Today's Game

The Clippers will send RHP Cody Morris to the mound today, making his Triple-A debut (16th different starter this year). Omaha will counter with RHP Eddie Butler. The Clippers are 30-36 (.455) against right handers this year. Butler has pitched against the Clippers four times in his career, all this season, going 0-0 with a 5.00ERA (9.0IP, 10H, 5R, 5ER, 5BB, 5K).

vs. the Storm Chasers

After a series opening shutout on 5/11, the Clippers dropped four of the next five against Omaha in the season's first matchup (Omaha has scored at least four runs in each of 10G since, averaging 7.1 per game). Individually, Gabriel Arias has hit .317 (13x41) with a HR and 6RBI against Omaha in 11G and Trenton Brooks is hitting .450 (9x20) with 2RBI in 5G.

Here We Go Again

The Clippers have allowed at least four runs in each of 5G (39 total) since back to back shutouts on 7/31-8/1 at Nashville (second time this year; all other IL staffs have three instances of consecutive shutouts combined). After blanking Indianapolis from 7/6-7/7, the Clippers allowed 147 runs in the next 19G (7.7 per). When they hold opponents to three runs or fewer, they are an IL-best 22-2 (.917).

One Thousand

Coming into today's game, opponents are on the doorstep of 1,000 homers hit at Huntington Park with 997HR in 12 seasons (includes playoffs). Omaha has homered three times in four of five games this series (had only 2HR on Wednesday) and had a pair of 3HR outings at HP back in May. In the last 14G at home, Clipper pitching has surrendered 30HR with only one 0HR game (7/22 vs. lowa).

Welcome Back

Yu Chang returned with a bang last night, going 2x5 with a double and a 2-run HR (has 7XBH in last 9G with Columbus). Unfortunately for the Clippers, they fell to 0-3 when he homers (provided lone run in 19-1 loss at St. Paul on 7/13; lost 9-8 at St. Paul on 7/14). The Clippers also wasted a 2-run shot from Gavin Collins (0-3 when he homers, including grand slam in 9-5 loss at St. Paul on 7/15).

Month On, Month Off

Beginning on 8/4, Nolan Jones has at least one hit in each of 4G (three multi-hit), batting .533 (8x15) with a HR and 5RBI. In the month prior, 7/4-8/3, Jones hit .172/.287/.368 with 5HR and 11RBI over 25G. For the month from 6/4-7/3, he hit .292/.411/.573 with 3HR and 17RBI in 27G (also had 14 doubles) and from opening day to 6/3, he struggled to .173/.313/.272 with a HR and 7RBI in 24G.

Three Left Turns

Gabriel Arias has scored in only 10 of his last 28G, totaling 11 runs (only multi-run game came on 7/14 at St. Paul, 21G since), following a streak of 22 runs in 15 of 18G (6/12-7/4). Still, beginning with a 3-run game on 6/12 at lowa, Arias has scored 33 runs in his last 46G, tied for 2nd in the IL in that time (hitting .324, 58x179, since 6/12; 4th best in IL). On the season, Arias is 8th in the IL in runs (46).

Bus Driver

Oscar Gonzalez failed to drive in a run for the second straight night last night (first consecutive games since 7/23-7/24, has not had 3G without RBI since first 6G as Clipper), but still has 10RBI in his last 12G. With Columbus, Gonzalez is batting .324 (11x34) with RISP and has gotten plenty of chances in his last 12G (21PA, tied with Nolan Jones for 2nd most in IL since 7/25; Bobby Witt has 23PA).

Sluggish Slugging

Trenton Brooks has hit safely in seven straight (.407, 11x27 since 7/31), but didn't see his slugging rise during the streak until collecting doubles in each of the last 2G. As recently as 7/6, Brooks was sitting at a .500SLG (11XBH in first 24G with Columbus, including 4HR), but he has fallen on hard times in the last month, slugging .380 over his last 26G (7XBH, including 2HR).

Olympic Spirit

Since the start of the Track and Field events on 7/30, Clipper sprinters have amassed 13SB in the last 8G (1CS; in the 30G prior, had 13SB to go against 9CS). Richie Palacios leads seven different Clippers with a steal in the last week (4SB), while Alex Call, Gabriel Arias and Andres Gimenez have a pair each. Both Palacios (14, 10 with Akron) and Call (15, 12 with Akron) have set career highs.

This Date in Clipper History 8/8/1996

For the second consecutive night, Ivan Cruz hit a grand slam off of Syracuse pitching. Cruz was 2x4 with a HR and 4RBI in a 6-0 win the previous night and on 8/8 he went 3x3 with 2HR and 5RBI as the Clippers won 12-4. He would finish the season as an IL All-Star at first base, pounding out 28HR (tied for 10th in Clipper history) to go along with 96RBI (tied for 7th). All-time, Cruz ranks 5th in HR (65) and 8th in

Huntington (Small) Park

In each of the first 11 years since the move downtown, Huntington Park has ranked among the top two in the IL in homers per game, totaling 2.25 per contest (1,763HR, 783 games). In 2019, HP averaged over three per game for the first time ever (seventh time averaging over a pair), as the Clippers surrendered a record 127HR and just missed out on triple digits themselves (97HR was second highest team total). Including the postseason, the Clippers have been out-homered over the life of the park (997 to 950).

Homers, Homers and More Homers

The franchise record for homers was destroyed in 2019 (213, +31 from '83), as was the record for homers allowed (198, +42 from '98). This season's Clippers are homering at a rate of 1.28 per game, putting them two off of the pace of the pre-2019 record (adjusted for 140G). On the mound they are allowing 1.56 per game, enough to beat the pre-2019 record by 43, even with the shortened season.

Ain't Over 'Til It's Over

From 2014-19, no team had more come from behind victories than the 210 posted by Columbus and no team produced a better winning percentage when trailing than the .353 of the Clippers (Scranton/WB was 2nd in percentage, .338, and wins, 192). This year has seen the Clippers go 16-45 (.262) in games in which they trail, ranking 11th.

Not Close

The Clippers have suffered the most losses by at least a grand slam in the IL (26; six in 10G from 7/8-7/19) and rank tied for last in wins by at least that many (11, Norfolk). That poor ratio has led to a -90 run differential (had a -50 differential over 10G from 7/8-7/19), a figure that places them tied for last in the IL (Norfolk).

Get What You Pay For

Columbus was the last team in the IL to play free baseball this season, playing 85 straight games, including the postseason, between extra-inning rumbles on 7/31/19 vs. Louisville and 6/26/21 vs. St. Paul. The Clippers were also the last team to win an extra-inning game, toppling Omaha on 8/6 (snapped 5G losing streak in extras). The 85G regulation-inning streak was the longest for Columbus dating to the 1984 season (as far back as the day by day records go), as was 45 straight to start a season.

Trending Downward

The current staff ERA of 5.60 is on pace to be the worst in franchise history (5.08, 1983) and anything over 4.71 will mark the fifth straight season in which the ERA has gotten worse. From 2011-16, the Clipper staff turned in a sub-4.00ERA five times in six seasons (zero such seasons from 1993-2010), including the best two ERAs of the past 32 years (3.33 in 2015 and 3.65 in 2016). The 6.01ERA at Huntington Park is the worst ever (5.29 in 2019, only time ERA has ever been over 5.00 at HP).

Under Control

After three straight seasons leading the IL in strikeouts, the Clipper lineup is not threatening for a fourth, as they are currently 65K off the lead. To begin the season, they were averaging as many as 10 per game through the first 38G, but that has cooled considerably in recent weeks (8.50K per game since 7/6). The 2019 squad obliterated the franchise record, as they struck out 95 more times than the previous high (1,392; each of last three seasons rank among franchise's three worst, totalling 3,979K in 422G).

Defense Doesn't Win Anything

When playing errorless baseball, the Clippers have a winning percentage that is marginally higher (.465, 20-23) than when they make a mistake in the field (.421, 16-22). After an exceptional defensive run from 2015-2019, in which the fielding percentage was never below .983 and the team never committed more than 88E, the 2021 team is on pace to botch 88 plays (adjusted for 140G season, have not had triple digits in errors since six straight seasons from 2009-14) with a fielding percentage of .982.

One On, No Out Success

When the leadoff batter of an inning reached base in 2019, the Clippers plated him nearly 60% of the time (over 51% only once in the last six seasons, 55% in 2016). Getting more than one base was a specialty of Clipper hitters, as they led the IL with 136XBH to lead off the inning, including 54HR (led the IL, had 28 leadoff homers in 2018). So far in 2021, the Clippers are scoring the leadoff batter 52% of the time he reaches, with the leadoff batter scoring himself 24 times (on pace for 38HR).

Andres Gimenez advanced a runner with a sac bunt on 7/25 vs. lowa and the runner came around to score in the win (4-1 when advanced runner scores). During 2019, the Clippers struggled in the bunt department, but when the advanced runners scored, they were 7-1. During 2018, Columbus was 23-2 in games in which a run was scored after a good bunt attempt.

No Difference

Through the first half of the season, in which the IL played with 18-inch bases (shortening the distance between bases by a whopping 4.5 inches), the Clippers saw a combined average of 1.71 stolen base attempts in their games (averaged 1.73 attempts per game over five seasons from 2015-19). However, since going back to normal bases, steal attempts are at 2.00 per game.

Manager Profile

Andy Tracy makes his Clippers debut in 2021, following Tony Mansolino's championship rookie year in 2019 (sixth Clipper skipper to win Governors' Cup in first season; Gene Michael-'79, Joe Altobelli-'80, Frank Verdi-'81, Bucky Dent-'87 and Mike Sarbaugh-'10). This season marks Tracy's second year as a manager (first with Williamsport in the Philadelphia system), as he holds a career record of 66-91 (.420), 36-45 with Columbus (.444).
