NEWS AND NOTES

PANNONE BUMP DAY: LHP Thomas Pannone will make his third overall appearance of the season and his second start when he takes the mound to start the series against Norfolk. Through his first two games of the 2026 season, Pannone has yet to surrender a run over 6.2 IP while allowing just five hits. He has one previous appearance against Norfolk when he worked 6.2 IP and allowed one run with 10 strikeouts and two walks allowed on June 22, 2023.

REHAB REINFORCEMENTS: OF Jackson Chourio and INF Andrew Vaughn are scheduled to begin rehab assignments with Nashville on Wednesday night. Chourio was placed on the 10-day IL on March 25 after suffering a fracture in his left hand. Vaughn was placed on the IL two days after Chourio, landing on the 10-day IL with a left hamate fracture. Vaughn appeared in 16 games with Nashville in 2025 following a trade from the Chicago White Sox. Vaughn hit .259 with three homers, three doubles, and a triple, with 16 RBI. Chourio's last appearance with Nashville was a five-game rehab assignment from August 22-27, 2025. He's appeared in 11 total games with Nashville since the start of the 2023 season.

POWER HOUR: Luis Lara hit just two home runs in 136 games played with Double-A Biloxi during the 2025 season. The Brewers no. 11-rated prospect matched that total through his first five games of this season with Nashville. He entered Sunday's finale sitting on four home runs through his first 25 Triple-A games after hitting a solo homer on Saturday night to match his previous single-season career-high that he hit with High-A Wisconsin during the 2024 season in 110 games. His solo home run in Sunday's finale not only helped set a new single-season career-high, but it was also the first time in his professional career with a home run in back-to-back games. He entered the season with just 10 total professional home runs over his first four seasons (391 games) and sits here at the end of April with five home runs through his first 26 games in Triple-A.

GOTTA HEND IT TO YA: Logan Henderson worked a season-high 5.0 IP on the mound and allowed one run on five hits. It was just the second run the Brewers no. 6-rated prospect has allowed this season in Triple-A. He now owns a 1.02 ERA through his first 17.2 IP. The nine strikeouts from Henderson on Sunday set a new Triple-A career-high and were his most in a game since he struck out nine during his Major League debut on April 20, 2025, vs. the Athletics.

Sunday's relief appearance was just the third of his professional career, and he is now 3-0 with a 1.50 ERA over 12.0 IP out of the bullpen with 19 strikeouts and two walks allowed. The 5.0 IP on Sunday was the most he had ever gone out of the bullpen, surpassing his previous career-high of 4.0 IP from May 8, 2025, vs. Norfolk. Both of his wins this season have come against Charlotte.

BY THE NUMBERS: Nashville set new offensive single-game highs in runs, hits, extra-base hits, and home runs against Charlotte last Saturday night. The 12 runs scored in the first game topped the previous high (9) which the Sounds had done twice. The 15 hits Nashville had in game one also set a new single-game high in 2026, topping the 13 hits the team had on March 28th at Norfolk and most recently April 9 at Gwinnett. The six XBH (3 2B, 3 HR) in game two set a new season-high after tying the previous high (5) in game one. The Sounds racked up 24 total XBH last week at Truist Field. 17 of Nashville's 22 total home runs on the season have come off Charlotte pitching, including 12 during the seven-game series last week after entering the week with just 10 total home runs on the season through the first 20 games.
