THEFT ON THE BASES: Omaha holds the second best stolen base percentage in all of Triple-A, trailing only Memphis. The Chasers steal a base safely 86.2 percent of the time. Two Storm Chasers are in the top 15 in the International League in stolen bases. **OF Dairon Blanco** has 13 steals with no caught stealing to rank tied for sixth and is the only player in the top 10 that has yet to be caught. **OF Brewer Hicklen** has 11 stolen bases to rank tied for 12th, also not yet getting caught this season.

SWEET RELIEF: Omaha's bullpen now boasts the second-best ERA in all of Triple-A. The Storm Chasers' 3.38 reliever ERA is just behind Nashville's 3.36 reliever ERA. Omaha and Nashville have both been charged with 81 earned runs, but Omaha's bullpen has thrown one less inning. The Storm Chasers also hold the second best walk per nine innings ratio, allowing just 3.46 walks per 9.0 innings pitched.

FOLLOW THE LEADER: Omaha **INF Vinnie Pasquantino** is crushing the ball out of the park like it's nobody's business and is now in sole possession of the International League home run lead after spending parts of the last few weeks tied for the lead. Pasquantino leads the league in homers with 16 and RBI with 55. Both of those numbers are one better than Lehigh Valley infielder Darrick Hall. Pasquantino has the best walk to strikeout ratio among the league's top 10 home run hitters, drawing a walk 27 times and striking out 32 times this season. Pasquantino also leads qualified International League players with a .633 slugging percentage. Last night, Pasquantino had a walk and a home run, marking the ninth time that he has drawn a walk and hit an extra-base hit in the same game. Pasquantino also leads Omaha in hits (53), total bases (119), doubles (14), and OPS (1.005). He is also tied for the team lead with OF Nate Eaton with two triples.

MAKING HISTORY: Omaha is facing off against Lehigh Valley for the first time in the history of the two teams. Lehigh Valley has taken both games in the series this season. Omaha holds a 4-3-2 series record with all four series wins coming at home. Omaha's 1.50 runs per game through the first two games is the second lowest mark to start a series, trailing only the series with Toledo at the end of April. Omaha is averaging 4.76 runs per game this season but are averaging just 3.17 runs during June.

FOR OMAHA: RHP **Daniel Mengden** gets the nod for the Storm Chasers today to make his 11th start of the season. Mengden has tossed two consecutive quality starts coming into tonight with his most recent a 6.0 inning performance, allowing just one earned run with seven strikeouts in the no decision. Mengden has gone 5.0 or more innings in his last five starts, holding a 3-0 record in those games. Mengden is 4-1 in seven games going back to May 1. The Huston, Texas native made his Royals organizational debut on April 8 with Omaha, throwing 3.1 innings against Indianapolis with three strikeouts. Mengden spent the 2021 season pitching for the KIA Tigers in the KBO, posting a 3.60 ERA across 120.0 innings in 21 starts with 104 strikeouts and 35 walks. Mengden was originally drafted by the Houston Astros in the fourth round (106th overall) of the 2014 MLB Draft out of Texas A&M University.

FOR LEHIGH VALLEY: LHP **Ricardo Sánchez** takes the ball for the Iron Pigs today, heading to the mound to make his 11th start of the season for Lehigh Valley. Sánchez is 1-1 with a 4.06 ERA across 37.2 innings of worth this season. In his most recent outing, Sánchez went 5.0 one-run innings against Scranton/Wilkes-Barre, striking out seven while conceding no walks in the no decision. The 25-year-old was signed as an international free agent in 2013 by the Los Angeles Angels, making his professional debut in 2014. In 2015, Sánchez was traded to the Atlanta Braves. Sánchez spent most of the 2018 season with the Double-A Mississippi Braves, amassing a 4.06 ERA and 2-5 record in 13 starts. The Venezuela native played the 2019 season with Seattle's Double-A affiliate, making 27 starts with an 8-12 record and 4.44 ERA. In February of 2020, Sánchez was claimed off waivers by the St. Louis Cardinals, getting promoted to MLB and making his MLB debut on August 16, throwing 2.0 scoreless innings against the Chicago Cubs. He resigned with the Cardinals for the 2021 but did not play the 2021 season because of injury. After being released in March, Sánchez signed a minor league deal with the Philadelphia Phillies, getting assigned to Triple-A Lehigh Valley.
