SPRINGDALE, AR – Catcher **Sebastian Rivero** drove in three runs with a double and right-handed pitcher **Kasey Kalich** threw 2.1 perfect innings in his Arvest Ballpark debut, but the Northwest Arkansas Naturals fell short Tuesday night, a 5-3 loss to San Antonio Missions.

- After the Missions scored two early runs against starter **Jon Bowlan**, Rivero momentarily gave the Naturals a lead in the fourth inning with a bases-loaded double, at the time putting the Naturals on top, 3-2.
- That lead quickly disappeared, as San Antonio jumped back ahead on a two-out, two-run home run in the top of the fifth that knocked Bowlan out of the game, though the right-hander pitched into the fifth inning for the first time this year with Northwest Arkansas.
- Right-hander **Will Klein** relieved Bowlan in the fifth and got a quick out, and while he allowed a run in the sixth, got the first two outs of the seventh. Kalich followed Klein and retired all seven batters he faced, including 1-2-3 innings in the eighth and ninth to keep the Naturals within two.
- Unable to score after the fourth, Northwest Arkansas headed to the bottom of the ninth trailing by two runs. **John Rave** opened the inning with a 10-pitch at-bat that ended with a double, though Rave was left stranded to end the game, as the Naturals brought the tying run to the plate but could not score. **Seuly Matias** drove a fly ball to the center field wall after Rave's double, but with the wind blowing in could not tie the game.

THIS DAY IN NATURALS HISTORY

The Naturals are 4-6 all-time when playing on August 17

On August 17, 2011, the Northwest Arkansas Naturals beat the Frisco Roughriders, 14-2 at Arvest Ballpark. Eight of nine Naturals hitters in the starting lineup recorded a hit, including five multi-hit performances, led by a five-hit day from first baseman **Anthony Seratelli**. Seratelli singled in the second and third innings, scoring one of the Naturals' four runs in the third. He singled in runs in the fifth and sixth, then doubled in two runs in the seventh to cap his 5-for-5, four-RBI day. Seven different players drove in at least one run, including four multi-RBI games, led by Seratelli's four-RBI performance.

FOLLOW THE LEADER

Manager Chris Widger enters his first season at the helm of the Naturals, after previous stops in *Advanced Rookie* Burlington (2019) and *High-A* Quad Cities (2021) managing Royals affiliates.

- 13 of the Naturals' 27 active players played for Widger with the Quad Cities River Bandits last season.
- 4 of the Naturals' 27 active players played under Widger with the Burlington Royals, then in Quad Cities and now in Northwest Arkansas: **Dante Biasi, Jonah Dipoto, Jake Means and John Rave.**

EXTREME ENDS OF THE SPECTRUM

When looking at the Naturals' numbers one game to the next, it appears rather black and white with what leads to a win or loss.

- When scoring seven runs or more, the Naturals are 34-8, while when scoring six runs or less, just 10-57.
- The Naturals are 30-14 when recording 10 hits or more, but when they get nine hits or less, are just 14-50.
- The Naturals are 41-14 when out-hitting their opponent or hits are tied, but 3-50 when out-hit by their opponent.
- When the Naturals score first, they are 28-20, whereas 16-44 when the opponent scores first.

ONE RUN GOES A LONG WAY

The Naturals are 5-17 in one-run games this season, meaning 17 of their 64 losses (26.56%) this season have been decided by just one run.

- The Naturals have had the tying run at the plate or on base in 21 losses this season (including 13 of their one-run losses).

Yo, YOU WANNA SEE SOME REAL SPEED?

Through 108 games, the Naturals have stolen 137 bases in 171 attempts (average 1.27 steals/game, 80.12% success rate).

- 137 steals is second in the Texas League, ranks eighth in Double-A and tied 32nd in the Minors ... the team's collective 80.47% success rate ranks 32nd among the 120 full-season MiLB teams as well.
- The Naturals have stolen at least one base in 70 of 108 games this season (64.81%), including 34 games with two or more steals ... the team stole a season-high six bases on July 6 vs. Tulsa with a pair of five-steal games as well this season.
- The Naturals have pulled off a double steal 17 times, meaning 34 of 137 steals this year (24.82%) have come on a double-steal.
- Naturals players have stolen multiple bases in a game 14 times, SIX of those occasions being Garcia ... **Tucker Bradley** had the first three-steal game of the season (and of his career) on July 9 vs. Tulsa.
- Maikel Garcia's** 27 steals (in 30 attempts) still ranks fourth in the Texas League, **Nick Loftin's** 24 (in 27 attempts) ranks seventh in the league.

TUCK(ER) AND ROLL

Naturals outfielder **Tucker Bradley** has been consistent from the start of the season and established himself as one of the team's most reliable hitters.

- Bradley has reached base at least once in 76 of 93 games played this season (81.72%) and reached base multiple times on 48 occasions, which ranks second on the Naturals behind Logan Porter's 49 ... he has hits in 66 of 93 games and has a team-best 28 multi-hit games, as well as 13 multi-run games and nine multi-RBI games.
- Bradley's .300 batting average leagues qualified Naturals hitters, ranks tied ninth in the Texas League and fourth among Kansas City's minor league hitters ... his .381 on-base percentage ranks third in the system, as are his 101 hits, while 20 doubles are tied third, 148 total bases and a .820 OPS are eighth, rank eighth, 57 runs scored are tied eighth and a .439 slugging percentage is 10th.
- The Georgia native has hit first in the order 25 games this year, which ranks second behind Maikel Garcia (76) ... when hitting first, Bradley is a .294 hitter (30-for-102) with a .390 on-base percentage and .792 OPS ... when leading off innings, he hits .303 (27-for-89) with a .386 on-base percentage.

TYLER, THE CREATOR (OF RUNS)

Naturals outfielder **Tyler Gentry** has been one of the best hitters in the Kansas City Royals' system this season, with an incredible impact since joining the Naturals in June.

- Among qualified full-season Minor League hitters, Gentry ranks **FIFTH** in batting average (.329) when you combine his stats between Northwest Arkansas and Quad Cities (A+).
- He is the Royals' organization leader in batting average (.329), slugging percentage (.555) and OPS (.978), while ranking second in on-base percentage (.423) ... his 17 home runs between the River Bandits and Naturals are tied third in the system, while 62 runs batted in are tied fifth.
- Gentry has reached base in 41 of 46 games (89.13%) and has hits in 32 of his 46 games with the Naturals, with already 18 multi-hit games.
- In 46 games since his call-up to Double-A on June 14, Gentry is batting .324 (56-for-173) with nine doubles, 12 home runs and 39 runs batted in and a .999 OPS ... he's driven in at least one run in 21 of 46 games, with 10 multi-RBI games.
- Gentry leads the Naturals in nearly every category since joining the team, with the highest average (.324), most total bases (101), most home runs (12) and most runs batted in on the team (39) ... his 39 RBIs are the third-most in the Texas League since then and his 12 homers rank third since his arrival in the circuit, while 101 total bases and a .999 OPS are fourth.
- His 18-game on-base streak between June 26 and July 17 is the longest for a Naturals player this season ... in that span, he hit .382 (26-for-68) with 10 extra-base hits and 12 walks, with an on-base percentage of .459 in that span.

ALEXANDER THE GREAT

Infielder **CJ Alexander** has quickly heated up at the plate since joining the Naturals in a trade last month from Atlanta.

- Alexander has hit 6 of the Naturals' last 10 home runs, across the team's previous 11 games ... that means he has *hit more home runs than the rest of the team combined.*
- Over 25 games with the Naturals, the corner infielder is hitting .252 (26-for-103) with 11 extra-base hits (eight home runs) and 26 runs batted in, with 15 runs scored as well.
- He has hits in 15 of 25 games with the Naturals, 10 of which are multi-hit performances, while he's driven in runs in 9 of 25 games, including already SEVEN multi-RBI games.
- In the month of August, Alexander is hitting .300 (15-for-50) with seven home runs and 18 runs batted in ... seven homers and 18 RBI lead the Texas League this month, while 37 total bases are second in the circuit.
- CJ homered in four straight games against Tulsa, August 3 to 6 ... he is the third Natural this season and just the sixth all-time to homer in four consecutive games.
- Alexander began his Naturals tenure 0-for-12 over his first three games, then homered on July 16 @ Corpus Christi for his first hit with the team and went 4-for-10 in his next two games.

ROCKIN' ROBBIE

After slumping for much of June, first baseman **Robbie Glendinning** has returned to form, with a hot stretch that has carried through July into August.

- Glendinning's 65 runs batted in this season rank seventh in the Texas League, while 65 runs scored are tied for the eighth-most in the league.
- He has reached base in 82 of 92 games played this season (89.13%), reaching multiple times in 43 games this season ... he has hits in 60 of 92 games, including 26 multi-hit games this season.
- Among Royals minor league hitters, Glendinning ranks as one of the top hitters in nearly every category ... he is third in the system with 37 extra-base hits and 65 runs scored, while tied third in the system with 17 home runs and 65 runs batted in, fourth with 162 total bases and tied fifth with 19 doubles ... his .471 slugging percentage and .836 OPS rank as the sixth-best in the organization, while his .365 on-base percentage and .262 batting average each rank ninth in the system.

Pitchers of the Month (1)

May: LHP Drew Parrish ... started five games and went 3-1 with a 0.59 ERA (2 ER in 30.2 IP) ... only allowed 15 hits and four walks, while striking out 29 opposing hitters ... among qualified Texas League pitchers, threw the most innings and had the lowest ERA and WHIP (0.62), while holding opponents to a .144 average.

Players of the Week (3)

- April 25 to May 1:** 2B Michael Massey ... hit .417 (10-for-28) across six games with a league-best 19 total bases and nine runs batted in, while tied for the Texas League lead with 10 hits. His 1.221 OPS ranked third among players with at least 20 at-bats, while his .417 average tied for second among that same group.
- May 23 to May 29:** 2B Michael Massey ... hit a league-best .481 (13-for-27) across six games in Midland, while tied for the league lead with 19 total bases. He drove in nine runs as well, doubling three times with one home run, a go-ahead grand slam on May 24 and collected multiple hits in each of the first five games of the series.
- June 27 to July 3:** OF Tyler Gentry ... hit .435 (10-for-23) with two doubles, four home runs and 11 runs batted in, which was tied for the most in the league. Recorded 24 total bases with a 1.043 slugging percentage 1.543 OPS.

Pitchers of the Week (4)

- May 2 to May 8:** LHP Drew Parrish ... threw 7.0 scoreless innings on May 7 @ Springfield ... held the Cardinals to just two hits and one walk while striking out four. He retired the first eight he faced and the final five, with five 1-2-3 frames.
- May 9 to May 15:** LHP Drew Parrish ... threw 7.0 scoreless innings on May 13 vs. Wichita ... held the Wind Surge to just three hits and no walks while striking out nine. Between the second and sixth innings, he retired 13 straight batters, retiring the side 1-2-3 in the first inning, as well as the third through sixth.
- June 6 to June 12:** LHP Anthony Veneziano ... threw 7.0 scoreless innings in a complete-game shutout on June 9 @ Tulsa ... held the Drillers to just three hits and one walk while striking out five, on 79 pitches. Retired the final eight hitters he faced and 11 of the last 12, only needing five pitches for a 1-2-3 seventh inning to end the night.
- July 25 to July 31:** LHP Dante Biasi ... threw 5.0 scoreless innings on July 27 @ Wichita in an eventual 5-0 shutout win ... held the Wind Surge to just one hit and three walks while striking out five, on 79 pitches, his second straight scoreless start.
