Tonight's Game

The Clippers will send RHP **Yorman Gomez** to the mound today, looking to bounce back from a series opening loss (6-0 in game two after a loss; last 0-2 series start: 8/26-8/27/25 at Louisville). Lehigh Valley will counter with LHP **Tucker Davidson**. Columbus is 9-16 (.360) versus left handers this year. Davidson has never pitched against the Clippers in his career (tonight is 78th game in the IL).

vs. the IronPigs

Columbus has won 45 of the last 77G (.584), including playoffs. All-time in Allentown, the Clippers are 33-25 (.569), including playoffs (2-0 in '11 GC Finals). This year marks the second straight season the Clippers have travelled to Allentown and the third time since the expansion of the IL (Lehigh has been to Columbus once, 2024). **Dom Nunez** has 2HR and 7RBI in 8G against the Pigs in his career.

Back to Scratch

A leadoff bomb from **Petey Halpin** on Sunday pushed the team total to 100, as the differential meter dropped to +0 (9HR in last 13G, including 8G homerless). The Clippers still carry negative differentials in the hit (-4) and run (-9) columns, making them the only winning team in the IL with fewer hits and runs than their opponents. Sunday's win was the only one by 4+ runs since 6/13 at Indianapolis.

Missed Opportunities

In the second half of the year, Columbus has the 6th most PA with the bases loaded in the IL (23), but the lineup has produced the 18th best OPS (.412; 3x21 with a triple and 9RBI). The Clippers left the bases loaded twice in yesterday's 1-run loss (9LOB) and they lead the IL with 119LOB through 13G (9.2 per game; led with 585LOB, 7.9 per in the first half). With RISP, the lineup has 1HR this half (20th).

Down a Run

Since hanging back to back 10s on the Mud Hens in Toledo on 5/28 and 5/29, the Clippers have scored double digits once (13 on 6/28 at Omaha, needed a 5-run 10th). Columbus is averaging 4.8 runs and 1.3 homers per game in the last 33G (19-14) after plating 5.8 on 1.0 homers an outing through the first 54G (29-25). The team ERA is at 4.70 on 1.3 homers in the last 33G (5.42 on 1.0 bombs before).

Angel Ascendant

Angel Genao has a 1.029OPS in the last 18G, batting .385 (25x65) while drawing 12BB in 80PA (15%) over that time (11BB in 139PA, 8%, in first 35G with Columbus). Genao has scored 14 runs in those 18G, collecting 11RBI and 7XBH (.554SLG). Among IL hitters with at least 35PA from the 7th inning on, Genao has the 2nd best OPS (1.228; 1st- **Travis Bazzana**, 10th- **Kody Huff**, 11th- **Cooper Ingle**).

More Ralphy

Ralph Velazquez extended his career best on base streak to 27G yesterday (.387OBP since 6/3), collecting a single and a double (hits in 13 of last 14; .345, 19x55). His streak is the third longest active streak in the IL. Over his last 19G, Velazquez has watched his OBP rise 63 points and his average grow by 53, but his SLG has increased by only 23 points (4XBH in 73AB, but has one in each of last 3G).

Bo Knows the Zone

Yesterday's successful challenge from **Bo Naylor** improved his record to 21-4 (.840) when he is behind the plate, best in the IL among catchers with at least 25 reviews (2-2 when questioning as a batter). He has won five straight after starting his Clipper tenure with victories in 14 of 15. Offensively, Naylor is 3x7 (all doubles) in his last 2G, following a 6G slump from 6/25-7/3 (.053, 1x19, triple).

Roughing It

Since doubling twice on 6/25 at Omaha, **George Valera** is hitting .125 (4x32, all singles), while scoring once and driving in a pair over his last 8G. He has drawn only 3BB during the slump (all on Sunday) against 7K in 35PA. Valera has not homered since 5/19 vs. Louisville (82AB since) and has just 2HR in his last 40G (144AB, .326SLG). Additionally, he has no multi-RBI games since 5/30 (19G).

Another Personal Best

Kody Huff tied his career high in steals (7) on 6/28, having already hit top marks in triples (3), homers (10), runs (49), RBI (48), hit streak (12G, 5/1-5/16) and on base streak (20G, 6/2-6/28). He enters tonight a pair of walks short of his personal best (44BB in 2024 with Akron). All of that damage has come in just 281PA (averaged 398PA from 2024-25, when he set all his prior career highs).

This Date in Clipper History

7/8/1998

Mike Lowell homered and drove in a pair to lead the IL All-Stars to an 8-4 victory over their PCL counterparts in the first ever Triple-A All-Star Game that pitted the two leagues against each other. He garnered the IL's "Star of Stars" Award as the team's MVP. Lowell went on to be named the Clipper of the Year in 1998 and is one of only two Clippers of the Year to win a World Series MVP (2007), joining **Derek Jeter** (2000).

First Half Wrap

Despite being eliminated from playoff contention on the penultimate Sunday of the first half, the Clippers were 41-33 and finished with their first winning record in the front half since the season was split in 2023 (averaged 32 wins from 2023-25, topping out at 34-38, .472, last season). From 4/22-6/17, they spent every day between 3.0 and 6.0 games off the lead, while occupying anywhere between 4th and 13th in the standings. A late push (15-6 from 5/16-6/9) got them to within 2.5 before derailing with a 3G losing streak at Indy to seal their fate. On the back half, Columbus has posted just one winning record, clinching a playoff berth in 2024 with a mark of 48-26 (.649).

Huntington (Small) Park

In each of the first 11 seasons after the move downtown (2009-19), Huntington Park ranked among the top two in the IL in homers per game. With the arrival of six new parks to the IL in 2021, Huntington Park finished 4th, 6th and 10th from 2021-23, respectively. The 2024 season saw a return to the top (2.96; 108HR hit by the Clippers, most for the home team in HP's existence), but it dropped back to 7th last year (2.31). Including the postseason, the Clippers have been out-homered over the life of the park (1,453 to 1,400).

Challenging Times

The Clippers are 128-105 (.549) in pitch reviews, with batters going 66-70 (.485) and pitchers/catchers going 62-35 (.639). They have run out of challenges in 38G and have not challenged in 4G. Last season, they were correct 43.1% of the time (2nd worst in the IL).

Extras, Read All About Them

Columbus is 5-4 in extra innings this year, after having gone .500 in each of the last two seasons. Since the start of the 2018 season, when baserunners started appearing at second base, the Clippers are 55-37 when playing past regulation (.598, best in the IL; no other team above .571), including 27-17 at home (.614; 5-7 in last 12G). Of the 92G to require extra play, 73 have been resolved after one frame (including nine DH games) and only one has gone past the 12th (5-4 loss in 13 on 9/20/22 at Toledo).

On the Runs

Starting with the embiggened 150G schedule in 2022, the Clippers scored over 800 runs in three consecutive seasons from 2022-2024 (855, 808 and 805 runs, respectively; accounting for the 3rd, 4th and 5th best totals in team history). Following a steep decline last season (670, fewest scored in a full season since 2018), Columbus is looking to top 800 again (on pace for 802, would rank as 6th most all-time; record is 898 scored in 1983).

On the Run

On the basepaths, the Clippers are making a run at the franchise mark in stolen bases, with 103 through the first 87G (on pace for 176SB). The team record was set in 2024 when Columbus swiped an even 200, but the team speed was throttled last year (129SB; still, the 2nd highest total since the Cleveland affiliation started in 2009). However, with 30CS so far, the Clippers are also pacing for the most times caught stealing of the Cleveland affiliation (51; nabbed 51 times in 2024).

Crazy Eighthths

From the 8th inning on, the Clippers have scored an IL-best 134 runs while crafting a .927OPS (nearly 100 points better than all other teams). On the flipside, Columbus has given up 69 runs from the 8th on, resulting in a +65 run differential (Clippers are getting outscored 199-132 from innings 5-7).

Juiced is Loose

In the Huntington Park Era (since 2009), Columbus leads the IL with 78 grand slams and 1,954RBI (led IL in RBI in 2010, '11, '12, '17, '18 and '22). Collecting an IL-best 10 grand slams last season, it marked their fifth straight season with at least four (118RBI last year; had only 97RBI in 2024, worst in a 140+G season since 2016).

In Big Trouble

The Clipper pitching staff is trending toward the worst ERA in club history, sitting at 5.15 through the first 87G. Since the reorganization of the minor leagues in 2021, Columbus has twice finished the season with a 5+ ERA (current record is 5.32, set in 2023), after having done so just once in the first 43 seasons (5.08 in 1983). However, the staff is pacing to give up only 171HR (average of 182 per season since the Year of the Homer in 2019).

Department of Defense

The Columbus defense is sitting at 8th in the IL this year (.980), following a 2025 that saw a franchise record (.985, led the IL). On 4/10 at Worcester, the defense collapsed for the first 5E game since 8/27/24 (topped out at 3E in a game twice last year and had fewer than 5E in 21 of 26 series). The Clippers have played flawlessly in 47G this season (28-19, .596), after doing so in nearly 60% of games last year (44-42, .512), including 16 straight from 6/20-7/8/25 (longest streak in the IL over the last 20 years).

Good Baseball

CJ Kayfus bunted a runner into scoring position with a single on 7/5 vs. Louisville, with that runner kicking off a 5-run inning that led the Clippers to victory. Since the start of the 2018 season, Columbus is 90-23 (.796) in games in which a run is scored after a good bunt attempt, including a 7-2 mark this season (.778, blew 7-run lead in one of the losses; went 23-2 in 2018).

To the End

The Clippers have the most last at bat wins this year (14, tied with Syracuse) while playing in the most games decided in the last at bat (24). Since the start of the 2024 season, Columbus has played in 97G decided in the last at bat (2nd most in the IL), going 48-49 (.495, 14th best winning percentage; 3rd most wins, 2nd most losses).

Manager Profile

Andy Tracy made his Clippers debut in 2021, following **Tony Mansolino's** championship rookie year in 2019 (sixth Clipper skipper to win Governors' Cup in first season; **Gene Michael**-'79, **Joe Altobelli**-'80, **Frank Verdi**-'81, **Bucky Dent**-'87 and **Mike Sarbaugh**-'10). This season marks Tracy's sixth year as a manager (first was with Williamsport in the Philadelphia system), as he holds a career record of 434-445 (.494), 404-399 with Columbus (.503).

Injury Delay:

Gomez was slated to make his Triple-A debut during the season-opening series at Iowa, but injured his shoulder in his last preseason bullpen to wind up on the shelf (missed 72G; Clippers went 40-32). He was sent to Arizona at the end of May to rehab, appearing in 4G for the Guardians.

Rocky Start:

When he did make his Triple-A debut, 6/20 vs. Scranton/WB, Gomez was touched for a 2-run homer in the 1st inning, but settled down to retire 10 of the next 12BF (7K). While with the AZL Guardians, he gave up 5ER over the course of 4.0IP in the 1st inning and 2ER in 6.1IP thereafter.

Right Stuff:

While in the Rookie League, Gomez mowed down opposing right-handers, racking up 10K against 21BF (48%; 4K to 23BF on the left side, 17%). When they did put the bat on the ball (5x20, .250), righties notched 3XBH (all doubles; .400SLG), compared to .295 (5x17, all singles) from lefties.

2026 Spring Training:

Gomez pitched twice for Cleveland in spring training, with a 10.80ERA (3.1IP, 5H, 4R, 4ER, 4BB, 1K). He was optioned to Columbus on 3/6.

Last Season:

Began the season pitching out of the Lake County bullpen (all appearances on starter's rest)... gave up 5ER in 4.0IP of season debut, 4/9 vs. West Michigan... rebounded with a scoreless win at Fort Wayne on 4/15 (5.0IP, 1H, 2BB, 4K) and a nearly scoreless win at Fort Wayne on 4/20 (4.0IP, 2H, 1R, 1ER, 2BB, 4K)... following a 4ER outing vs. Great Lakes on 4/27 (2.2IP), went 1-0 with three saves (first of career, all 4.0IP) over 5G (1GS) from 5/2-5/27 while posting a 1.71ERA (21.0IP, 14H, 4R, 4ER, 8BB, 25K)... starting on 6/8, pitched mostly in the rotation, going 5-0 with a 2.27ERA (35.2IP, 26H, 9R, 9ER, 11BB, 38K) over 7G (5GS) prior to the All-Star Break... homer allowed to leadoff 6/20 at South Bend snapped streak of 192BF without (dated to 4/9)... sent to Akron on 7/18, picking up the win in Double-A debut on 7/23 at Harrisburg (5.0IP, 2H, 1R, 1ER, 4BB, 5K)... did not allow an ER in either of next 2G with Akron (1ER in 24.0IP between Lake County and Akron from 7/8-8/3)... notched 10K against 1BB in a win vs. Chesapeake on 8/9 (6.0IP, 2H, 1R, 1ER)... went 1-2 with a 5.91ERA (21.1IP, 14ER) in next 5GS (8/15-9/7)... finished the season with a scoreless start at Harrisburg on 9/14 (5.0IP, 2H, 1BB, 4K).
