TODAY'S HEADLINES

LAST GAME'S RESULT - The St. Paul Saints series finale against the Nashville Sounds on Sunday at CHS Field was canceled due to unsafe playing conditions. The two teams do not meet again and will not make up the game. The Saints will only play 149 games this season.

NEW M&M BOYS: On May 2 LHP Jovani Moran and IF Jose Miranda were recalled to the Minnesota Twins. It's the second time Moran has been promoted (2021) and the first for Miranda. Moran was 0-0 with a 3.68 ERA in while fanning 14 in 7.1 IP in six relief appearances while Miranda was .256 with 10 doubles, two home runs, and 12 RBI in 21 games. Miranda went 0-4 in his Major League debut.

DOMINATING THE I-35 RIVALRY: In their first season as the Minnesota Twins Triple-A affiliate, the Saints found their first rival, the Iowa Cubs. The team closest in proximity to the Saints faced off 35 times a season ago with the Saints going 23-12, including a six-game sweep in Iowa from May 25-30. Overall, the Saints went 3-0-3 in their six series. Jose Miranda hit .319 with two homers and 13 RBI. Ryan Mason went 1-0 and didn't give up a run 4, 1 innings while Ian Hamilton was 2-0 with a 1.15 ERA in 11 relief appearances.

HOME WRECKED: The St. Paul Saints never had a chance to even up their series against the Nashville Sounds. After losing three of five, the Saints were hoping to even the series, but because of unsafe playing conditions the series ended after five games with the Saints losing the series. It was the first time in the last nine home series they had lost. They had gone 6-0-2 dating back to last season. Their last home series loss was to Omaha from June 8-13, 2021.

TROUBLED TWO WEEKS: The St. Paul Saints got off to a great start offensively over their first two series, but in the last two they have struggled. The Saints rank dead last in Triple-A in average (.202), runs (34), hits (69), total bases (103), RBI (29), slugging (.302) and OPS (.608) since then.

IF YOU'RE NOT FIRST, YOU'RE LAST: The St. Paul Saints made a habit out of scoring first over the first two series, but over the last two series they have scored first just twice in 11 games. During those 11 games the Saints are just 4-7.

APRIL IS THE CRUELEST MONTH: This season is the first time the St. Paul Saints have played in the month of April. They finished the month 12-10, but hit just .229 (27th in Triple-A) with 109 runs (19th), 19 home runs (22nd), .326 OBP (25th), and .387 slugging (21st). On the pitching side they had a 4.74 ERA (T14th), 23 HR (T11th), 197 K's (T19th), and a 1.41 WHIP (T14th).

ROYCE ROLLS: Royce Lewis is living up to, and perhaps surpassing, expectations this season. He is currently on a five game hitting streak (7-16, 2 2B, HR) and has hit safely in 15 of 21 games. He has an extra base hit in 10 of 21 games and eight multi-hit games. Overall, 13 of his 24 hits are for extra bases and is averaging an extra base hit every 5 ABs. Once he gets on, the Saints are cashing him in, scoring a run in 12 of 21 games. The Saints are 9-3 when Royce scores.

THAT 70s THROW: Through 20 games no Saints pitcher has thrown more than 78 pitches in a game. JC Ramirez has thrown the most in a game at 78, Devin Smeltzer threw 77 and Jake Farria and Daniel Gossett have each thrown a high of 76.

TWINS UPDATE - The Twins pitching continues to dominate allowing just one run to the Baltimore Orioles in a 2-1 win on Monday at Camden Yard. Chris Paddock picked up his first win going 5.1 innings allowing one run while Jhoan Duran picked up his first MLB save.

A PITCHER YOU ROOT FOR: When Smeltzer was just nine years old, he was diagnosed with pelvic rhabdomyosarcoma (bladder cancer), as a tumor had formed against his bladder that was connected to his prostate. He underwent surgery and chemotherapy at St. Christopher's Hospital for Children in Philadelphia, PA, and sent the cancer into full remission in 2012.

PHILLIE FAN(ATIC): During his time with cancer, Devin took a photo with the Phillies Cole Hamels. He also received encouragement and an autograph from Chase Utley when he was 10 on a trip to Citizens Bank Park. Fast forward to 2018 when Hamels was in spring training with the Dodgers and who else was on that team? That's right, Chase Utley. The two reunited 13 years later at Spring Training in Arizona.

CATCH CANCER LOOKING: The lefty, who's worn glasses and a goatee for the majority of his professional career, continues to offer support to others fighting cancer through his Catch Cancer Looking apparel with his likeness. All proceeds benefit Katie's Crusaders, an organization focused on helping cover expenses for pediatric cancer survivors.

#NEVERFORGET: -Smeltzer writes the names of fellow cancer patients under the brim of his cap of both survivors and those that didn't make it. He started this at the age of 10 and did that as recently as 2018. Since then he carries a hat that has a bunch of names on it and puts it on his top shelf with all his other hats in his locker.

THE-OUT-OF-TOWNER: Believe it or not, Smeltzer had never stepped foot in New York City, that is until he pitched in Game 2 of the American League Division Series at Yankee Stadium against the New York Yankees. The New York crowd didn't phase Smeltzer as he went 3.1 scoreless innings with two hits allowed, three walks and four strikeouts in a Twins 8-2 defeat.

WELCOME TO THE CLUB: Devin made his Major League debut with the Minnesota Twins on May 28, 2019 vs. Milwaukee. All he did was go 6.0 shutout innings allowing three hits, no walks, and seven strikeouts. He became fourth Twins starter in history to throw 6.0-or-more shutout innings in his debut, joining Andrew Albers (8.1 on August 6, 2013), Anthony Swarzak (7.0 on May 23, 2009) and Eric Milton (6.0 on April 5, 1998). His seven strikeouts were one shy of the franchise record in a debut (Boof Bonser set by Boof Bonser on May 21, 2006 at Milwaukee).

FLY LIKE AN EAGLE: Following his high school career at Bishop Eustace (NJ) Preparatory School in 2014, Smeltzer was drafted in the 33rd round by the Chicago Cubs. Smeltzer elected not to sign with the Cubs and instead went to school at Florida Gulf Coast University. After one season, however, Smeltzer transferred to San Jacinto (TX) JC so that he would be eligible for the draft after two years instead of three. The moved paid off when the Los Angeles Dodgers selected him in the 5th round of the 2016 draft.

- Pitched in one game for the Minnesota Twins in 2021 before being optioned back to the alternate training site on April 25. He was recalled from the Saints on May 6, but never pitched in a game for the Twins. Was placed on 10-day Injured List on May 12 with left elbow inflammation; missed remainder of season
- Made the Twins Opening Day roster in 2020 for the first time in his career
- Earned the Twins minor league Pitcher of the Week and Southern League Pitcher of the Week April 14, 2019 after making two starts, going 2-0, 0.00 ERA (14.0 IP) with five hits allowed, two walks and 17 strikeouts
- Earned first major league win August 4, 2019 vs. Kansas City, pitching 6.0 shutout innings with two hits allowed, one walk and four strikeouts in a 3-0 Twins victory
- Became just the fifth Twins pitcher to record seven-or-more strikeouts in a debut on May 28, 2019, joining Bonser (8, in 20016), Yohan Pino (7 in 2014), Darrell Jackson (7 in 1978) and Bert Blyleven (7 in 1970)
- Had five overall stints with the Twins in 2019, going 2-2 with a 3.86 ERA (49.0 IP, 21 ER), 12 walks and 38 strikeouts in 11 games (6 starts)
- Traded from the Los Angeles Dodgers, along with 2B Logan Forsyth and OF Luke Raley in exchange for 2B Brian Dozier on July 31, 2018
- Started 2017 with Low-A Great Lakes (Los Angeles Dodgers), where he pitched in 10 games (all starts), and allowed 22 earned runs in 52.1 innings pitched (3.78 ERA). He was promoted to High-A Rancho Cucamonga, where he pitched in 16 games (15 starts), amassing a 5-4 record with a 4.40 ERA (90.0 IP, 44 ER), 102 strikeouts and just 18 walks
