Today: The Lansing Lugnuts, High-A affiliate of the A's, play the fifth of a six-game series against the Cedar Rapids Kernels, High-A affiliate of the Minnesota Twins. These are the only meetings of the year between the two squads; they have split the first four games of the series.

Yesterday: Lugnuts 10, Kernels 7. Though Cedar Rapids scored seven runs for the third straight game, **Casey Yamauchi** delivered three hits, scored three runs, and knocked in a pair of runs to lead a balanced attack, helping Lansing take an early 9-1 lead en route to the Friday night win in front of a crowd of 7,889.

Off the Field: Tonight is Harry Potter Night with a special Hogwarts House Hat Giveaway and a postgame LAFCU Fireworks Spectacular! Tomorrow, closing out the homestand, is a Capital City Market Kids Day featuring postgame Kids Run the Bases and an Extra Inning of free ice cream at Capital City Market across Michigan Ave.

Prospecting: The Lugnuts' current roster boasts six of MLB Pipeline's Top 30 Athletics prospects in No. 1 **Leo De Vries**, No. 14 **Steven Echavarria**, No. 19 **Ryan Lasko**, No. 23 **Wei-En Lin**, No. 27 **Kenya Huggins** and No. 30 **Tzu-Chen Sha**.

200 to The Show: Seven former Lugnuts players have made the Major Leagues this season, most recently 2023-24 Lugnuts right-hander **Luis Morales** last night for the Athletics, bringing the total to 200 Lugnuts all-time who've reach the Majors. Morales joined **Max Muncy**, **Gunnar Hoglund**, **Jack Winkler**, **Denzel Clarke**, **Jack Perkins**, **Colby Thomas** and broadcaster **Adam Jaksa** to debut this season in MLB.

At the Deadline: The Lugnuts' roster includes two prospects acquired by the Athletics at the MLB Trade Deadline: top prospect shortstop **Leo De Vries** (picked up with a trio of pitchers from San Diego for 2022 Lugnut **Mason Miller** with starter JP Sears) and pitcher **Kenya Huggins** (received from Cincinnati in exchange for **Miguel Andújar**).

Roll Call: The 2025 Lugnuts have featured 46 different players, 23 position players and 23 pitchers (plus one position player pitching). 18 different players have stolen a base, 15 different players have hit a home run, 11 different pitchers have started a game and five different pitchers have recorded a save. The 47th player of the season and 977th player in team history is **C.J. Pittaro**, who receives the start today at designated hitter after getting called up from Stockton yesterday; the 48th / 978th all-time will be **Kenya Huggins**, starting tomorrow's finale.

The Mutant Cycle: The best individual performance of the season was achieved *against* the Lugnuts by one of the newest Nuts, **Leo De Vries**, who went 5-for-5 on April 22nd against the Lugnuts with a single, a double, two home runs, a sacrifice fly, and - in the top of the ninth inning - a go-ahead two-run triple to both give the TinCaps the win and culminate the third cycle in Fort Wayne franchise history. De Vries finished the game with eight RBIs. MLB Pipeline ranks De Vries as the No. 3 prospect in all of professional baseball.

Wild Times Against the West: This series vs. Cedar Rapids marks the Lugnuts' final meetings with a West Division team this season. The results: 2-2 vs. Cedar Rapids, 5-1 at Wisconsin, 5-1 vs. South Bend, 3-3 vs. Beloit and 3-3 at Quad Cities, giving the Nuts a 18-10 record for the year against the West compared to 32-40 vs. the East.

We Have Contact: No team in Minor League Baseball strikes out fewer times than the Lugnuts, whose total of 685 whiffs is the best in MiLB by 26 over the next closest team, Erie. The Nuts average a scant 6.85 strikeouts per game. Toledo, in contrast, has struck out 1062 times this year and averages 10 K's per game.

Mark it Down: Lansing closer **Mark Adamiak** notched his 16th save last week, putting him one save back of Colorado Rockies Futures Game representative Welinton Herrera (Hartford Yard Goats) for the Minor League Baseball saves lead. Adamiak entered this season with just two saves in all of his baseball career, comprising high school, college, summer ball and MiLB action.

Black and Blue: **T.J. Schofield-Sam** has been hit by 25 pitches this year to put him in second place in Minor League Baseball, three behind Arkansas's Michael Arroyo. The Midwest League record is held by Luke Adams, who was hit by 40 pitches last year with Wisconsin.

League Leaderboard: **T.J. Schofield-Sam** is 1st in the Midwest League in batting average (.312), 6th in on-base percentage (.395) and 7th in OPS (.848). **Grant Judkins** leads the Midwest League in innings pitched (102 2/3) and is tied for 1st in starts (20) and complete games (1). **Blaze Pontes** and **Mark Adamiak** lead the league with 33 appearances.

History vs. Cedar Rapids

The Lugnuts are 78-92 all-time vs. the Kernels, 48-42 at home and 30-50 in Cedar Rapids.

The Nuts have made only one trip to the City of Five Seasons in the last four years: 2023 with new shortstop Jacob Wilson (a 2025 A.L. All-Star), when they went 1-5.

Last year, the Lugnuts lost four of six home games to the Kernels, fitting an uncomfortable pattern: for three consecutive seasons entering 2025, the Nuts have gone 2-4 vs. Cedar Rapids at home.

AUGUST 2ND IN LUGNUTS HISTORY

2010: The Bowling Green Hot Rods scored six runs in the bottom of the 8th inning to seize a 9-7 lead, and then closer Alex Koronis retired the first two batters in the ninth. With two strikes, Brad Glenn homered. With two strikes, A.J. Jimenez singled. And then Kevin Ahrens homered as well, catapulting the Lugnuts to an unexpected 10-9 victory at Bowling Green Ballpark. Sean Ochinko finished the game 4-for-5 with a three-run HR and five total RBIs. By the way: It was a sweltering day, 94 degrees at first pitch.

2022: Denzel Clarke beat out an inside-the-park home run to left field and Cooper Bowman homered in his first Lugnuts game, but the Nuts were outslugged by West Michigan, 15-8, at Jackson Field. Earlier in the day, 20-year-old Tyler Soderstrom was promoted to Double-A Midland. In 89 games with the Nuts, Soderstrom hit .260/.323/.513 with 19 doubles, three triples, 20 homers and 71 RBIs, departing as the MWL leader in RBIs and tied for first in homers.

High School: Played four years on varsity for George C. Marshall High School (Falls Church, Virginia)... named All-Conference First Team as sophomore, junior and senior... named Conference Pitcher of the Year and Conference Player of the Year as a senior: 66 2/3 IP, 1.49 ERA, 60 K... George C. Marshall is best known for the Marshall Plan, which saw the United States give \$13.3 billion to help rebuild Western European economies; it earned Marshall the 1953 Nobel Peace Prize... Marshall's nickname is the Statesmen... other notable Marshall alumni include the first woman to officially run the Boston Marathon, Kathrine Switzer; safety and current Dallas Cowboys special teams coordinator Nick Sorensen; defensive end Michael McCrary; table tennis legend Sean O'Neill; and pitcher Pete Schourek.

Texas Tech: Robinson opened up his time in Lubbock as a reliever in 2022, appearing in 12 games (including nine appearances without allowing an earned run)... as a sophomore, was named to the 2023 Collegiate National Team; posted 5.36 ERA in 45 1/3 innings before finishing strong, posting five scoreless innings with eight strikeouts in the Big 12 Tournament against Oklahoma State to earn a nod on the All-Tournament Team, then limited No. 2 Florida to two ER in five innings in the NCAA Tournament... as a junior, led the Red Raiders with 76 IP in 15 starts, with a 5.09 ERA; struck out 11 in six innings at Oklahoma State on May 11, 2024... drafted following junior year... notable Texas Tech pros include Josh Tomlin, Danny Coulombe, Josh Jung, and the inimitable Dallas Braden.

Welcome to Pro Ball: Signed for \$150,000 after being selected with the first pick of Day 3 by the A's... made pro debut for Stockton on August 23, 2024 (2 IP, 3 H, 2 R, 1 BB, 2 K)... made three starts in total before Stockton's season ended, allowing exactly two earned runs in each outing... lefties hit .333 (6-for-18) with 1 BB / 6 K, while righties hit .273 (3-for-11) with 2 BB, 3 K... base-stealers went 2-for-2... pitched in the 2025 Crosstown Showdown, tossing two scoreless innings against Michigan State in relief of Yunior Tur.

Quality x 3: Posted a quality start in three straight outings for the Lugnuts... April 24 vs. Fort Wayne, allowing one run on five hits and one walk in six innings, one strikeout; 81 pitches, 53 strikes... April 30 vs. Lake County, pitched six hitless innings, walking three and striking out four; 90 pitches, 53 strikes... May 6 at West Michigan in the series opener, with a career high 6 2/3 innings, allowing two runs with three strikeouts: 89 pitches, 55 strikes.

ADDITIONAL LUG•NOTES

DK at the Helm: The 19th manager in Lugnuts history is **Darryl Kennedy**, entering his second year in the A's organization. Kennedy distinguished himself as a catcher at Manatee Community College before starring at the University of North Florida and was named an NCAA All-American in 1991 en route to North Florida's Hall of Fame, inducted in 2017. Kennedy played in the Minor Leagues for seven seasons, including parts of four seasons in Triple-A. Following his 1997 retirement, he immediately began managing, leading the Gulf Coast League Rangers to the 1998 GCL Championship. Kennedy won a second title with the GCL Rangers in 2000, moving on to stops in the Florida State League, Northwest League and Texas League through 2006. Upon joining the Royals' organization, Kennedy managed in the Appalachian League, Carolina League, Pioneer League, Arizona League and Texas League through 2020. He served as bench coach for the KBO's Hanwha Eagles from 2021 through 2023 before joining the A's as Double-A Midland's assistant hitting coach in 2024.

Filling Out the Staff: **Dave Burba**, the Lugnuts' pitching coach, walked on at Ohio State, pitched in the Big Ten Championship game as a freshman, was drafted by the Mariners one round after Ken Griffey, Jr. in 1987, and won 115 games in 15 MLB seasons before spending 13 seasons as a pitching coach in the Colorado Rockies' organization. **Rubén Escalera** is in his second year as hitting coach and his 30th season in the A's organization; he simultaneously serves as a scout for the A's in Puerto Rico. And the pride of Yuba City, Calif., **Cooper Goldby** comes to the Lugnuts after two seasons serving as the Dominican Summer League A's manager. The catcher/utilityman was drafted out of Lewis-Clark State in the 35th round in 2017.

Get to Know These Names: If the past is any indication, the Athletics' 2025 draft picks will be making a Midwest League impact sooner rather than later. Last year, third-rounder **Joshua Kuroda-Grauer** finished the season in Lansing before starring for the Nuts thus far this year. In 2023, the Lugnuts received first-rounder **Jacob Wilson** for 23 games in August; two years later, Wilson started the All-Star Game for the American League at shortstop. This year, the A's selected Florida State southpaw **Jamie Arnold** with the 11th overall pick, following up with a pair of impact slugging outfielders: Indiana Hoosier **Devin Taylor** (the No. 30 prospect) at pick 48 and Oregon State Beaver **Gavin Turley** (the No. 78 prospect) at pick 110.

- Sahid Valenzuela's RBI single in the 10th inning to beat Lake County, 1-0, May 4th
- Rodney Green, Jr.'s RBI single in the 10th inning to beat South Bend, 7-6, May 13th
- Jared Dickey's RBI fielder's choice in the bottom of the 9th to beat West Michigan, 4-3, June 11th

All-Star Representation, Futures Edition: **Tommy White** and 2025 Opening Day starter **Gage Jump** represented the Athletics' organization at the **2025 All-Star Futures Game** on July 12th at Truist Park. White went 0-for-1 with a strikeout while Jump needed only four pitches to strike out Padres No. 1 prospect Leo De Vries and induce a groundout from Cubs No. 1 prospect Owen Caissie – coincidentally to White at third. White, the A's No. 6 prospect, joined Luis Morales (2024), Denzel Clarke (2022), Vladimir Guerrero Jr. and Bo Bichette (2017) and Angel Perdomo (2016) as active Lugnuts to play in the Futures Game.

All-Star Representation, Present Tense: Four Lugnuts were named Major League All-Stars – American League starting shortstop **Jacob Wilson** (2023), A.L. starting first baseman **Vladimir Guerrero, Jr.** (2017), A.L. reserve catcher **Alejandro Kirk** (2019), and N.L. starting pitcher **Matthew Boyd** (2013). It was Vladdy's fifth All-Star appearance, Kirk's second, and the first apiece for Wilson and Boyd. Wilson was the first A's starting shortstop in an All-Star Game since Bert Campaneris (1974) and the first rookie starting shortstop in an All-Star Game since Ron Hansen in 1960.

Still Shoving: 45-year-old **Rich Hill** pitched for the Lugnuts in 2003 (0-1, 2.76, 15 G, 4 GS, 29 1/3 innings, 14 H, 36 walks, 50 strikeouts, 9 wild pitches). On July 13, Hill struck out 10 Toledo Mud Hens in five innings, becoming the first 45-year-old to strike out at least 10 batters in a game since the Texas Rangers' Nolan Ryan whiffed double-digit Athletics on August 6, 1992. Hill is in his 20th professional season and with his 14th different MLB organization.

The Butler Did What?! 2021-2022 Lugnut **Lawrence Butler** led off July 8th's game for the A's vs. Atlanta with an inside-the-park home run, the Athletics' first inside-the-park homer since Mark Kotsay achieved the feat on October 4, 2006; the first leadoff inside-the-park home run for the A's since Elmer Valo in 1943; and the first A's player to have both an inside-the-park home run and an over-the-fence home run in the same game since Billy Williams on August 23, 1975. When the Giants' Patrick Bailey delivered a walk-off inside-the-park home run to end the night in baseball, it was the first time in Major League Baseball history that a leadoff inside-the-parker and a walk-off inside-the-parker were hit on the same day.

Dubious History: 2018 Lugnut **Vinny Capra** was former Great Lakes Loon Clayton Kershaw's 3,000th strikeout victim on July 2. Capra, a 20th-rounder from Richmond in 2018, had been claimed off waivers by the White Sox from the Milwaukee Brewers on May 15.

Simply Electric: 2022 Lugnut **Denzel Clarke** won the MLB Chevrolet Electric Play of the Week each of his first four weeks in the Majors.

Happy Trails: 2012 Nut **Kevin Pillar** announced his retirement on July 2 following a 13-year playing career with 10 different teams. A 32nd-round selection in 2011, Pillar went 6-for-6 with a grand slam in a 6-RBI night at the Dayton Dragons on May 13, 2012, and found a fire extinguisher in his locker after the game. He went on to be the 2012 Midwest League Most Valuable Player.

What a Crowd! The Lugnuts' July 4 crowd of 10,527 was...

- Larger than any crowd drawn by the Tampa Bay Rays this season.
- 18th largest crowd in Minor League Baseball this season.
- Larger than 15 Triple-A teams (Round Rock, Lehigh Valley, Scranton/Wilkes-Barre, Gwinnett, Jacksonville, Reno, Omaha, El Paso, Worcester, Louisville, St. Paul, Memphis, Salt Lake, Tacoma, Sugar Land).
- Larger than 29 Double-A teams (everyone except Frisco).
- Largest crowd in High-A. (No one else drew over 9,000.)
- Larger than 29 Single-A teams (everyone except Fresno, which used to be in Triple-A and edged Lansing by four: 10,531).
- The 2nd largest crowd in Lansing since 2020, beaten only by 2023's July 4.

What a Crowd, Part II: The Nuts drew 8,863 for Grand Slam School Day III on May 28 vs. Beloit, an attendance that ranks the 31st largest crowd in Minor League Baseball this year. If Lansing's July 4 crowd is excluded, the May 28 attendance would rank larger than any crowd in High-A this season except for a West Michigan Whitecaps gate of 9,049 on June 7.
