Last year, Worcester went 8-9-10 in their 27 series played... 8 wins, 9 losses, 10 splits.

A Winning Tradition – The 2025 Worcester Red Sox went 76-73 to post a winning season for the fifth time in as many years of existence (and for the fourth year in a row under returning WooSox manager Chad Tracy). Worcester finished 41-33 during the first half last year and then 35-40 in the second half. Overall the 2025 WooSox went 40-34 at home compared to 36-39 on the road. The Pawtucket Red Sox posted five straight winning seasons just once in their 47 years as Boston's Triple-A affiliate – that coming from 1996-2000.

How the WooSox Have Won - The 2021 WooSox had a 74-54 record during their abbreviated inaugural season, the 2022 WooSox finished 75-73, the 2023 club posted a 79-68 mark, the 2024 team matched that win total going 79-71, and as mentioned the 2025 squad went 76-73. Heading into this season, the WooSox were 383-339 all-time for a .530 winning pct. including a 195-168 record at home compared to a 188-171 mark on the road.

Fun Fact – Of the 275 players who have played for the Worcester Red Sox in their 5+-year history (through today), 199 of them have played in the Major Leagues (72%) including 137 with the Boston Red Sox (50%).

A Trace of History - The second manager in Worcester Red Sox history, Chad Tracy has led the WooSox to winning seasons in each of his first four years at the helm of the WooSox to become the first Red Sox Triple-A manager to accomplish that feat dating back to at least the 1930's. Known affectionately as "Trace", he returns for his fifth season as WooSox manager in 2026. Tracy earned the 300th victory of his Worcester managerial career on August 31, 2025 in Durham. He has a 315-287 record since taking over as WooSox manager for the 2022 season. Chad became the sixth manager in modern Red Sox organizational history to reach the 300-win plateau with a Red Sox Triple-A affiliate. Joe Morgan is the all-time leader with 601 wins in his nine years as Pawtucket Red Sox manager (1974-82). "Trace" also had 176 wins in three years as a Minor League manager in the Los Angeles Angels' system from 2015-17 giving him a total of 491 career managerial wins including Worcester's wins to start the 2026 season. Tracy, 40, has sent a number of Worcester players to Boston during his tenure including, most recently, OF Roman Anthony, INF Marcelo Mayer, and LHPs Connelly Early & Payton Tolle who all earned their first-ever promotions to Boston during the 2025 season. Other past or current Red Sox who have played for Tracy in Worcester include: OF Wilyer Abreu, RHP Brayan Bello, INF/OF Kristian Campbell, 1B Triston Casas, RHP Kutter Crawford, OF Jarren Duran, INF Romy Gonzalez, RHP Tanner Houck, OF Cedanne Rafaela, INF Nick Sogard, and catcher Connor Wong among several others.

Portland Sea Dogs Update – The Double-A Portland Sea Dogs (1-1) will play their home opener at Delta Dental Park at Hadlock Field in Portland tonight.

WOOSOX ROSTER MOVES – The WooSox today reinstated veteran reliever **Tommy Kahnle** from their Development List. The WooSox also today added RHP **Tyler Uberstine** back on their roster following his option from Boston on Monday when the Red Sox reinstated reliever Garrett Whitlock from the paternity leave list.

Kahnle (pronounced CAIN-lee) was signed as a free agent by the Boston Red Sox on March 19 and added to the club's 2026 Spring Training roster as a non-roster invitee. He was placed on the WooSox Development List to begin the season and has been working out in Fort Myers, FL. Kahnle, 36, posted a 4.43 ERA (31 ER/63.0 IP) with 50 strikeouts in 66 games for the Detroit Tigers in 2025. Originally selected by the New York Yankees in the fifth round of the 2010 First-Year Player Draft, the New York native owns a 3.61 ERA (175 ER/436.2 IP) with 502 strikeouts in 456 career Major League games with the Colorado Rockies (2014-15), Chicago White Sox (2016-17), Yankees (2017-20, 2023-24), Los Angeles Dodgers (2022), and Tigers (2025). Since the start of 2022, the right-hander has held opponents to a .195 batting average (112-for-574) over 92 games. In 31 Postseason appearances, he is 2-2 with two saves, a 3.06 ERA (11 ER/32.1 IP), 31 strikeouts, and a .195 opponent batting average (23-for-118).

Uberstine, 26, made his Major League debut on Sunday at Fenway Park against the San Diego Padres, pitching 2.2 innings and allowing one run on three hits and one walk with two strikeouts. He suffered the loss in Boston's, 8-6 defeat to the Padres. The right-hander also made one start for Worcester on March 28 against Syracuse – 4 IP, 2 H, 1 R, 1 BB, 3 SO in an eventual, 5-3 WooSox win. Selected by the Red Sox in the 19th round of the 2021 First-Year Player Draft, the California native owns a 3.54 ERA (90 ER/228.2 IP) in 55 career minor league games (41 starts).

REHABBERS REVVING UP – The Boston Red Sox are expected to send two rehabbing pitchers to Worcester this week/weekend to make rehab starts. LHP **Patrick Sandoval** is slated to start tomorrow's 12:05 pm matinee at Polar Park while RHP **Kutter Crawford** is expected to get the nod to start Saturday's game at 4:05 pm also vs. Columbus.

Sandoval, 29, has been sidelined since undergoing Tommy John surgery on June 26, 2024. He missed all of last season after signing a 2-year contract with the Red Sox on December 23, 2024. In 107 career Major League games (100 starts) all with the Los Angeles Angels, Sandoval is 19-45 with a 4.01 ERA with 529 strikeouts in 536 career big league innings. Originally an 11th round selection of the Houston Astros in 2015 out of Mission Viejo High School in California, Patrick was traded to the Angels for Martin Maldonado in July of 2018. He made his MLB debut with the Angels in 2019 and spent the next four seasons in the Los Angeles rotation (2020-24) before leaving a start on June 21, 2024 with his injured elbow. From 2021-23 he posted a 3.53 ERA in 72 games despite a tough-luck losing record. He also owns MLB's 7th-lowest HR/9 IP ratio since the start of 2022 (0.675).
