DOUBLEHEADER SPLIT: The Omaha Storm Chasers split a doubleheader with the Indianapolis Indians on Thursday at Victory Field, dropping Game One, 5-3, before rebounding to win Game Two, 6-2. **1B Nick Pratto** drove in six runs between the two games thanks to a home run in each game, while **1B Vinnie Pasquantino** collected his first Triple-A hits, going 3-for-6 with an RBI double. **LHP Austin Cox** struck out four and did not issue a walk in his season debut as the Game One starter and **RHP Jonathan Heasley** struck out four across 3.0 innings of one-run ball in his Triple-A debut as the Game Two starter. **OF Brewer Hicklen** collected hits in each game to extend his season-opening hitting streak to three games, batting .333 (3-for-9) overall.

PRATTO POWER: **1B/DH Nick Pratto** homered in each end of Thursday's doubleheader, smacking a 429-ft., three-run home run in Game One before blasting a 426-ft., solo home run in Game Two. His home runs—which were also his first hits of the season—combined to travel 855 feet. Pratto became the second player in the Storm Chasers era (2011-pres.) to homer in both games of doubleheader, joining **Anderson Miller**, who did so on July 17, 2021, in a doubleheader against Indianapolis at Victory Field. Overall, Pratto combined to go 3-for-8 with two home runs and six RBIs between the two games.

BULLPEN BRILLIANCE: Through three games, the Storm Chasers bullpen has combined for 1.64 ERA (2 ER) across 11.0 combined innings with 17 strikeouts and six walks. **LHP Sam Freeman**, **RHP Jose Cuas**, and **RHP Arodys Vizcaino** combined for 3.1 hitless and scoreless innings and four strikeouts on Tuesday, **LHP Foster Griffin** threw 2.0 scoreless innings with three strikeouts in Game One on Thursday, and **RHP Colten Brewer**, **RHP Domingo Tapia**, and **RHP Jace Vines** combined for 3.0 hitless and scoreless innings and seven strikeouts in Game Two on Thursday.

FEELIN' 2022: 2022 marks the 11th season of Storm Chasers baseball (2011-pres.) and the 53rd season in franchise history (1969-pres.). Since 1969, 1,314 players have appeared in either an American Association, Pacific Coast League, or Triple-A East game. Of those 1,314 players, 985 (75%) have appeared in a Major League game. 310 players in franchise history (24%) made their debut with Omaha prior to their Major League debut.

THE MIGHTY THOR: **Scott Thorman** embarks on his first season as the manager of the Omaha Storm Chasers, taking over for **Brian Poldberg**, who retired from managing following the 2021 season. Thorman, who played for Omaha in 2009 and 2010, is the 19th manager in franchise history and the sixth Omaha manager to have previously played for the franchise. He has won Minor League titles in each of the last three seasons, winning with Double-A Northwest Arkansas in 2021, High-A Wilmington in 2019, and Low-A Lexington in 2018. Thorman, 40, was drafted by the Atlanta Braves in the first round (30th overall) of the 2000 MLB Draft and later made his Major League debut with Atlanta on June 18, 2006. A Kitchener, Ontario, Canada, native, Thorman began his coaching career in 2014 as the bench coach for the Burlington Royals under manager **Tommy Shields**, who serves as the Storm Chasers' bench coach in 2022.

FOR OMAHA: **RHP Daniel Mengden** makes his Royals' organization debut and his season debut after signing with Kansas City as a minor league free agent on March 10. Mengden spent the 2021 season pitching for the KIA Tigers in the KBO, posting a 3.60 ERA across 120.0 innings in 21 starts with 104 strikeouts and 35 walks. Mengden enters 2022 with 60 career Major League outings (48 career starts)—all with Oakland from 2016-2020—recording a career 4.64 ERA in 302.2 career innings with 224 strikeouts and 102 walks. A 29-year-old from Houston, Texas, Mengden was originally drafted in the fourth round (106th overall) of the 2014 MLB Draft by the Houston Astros out of Texas A&M University.

FOR INDIANAPOLIS: **RHP Chase De Jong** makes his season debut with Indianapolis, opening the season with the Indians for the second straight year. De Jong made four starts for Indianapolis in 2021, posting a 3.60 ERA in 20.0 innings with 28 strikeouts and eight walks before being called up by Pittsburgh. The 28-year-old made nine starts with the Pirates, recording a 5.77 ERA in 43.2 innings before suffering a season-ending left knee injury and undergoing surgery in July of 2021 to repair damaged cartilage that coats the medial femoral condyle.

DOPPLER RADAR: **SS/3B Bobby Witt Jr.** (2021), who entered 2022 as the No. 1 prospect in baseball per MLB Pipeline, made his Major League debut with Kansas City on April 7 at Kauffman Stadium against Cleveland, collecting a go-ahead, RBI double in the eighth inning for his first Major League hit. **RHP Collin Snider** (2021), who made the Royals' Opening Day roster, is poised to make his Major League debut upon his first appearance. The same goes for **INF Lucius Fox** (2021), who was named to the Washington Nationals' Opening Day roster.
