Tonight's Game

The Clippers will send RHP **Kevin Herget** to the mound tonight, as they try to improve to 2-0 on Tansky Tuesday Dime-A-Dog Night. St. Paul will counter with RHP **Chandler Shepherd**. The Clippers are 18-17 (.514) against right handers this year. Shepherd has pitched against the Clippers six times in his career, all with Pawtucket ('16-19), going 0-1 with a 7.90ERA (13.2IP, 20H, 12R, 12ER, 5BB, 14K).

vs. the Saints

Tonight will mark the first ever matchup between the Clippers and the St. Paul Saints. In 2019, Columbus split the season series against the baby Twins with Rochester, 3-3, after having won 2018, 4-2 (outscored by a combined 57-39 from 2018-19, as the Clippers went 6-1 in 1-run games). The series win over Rochester in 2018 was the first for Columbus since 2015.

Turning a Corner

After starting the season 5-1, the Clippers went 4-18 from 5/12-6/5 (worst 22G stretch since 4-18 from 6/13-7/4/09), but have rebounded to go 10-3. The Clippers are hitting .270 (37x137) with runners in scoring position in the last 13 (.180, 34x189 in the 22G prior) and have scored at least four runs in 11 of 13 (had at least four runs once in previous nine; 9-run inning in 13-9 loss vs. Nashville on 5/28).

Pummeled Pitching

Huntington Park has zoomed back to the top of the IL in homers per game (3.33), following 39HR in the last 10G. Unfortunately, 25 of those 39 have been surrendered by Columbus (145HR allowed in last 71G in the regular season at HP). Almost 22% of hits allowed at home have left the yard (37 of 169), the highest rate in the IL (led the league in 2019, as 20.4% of hits allowed at HP were homers).

Cursed at the Top

Heading into 6/4, Clipper leadoff hitters were hitting an IL-worst .198. **Oscar Mercado** took over leadoff duties that day, hitting .311 (19x61) in 15G (leadoff now .234, 11th). Wednesday, he scored three runs, marking the first multi-run game for a leadoff man this year (21 runs scored by leadoff, fewest in the IL). He left the game Sunday after getting hit in the face by an **Angel De Jesus** pitch.

Take Two

The double from **Gabriel Arias** Sunday was the 88th of the season for Columbus (leads IL; **Oscar Mercado** and **Nolan Jones** are tied for the individual lead, 13). As a team, the Clippers have doubled in 26 straight games and 40 of 41 on the year (went doubleless in 25 games during 2019, eight times in first 41). Columbus is averaging almost three doubles a game in the last 12 (33).

Hammering Gimenez

Andres Gimenez homered in each of six games from 6/13-6/19, after never having homered in consecutive games in his career (**Fernando Seguinol** homered in five straight from 6/30-7/4/03, previous long in the Anthony Slosser Era, 2003-21). Prior to his surge, Gimenez laid down three sac bunts over four games from 6/6-6/9 (3-0 when Gimenez executes a sac bunt, 6-1 when he homers).

Work to Do

Owen Miller returned to Columbus last Tuesday after a three week stint in Cleveland (5x46, 23K). At the time of his first ever promotion to the Big Leagues, Miller ranked 3rd in batting in the IL at .406 (26x64). He is 14PA short of qualifying for the batting title and adding them as hitless at bats would place him in 9th. Miller has four hitless games since his return (6G; had four hitless in 16G prior).

Swinging Hard

The Clippers have two among the top three in the IL in strikeouts, as **Daniel Johnson** and **Nolan Jones** are tied for 3rd (53K). Friday night marked the 34th game that the pair has played with each other and the first in which neither of them struck out (first time both had multi-hit games, second time both had homers). Saturday night, both batters put the ball in play every at bat again.

Bringing it Home

Connor Marabell reached base in nine of 10 on the roadtrip, batting .387 (12x31). That hot trip bumped his career average on the road in the IL to .300 (42x140), compared to a dismal .174 (23x132) in Huntington Park. However, Marabell put forth back to back multi-hit games on 6/15 and 6/16 (three multi-hit games in HP career prior) and is hitting .364 (8x22) on the home stand (now .201 in HP career).

This Date in Clipper History

6/22/1987

Darren Reed hit 3HR for the 2nd time in four games in a 13-6 win at Pawtucket. Long balls by **Orestes Destrade**, **Pete Dalena** and **Jeff Moronko** gave the Clippers six in the game, establishing a team record that would stand for over 14 years before a quartet of Clippers would hit 7HR on 7/31/01 vs. Richmond. In Clipper history, Reed's 3HR game is a feat that has been accomplished 12 times.

Huntington (Small) Park

In each of the first 11 years since the move downtown, Huntington Park has ranked among the top two in the IL in homers per game, totaling 2.25 per contest (1,763HR, 783 games). In 2019, HP averaged over three per game for the first time ever (seventh time averaging over a pair), as the Clippers surrendered a record 127HR and just missed out on triple digits themselves (97HR was second highest team total). Including the postseason, the Clippers have been out-homered over the life of the park (960 to 917).

Record Destruction

The Clippers broke the established mark for homers in a season (182 in 1983) on 8/7/19 and finished with a total of 213 (most in the IL). From 5/14-6/2, they homered in 20 straight games (44HR total) and they had seven straight multi-HR games from 6/14-6/21 (22HR). On the mound, they broke the record for homers allowed (156 in 1998) on 7/31/19, giving up 198 for the year (2nd most in the IL).

Ain't Over 'Til It's Over

From 2014-19, no team had more come from behind victories than the 210 posted by Columbus and no team produced a better winning percentage when trailing than the .353 of the Clippers (Scranton/WB was 2nd in win percentage, .338, and wins, 192). This year has seen the Clippers go 9-22 (.290) in games in which they trail, ranking 10th.

Get What You Pay For

Columbus is the only team in the IL that has yet to play any free baseball this season, having played 81 straight games, including the postseason, since their last extra-inning rumble (7/31/19 vs. Louisville, an 11-8 loss in 11; only extra inning loss of the season, 8-1). Over the past 20 seasons, the longest the Clippers had previously gone between extras was 57 games from 8/12/08-5/17/09 (37 to start '09 season was longest stretch to begin in last 20 seasons). That streak ended with consecutive extra inning games.

Trending Downward

The current staff ERA of 5.41 is on pace to be the worst in franchise history (5.08, 1983) and anything over 4.71 will mark the fifth straight season in which the ERA has gotten worse. From 2011-16, the Clipper staff turned in a sub-4.00ERA five times in six seasons (zero such seasons from 1993-2010), including the best two ERAs of the past 32 years (3.33 in 2015 and 3.65 in 2016). The 6.50ERA at Huntington Park is by far the worst ever (5.29 in 2019, only time ERA has ever been over 5.00 at HP).

Doing Damage

In 2019, the Clippers ranked tied for 5th in the IL with 112RBI with the bases loaded, while carrying a .252 average (10th, 36x143, 4HR). In both 2017 and 2018, the Clippers led the IL in RBI with the bases loaded (243RBI total) and paced the circuit in grand slams (16 total, no other team had more than eight).

Free Swingers

After three straight seasons leading the IL in strikeouts, the Clipper lineup is threatening for a fourth, as they currently rank 5th (406K, 35 off the pace, St. Paul). The 2019 squad obliterated the franchise record, as they struck out 95 more times than the previous high (1,392; each of last three seasons rank among franchise's three worst, totalling 3,979K in 422G). While the record appears safe due to the truncated schedule, this year's version is averaging 9.90K per game.

That's More Like It

In 2019, the Clippers were 50-30 (.625) when playing errorless baseball, while turning in a 31-29 (.517) mark with at least one error. Contrary to logic, in 2018 they actually had a worse winning percentage when playing mistake free (.514), than when committing at least one error (.530). The Clipper defense finished 1st in 2019 (.983) after falling to 6th in the IL in 2018, ending a run of three consecutive seasons ranked among the top three (2015-17 resulted in the three best seasons in franchise history).

One On, No Out Success

When the leadoff batter of an inning reached base in 2019, the Clippers plated him nearly 60% of the time (over 51% only once in the last six seasons, 55% in 2016). Getting more than one base was a specialty of Clipper hitters, as they led the IL with 136XBH to lead off the inning, including 54HR (led the IL, had 28 leadoff homers in 2018). From 4/13-4/20/19, the Clippers hit 16 leadoff doubles over 72 innings, including four straight innings in a win at Louisville on 4/15/19.

Good Baseball

Andres Gimenez advanced a runner with a sac bunt on 6/10 at Iowa and the runner came around to score in the win (3-0 when advanced runner scores). During 2019, the Clippers struggled in the bunt department, but when the advanced runners scored, they were 7-1. During 2018, Columbus was 23-2 in games in which a run was scored after a good bunt attempt.

International Accolades

Bobby Bradley was named International League Player of the Month for May 2019, reaching base in 24 of 25 games during the month while hitting .302/.374/.740 with 12HR (led IL) and 28RBI. **Brandon Barnes**, **Eric Haase**, **Josh Smith** and **Asher Wojciechowski** were named to the 2019 IL All-Star Team and Bradley, Barnes and Haase were selected to the postseason squad.

Manager Profile

Andy Tracy makes his Clippers debut in 2021, following **Tony Mansolino's** championship rookie year in 2019 (sixth Clipper skipper to win Governors' Cup in first season; **Gene Michael**-'79, **Joe Altobelli**-'80, **Frank Verdi**-'81, **Bucky Dent**-'87 and **Mike Sarbaugh**-'10). This season marks Tracy's second year as a manager (first with Williamsport in the Philadelphia system), as he holds a career record of 49-68 (.419), 19-22 with Columbus (.463).

Returning Champion:

Though 5/26 marked Herget's International League debut, he had pitched in Huntington Park once before, as a member of the Memphis Redbirds against the Durham Bulls in the 2018 Triple-A National Championship (W, 14-5). Herget started and picked up the win for Memphis (5.1IP, 5H, 2R, 2ER, 0BB, 4K), outdueling future Clipper **Chih-Wei Hu** (2019).

That Was Fast:

Starting the season with Fargo-Moorhead in the American Association, Herget made only one start, on 5/19 vs. Cleburne (W, 7.0IP, 3H, 1R, 1ER, 1BB, 10K), before Cleveland signed him to a minor league deal on 5/25. While Herget became the first RedHawk to play for Columbus, six former Clippers have suited up for Fargo-Moorhead: **Jalal Leach**, **Mike Figga**, **Randall Simon**, **Donzell McDonald**, **Yurendell de Caster** and **Yhoxian Medina**.
