RHP SHAUN ANDERSON (0-1, 7.20) vs. LHP AUSTIN GOMBER (0-1, 4.50)

TODAY'S GAME: The Isotopes and Bees meet for game two of the series after Salt Lake won the opener last night, 15-1 ... Rockies left-hander Austin Gomber is expected to make his second rehab start of the year while Shaun Anderson is slated to start for the Bees.

VEEN: Zac Veen singled in the first inning last night, extending his hit streak to begin the season to four games (5x14) ... Over 25 games with the Isotopes, including 21 in 2024, he is slashing .240/.305/.479 with five doubles, six homers, 15 RBI and six stolen bases.

HOME OPENER: Albuquerque dropped to 14-8 in home openers, and have lost five of their last six. They are 2-2 when facing Salt Lake to start the home schedule, winning in 2017 and 2023, while losing in 2019 and 2025.

TWO OR FEWER: The Isotopes won Sunday's game against Sacramento 2-1, the first time since September 24, 2023, vs. Oklahoma City, the 2023 season finale (2-1), the club has won a game when scoring two runs or fewer.

WHAT'S COOLER THAN BEING COOL?: It was 51 degrees at first pitch last night, making this the third coldest Home Opener in team history (behind 43° in 2023 and 48° in 2008). Yesterday also marked the windiest first home game for the Isotopes, as it registered at 32 miles per hour (surpassing 31 mph in 2008).

TALKIN BOUT LAST NIGHT: Prior to last night, the Isotopes most lopsided loss in a Home Opener was April 4, 2019, when they fell 11-4 to Salt Lake (also the most runs allowed).

FIVE-HIT GAME: Scott Kingery's five-hit game yesterday was the first such performance by an opposing player since Max Muncy on Aug. 4, 2024 at Las Vegas. Four opposing hitters had five hits against the Isotopes last season, including Brett Sullivan (El Paso) in the home opener.

TAKE YOUR BASE: The Isotopes issued a double-digit amount of walks for the 39th time in team history last night (11), and 22 of the instances have taken place since the start of 2019.

HOME SWEET HOME?: Albuquerque has been outscored 38-5 over their last three home games. They dropped the final two contests of 2024 to Las Vegas by 12-3 and 13-1 finals on Sept. 14-15, respectively.

SERIES OPENER: Last night marked Salt Lake's first victory in a series-opening game at Isotopes Park since July 27, 2019 (six sets since then).

ITTER: Ryan Ritter collected his first Triple-A multi-hit game of the season yesterday with two singles ... He has a hit in two of the three contests he's played.

MISCUES: The Isotopes committed two errors last night after entering Tuesday as one of only five Triple-A teams without a miscue in 2025.

BIG INNING: The Isotopes allowed nine runs in the eighth inning last night, the most runs surrendered since relenting seven to Las Vegas in the opening frame on Sept. 13, 2024.

HITS ALLOWED: Albuquerque permitted 16 hits last night, the most allowed since Sept. 14, 2024, vs. Las Vegas (18).

OPENING SERIES: Albuquerque has lost the first series of the year for the second-straight season ... The Isotopes look to avoid losing the first two series of the year for the second-straight season.

PROSPECTS: Nine players on MLB.com's top 30 Rockies prospects list begin the year with Albuquerque: Chase Dollander, Yanquiel Fernandez, Adael Amador, Zac Veen, Carson Palmquist, Ryan Ritter, Sterlin Thompson, Jaden Hill, Zach Agnos.

MLB EXPERIENCE: The Opening Day roster features 13 players who have seen time in the Major Leagues. Diego Castillo has registered the most MLB service time (4 year, 169 days).

HITTING COACH: Jordan Pacheco, entering his fourth season with the club, is the longest tenured Isotopes hitting coach, surpassing Steve Phillips (2006-08).

PITCHING COACH: Chris Michalak, entering his third season in the role, is the second-longest tenured Isotopes pitching in club history (longest: Glenn Dishman, 2010-14).

2025 FIRST-HALF SCHEDULE: The Isotopes will face seven teams over the 75 games in the first half, which ends June 22 ... Sacramento is the lone club Albuquerque will play just once in the first half ... The Isotopes also won't play Round Rock or Las Vegas in the first half.

SALT LAKE TIES: Bees pitchers Michael Petersen (2023) and Dakota Hudson (2024) have each spent time in an Isotopes uniform ... Salt Lake right-hander Chase Silseth hails from Farmington and was named Gatorade New Mexico Player of the Year in 2018 after his senior year at Piedra Vista High School ... Isotopes infielder Keston Hiura played in 37 games for the Bees last season, blasting 20 home runs with 42 RBI.

NUCLEI NOTES

SKIPPER: Pedro Lopez enters his 21st year as a minor league manager and third guiding the Isotopes. He is the eighth manager in club history ... Spent 2021 as Albuquerque's hitting coach and 2022 as its bench coach ... Notched his 1,000th career managerial victory June 4, 2023 at Salt Lake, 7-1 ... Managed in the Texas Rangers (2001-05, 2007) and New York Mets (2011-19) organizations while claiming the 2014 Eastern League Championship with Double-A Binghamton. Lopez was drafted in the 21st round by the San Diego Padres in the 1988 MLB Draft and spent 13 years in the minor leagues, reaching Triple-A on four occasions.

HOMETOWN KID: Jordan Pacheco begins his fourth season as the Isotopes hitting coach ... An Albuquerque native and 2004 graduate of La Cueva High School, Pacheco then attended the University of New Mexico (2005-07), where he was one of the most prolific offensive players in school history (.384, 59 2B, 25 HR, 145 RBI) ... Drafted by Rockies in the 9th round in 2007 and made his MLB debut with Colorado in 2011.

CHRIS MICHALAK: Begins his third season as Isotopes pitching coach ... Pitched for the Albuquerque Dukes in 2000, followed by stints with the Isotopes in 2004 and 2008 ... Started second-to-last game in Dukes history, giving up two runs in 6.0 innings during Game 4 of a PCL First Round playoff series at Memphis Sept. 9, 2000 ... Appeared in 61 Major League games (24 starts) over five seasons with the Arizona Diamondbacks (1998), Toronto Blue Jays (2001) Texas Rangers (2001-02) and Cincinnati Reds (2006) ... 12th round selection by the Athletics in 1993 ... Has been in the coaching ranks since 2009, including stops as the pitching coach for the Hagerstown Suns (2010-11), Potomac Nationals (2012-13) and Harrisburg Senators (2014-17). He was also the Minor League pitching coordinator for the Miami Marlins from 2018-20 and coached in the Washington Nationals organization from 2021-22.

MICHAEL RYAN: Enters his second year with the Rockies organization as the Isotopes bench coach ... The former outfielder played in 33 games for the Isotopes and hit nine homers during the 2008 campaign. He and Michalak were teammates on that squad for four days in late July ... Entered the coaching ranks in 2012 as a coach for the Double-A Altoona Curve (Pirates). He then managed in the Pirates organization at three levels for seven seasons with stops at Single-A West Virginia (2013-14), High-A Bradenton (2015-16) and Double-A Altoona (2017-19), while winning the Florida State League in 2016 and Eastern League in 2017. Ryan compiled a 221-197 managerial record with Altoona—the most wins for a manager in Curve history ... He also managed in the Cubs organization (High-A South Bend, 2021 and Double-A Tennessee, 2022-June 2023) ... A 5th round draft pick by the Minnesota Twins in 1996, played in 149 MLB games over parts of five seasons with the Twins (2002-05) and Angels (2010) ... Last Angels player to wear 27 prior to Mike Trout's call-up in 2011.

SPLIT-SEASON PLAYOFF FORMAT: For the third-straight year, the Pacific Coast League will use a split-season format to determine playoff participants. With one 10 team division, the first half winner (concluding June 22) will host the second half winner (beginning June 24) in a three-game set. The winner will then face the International League champion for the Triple-A Championship in Las Vegas, NV, on September 27.

BALLS AND STRIKES: The Challenge System, in its third full year in the PCL, will be used exclusively for every game this season. Under this system, the home plate umpire will call balls or strikes while each team has the opportunity to challenge the umpire's call with two challenges per game, retaining one for each successful challenge.

- In his fourth season with the Rockies, set career-highs in starts (30), quality starts (12) and innings pitched (165.0) ... finished with the most innings pitched on the club, tied with Cal Quantrill for the second-most quality starts and tied with Ryan Feltner for the most starts.
- Went 1-0 with a 0.68 ERA (26.2 IP, 2 ER) in four starts in May, the lowest ERA in any month by a Rockies starter in franchise history (min. four starts) ... ERA was the third-lowest in the Majors in May, second-lowest in the NL ... walked six with 19 strikeouts while holding opponents to a .172 average.
- 12 losing decisions were tied for the most on the club and were a career high.
- 2.07 walks-per-nine was the lowest mark of his career and finished 11th in the Majors and fifth in the NL among qualified pitchers ... 38 walks issued across 165.0 innings pitched.
- 30 home runs allowed tied for fifth-most in the Majors and tied for the most in National League.

- Set then career-highs in starts (29) and innings pitched (139.0), going 9-9 with a 5.50 ERA (85 ER), 26 home runs, 43 walks and 87 strikeouts for Colorado.
- Made 18 starts in the first half, going 7-7 with a 6.40 ERA (90.0 IP, 64 ER) ... in nine second-half starts, went 2-2 and pitched to a 3.86 clip (49.0 IP, 21 ER).
- Began his season with four straight losses through April 19, the eighth time in history a Rockies starter has started 0-4 through their first four starts of a season, first since Roy Oswalt (five straight, June 20-Sept. 14) and Jeff Manship (four straight, Aug. 8-24) in 2013.
- Pitched at least six innings in a career-best seven consecutive starts from June 30 to Aug. 6, going 5-1 with a 2.51 ERA (43.0 IP, 12 ER), six walks and 26 strikeouts ... first Rockies starter with as many or more consecutive 6.0-plus inning starts with four or fewer earned runs allowed since Germán Márquez, July 5-Aug. 17, 2022 (eight straight).
- Went 4-2 and posted a 3.63 ERA (62.0 IP, 25 ER) over 11 starts from June 30-end of season ... was placed on the 60-day IL with lower back inflammation on Sept. 8, ending his season.
- Set a franchise record with 29.2 walkless innings from the fourth inning on June 30 to the third inning on July 31, surpassing José Jimenez's 23.2-inning streak, May 7-June 23, 2002.
- Left-handed opponent's .372 average, .419 OBP, .655 slugging and 1.074 OPS were all the highest marks in the Majors against a left-handed pitcher.
- 10.62 H/9 was the third-highest mark in the Majors, 13.60 baserunners-per-nine were the eighth-highest, and 5.63 SO/9 was the second-lowest (min. 130.0 IP).
