YESTERDAY: The Flying Squirrels lost to the RubberDucks, 10-1, to open the series. Akron took a 3-0 lead in the second inning with a two-run triple by Jake Fox and an RBI groundout by Alex Mooney. In the fourth, the 'Ducks issued three walks to load the bases before **Drew Cavanaugh** was hit by a pitch to bring in Richmond's only run. In the sixth, Angel Genao hit a grand slam to push the Akron lead to 7-1. Joe Lampe hit an RBI triple and scored on a groundout by Tyreese Turner in the ninth to extend the lead to 10-1.

TODAY'S GAME: The Flying Squirrels play the second of a six-game series against the Akron RubberDucks, Double-A affiliate of the Cleveland Guardians. Richmond is in fourth place in the Southwest Divisions second-half standings, 2.5 games behind Akron, 2.5 games behind Harrisburg and 4.5 games behind Altoona. The RubberDucks swept a three-game series at The Diamond to open the season in April. Richmond went 1-5 at Akron from April 22-27 and 5-1 at Canal Park from July 8-13.

PACKING THE HOUSE: This season the Flying Squirrels are averaging 6,584 fans per home game, which leads Double-A and ranks seventh among all 120 MiLB clubs. Their average of 7,290 in the season's first month was the highest April attendance in franchise history. Last year, the Flying Squirrels led all 30 Double-A teams in average (6,595) and total (435,295) attendance. Among the 120 MiLB teams, the Flying Squirrels were 10th in average attendance. It was the third straight year the Flying Squirrels led all 30 Double-A clubs in average and total attendance, which had not been done prior to 2022. Last year's total attendance was the highest since 2013 (434,769) and the fourth-highest average in team history.

THE FLYING SQUIRRELS are in fourth place in the Southwest Division second-half standings, 4.5 games behind first-place Altoona. They split last week's series in Bowie against the Baysox. After going 10-2 from July 4-20, they dropped six-of-seven from July 22-30 before going 11-12 in their last 23 games dating back to August 1. Of Richmond's 72 losses this season, 40 of them have been by two runs or less (24 by one, 16 by two). Their 24 one-run losses are tied for the most in the EL, even with Reading.

THE RUBBERDUCKS are tied for second place in the Southwest Division second-half standings, two games behind first-place Altoona. The RubberDucks split last week's series against the Fisher Cats after winning five-of-six the previous week at Reading. Akron's roster features four players ranked in Baseball America's top-30 Guardians prospects, including SS Angel Genao (No. 2), RHP Khal Stephen (No. 6), C Jacob Cozart (No. 18) and LHP Josh Hartle (No. 27). MLB.com's top-30 Guardians prospects list features five Akron players, including Genao (No. 3), Stephen (No. 7), OF Alfonsin Rosario (No. 13), Cozart (No. 18) and Hartle (No. 25).

FOR RICHMOND: Left-hander **Joe Whitman** makes his 23rd start of the season and his fourth against the RubberDucks. He last pitched last Thursday on the road against the Baysox and allowed four runs over five innings with six strikeouts. In the Eastern League this year, Whitman ranks third in K/9 (9.94), third in K% (25.4%) and tied for sixth in strikeouts (109). On May 3, Whitman threw six perfect innings against the Patriots at The Diamond, retiring all 18 batters he faced, and set a then-career high with 10 strikeouts. He was named Eastern League Pitcher of the Week on May 5. In his first full professional season last year, Whitman split the year between Low-A San Jose and High-A Eugene, going 3-8 with a 4.63 ERA in 23 starts. He finished the year ranked ninth in the Giants organization in strikeouts (108) and tied for ninth in games started. Whitman was selected in the second round of the 2023 MLB Draft by the Giants out of Kent State, where he was the MAC Pitcher of the Year that season. Before transferring to Kent State near his hometown of Akron, Ohio, Whitman pitched at Purdue. Entering 2025, Whitman was ranked by Baseball America as the No. 8 Giants prospect and No. 7 by MLB.com. **For more on Whitman, see page two.**

FOR AKRON: Right-hander Yorman Gómez makes his sixth Double-A start and first against the Flying Squirrels. He last pitched last Thursday against Fisher Cats and allowed one run over five innings. He began the season with High-A Lake County and went 8-0 with a 2.84 ERA in 17 outings (six starts). Gómez signed with Cleveland in July 2019.

DON'T RUN ON RICHMOND: The Flying Squirrels' catching unit of **Adrián Sugastey**, **Zach Morgan**, **Onil Perez** and **Drew Cavanaugh** have combined to catch 65 stolen base attempts this season, which first among the 30 Double-A teams and leads the Eastern League. Sugastey leads all Double-A catchers with 45 runners caught stealing. Sugastey has set a franchise record for the most caught stealing in a season in Flying Squirrels history, passing **Jackson Williams'** mark of 35 set in 2015 with his 36th on July 26 against Portland. For his career with Richmond, Sugastey's 58 runners caught stealing for his career is second-most in franchise history. He is one behind the Flying Squirrels career record of 59, set by Williams (2010-11, '15).

BERI BOMBS: **Victor Bericoto** hit his 11th homer of the season last Friday night, which leads all Richmond players for the year. It was the 33rd homer of his Flying Squirrels career, which is tied for second-most in team history with **Jacob Heyward** (2019, '21-22) and four behind **Ricky Oropesa's** (2013-16) franchise record of 37. Bericoto now has 130 career RBIs with Richmond, trailing only Oropesa's record of 165. In 21 August games, Bericoto is batting .286 (20-for-70) with three homers, two doubles, 12 walks and 13 RBIs.

KING OF THE HILL: In his last 21 games since July 30, **Turner Hill** is batting .318 (21-for-66) with four doubles, 10 walks, a homer, seven RBIs and 11 runs scored. On August 9 at Erie, he tied his Double-A career high with four hits and set a Double-A career high with three runs scored. He had three hits in the series opener at Chesapeake on Tuesday and drove in the go-ahead run in a 4-2 win on Saturday night with a sixth-inning single.

CROES CONTROL: Since joining the Flying Squirrels on August 5, **Dayson Croes** is batting .352 (19-for-54) with a homer, two doubles, a triple, nine RBIs and five walks in 15 games. He hit a two-run single in his Double-A debut on August 6 at Erie. On Thursday against the Curve, he picked up three hits, including his first Double-A homer. Croes is the first player in Flying Squirrels history born in Aruba. He played four seasons at NCAA DII Quincy before spending two seasons with the Winnipeg Goldeyes of the independent American Association, where he hit .347 in 187 games. Croes signed with the Giants on April and played nine games in the Arizona Complex League before spending 47 games with High-A Eugene.

SECOND-HALF SABIN: In his last 10 games since August 9, **Sabin Ceballos** is batting .353 (12-for-34) with two homers, four doubles and 10 RBIs. For the season, he is tied for the team lead with 39 RBIs. On August 13 against the Curve, Ceballos hit a two-run homer in the first inning and matched his season high with four RBIs. On Saturday night at Chesapeake, he had two hits, including a solo homer in the second inning. In his last 33 games since July 3, Ceballos is batting .281 (32-for-114) with four homers, eight doubles and 19 RBIs.

TAKE A WALK: **Diego Velasquez** has worked 62 walks this year, which is tied for third-most in a season in Flying Squirrels franchise history, tied with Jarrett Parker and Mark Minicozzi's previous franchise records for the 2023 season. Jacob Heyward set a new record with 80 walks in 2019 and Hayden Cantrelle moved into second on the list with 66 walks in 2023. Velasquez is tied for fourth in the Eastern League in walks this season.

IN THE LEAGUE LEADERS: In the Eastern League, **Diego Velasquez** is ranked tied for fourth in hits (105), tied for fourth in walks (62) and eighth in OBP (.360). **Turner Hill** is tied for sixth in triples (5). **John Michael Bertrand** is second in innings pitched (119.2), third in ERA (2.93), eighth in BAA (.252) and eighth in WHIP (1.35). **Jack Choate** is fifth in strikeouts (114). **Joe Whitman** is sixth in strikeouts (109). **Tyler Myrick** is tied for first in saves (10).

TOP SKIPPER: Flying Squirrels manager **Dennis Pelfrey** has led the team to 247 wins in his career, which is a new franchise record all-time wins record for a manager. He passed the record with Richmond's 6-1 win at Binghamton on May 23. From 2011-2013, **Dave Machemer** won 216 games as Richmond's manager, leading the team to the Eastern League postseason for in 2011. Pelfrey, who has been with Richmond since the 2022 season, led the team to back-to-back postseason appearances for the first time in franchise history in 2022 and 2023. He also managed the 2021 Eugene Emeralds to the High-A West championship.

PROSPECT WATCH: Richmond's roster features four players are ranked in Baseball America's top-30 Giants prospects, including **Bo Davidson** (No. 3), **Diego Velasquez** (No. 10), **Joe Whitman** (No. 11) and **Jack Choate** (No. 30). **John Michael Bertrand** is rated as having the best control in the Giants system. **Adrian Sugastey** is ranked as the top defensive catcher. **Aeverso Arteaga** is rated as the best defensive infielder and best infield arm. MLB.com's top-30 Giants prospects list features three Richmond players, including Davidson (No. 5), Whitman (No. 14) and Velasquez (No. 21).

THIS DATE IN RICHMOND BASEBALL HISTORY

1956: The Richmond Virginians beat the Miami Marlins, 2-0, at Parker Field. Vees manager Eddie Lopat started on the mound threw a complete-game shutout and held Miami to six hits, all singles. Facing Miami starter Seth Morehead, who led the International League in strikeouts at the time, Richmond took a 1-0 lead in the first on a bases-loaded sacrifice fly by Bill Renna. Cal Neeman followed with an RBI double for a 2-0 lead. **1970:** The Richmond Braves beat the Syracuse Chiefs, 6-5, at Parker Field. Richmond led early, 2-0, before tying with runs in the fourth and fifth. In the eighth, Bobby Cox gave the Chiefs the lead with a two-run homer in the seventh before another run in the eighth. Richmond scored three unearned runs in the eighth to erase a 5-2 deficit. In the bottom of the ninth, Ralph Garr led off with a double, his third hit of the game and came in to score on a walk-off single by Darrell Evans. **1974:** The Richmond Braves beat the Charleston Charlies, 4-1, in the second game of a doubleheader to clinch a spot in the International League's playoffs for the first time since 1967. **1993:** The Richmond Braves beat the Toledo Mud Hens, 10-3, at The Diamond. Richmond had lost nine of 12 entering the game and slid into third place in the IL West, out of a potential postseason spot. In the bottom of the second inning, Chipper Jones was ruled out at home plate attempting to score, slammed his helmet and was ejected for arguing. Jones said he touched home plate twice before being tagged and also said it was the first time he had ever been ejected in his life. Grady Little came out and the first base umpire Dick Fossa began pointing in Little's face. Little began pointing back and was ejected. Kevin Mitchell had two hits, including a homer, and drove in four runs. Ryan Klesko went 3-for-5 with a double and two RBIs. **1999:** The Richmond Braves beat the Durham Bulls, 5-4, at The Diamond. Steve Sisco opened a 1-0 lead with a homer in the first before Steve Cox tied the score for Durham with a solo homer in the fourth. Howard Battle hit a two-run homer in the fifth for a 3-1 lead. Durham rallied to take a 4-3 lead in the top of the ninth inning. Brad Tyler worked a bases-loaded walk in the bottom of the ninth to tie the game, 4-4. In the bottom of the 10th, Sisco won the game with a walk-off single. **2014:** Mario Lison hit his 18th homer of the season in Altoona, tying Jarrett Parker's single-season record. **2016:** The Flying Squirrels beat the Akron RubberDucks, 13-3, at Canal Park. Richmond scored 12 runs in the fifth inning, setting a new franchise record and also set the record for most hits in an inning with nine. Christian Arroyo had a homer.
