The Round Rock Express and Tacoma Rainiers (Seattle Mariners) get set for the 2025 season opener on Friday night at 9:05 p.m. CT.

OPENING ON THE ROAD

Friday's season opener marks the first time the Express have opened a campaign on the road since 2019 (New Orleans). This is the farthest away from Dell Diamond (2,241 miles) that the E-Train have opened a season in the club's 25-season history. Prior to this season, their longest road trip to start a season came against the Iowa Cubs ('08, '12, '16 - 914 miles). This is only the 11th time they have opened a season on the road. They are 4-6 in Opening Day games on the road and they are 9-15 overall. They have lost their last three Opening Day games and five of the last six.

KEPT OUR ROOM KEYS

Round Rock finished last season in Tacoma 187 days ago. The E-Train dropped four of six games to finish the year. They went just 3-9 overall against the Rainiers. The two teams meet 15 times in 2025 with Tacoma coming to Dell Diamond June 24-29 and the Express come back to Tacoma July 22-27.

THE BIG CLUB

The Rangers fell in their 2025 opener yesterday at Globe Life Field by a final of 5-2 to the Boston Red Sox. Boston OF Wilyer Abreu blasted a three-run, ninth-inning homer to lift the Red Sox.

BOUSHLEY IS A BAD MAN

Round Rock RHP Caleb Boushley is set to take the baseball on Opening Night. The 31-year-old, Hortonville, Wisconsin native last took the mound on Opening Night on April 1, 2023 for the Nashville Sounds (Milwaukee Brewers). He went 3.0 innings while allowing one earned run on three hits with one walk and two strikeouts. The lone run was a solo home run from the rehabbing 1B Joey Votto of the Louisville Bats (Cincinnati Reds).

CARTER SET TO CRUSH

Express OF Evan Carter will open the season with Triple-A Round Rock. Carter appeared in just 45 games last year and missed Texas' final 108 contests after being placed on the Injured List on May 28 with a lower back injury. The 22-year-old Carter appeared in only seven games with Round Rock in 2023 before he was promoted to the big leagues. Carter turned in one of the most prolific postseasons ever by a rookie in 2023, batting .300/.417/.500/.917 (18-60) with one home run, nine doubles, six RBI, and 10 walks over 17 playoff contests while helping Texas win the World Series.

CRIM, FOSCUE, HARRIS, ORNELAS

The core of 1B Blaine Crim, INF Justin Foscue, OF Dustin Harris and INF Jonathan Ornelas have appeared in a combined 837 games with Round Rock since the start of the 2023 season. Crim leads the group with 280 games played since his promotion to Triple-A at the end of 2022. He is eight home runs away from joining the Express 50-homer club. Only six players have ever accomplished the feat.

HOME OPENER ON DECK

Round Rock gets set to open the 2025 home slate on Tuesday, April 1 against International League foe the Toledo Mud Hens (Detroit Tigers). RHP Dane Dunning is set to take the baseball.

EXPRESS MANAGER DOUG DAVIS

The 2025 season marks Round Rock Express Manager Doug Davis's third season with the E-Train. In 2024, Davis secured his 800th win as a manager on July 12 at Reno. In his first season with the Express in 2023, he guided the E-Train to a PCL Second Half title and the club's first playoff appearance since 2019. The team's 89 total wins were the most regular-season wins in franchise history and just the seventh 80-win campaign in club history. Davis oversaw the longest winning streak in franchise history when the Express won 14 consecutive games from August 8-23.

Prior to Round Rock, Davis spent two seasons as the manager for the Scranton Wilkes-Barre RailRiders, the New York Yankees Triple-A affiliate. Davis brings over 25 years of coaching experience to the Express dugout. Since he began coaching in 1995, he has led a minor league team for 10 total seasons and has accumulated a career 744-665 record. He spent the 2003-2004 seasons as the bench coach for the Florida Marlins, where he won the 2003 World Series.



In two seasons as the manager for Scranton Wilkes-Barre, Davis led the RailRiders to a combined record of 158-119. Last season, he helped oversee a pitching staff that led all Triple-A teams with a 3.89 ERA. Prior to his time as skipper, Davis spent three years in three different roles with Scranton Wilkes-Barre from 2017-2019. In 2017, he was the defensive coach before moving over to bullpen coach in 2018. In 2019, Davis was named the bench coach.

Before joining the New York Yankees organization, Davis spent 11 years in the Toronto Blue Jays system in a variety of roles. Before he was named manager of the RailRiders in 2021, Davis hadn't held a manager title since 2008. He has also been a minor league field coordinator for the Montreal Expos (2001) and Florida Marlins (2002, 2005). His coaching career began in the Yankees system in 1995.

A catcher and infielder in his playing days, Davis was a ninth-round selection by the California Angels in the 1984 MLB Draft. He played professionally for 11 seasons between the Angels, Rangers and Kansas City Royals organizations. He appeared in seven games in the big leagues and tallied six games in 1988 with the Angels, while appearing in one game for the Rangers in 1992. He is a native of Bloomsburg, Pennsylvania.

CAREER NOTES

- The 31-year-old Boushley (pronounced "BAHZ-lee") was signed by Texas to a minor league contract with a Major League camp invite on November 15.
- Spent the 2024 season in the Minnesota organization, making two relief appearances for the Twins (0-0, 4.50 ERA) while spending the duration of the season at Triple-A St. Paul.
- Pitched for the Milwaukee organization from 2022-23, including making his MLB debut on 9/29/23 vs. ChC (2.1 IP, H, R/ER, HR, 2 BB/1 IBB, 5 SO).
- Was originally selected by San Diego in the 33rd round of the 2017 MLB Draft from University of Wisconsin-La Crosse.
- Spent four seasons (2017-19, 2021) in the Padres chain before he was chosen in the Triple-A phase of the Rule 5 Draft by Milwaukee on 12/8/21.
- Owns a lifetime record of 48-37 with a 4.41 ERA (358 ER/730.0 IP) in 179 MLB games/120 starts.
- Is a native of Neenah, Wis.

2024 NOTES

- Made two relief appearances with Minnesota while spending balance of season with St. Paul (AAA), going 9-6 with a 5.23 ERA (78 ER/134.1 IP) in 26 games/starts for the Saints.
- Went 3-1 with a 4.00 ERA (12 ER/27.0 IP) and 30 strikeouts in five April starts with the Saints.
- Had his contract selected by Minnesota on 5/1 but was optioned on 5/2 without appearing.
- Made three more starts with St. Paul before being recalled by the Twins on 5/19 and appearing in relief on 5/20 at WAS (2.0 IP, 3 H, 2 R/ER, BB, SO).
