Great Lakes Loons (36-29) at Dayton Dragons (35-29)

RH Clayton Beeter (0-3, 4.50) vs. LH Jacques Pucheu (3-1, 4.75)

Today's Game: The Dayton Dragons (affiliate of the Cincinnati Reds) meet the Great Lakes Loons (affiliate of the Los Angeles Dodgers) in the last game of a six-game series.

2021 Season Series: Dayton 10, Great Lakes 7. Current Series: Great Lakes 4, Dayton 1.

Last Game: Saturday: Great Lakes 13, Dayton 3 (suspended game from Friday). Dayton 4, Great Lakes 1 (game two). Great Lakes hit four home runs in game one including two by Brandon Lewis, the second of which was a grand slam. The Dragons came back to win the second game as Noah Davis tossed six strong innings in a seven-inning game, allowing just one run. Alex McGarry had three hits and Victor Ruiz added two hits and two RBI.

Season Highs from Last Games: Largest Margin of Defeat: 10 (lost 13-3, matched season high, G1); Most Home Runs Allowed, Game (Individual): 3, Hoffman (G1); Most Strikeouts, Dayton Batters (Team): 17 (G1).

Current Homestand: The Dragons are 5-6 on the current homestand, which is scheduled for 12 games featuring six games each against West Michigan and Great Lakes. The team batting average on the homestand is .270 (96-355). The Dragons have hit just two home runs on this homestand. The team ERA on the homestand is 6.25 (95 IP, 66 ER). The Dragons have committed seven errors in the 11 games.

High-A Central League Playoffs: Major League Baseball has announced that leagues at three classifications, including the High-A Central League, will conduct playoffs in September. The top two teams in each league, regardless of division, will meet in a best-of-five series.

The Mythical First Half Division Title: The Dragons were the winners of the "Mythical First Half" East Division title as the midpoint of the season concluded with games on Sunday. Note that the league is not utilizing a split-season format in 2021. There is no First Half or Second Half, and no First Half championship race in 2021 in the High-A Central League. The Midwest League was split into two equal halves for every season from 1988-2019, and from 1956-1981. The league did not play a split season from 1982-87.

Player Notes

- Francisco Urbaez is second in the league in batting average at .337. He is batting .364 over his last 39 games since May 29 and has a 12-game hitting streak, batting .413 (19 for 46) with six doubles. The hitting streak is one short of the team season high in 2021 of 13 by Brian Rey.
- Victor Ruiz is batting .361 with nine doubles over his last 16 games to raise his average from .213 to .277.
- Mariel Bautista is batting .323 over his last nine games and hit his first home run of the season in the last series vs. West Michigan.
- Quin Cotton is batting .316 on the homestand (9 games) with five RBI.
- Reliever Braxton Roxby over his last four appearances: 5.2 IP, 1 H, 0 R, 1 BB, 11 SO.
- Reliever Matt Gill over his last three appearances: 5.2 IP, 3 H, 0 R, 0 BB, 7 SO.

Team Notes

- The Dragons snapped a season-high six-game losing streak with the win in last night's second game.
- Dayton is in second place, one-half game behind Great Lakes in the High-A Central League East Division.
- Dayton had maintained sole possession of first place from June 8 until Thursday night's loss dropped them to second place. They have held at least a share of first place after 51 of the 64 games they have played this season. They have not been lower than second place in the standings at the end of a night and have not been more than one and one-half games out of first at any time this season.
- The Dragons are 9-1 in one-run games at home, and 12-2 when scoring first at home.
- The Dragons are 21-9 overall in games decided by two runs or less, the best mark in the league.
- BATTING:** The Dragons hit .300 as a team during the series with West Michigan to start this homestand. Their previous highest average in a series this season was .261, vs. Fort Wayne, June 15-20. They are batting .230 during the current series with Great Lakes...The Dragons have hit only two home runs on the homestand and only one over the last 10 games.
- FIELDING:** The Dragons have committed only 54 errors in 64 games, ranking second in the league in team fielding.
- The Dragons roster is headlined by outfielder Michael Siani. Siani is listed by Baseball America as the "Best Athlete" and "Best Defensive Outfielder" in the Reds organization. He is ranked as the Reds 10th best prospect overall. Other Dragons players ranked by Baseball America are RHP Lyon Richardson (#13), RHP Noah Davis (#15), and OF Jacob Hurtubise (#41).

Comeback Kids: June 8 and 9, the Dragons won two games in two nights despite trailing by five or more runs in each game. They had six such comebacks in the last five years (697 games), averaging 1.2 comebacks per season in games when trailing by five or more runs. The June 8 win after trailing 7-0 matched the largest comeback for the Dragons over at least the last 15 seasons. Records on comebacks date back to 2006. The Dragons have battled back to win five times after trailing by at least four runs since May 18. Over the last five years, they averaged 2.2 wins per season when trailing by at least four runs. The Dragons have won eight games in 2021 after trailing by at least three runs, compared to the five-year average of 5.6 per season. The Dragons have lost two games that they led by three runs or more this season.

Notes: Named pronounced in accordance with French-Canadian ancestry (first name like JOCK; last name PEE-Shoe)...Went undrafted in 2019 after a record-setting career at Austin Peay State University before briefly joining the Evansville Otters of the independent Frontier League...Reds purchased Pucheu's contract from Evansville on June 22, 2019...After one year in junior college, Pucheu spent his remaining three years of college baseball at Austin Peay in the Ohio Valley Conference. His best year came as a senior in 2019 when he went 8-4 with a 3.07 ERA to earn 1st Team All-OVC...Pucheu was initially sent to the Arizona League Reds in Goodyear, where he made 11 appearances including three starts, producing an ERA of 4.08. He was promoted to Greeneville in mid-August and made four appearances with the G-Reds including two starts, allowing just three runs in 18 innings for an ERA of 1.50. His best outing came August 23 when he fired seven shutout innings, allowing just four hits and one walk with nine strikeouts.

Pucheu in 2021: Had been utilized exclusively as a reliever prior to start on June 23 (in rotation slot vacated by Graham Ashcraft with his promotion to Chattanooga on June 22)...Allowed one run in four innings in first start in Dragons win at West Michigan...Over first three starts, allowed just three runs (two earned) over 14.1 innings...Allowed four runs in 2.2 innings in fourth start...Opened season with five consecutive scoreless outings covering 9.2 innings, allowing just three hits while striking out 11...Finished month of May with an ERA of 0.69 in 13 innings...Posted 8.16 ERA in June...July ERA is 5.19.

Longest outing: 4.1 innings (June 30) High pitch total in an outing: 75 (June 30)

Last Start: Suffered through his worst start of the season against West Michigan last Sunday, allowing four runs on five hits in 2.2 innings...All the runs and hits came in the third inning and the five hits came consecutively to start the inning after he had allowed only a walk over the first two innings.

Against this Opponent: Has made four relief appearances vs. Great Lakes...First three were scoreless covering six innings with just one hit allowed...Fourth outing lasted just one and two-thirds innings, surrendering three hits and three runs.

Dragons Manager/Coaches:

Jose Moreno is in his first season as Dragons manager and his second year in the Reds organization. The 2021 season is Moreno's 22nd year as a coach, instructor, or coordinator in professional baseball. As a manager, he has won three league championships with affiliated clubs, guiding his teams to titles in 2002, 2007, and 2010. Moreno also led his teams to back-to-back championships in the Venezuelan Winter League in 2019-20 and 2020-21. Moreno was a catcher in Cleveland Indians and Baltimore Orioles farm systems.

Wapakoneta, Ohio native **Brian Garman** joins the Dragons in 2021 as pitching coach. Garman was slated to serve as the Dayton pitching coach in 2020 before the season was canceled. He served as a pitching coach in the Los Angeles Angels system for the previous two seasons, working at Rookie-level Orem (Pioneer League) in 2019 and Advanced-A Inland Empire (California League) in 2018. Garman pitched at Wapakoneta High School and the University of Cincinnati before being drafted by the Milwaukee Brewers in the 17th round in 2010. He spent four years as a pitcher in the Brewers system, reaching the Double-A level.

Hitting coach **Daryle Ward** returns to the Dragons in 2021 after serving in the same position in Dayton in 2017-18. He is in his sixth year in coaching in the Cincinnati Reds organization. He served as the hitting coach with the Goodyear Reds in the Arizona League in 2016 and with the Chattanooga Lookouts in 2019. He was slated to return to Chattanooga in 2020 before the season was canceled. Ward played professionally for 22 seasons from 1994-2015. He spent seven full seasons and parts of four others in the Major Leagues, primarily as a left fielder and first baseman. His father, Gary Ward, was a Major League All-Star selection with both the Twins and Rangers as part of a 12-year Major League playing career.

Darren Bragg returns to the Dragons in his 15th year as a coach or instructor in the Reds organization. He will serve in a newly named position within the Reds organization, carrying the title of development coach. Bragg was the Dragons hitting coach for two seasons in 2007-08, helping the club to the playoffs in both years as he worked with future Reds Todd Frazier, Zack Cozart, Chris Heisey, Drew Stubbs, Juan Francisco, and others in Dayton. Bragg served as the Reds minor league outfield coordinator from 2009-18 before returning to a coaching assignment with an individual team. He was the bench coach at Double-A Chattanooga in 2019 and was slated to fill the same role with Daytona in 2020 before the minor league season was canceled. Bragg spent 11 years as a player in Major League Baseball from 1994-2004, appearing in 916 big league games with nine teams

Stockton's 2019 season was an amazing one, as he climbed from the USPBL, making his last start on June 27 against a team called the Westside Woolly Mammoths, all the way to becoming the Cincinnati Reds Minor League Pitcher of the Month in August...Played four years of college baseball at Jacksonville University in the Atlantic Sun Conference, posting strong numbers every year.
