THORPE WAS SHARP: One week ago tonight, Drew Thorpe made his Double-A debut and went 8.0 IP, 0 R, 2 H, 9 K en route to winning Eastern League Pitcher of the Week honors in his first week at Double-A. It was the third time this season that Thorpe went the distance of 8.0 IP (tied career-high for third time), making him the second Patriot to accomplish the feat this season, joining Richard Fitts on 6/12 @HFD.

CAREER: 2.81 ERA, 109.0 IP, 138 K, 1.07 WHIP

2023: Assigned to High-A Hudson Valley to begin the season, making his professional debut on 4/9. Allowed a home run to Greensboro's Mike Jarvis on his first professional pitch, then struck out 4 of the next 5 batters he faced. Named South Atlantic League pitcher of the week for May 29-June 4 (1 GS: 7 IP, 0 R, 5 H, 12 K) and July 17-23 (1 GS: 8 IP, 0 R, 2 H, 13 K, 1 BB). Set the Renegades single-game strikeout record on 6/22 vs. BRK with a career-high 13. Named the SAL Pitcher of the Month for June, going 3-0 with a 0.31 ERA in four starts over the month, highlighted by a 25-inning scoreless streak, where he allowed just 1 ER on 12 H over 28 IP. Promoted to Somerset on 8/8 and in his Double-A debut on 8/11, he went 8.0 IP, 0 R, 2 H, 9 K en route to being named Eastern League Pitcher of the Week. Departed Hudson Valley as the single-season record holder in W (10) and K (128). At the time of his promotion, he led all Yankees minor leaguers in ERA (2.81), W (10), SO (138) and WHIP (1.07).

College: Thorpe was one of four Cal Poly players drafted in 2022, highlighted by 8th overall pick Brooks Lee. He was ranked by MLB.com as the No. 61 prospect in the 2022 Draft class. Pitched to a career 3.03 ERA at Cal Poly with 284 K in 223 IP. Served as Cal Poly's Sunday starter as a freshman in 2020, posting a 3.21 ERA in 28 IP before COVID. Served as the Mustangs' No. 1 starter in each of the next two seasons. Was a consensus All-American in 2022 after ranking second in NCAA Division I in strikeouts (a school-record 149 in 104 2/3 innings) and third in hits per nine innings (5.6) while finishing his college career with 14 consecutive quality starts. Named Big West Conference Pitcher of the Year, becoming the first pitcher in school history to earn the accolade. Tied Cal Poly school record with 15 strikeouts against UC San Diego on 3/25/22. His 284 career strikeouts is No. 4 in the school record book. Majored in Kinseology at Cal Poly.

Personal Notes: Recruited as a pitcher and shortstop out of Desert Hills High School in St. George, Utah, where he led the team to a Class Championship in 2019. During senior year, Thorpe pitched to a 7-1 record and 1.93 ERA and hit .395 with 26 RBI. Before heading to college, Thorpe pitched in the Alaska Baseball League for the Peninsula Oilers where he posted a 2.48 ERA and hit .239. Pitched in the Cape Cod League with the Y-D Red Sox and was a member USA Baseball's Collegiate National Team in 2021. Enjoys fishing and hiking. Did not have a favorite pro baseball team growing up but enjoys watching Max Scherzer pitch. Was spring training roommates and is close friends with fellow 2022 draft pick Chase Hampton.

Career Notes: Selected in the 2nd round (No. 61 overall) of the 2022 MLB Draft by the Yankees out of Cal Poly accompanied by a \$1.18M signing bonus.

RAUL DOMINGUEZ: Manager (1st year)

Dominguez begins his 1st season as manager for the Somerset Patriots, 9th overall as a manager and 17th overall coaching in the Yankees organization. He spent the past two seasons (2021-2022) as a defensive coach for Triple-A Scranton/Wilkes-Barre and was assigned to the same post for 2020, before the minor league season was canceled due to the COVID-19 pandemic. Dominguez also previously served as the defensive coach for Trenton (2018-2019) and Tampa (2017). The Panama City, Panama native has managerial experience with the GCL Yankees East (2016), DSL Yankees 1 (2011-15) and DSL Yankees 2 (2009-10). From 2012-2015, his teams finished at least 10 games over .500, including reaching the DSL semifinals in 2012 and 2015. An outfielder during his playing days, Dominguez signed with the Yankees as an undrafted free agent in 2001 and spread four minor league seasons for New York between the DSL and the GCL. 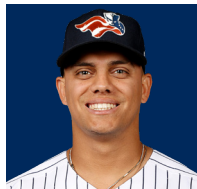
