**APRIL 12<sup>th</sup> COLUMBUS (8-6) at WORCESTER (9-4) 1:05 pm**

**Columbus Clippers RHP Trenton Denholm (1-0, 2.45) vs. Worcester Red Sox LHP Payton Tolle (1-0, 4.50)**

**Sunday Series Finale** – The Worcester Red Sox will put a bow on their first extended home series of the season when they play the finale of their 6-game set against the Columbus Clippers (AAA-Cleveland Guardians) this afternoon at 1:05 pm at Polar Park. The WooSox lead the series, 3 games to 2 and are in search of their second straight series victory following their 5-game sweep at St. Paul last weekend. Worcester dropped 2 of 3 to Syracuse here at home to begin the season so they have a 1-1-0 series record pending today's outcome. Today's game is live on NESN+ and on The Pike 100.1 FM and the rest of the WooSox Radio Network.

**This and That** - The WooSox will be looking to avoid losing back-to-back games for the first time this season today. The Sox are 9-4 to match their best start in franchise-history (the 2022 WooSox were also 9-4, but then 9-5). The WooSox have won 8 of their last 10 games overall. They are 4-4 at home compared to 5-0 on the road.

**The Road Ahead** - Speaking of the road, the Sox will fly to Nashville, TN on their offday tomorrow in advance of opening a 6-game series in the terrific city of Nashville on Tuesday evening at 7:35 pm (EDT). The WooSox will be facing the Nashville Sounds (AAA-Milwaukee) for the first time ever as the 6-game set starts on Tuesday and continues through next Sunday afternoon at First Horizon Park. The last time a Red Sox Triple-A affiliate played in Nashville was on May 23, 1991 when the Pawtucket Red Sox blanked the Sounds behind Kevin Morton, 4-0. The PawSox victory gained a split of that 2-game series (yes, travel from Pawtucket, RI to Nashville, TN for a 2-game set) and began a rather strange 10-game roadtrip for Pawtucket that included stops in Nashville (2 games), then to Louisville (3 games), then off to Indianapolis (3 games), and then finally to Buffalo (for 2 games). Ah, travel in the old International League! By the way, Pawtucket and Nashville were part of the unique Triple-A Alliance that featured teams from the International League (like Pawtucket) facing teams from the American Association (like Nashville) in an interleague partnership from 1988-1991. The Pacific Coast League, the third Triple-A league at the time, did not participate – thankfully!

**View From Above** - The WooSox (9-4) are still alone in 1<sup>st</sup>-place atop the International League East division by a ½-game over both Scranton/Wilkes-Barre and Lehigh Valley. Memphis leads the overall 20-team league with an 11-3 record good for 1<sup>st</sup>-place in the IL West. We know it's early, but we are 17.5% of the way through the first half of the season (first 75 games) which ends on June 21.

<b>Kristian Campbell</b>	Had his 9-game hitting streak snapped on Saturday. Has hit in 9 of his last 10 games (11-for-39, .282) with 2 2B, 1 HR, 8 RBI.
<b>Vinny Capra</b>	Hit in 6 of his last 7 games (9-for-24, .375) with 4 2B, 2 HR, 7 RBI, 11 runs scored. Is 2 <sup>nd</sup> in the league with 13 Runs scored and 7 <sup>th</sup> in the IL in both OBP (.476) and 10 <sup>th</sup> in OPS (1.089).
<b>Tsung-Che Cheng</b>	Is 9 <sup>th</sup> in the league in OBP (.465), 2 <sup>nd</sup> in SLG (.735), and 3 <sup>rd</sup> in OPS (1.200).
<b>Jason Delay</b>	Hit in 5 of his last 6 games (7-for-21, .333) with 4 2B & 5 RBI.
<b>Mickey Gasper</b>	Had his 9-game hitting streak snapped on Saturday. Has hit in 9 of his 10 games played (14-for-39, .359) with 2 2B, 3 HR, 12 RBI. Is 8 <sup>th</sup> in league in Batting (.359), T7 <sup>th</sup> in RBI (12), 5 <sup>th</sup> in OBP (.500), 9 <sup>th</sup> in SLG (.641), and 4 <sup>th</sup> in OPS (1.141).
<b>Mikey Romero</b>	Had his 10-game hitting streak snapped on Friday. Still has hit in 10 of his 12 games played (14-for-50, .280) with 5 2B, 1 HR, 11 RBI and is T10 <sup>th</sup> in the league in RBI (11) and T3 <sup>rd</sup> in Doubles (5).
<b>Nick Sogard</b>	Hit in 9 of his 11 starts (11-for-43, .252) with 2 2B, 3 HR, 8 RBI and has reached base safely in all 11 of his games played. Is 5 <sup>th</sup> in league with 13 Walks and T8 <sup>th</sup> in Runs Scored (11).
<b>Braiden Ward</b>	Has been hit by pitch 4 times in his last 2 games and has 6 HBP in his 11 games played. Is 6 <sup>th</sup> in the IL in OBP (.488) and tied for 4 <sup>th</sup> in Stolen Bases (7).
<b>Jake Bennett</b>	Is 2-1 with a 0.68 ERA in 3 GS (2 R, 1 ER in 13.1 IP). He is 2 <sup>nd</sup> in the league with his 0.68 ERA and is 2 <sup>nd</sup> in Lowest Batting Average Against (.109) and 2 <sup>nd</sup> in WHIP (0.53).

**Tayron Guerrero** Has had 4 hitless appearances in his 4 outings (4 IP) and is tied for 2<sup>nd</sup> in league with 2 Saves.

**NEXT ON TAP - The probable pitching match-ups for the upcoming series in Nashville between the WooSox and the Nashville Sounds (AAA-Milwaukee) this week/weekend are TBD at this point:**

**A Recap of This Series** – Yesterday...The WooSox were held to a season-low 3 hits in a 7-0 shutout loss to the Clippers on Saturday. Boston Red Sox RHP Kutter Crawford, who missed all of last season due to right wrist surgery, made his first rehab start for the WooSox and took the loss - 3 IP, 6 H, 5 R, 5 ER, 1 BB, 5 SO. Columbus RF Kahlil Watson belted a pair of homers and had 4 RBI and DH Nolan Jones added a 2-run blast. Columbus starter Rorik Maltrud was outstanding for the victory tossing 6 shutout innings allowing just 2 hits with 1 walk and 4 strikeouts.

Friday night... Thanks to a history-making cycle from shortstop Tsung-Che Cheng, the WooSox won their third in a row over the Clippers, 8-5. WooSox SS Tsung-Che Cheng had a tremendous night at the plate becoming the first WooSox player to hit for the cycle and the first for a Red Sox Triple-A player since outfielder Henry Ramos did it for the Pawtucket Red Sox on July 4, 2016 at Charlotte. The 24-year-old Cheng, from Pingtung County, Taiwan, tripled off the centerfield fence in the 2nd inning, walked in the 3rd inning, ripped an RBI double to the left-centerfield gap in the 4th inning, drilled a solo HR (#3) to leftfield in the 6th, and then laid down a perfect bunt for a single in the 8th inning as the WooSox dugout erupted and the Polar Park crowd of 6,111 saw history in the making. Jake Bennett continued his impressive start to his first year in the Red Sox organization as the 25-year-old, 6'6" southpaw acquired from the Washington Nationals this past offseason was outstanding for the third start in row going 5.1 innings and allowing just 2 hits and 1 run to improve to 2-1.

Thursday night... Worcester received outstanding pitching from starter and winner Jack Anderson (1-0) and reliever Tyler Uberstine (SV #1) to blank the Clippers, 5-0 on Thursday night at Polar Park in a game that took just 2 hours & 14 minutes. Anderson was sharp throughout his outing striking out 7 while allowing only three singles and one walk to blank the Clippers over 6-innings on 76 pitches (54 for strikes). Uberstine, just back from making his Major League debut with the Red Sox at Fenway Park on Sunday, breezed through the final three innings yielding just a single and a walk to go with 3 strikeouts. Vinny Capra, Jason Delay, Kristian Campbell, and Mickey Gasper all had RBI hits.

On Wednesday afternoon... Worcester overcame a 3-0, 1st-inning deficit and snapped a 5-5 tie with 3 runs in the 8th inning to overtake the Clippers, 8-5. The winning rally came in the bottom of the 8th-inning after Columbus had scored twice in the top half of the inning to tie things at 5-5. Vinny Capra led the Sox 8th with a walk, and after a strikeout, Nathan Hickey also walked. Lead-off speedster Braiden Ward (2 hits, 2 runs) was next and while he beat out an infield single, the subsequent throwing error allowed Capra to score with the go-ahead run. Mickey Gasper (hit, 3 walks, 8-game hitting streak) walked to load the bases for Kristian Campbell (single, HBP, SF, 2 RBI, 7-game hitting streak) who was hit by a pitch forcing in an insurance run. Mikey Romero (2 RBI, 10-game hitting streak) added an RBI sac fly to cap the 3-run uprising and make it 8-5 WooSox. LHP Patrick Sandoval made his Red Sox organizational debut and his first official appearance in 22 months since undergoing Tommy John surgery on June 26, 2024. His final line – 3.1 IP, 3 H, 3 R, 0 ER, 3 BB, 3 SO – with a no-decision on 63 pitches (35 for strikes).

On Tuesday night...The WooSox battled back from 4-0 and 7-2 deficits to eventually take a 7th inning lead, 10-8 on a towering 3-run HR by catcher Matt Thaiss, but Columbus scored 3 times in the 8th inning and added 3 more in the 9th to out-last the Sox, 14-10. Worcester pounded 14 hits for their 10 runs led by Kristian Campbell (3 hits), Matt Thaiss (2 hits, 2 walks, 3-run HR & 4 RBI), and Mikey Romero (a pair of RBI doubles). However, Sox pitchers gave up 16 hits as well as 12 walks and 6 wild pitches that led to 14 Columbus runs.

**Almost Time to Say Goodbye, Columbus** – This is the fourth straight year that Columbus has made a trip to Polar Park to take on the WooSox. Until this week/weekend (going 2-3 thus far) the Clippers had largely enjoyed their visits to the Heart of the Commonwealth. Columbus is now 13-9 all-time here at Polar Park and in the process have out-scored the WooSox, 154-104 in those 22 games. About three years ago the Clippers took 5 of 6 from the Sox from April 11-16, 2023 scoring 54 runs total in their 5 victories that series. In 2024, Columbus and Worcester split a 6-game set from June 18-23. And almost exactly one year ago, the Clippers won 3 games of an abbreviated 5-game set here at Polar Park from April 8-13, 2025 during a week that was marred by weather issues. The WooSox have never played in Columbus and won't until at least next year.

***Come out and Play*** – The WooSox have played each of their first 8 scheduled home games to begin a season (March 27-29 and April 7-11) – their longest stretch to open a season since 2023 when the Sox were able to play their first 16 scheduled Polar Park games until a rainout on May 3, 2023 vs. Buffalo. In both 2024 & 2025 the WooSox had their second home games each year postponed due to inclement weather. During Worcester’s inaugural season in 2021, which did not commence at home until May 11 due to Covid-restrictions, it took until their 28<sup>th</sup> home game that year before they finally had a home game postponed (July 2, 2021 vs. Scranton/Wilkes-Barre).

***Series Matters*** – The WooSox – up 3 games to 2 in this 6-game set vs. Columbus - are 1-1-0 in their first two series thus far as they dropped 2 of 3 at home to Syracuse on Opening Weekend (March 27-29) but rebounded to sweep a 5-game set at St. Paul last week/weekend. It marked their third sweep of more than three games in Worcester’s five+ year history. The WooSox swept one series all of last year – that a 6-game set at home vs. Rochester last June 3-8. That marked just their second 6-game sweep in club-history and their first-ever at Polar Park. Worcester’s only other 6-game sweep came during their inaugural 2021 season when they swept a 6-game set at Rochester from August 31 – September 5, 2021. Last year, Worcester went 8-9-10 in their 27 series played... 8 wins, 9 losses, 10 splits.

***A Winning Tradition*** – The 2025 Worcester Red Sox went 76-73 to post a winning season for the fifth time in as many years of existence (and for the fourth year in a row under returning WooSox manager Chad Tracy). Worcester finished 41-33 during the first half last year and then 35-40 in the second half. Overall the 2025 WooSox went 40-34 at home compared to 36-39 on the road. The Pawtucket Red Sox posted five straight winning seasons just once in their 47 years as Boston’s Triple-A affiliate – that coming from 1996-2000.

***How the WooSox Have Won*** - The 2021 WooSox had a 74-54 record during their abbreviated inaugural season, the 2022 WooSox finished 75-73, the 2023 club posted a 79-68 mark, the 2024 team matched that win total going 79-71, and as mentioned the 2025 squad went 76-73. Heading into this season, the WooSox were 383-339 all-time for a .530 winning pct. including a 195-168 record at home compared to a 188-171 mark on the road.

***Fun Fact*** – Of the 278 players who have played for the Worcester Red Sox in their 5+-year history (through today), 201 of them have played in the Major Leagues (72%) including 137 with the Boston Red Sox (49%).

***A Trace of History*** - The second manager in Worcester Red Sox history, Chad Tracy has led the WooSox to winning seasons in each of his first four years at the helm of the WooSox to become the first Red Sox Triple-A manager to accomplish that feat dating back to at least the 1930’s. Known affectionately as “Trace”, he returns for his fifth season as WooSox manager in 2026. Tracy earned the 300th victory of his Worcester managerial career on August 31, 2025 in Durham. He has a 318-289 record since taking over as WooSox manager for the 2022 season. Chad became the sixth manager in modern Red Sox organizational history to reach the 300-win plateau with a Red Sox Triple-A affiliate. Joe Morgan is the all-time leader with 601 wins in his nine years as Pawtucket Red Sox manager (1974-82). “Trace” also had 176 wins in three years as a Minor League manager in the Los Angeles Angels’ system from 2015-17 giving him a total of 494 career managerial wins including Worcester’s wins to start the 2026 season. Tracy, 40, has sent a number of Worcester players to Boston during his tenure including, most recently, OF Roman Anthony, INF Marcelo Mayer, and LHPs Connelly Early & Payton Tolle who all earned their first-ever promotions to Boston during the 2025 season. Other past or current Red Sox who have played for Tracy in Worcester include: OF Wilyer Abreu, RHP Brayan Bello, INF/OF Kristian Campbell, 1B Triston Casas, RHP Kutter Crawford, OF Jarren Duran, INF Romy Gonzalez, RHP Tanner Houck, OF Cedanne Rafaela, INF Nick Sogard, and catcher Connor Wong among several others.

***Portland Sea Dogs Update*** – The Double-A Portland Sea Dogs (4-3) edged New Hampshire, 2-1 yesterday. SS Franklin Arias continued his torrid start to the season with his second straight 3-hit game to raise his average to .588. Portland scored both their runs in the 5<sup>th</sup> on a Marvin Alcantara RBI double and a Nate Baez sac fly. John Holobetz started and was outstanding – 4 IP, 3 H, 1 R, 1 ER, 2 BB, 9 SO. Jorge Juan (1-1) was the winner with 1.2 scoreless innings of relief while Patrick Halligan worked a perfect 9<sup>th</sup> for his first save.

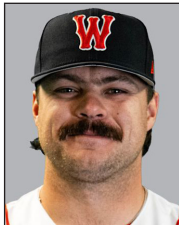
