YESTERDAY: The Flying Squirrels lost to the Fightin Phils, 1-0. The game's only run scored on a solo homer by Hendry Mendez in the third inning. **Seth Lonsway** allowed one run over five innings. **Marques Johnson** struck out three over two scoreless innings. **Ian Villers** and **Cameron Cotter** each threw a scoreless inning. Reading starter Koyo Aoyagi worked around four walks in four hitless innings. Mitch Nuenborn threw four scoreless innings and allowed two hits. Andrew Walling closed his fourth save of the season, stranding two baserunners in the bottom of the ninth.

TODAY'S GAME: The Flying Squirrels play fourth of a six-game series against the Reading Fightin Phils, Double-A affiliate of the Philadelphia Phillies. This is the only series between the two teams this year. The Flying Squirrels are 14-4 against the Fightin Phils since the start of the 2023 season, including an 9-3 record at The Diamond. In 2023, the Flying Squirrels swept Reading in three games to open the season and won five-of-six in a series at FirstEnergy Stadium. Last year, they went 5-1 in a six-game series in their only series against Reading, with the Fightin Phils avoiding a sweep with a win in the fifth game.

PACKING THE HOUSE: Last year, the Flying Squirrels led all 30 Double-A teams in average (6,595) and total (435,295) attendance. Among the 120 MiLB teams, the Flying Squirrels were 10th in average attendance. It was the third straight year the Flying Squirrels led all 30 Double-A clubs in average and total attendance, which had not been done prior to 2022. Last year's total attendance is the highest since 2013 (434,769) and the fourth-highest average in team history. April 4 marked the 15th consecutive Opening Night sellout, marking every home opener in franchise history to date. This year, the Flying Squirrels are averaging 6,646 fans per home game, which ranks fifth among all 120 MiLB clubs. Their average of 7,290 in the season's first month was the highest April attendance in franchise history.

THE FLYING SQUIRRELS won their first series of the season last week, taking three-of-five against Altoona on the road. In that series, both teams were led to two-or-less runs in four-of-five games. Of Richmond's 48 losses this season, 26 of them have been by two runs or less (18 by one, eight by two). Their 18 one-run losses are the most in the EL, two ahead of Reading (16). The Richmond offense is last in the Eastern League in runs scored (226). Richmond's pitching staff has a league-high 4.63 ERA.

THE FIGHTIN PHILS: went 2-4 in last week's home series against the Yard Goats and finished the first half 25-42, last in the Northeast Division. Reading's roster features six players ranked in Baseball America's top-30 prospects list, including SS Aidan Miller (No. 2), RHP Jean Cabrera (No. 13), SS Carson DeMartini (No. 16), RHP Daniel Harper (No. 23), OF Hendry Mendez (No. 27) and RHP Griff McGarry (No. 29). There are also five players featured in MLB.com's top-30 Phillies prospects list, including Miller (No. 2), Cabrera (No. 11), DeMartini (No. 15), Mendez (No. 25) and C Caleb Ricketts (No. 29).

STRONG ARMS: Since June 16, the Flying Squirrels have posted a 2.73 ERA (20 ER/66.0 IP) in eight games. The Richmond bullpen has posted a 0.84 ERA (3 ER/32.0 IP) in that stretch. Richmond's 2.08 ERA (9 ER/39.0 IP) in last week's road set at Altoona was their lowest of the season for a series and the best in the Eastern League for the week. The previous low was a 3.17 ERA (19 ER/54.0 IP) in their six-game series from April 15-20 against Chesapeake at The Diamond.

FOR RICHMOND: Left-hander **Joe Whitman** makes his 14th start of the season and his first against Reading. He last pitched on Saturday at Altoona and allowed one run over 3.2 innings in a loss. After going 2-1 with a 1.55 ERA (5 ER/29.0 IP) in five May starts, Whitman has gone 0-3 with a 12.15 ERA (18 ER/13.1 IP) in his four starts in June. On May 3, Whitman threw six perfect innings against the Patriots at The Diamond, retiring all 18 batters he faced, and set a career high with 10 strikeouts. He was named Eastern League Pitcher of the Week on May 5. In his first full professional season last year, Whitman split the year between Low-A San Jose and High-A Eugene, going 3-8 with a 4.63 ERA in 23 starts. He finished the year ranked ninth in the Giants organization in strikeouts (108) and tied for ninth in games started. Whitman was selected in the second round of the 2023 MLB Draft by the Giants out of Kent State, where he was the MAC Pitcher of the Year that season. Before transferring to Kent State near his hometown of Akron, Ohio, Whitman pitched at Purdue. Entering 2025, Whitman was ranked by Baseball America as the No. 10 Giants prospect and No. 7 by MLB.com. **For more on Whitman, see page two.**

FOR READING: Right-hander Chuck King makes his 12th start of the season and the first of his career against the Flying Squirrels. In his last start on Saturday against the Yard Goats, he tied his longest outing of the year, allowing two runs over six innings with three strikeouts to pick up his second consecutive win. King went 0-2 with a 7.11 ERA (20 ER/25.1 IP) in his five May starts, but he has gone 2-1 with a 3.27 ERA (8 ER/22.0 IP) in four starts this month. King played five seasons at TCU from 2017-2021 before taking an internship and later an analyst job with the San Diego Padres. He signed with the Phillies last February after throwing in Driveline's Pro Day. Last year, he climbed four different levels in the Phillies organization and wetn 2-2 with a 3.92 ERA in 34 outings, including one game with Double-A Reading.

DON'T RUN ON RICHMOND: The Flying Squirrels' catching unit of **Adrián Sugastey**, **Zach Morgan** and **Onil Perez** have combined to catch 39 stolen base attempts this season, which is second among the 30 Double-A teams and leads the Eastern League. Sugastey leads all Double-A catchers with 26 runners caught stealing. Morgan, who was promoted to Triple-A Sacramento on June 10, is sixth in the Eastern League with 12. Perez threw out his first base-stealing attempt on Wednesday.

GO, DIEGO, GO!: **Diego Velasquez** is batting .350 (21-for-60) in his last 16 games since June 6 with two doubles, two RBIs, 11 walks and seven runs scored. In that span, he has at least one hit in 13-of-16 games and multiple hits in seven games. He is currently riding a team-leading 13-game on-base streak since June 10, which is tied with his own 13-game on-base streak from April 18-May 5 and another by **Jairo Pomares** from April 4-18 for the longest by a Richmond player this season. In the Eastern League this season, Velasquez is fifth in hits (69), fifth in OBP (.389), tied for seventh in walks (38) and ninth in batting average (.286).

BERI BOMBS: Outfielder/first baseman **Victor Bericoto** returned to the Richmond roster on June 3. He was placed on the injured list with Triple-A Sacramento on May 9 and played six games with the ACL Giants on a rehab assignment before returning to the Flying Squirrels. Bericoto opened the season with Richmond and hits .319 with three homers, four doubles and eight RBIs in 13 games before being promoted to the River Cats on April 20. He hit his fifth Double-A homer of the year on Wednesday afternoon. In his Richmond career dating back to 2023, Bericoto has homered 27 times, which is locked in a five-way tie for fourth place in franchise history (**Devin Harris**, **Sean Roby**, **Shane Matheny** and **Will Wilson**).

NIGHT AT THE ROXBY: Reliever **Braxton Roxby** closed his third save of the season on Sunday in Richmond's 2-1 win at Altoona. In that outing, he allowed an earned run for the first time since April 29 after throwing 13 consecutive games without surrendering an earned run, spanning 18 innings. In that stretch, the only two runs he surrendered were a pair of unearned runs in the 10th inning on May 27 against the Senators. In his last 15 outings since April 29, Roxby is 3-0 with a 0.43 ERA (1 ER/21.0) with 24 strikeouts and six walks. Among Eastern League relievers (min. 20 IP) this season, Roxby's 1.24 ERA is ranked fourth.

IN THE LEAGUE LEADERS: In the Eastern League, **Diego Velasquez** is ranked fifth in hits (69), fifth in OBP (.389), tied for seventh in walks (38) and ninth in batting average (.286). **Seth Lonsway** is fourth in innings pitched (70.1), seventh in ERA (3.45) and tied for ninth in strikeouts (64). **John Michael Bertrand** is second in innings pitched (72.0) and ninth in ERA (3.50). **Jack Choate** is sixth in strikeouts (67) and 10th in BAA (.239).

TOP SKIPPER: Flying Squirrels manager **Dennis Pelfrey** has led the team to 226 wins in his career, which is a new franchise record all-time wins record for a manager. He passed the record with Richmond's 6-1 win at Binghamton on May 23. From 2011-2013, **Dave Machemer** won 216 games as Richmond's manager, leading the team to the Eastern League postseason for in 2011. Pelfrey, who has been with Richmond since the 2022 season, led the team to back-to-back postseason appearances for the first time in franchise history in 2022 and 2023. He also managed the 2021 Eugene Emeralds to the High-A West championship.

PROSPECT WATCH: Richmond's roster features five players are ranked in Baseball America's top-30 Giants prospects, including **Joe Whitman** (No. 5), **Diego Velasquez** (No. 10), **Sabin Ceballos** (No. 21) and **Jack Choate** (No. 26). **John Michael Bertrand** is rated as having the best control in the Giants system. **Adrian Sugastey** is ranked as the top defensive catcher. **Aeverson Arteaga** is rated as the best defensive infielder and best infield arm. MLB.com's top-30 Giants prospects list features five Richmond players, including Whitman (No. 7), Velasquez (No. 15), Arteaga (No. 16), Ceballos (No. 23) and Choate (No. 27).

THIS DATE IN RICHMOND BASEBALL HISTORY

1962: The Richmond Virginians beat the Syracuse Chiefs, 7-6, at Parker Field. Syracuse led, 6-2, entering the bottom of the ninth. After a leadoff double by Pedro Gonzalez, Jake Gibbs singled, Tom Umphlett drove in a run with a groundout, Ben Mateosky singled in a run to cut the score to 6-4 and the tying runs scored on a throwing error while Syracuse attempted to turn a game-ending double play. Gibbs hit a triple in the bottom of the 10th and scored the winning run on a sacrifice fly by Umphlett.

1988: The Richmond Braves beat the Buffalo Bisons, 3-1, at The Diamond. John Smoltz, 21 years old at the time, started and took a no-hit bid into the seventh inning until a one-out double by Bryan Little. In the ninth, Little spoiled the shutout bid with an RBI single. He finished with four hits and one unearned run allowed over nine innings and struck out eight in his first Triple-A complete game. In the third inning, Mike Fischlin led off the third with a single and advanced to third when Smoltz hit a ball off the glove of Buffalo shortstop Al Pedrique into center field. Fischlin scored the game's first run on a wild pitch by Buffalo starter Dorn Taylor deflected off catcher Tom Prince. Dave Griffin doubled in a run in the sixth. David Justice brought in a third run in the eighth with a sacrifice fly to score Lonnie Smith.

1989: The Richmond Braves beat the Oklahoma City 66ers, 3-0, at All Sports Stadium in Oklahoma City. Charlie Puleo and Steve Ziem combined for a no-hitter. Both pitchers were in their first game with the R-Braves for the year. Puleo, who had just been sent down by Atlanta, pitched the first five innings. He had not pitched in five days and was limited to five innings or 75 pitches. Ziem had just been promoted from Single-A Durham and covered the final four frames. It was the first Richmond no-hitter since Mickey Mahler in 1977 and the first combined nine-inning no-hitter in the history of the International League. Kash Beauchamp, playing in his home state, hit a solo homer in the third inning. Mark Lemke added an RBI double in the fourth. In the fifth, Barry Jones drove in a run. **2011:** The Flying Squirrels beat the Harrisburg Senators, 9-3, at The Diamond. Chris Dominguez hit a grand slam in the seventh inning to cap the scoring, the first grand slam in Flying Squirrels history. He finished the game with six RBIs, which tied the single-game franchise record at the time. Charlie Culberson had three hits and scored two runs.
