# LHP Carson Palmquist (1-2, 4.91) vs. LHP Tommy Henry (0-4, 9.82)

TODAY'S GAME: Albuquerque needs a win to avoid their third series loss on the year after dropping the last three games to . A rematch of game one starters is set for the series finale: lefties Carson Palmquist and Tommy Henry, respectively, for the Isotopes and Aces.

DUKE CITY HR RECORD: Sam Hilliard belted his 80th home run in an Isotopes uniform Friday - passing Mike Busch (Dukes, 1993-96) for the most in Albuquerque professional baseball history.

ISOTOPES RBI RECORD: Hilliard has 225 RBI with Albuquerque, which ranks third among career leaders in team history. Jordan Patterson (2016-18) is second with 229 RBI.

SAM I AM: Sam Hilliard drew a walk last night to extend his onbase streak to 17, every game he's played in 2025. It's tied for the second-longest active on-base streak in the PCL and tied for the third-longest overall streak ... Dating back to 2024, has a 25-game on-base streak in Triple-A (June 11-19, 2024) ... It was his sixth hitless game on the year.

**HR/AB**: Hilliard compiled 80 home runs in 1,148 at-bats with Albuquerque, a ratio of one long ball every 14.35 official at-bat.

**STREAK**: Albuquerque has tied their season-worst with a three-game losing streak, done previously from April 6-9.

RUNS: Albuquerque was held to one or fewer runs for the fifth time this season yesterday, with four occurrences taking place on the road.

MULTI-HOMER GAME: Blaze Alexander launched two homers for Reno last night, a day after his teammate A.J. Vukovich did the same on Friday. It is the first time Albuquerque allowed a multi-homer performance in back-to-back games since current Isotope Keston Hiura accomplished the feat for Salt Lake himself on June 27-28, 2024.

XBH: After compiling just four extra-base hits in the first two games of this series, the Aces have produced 20 in the last three contests.

PUNCHOUTS: Albuquerque's pitching staff recorded just three strikeouts yesterday, fewest in a nine-inning game this year (previous: four on April 17 vs. El Paso).

ASSIST: Zac Veen threw out Jake McCarthy at third base in the first inning yesterday, his first outfield assist of the season and Albuquerque's seventh.

WARMIN' UP: Warming Bernabel produced his team-leading 10th multi-hit game of the season yesterday and fourth in his last five contests. ... Has 10 RBI this series ... Over his last 12 games, is slashing .370/.407/.652 with seven doubles, two homers, 16 RBI and five walks.

HOME RUN LEADERBOARD: Yanguiel Fernandez has seven homers on the year, tied for the most in all of MiLB.

VEEN: Zac Veen went 2-for-5 last night, doubling home the Isotopes lone run in the fifth inning. Five of his 10 games at the Triple-A level this season have been of the multi-hit variety.

YF: Yanquiel Fernandez went 0-for-4 yesterday, ending his five game hit streak. Over those five contests, went 9-for-22 with four homers, two doubles and seven RBI.

RITTER: Rvan Ritter delivered his second multi-hit performance in four nights yesterday after not recording any between April 11-

KESTDADDY: Keston Hiura tripled for one of his two hits yesterday, the first time he legged out a three-bagger since April 25, 2024 when he was playing for the Toledo Mud Hens ... Recorded his fifth multi-hit game of the year and second in his last three games.

JC: Julio Carreras singled and walked last night and has a hit in four-straight contests ... During the stretch is 9-for-16 with a triple, thee RBI and seven runs scored.

THE VET: Austin Nola singled last night and has a hit in four-straight .. Is 9-for-17 with two doubles and one RBI during the

### NUCLEI NOTES

SKIPPER: Pedro Lopez enters his 21st year as a minor league manager and third guiding the Isotopes. He is the eighth manager in club history ... Spent 2021 as Albuquerque's hitting coach and 2022 as its bench coach ... Notched his 1,000th career managerial victory June 4, 2023 at Salt Lake, 7-1 ... Managed in the Texas Rangers (2001-05, 2007) and New York Mets (2011-19) organizations while claiming the 2014 Eastern League Championship with Double-A Binghamton. Lopez was drafted in the 21st round by the San Diego Padres in the 1988 MLB Draft and spent 13 years in the minor leagues, reaching Triple-A on four occasions.

HOMETOWN KID: Jordan Pacheco begins his fourth season as the Isotopes hitting coach ... An Albuquerque native and 2004 graduate of La Cueva High School, Pacheco then attended the University of New Mexico (2005-07), where he was one of the most prolific offensive players in school history (.384, 59 2B, 25 HR, 145 RBI) ... Drafted by Rockies in the 9th round in 2007 and made his MLB debut with Colorado in 2011.

CHRIS MICHALAK: Begins his third season as Isotopes pitching coach ... Pitched for the Albuquerque Dukes in 2000, followed by stints with the Isotopes in 2004 and 2008 ... Started second-to-last game in Dukes history, giving up two runs in 6.0 innings during Game 4 of a PCL First Round playoff series at Memphis Sept. 9, 2000 ... Appeared in 61 Major League games (24 starts) over five seasons with the Arizona Diamondbacks (1998), Toronto Blue Jays (2001) Texas Rangers (2001-02) and Cincinnati Reds (2006) ... 12th round selection by the Athletics in 1993 ... Has been in the coaching ranks since 2009, including stops as the pitching coach for the Hagerstown Suns (2010-11), Potomac Nationals (2012-13) and Harrisburg Senators (2014-17). He was also the Minor League pitching coordinator for the Miami Marlins form 2018-20 and coached in the Washington Nationals organization from 2021-22.

MICHAEL RYAN: Enters his second year with the Rockies organization as the Isotopes bench coach ... The former outfielder played in 33 games for the Isotopes and hit nine homers during the 2008 campaign. He and Michalak were teammates on that squad for four days in late July ... Entered the coaching ranks in 2012 as a coach for the Double-A Altoona Curve (Pirates). He then managed in the Pirates organization at three levels for seven seasons with stops at Single-A West Virginia (2013-14), High-A Bradenton (2015-16) and Double-A Altoona (2017-19), while winning the Florida State League in 2016 and Eastern League in 2017. Ryan compiled a 221-197 managerial record with Altoona—the most wins for a manager in Curve history ... He also managed in the Cubs organization (High-A South Bend, 2021 and Double-A Tennessee, 2022-June 2023) ... A 5th round draft pick by the Minnesota Twins in 1996, played in 149 MLB games over parts of five seasons with the Twins (2002-05) and Angels (2010) ... Last Angels player to wear 27 prior to Mike Trout's call-up in 2011.

**SPLIT-SEASON PLAYOFF FORMAT**: For the third-straight year, the Pacific Coast League will use a split-season format to determine playoff participants. With one 10 team division, the first half winner (concluding June 22) will host the second half winner (beginning June 24) in a three-game set. The winner will then face the International League champion for the Triple-A Championship in Las Vegas, NV, on September 27.

**BALLS AND STRIKES**: The Challenge System, in it's third full year in the PCL, will be used exclusively for every game this season. Under this system, the home plate umpire will call balls or strikes while each team has the opportunity to challenge the umpire's call with two challenges per game, retaining one for each successful challenge.
