CHARLOTTE SERIES: The Bulls dropped their first series of the second half, losing four of six at Charlotte. The Knights won the season-series 14-4, just the third time in 20 years in which Charlotte has taken the head-to-head against the Bulls (2012, 2024).

HOME TO MEMPHIS: The Bulls return to the DBAP to host the first-half champion Memphis Redbirds in a six-game series. Durham split six games with Memphis in July, and return to AutoZone the first week of September. The Redbirds won the first half on the final day, defeating Nashville. That win, coupled with Toledo's defeat of second-place Rochester, handed the first half title to the Redbirds. Memphis will host the best-of-three International League championship series Sept 22-24 with the winner heading to Las Vegas for the Triple-A National Championship against the winner of the Pacific Coast League.

UPCOMING: The Bulls head to Lawrenceville, GA to face the Gwinnett Strippers beginning August 18th.

TRANSACTION WIRE: RH Hayden Snelsire was assigned to Durham. RH Michael Grove was optioned to Durham. RH Brody Hopkins has been placed on the developmental list. IF Carson Williams was recalled by Tampa Bay. RH Steven Wilson was designated for assignment.

CONNECTIONS: Manager Ben Johnson was a coach for the Durham Bulls in the late 2010s, and is now in his eighth season as manager for the Memphis Redbirds. Johnson became the winningest manager in Memphis history on May 21st, 2025.

* Durham's W5 (June 24-28) was their longest winning streak of 2026

* The Bulls' 0-4 start to the 1st half was the worst in their Triple-A franchise existence

2026: Opened season on Durham injured list, making one rehab appearance for Charleston (April 18th) before joining Bulls for Triple-A debut April 21 in Lehigh Valley (3-4, RBI, SB). Matched career-high with 4H (4-5) 5/13 at Gwinnett.

Bio: 4th round (SD) in 2023 from Grand Canyon University.

Other: Hit .301 at Double-A Montgomery in 2025 with 57 stolen bases in 69 attempts. Father Homer Sr, spent between 1997 and 2004 in MLB, winning a World Series with the Yankees in 1998. Career spanned New York, Toronto, Florida and culminated back with the Yankees in 2004 (9g).

2026: Started 2026 on injured list, activated by Durham on June 9th. Spent May 13th-June 7th at Low-A Charleston (16g: .292-1-12). Hit grand slam July 22nd @ Memphis, his first Durham HR since August 14, 2024 v Nashville.

Bio: 2nd round (SD) in 2019 from George Mason.

Other: Made MLB debut 9/3/24 with Tampa Bay. Traded to Tampa Bay February 8, 2020 from San Diego with Manuel Margot for Emilio Pagan. Released by Rays August 15, 2025, but re-signed with Rays on August 25th, 2025. Spent first 4 games of 2026 (May 2-8) with FCL Rays before joining Charleston (May 13). Hit .220 with 1 HR and 12 RBI in 16 games before being assigned to Durham. Played 20g with Bulls in 2023 and 70g in 2024. TJ surgery on April 16, 2025, costing him most of 2025 season. Underwent second non-TJ surgery in January, 2026 to realign nerve in elbow.

2026: Made first Opening Day Bulls roster. Placed on IL June 22, activated July 4th.

Bio: 1st round (Oakland) in 2019 from Clemson.

Other: Signed as free agent by Tampa Bay in off-season. Split time in 2025 between Triple-A Las Vegas (Athletics) and Sugar Land (Houston), along with LA Angels (10g) and Athletics (9g). Played HS ball at Providence High in Charlotte. Was everyday shortstop at Clemson. Made major league debut May 24, 2025 with Athletics. Dad (Mark) played baseball at Clemson. Logan was NC Gatorade HS Player of Year.

2026: Made his season (and Triple-A) debut on April 23rd in Lehigh Valley, hitting a solo home run in his first AB (2-0 pitch). Levins then homered in Game 2 of a doubleheader two days later. Matched career-high with 5RBI at Gwinnett May 16 (2-4, 2B, 1B, SF).

Bio: 8th round (Seattle) in 2022 from Pitt.

Other: Acquired by TB from Seattle in November, 2023 in trade for Blake Hunt. Levins spent 2025 at Double-A Montgomery, appearing in 100 games (244-7-54-2) with 77 walks for an OBP of .405. Levins also threw out 40 baserunners (139 SBA). Levins spent his first three collegiate seasons at LaSalle before Explorers program was discontinued. Was a freshman All-American at LaSalle and A-10 Rookie of Year. Three-time all-state swimming selection at Notre Dame HS (PA).

2026: Opened season with Durham, placed on IL April 3rd. Rehabbed FCL Rays May 15-21 before being shut down. Restarted rehab at FCL June 1-6 (4-14, 4g). Activated by Durham June 9th. Placed on IL June 20th, activated July 17th.

Bio: 3rd round (TB) in 2023 from LSU.

Other: Hit .274 with 8 HR and 45 RBI with Durham in 2025 (92g). Spent three seasons at LSU, winning NCAA title in 2023. Invited to Futures Game and Arizona Fall League in 2024. Member of CWS-All Tournament Team. Hit for cycle at LSU (v Southern U, 2023), the first Tiger to do so since 2010.

2026: Made Durham debut 5/28 in G2 at Norfolk. Was opening day RF and leadoff batter for Miami. With Marlins through April 21st (12g: .174, 4-23, 1RBI) Joined NYM on April 29th through May 16th (9g: .250, 5-20, 1RBI). DFA'd by Marlins April 23rd, elected free agency. DFA'd by Mets May 19th, elected free agency.

Bio: 8th round pick (SF) in 2014 from Stanford.

Other: Prepped at The Bolles School in Jacksonville, FL, winning three straight state titles. Grandfather played football at Duke. Led MLB in pinch-hit RBIs in 2021 with 13. Named after his grandfather Ed Austin, who was mayor of Jacksonville, FL from 1991-95. Played MLB with SF, CIN, BAL, CWS, NYY, MIA and NYM. Post-season 2021 with SF (3g: v LAD, NLDS) and in 2024 with BAL (1g: v KC, ALWC)

2026: Added to Bulls' roster June 25th.

Bio: 6th round (NY Yankees) in 2011 from Kecoughton (VA) HS.

Other: Signed by Tampa Bay as free agent June 25th. Made MLB debut May 19, 2018 with Minnesota. Spent 18-22 seasons with Twins; '23 with Phillies & '24 with Colorado. 523 career MLB games (.236-45-176/OPS 692). Spent '25 season with Doosan (Korea: 299-16-87) and the first half of '26 with Veracruz (MX). Made five Opening Day rosters (3 MIN, 1 PHL, 1 COL). In first pro game, fractured kneecap in collision at home plate, missing rest of 2011 and 2012 seasons.

2026: Opening Day 3B for Charlotte (CWS). Played with Knights through May 19th before traded to Tampa Bay for Joe Rock. Assigned directly to Rays where hit .091 (1-11) in nine games before being optioned to Durham June 8th.

Bio: 11th round pick (NYY) in 2014 from Utah.

Other: Spent 2025 with Nashville Sounds, hitting .208 with 8 HR and 43 RBI with 25 stolen bases. Appeared in 14g with Milwaukee in 2025. Made MLB debut in 2024 with Milwaukee (41g: 221-1-7-3). Younger brother Ross is pitcher in Minnesota organization. Made Opening Day roster for Milwaukee in both 2024 and 2025.

2026: Opening Day roster for Bulls. Began season on 0-29 skid. DFA'd May 9. Placed on IL June 17th, activated August 6th.

Bio: 6th round (Atlanta) in 2021 from Georgia Tech

Other: Acquired by Rays in January (\$) from Detroit. Played in 2023 Futures Game. Spent 2019 & 2020 at Vanderbilt with current Bulls catcher Dom Keegan before transferring to GT. Made major league debut June 3, 2024 with Detroit. Was recalled to Detroit four separate occasions in 2025, appearing in 52 games with the Tigers. Malloy hit .322 with nine homers in 72 games with Triple-A Toledo.

2026: Opening Day roster for Salt Lake. Selected by LAA May 27th. DFA 6/22, elected free agency. Signed by TB on June 26th.

Bio: 1st round (Chicago White Sox) in 2018 from Oregon State.

Other: 4th overall pick in 2018, signing for \$6.4m bonus. MLB debut 7/31//20 for CWS. Spent 2 years with White Sox before dealt to Cubs (7/30/21). Played in 300 MLB games (.274). 38g for Salt Lake (275-2-23-3), 15g w/LAA (273-0-2-1). Went 3-12 in 3g in 2020 ALWC series for CWS vs Oakland.

2026: Made his first Durham Bulls opening day roster. Capped Durham's first-ever back-to-back-to-back HRs July 4th v Gwinnett (Williams/Melton/Sabol) v Anderson Pilar.

Bio: 7th round pick (PIT) in 2019 from Southern Cal.

Other: Signed as free agent in Jan, 2026 with Tampa Bay. Prepped at Aliso Niguel HS in Aliso Viejo, CA. Made MLB debut March 30, 2023 with San Francisco. Played three years at USC. Brother Stefan was drafted by Mets in 2012, playing five years in minors. Second cousin to NFL safety Troy Polamalu. First and thus far only MLB Opening Day roster was with San Francisco in 2023 – remained on roster all year after being selected as Rule V pick from Cincinnati. Dad (Rob) played baseball at Long Beach State.

2026: Started season with OKC (LAD): 93g: 291-21-72-5. 2nd-t in PCL HR, 5th in RBI, 2nd in SLG% (562), 3rd in OBS (948) at time of trade to Rays (Aug 3).

Bio: 15th round (SD) in 2016 from Taft (IL) HS.

Other: Made Opening Day roster in 2023 & 2024 for Pittsburgh. MLB debut April 26, 2022. Hit 26 HR in 144g in 2023 for Pirates. Acquired by TB from LAD August 3rd, 2026 in Hunter Feduccia trade. 57 career MLB HR. Had signed LOI to play baseball at Indiana.

ALEXANDER ALBERTO 6’8 RHP 11/2/01 MLB: 0.000

2026: Assigned to Durham June 16th from Double-A Montgomery.

Bio: International free agent (TB) in 2019.

Other: Was 2-1, 2.20 in 21 games for Montgomery (28.2IP/18H/7ER/9W/39K). Earned save in Triple-A debut v Jacksonville on June 16th. Was Major League Rule V pick by CWS in Dec ’25, but did not make team in spring training. Offered back to Tampa Bay in March.

ALEX COOK 6’2 RHP 3/29/01 MLB 0.000

2026: Made Bulls Opening Day roster. Placed on injured list May 20th. Activated May 26th. Made MLB debut 7/31 v CWS.

Bio: 12th round (TB) in 2022 from Colby College (KS)

Other: Added to 40-man roster at end of 2025 season. Limited to 20 innings in 2025 (R shoulder injury). Appeared in 13g with Double-A Montgomery (1-1, 2.30) after making his Biscuits debut on July 9th.

MICHAEL GROVE 6’3 RHP 12/18/96 MLB: 3.031

2026: Added to Bulls June 2nd. Made 1st rehab outing 6/2 (2IP/1H/0R/1W/4K; 26p)

Bio: 2nd round (LAD) in 2018 from West Virginia

Other: Prepped at Wheeling Park HS (WV). Made MLB debut May 5, 2022 with LAD. 64g across MLB career, all with Dodgers, including 12 starts in 2023. Made 3 post-season appearances combined in 2023 (2g NLDS v AZ) and 2024 (1g NLDS v SD). Signed as free agent April 14, 2026 with Rays. Made 3 rehab starts in FCL (May 23-June 1). Labrum surgery in April, 2025, missed entire year.

BRODY HOPKINS 6’4 RHP 1/18/00 MLB: 0.000

2026: Made first career Triple-A roster. Threw career-high 100 pitches May 16th at Gwinnett (4.2IP/3H/1R/0ER/5W/5K). Had only one start of 90+ pitches in career. 5 no-hit IP (9) May 29 @ Norfolk.

Bio: 6th round (SEA) in 2023 from Winthrop University (SC)

Other: Acquired by TB on July 26, 2024 from Seattle in Randy Arozarena trade. Futures Game selection in 2024. Was OF/P in college, where career started at College of Charleston (2yrs). Played his final year of college ball at Winthrop. Spent 2025 at Double-A Montgomery (5-7, 2.72 in 25 starts). Fanned 141 in 116IP.

EVAN REIFERT 6’4 RHP 5/14/99 MLB: 0.000

2026: Made Opening Day Durham roster for second straight season.

Bio: Free Agent (MIL) in 2020 from Central Missouri.

Other: Spent two seasons at Iowa Western CC before heading to Central Missouri. Acquired by TB for Mike Brosseau ahead of 2022 season. Reifert was selected by Washington in Major League Rule V draft in Dec, 2024, but did not make team and offered back. Was 2-2, 5 with 2.48 ERA in 31 games with Durham in 2025.

OWEN WILD 6’2 RHP 7/30/02 MLB: 0.000

2026: Started the season at Double-A Montgomery. Assigned to Durham on May 26. Earned first Triple-A win of career on July 7th at Jacksonville (2IP/0H/0R/1W/3K)

Bio: 7th round (TB) in 2023 from Gonzaga.

Other: Was 1-3, 3.43 in 16 games with Montgomery (21IP/9H/8ER/9W/33K). Was 7-8, 4.71 at Montgomery in 2025 as a starter (23gs). Pitched for Great Britain in 2026 WBC (1gs v Italy in Pool play). Pitched three seasons at Gonzaga after growing up in Gig Harbor, WA.

HUNTER BIGGE 6’0 RHP 6/12/98 MLB: 1.049

2026: Made Durham Opening Day roster before recalled by Rays on April 2nd.

Bio: 12th round (Cubs) in 2019 from Harvard.

Other: Made MLB debut July 9, 2024 with Cubs. Traded to TB July 28, 2024 with Ty Johnson and Christopher Morel for Isaac Paredes. Appeared in 13g for Rays in 2025 before being struck in face while in dugout by 105mph line drive from Baltimore’s Adley Rutschman on June 19th, suffering multiple facial fractures. Missed remainder of 2025. Finished Harvard degree (physics).

MASON ENGLERT 6’4 RHP 11/1/99 MLB: 1.168

2026: Made Opening Day roster for TB. Placed on injured list April 20th with right forearm tightness. Was 0-1, 5.63 in 10g for Rays. Optioned by Rays May 9th. 6IP start 5/26 @ Norfolk was longest since 8/18/22 with High-A Hickory (Texas)

Bio: 4th round (TEX) in 2018 from Forney (TX) High School.

Other: Made MLB debut March 30, 2023 with Detroit. Claimed on waivers by DET (from TEX) in December, 2022. Rays acquired Englert from DET in February, 2025 for Drew Sommers. Made 29 appearances for Rays in 2025 (0-1, 3.83). Made 14 appearances for Durham in 2025 (1-0, 1.23).

LUIS GUERRERO 6’0 RHP 8/5/00 MLB: 0.155

2026: Made Durham Opening Day roster. Assigned to dev list June 23.

Bio: 17th round (BOS) in 2021 from Chipola JC (FL)

Other: Made MLB debut September 8, 2024 for Boston. Acquired by Rays in November, 2025 for Tristan Gray. Endured knee surgery resulting from throat infection at 1-year-old, spending nine months in hospital, resulting in limited, permanent mobility in right knee. 2023 Futures Game.

TREVOR MARTIN 6’5 RHP 12/15/00 MLB: 0.000

2026: Made first Opening Day roster with Durham. Selected to make his MLB debut April 20th v Cincinnati. Recalled again May 14th.

Bio: 3rd round (TB) in 2022 from Oklahoma State

Other: Grew up in Asher, OK, a town of less than 1,000. Father, Michael, made first-ever flight to Tampa to see his son make debut (2.1IP/2H/1ER/0W/2K). Was added to Rays’ 40-man ahead of selection.

JESSE SCHOLTENS 6’4 RHP 4/6/94 MLB: 2.091

2026: Started season with Durham (1 app) before recalled by TB. Remained with Rays until placed on IL after 5/25 app with right wrist injury. Assigned to Dur on rehab 7/18. Reinstated and optioned to Durham July 23.

Bio: 9th round (SD) in 2016 from Wright State.

Other: MLB debut April 7, 2023 for CWS. Holds M.A. in accounting. TJ surgery March, 2024, returning in May, 2025 for Charlotte. Waiver claim by TB August, 2025. Spent one season at Arizona before transferring to Diablo CC (CA). Finished college career over final two seasons at Wright State.

STEVEN WILSON 6’4 RHP 8/24/94 MLB: 3.166

2026: Started season on IL (lumbar disc). Placed on 60-day IL. Made debut in FCL July 4, then transferred to Durham July 17th.

Bio: 8th round (SD) in 2018 from Santa Clara.

Other: B.A. in economics & M.A. in business analytics from Santa Clara. Father (Robert) was an NCAA umpire. Early in minor league career, drove for Uber in off-season & worked at Lululemon while living with parents in Littleton, CO. Made O.D. roster for SD in ’22 & pitched in post-season with Padres. Acquired from CWS 11/25 w/Yoendrys Gomez for Tanner Murray & Everson Pereira.

JOE BOYLE 6’8 RHP 8/14/99 MLB: 1.005

2026: Opening Day Roster for Tampa Bay before IL with R elbow strain after April 8th start vs. Chicago Cubs. Started rehab for May 6th. Is 0-1, 5.17 in 3gs with Rays. Optioned to Durham May 18.

Bio: 5th round (CIN) in 2020 from Notre Dame.

Other: Traded from CIN to OAK in July, 2023 (Sam Moll), then acquired by TB in Dec, 2024 for Jacob Lopez and Jeffrey Springs. Made MLB debut September 17, 2023 for Oakland. Split 2025 between Durham (8-4, 1.88 in 18g/17gs) and Tampa Bay (1-4, 4.67 in 13g/9gs)

KODI WHITLEY 6’3 RHP 2/21/95 MLB: 1.157

2026: Made Opening Day roster for Durham. Placed on injured list May 17th. Activated August 4th.

Bio: 27th round (STL) in 2017 from Mt Olive College

Other: Grew up in Clayton, NC, about an hour’s drive from DBAP. Made MLB debut on July 26, 2020 for St. Louis, appearing in 43 games over three seasons. Signed by Tampa Bay to minor league deal after release from St Louis as recovered from injury that cost him all of 2024 and half of 2025. Made Durham debut July 20, 2025.

CAM HILL 6’1 RHP 5/24/94 MLB: 1.112

2026: Made Durham opening day roster.

Bio: 17th round (CLE) in 2014 from Redlands CC (OK)

Other: Made MLB debut July 26, 2020 for Cleveland, appearing in 18 games (2-0, 4.91). Last affiliated game prior to 2026 with Durham was September 30, 2021 pitching for Columbus against Louisville. Induced out of retirement twice. Spent one season as a fill-in pitching coach for University of Illinois in 2024.

HAYDEN SNELSIRE 6’3 RHP 1/16/01 MLB: 0.000

2026: Started the season at Double-A Montgomery. Assigned to Durham on May 21. Made Triple-A debut 5/22 v Nash (2IP/2H/0R/1K). Returned to MTG May 26. Reassigned to Durham August 7.

Bio: 17th round (TB) in 2023 from Randolph-Macon.

Other: Was 3-1, 3.68 in 12 games with Montgomery (22IP/18H/9ER/4W/23K). Was 4-2, 2.97 at Bowling Green in 2025 mainly as a starter (22g/10gs). Only 3 MLB players have come through Randolph-Macon (Ashland, VA; Division III).

LOGAN WORKMAN 6’4 RHP 12/6/98 MLB: 0.000

2026: Made second straight Opening Day roster for Durham. Was Durham’s Opening Day starter in Charlotte.

Bio: 7th round (TB) in 2021 from Lee University (TN).
