VRIELING AND DEALING: Over his last two starts. Patriots RHP Trystan Vrieling is 2-0 with 2 ER allowed over his last 12.0 IP (1.50 ERA) with 11 K and 5 H allowed.

FROM LONG BALL TO SMALL BALL: Since beginning this week's series with 24 R and 8 HR over a three-game win streak, the Somerset Patriots have gone homerless over their last 20 innings. Over the last two games, the Patriots have had just one run-scoring hit (Tyler Hardman, 1st inning RBI-single on Saturday). Saturday's win marked just the Patriots' 13th win this season without hitting a home run (13-23).

HOORAY FOR TREY: On Friday night, INF Trey Sweeney became the 39th Somerset Patriot to debut in the big leagues since 2021. Sweeney is the 13th Patriot this season to make his MLB debut and the third this week, for three different teams (Mickey Gasper, BOS, Monday 8/12 and Andres Chaparro, WSH, Tuesday 8/13). He made his MLB debut against the Yankees, who drafted him in the first round of the 2021 MLB Draft, going 1-for-3 with his first big league hit coming off of Luke Weaver. **RED-HOT RICHARDSON:** After hitting a homer on Thursday night and a triple on Friday night, Grant Richardson is now on a five-game hit streak over which he is 7-for-17 (.412/.500/.824) with 4 XBH, 3 RBI and 4 R. Over his last 11 games dating to 7/30, Richardson is 15-for-40 (.375/.435/.600) with 6 XBH, 4 RBI and 6 R. Richardson's 27 multi-hit games this season lead the Patriots and outnumber his total of single-hit games (22) this season.

LET'S GO FLO: Rafael Flores has hit safely in all five games of this week's series, going 7-for-17 with 3 RBI, 3 R, 2 HR, 1 2B and 2 BB. Flores now has 11 HR in 42 Double-A games with the Patriots, which was more than he hit all of last season over 105 games in Hudson Valley. Since the start of the second half (6/25) when Flores joined the Patriots, his 11 HR and 83 TB lead the Eastern League, while his 19 XBH rank 2nd to teammate Spencer Jones (21). Rafael Flores' 2 HR game on Wednesday marked the first multi-homer effort of his career and he became the fifth Patriot this season to accomplish a multi-homer game. SEIGING THE BALL WELL: In four games this week, Anthony Seigler is 6-for-16 with 2 HR, 5 RBI and 4 R. Seigler's 25 BB since 6/23 lead the Eastern League. Over his last 14 games, Seigler has totaled 4 HR, 7 RBI, and 11 R. In 13 games against Hartford this season, Seigler has hit a team-high 5 of his 12 HR, while his 12 RBIs against the Yard Goats are tied with Spencer Jones for the most on the team.



Raul Dominguez enters his second consecutive season as manager for the Somerset Patriots, 10th overall as a manager and 18th coaching in the Yankees organization. He led the 2023 Patriots to a Double-A best record of 84-53 and a +211 run differential, which ranked first among all MiLB teams. Under his leadership, the Patriots finished with the Eastern League's top record in both halves of the season and clinched their second straight playoff berth. In 2023, Dominguez became the third manager in Somerset Patriots Double-A franchise history and in 2024 he will become the first to serve as manager for more than one season. Before joining Somerset, Dominguez spent the prior two seasons (2021-2022) as a defensive coach for Triple-A Scranton/Wilkes-Barre. He previously served as defensive coach for Trenton (2018-2019) and Tampa (2017). The Panama City, Panama native gained prior managerial experience with the GCL Yankees East (2016), DSL Yankees 1 (2011-15) and DSL Yankees 2 (2009-10). From 2012-2015, his teams finished at least 10 games over .500, including reaching the DSL semifinals in 2012 and 2015.

KEVIN MARTIR: Hitting Coach (1st year)

Hitting coach Kevin Martir begins his first season in Somerset and fourth in the Yankees organization, after serving in the same position for High-A Hudson Valley in 2023 and Single-A Tampa for two seasons in 2021-22. He joined the Yankees organization in 2020 and had been scheduled to serve as hitting coach for former Rookie-Advanced level Pulaski, prior to the cancellation of the minor league season. Martir began his caching career in 2019 as a development coach for the GCL Phillies East. Martir starred at catcher during his playing career at the University of Maryland (2013-15), where he was a semi-finalist for the Johnny Bench Award in 2015. Martir was drafted by the Houston Astros in the 18th round of the 2015 MLB Draft. He played two professional seasons for the Astros with Rookie-Advanced Greeneville in 2015 and Short-Season Class-A Tri-City in 2016. A native of Brooklyn, New York, Martir graduated from the Grand Street Campus in 2012, after transferring from Xaverian High School in Brooklyn prior to his senior year.

BRETT DeGAGNE: Pitching Coach (1st year)

Pitching coach Brett DeGagne begins his first season with Somerset and fourth year in the Yankees organization. After making his organizational coaching debut as the Single-A Tampa Tarpons' pitch-ing coach in 2021, DeGagne most recently served as the FCL Yankees pitching coach in 2022 and 2023. In 2023, his staff led the Florida Complex League in strikeouts (587) and finished fourth in ERA (4.47). DeGagne was initially tabbed to be the DSL Yankees pitching coach in 2020, before the cancellation of the minor league season. DeGagne played college ball at the University of North Dakota from 2012-2016. He moved on to grad school at St. Cloud State University, where DeGagne also began his baseball coaching career. He served as the Huskies' pitching coach during the 2017-2018 seasons. He gained additional coaching experience in 2018 as the pitching coach for the Bismarck Larks of the Northwoods League. One year prior to joining the Yankees, in 2019 DeGagne took over as pitching coach for North Iowa Area Community College.

AARON BOSSI: Defensive Coach (3rd year)

Aaron Bossi returns for his third consecutive season as the Patriots' defensive coach. Under Bossi's leadership in each of the past two seasons, infielders Jesus Bastidas (2B, 2022) and T.J. Rumfield (1B, 2023) were each awarded Rawlings Minor League Gold Gloves for their work in the field. Bossi has also overseen Somerset's baserunning program each of the last two seasons, leading the team to an Eastern League-best 205 stolen bases in 2022 and a Double-A-best 256 stolen bases in 2023. Bossi made his coaching debut as Hudson Valley's defensive coach in 2021. Prior to his coaching experience with the Yankees, he spent 2017-2019 assisting rehabbing players at the organization's minor league complex in Tampa. The St. Louis, Missouri native was signed as a non-drafted free agent by the Yankees on June 24, 2016 as a catcher/infielder. He played in 22 games for the GCL Yankees East in 2016

2024: The Yankees assigned Vrieling to Double-A Somerset to start the 2024 season without any pitching experience at any level of the Yankees minor league system. In his third career game on 4/19/24 vs. HFD, Vrieling started and went 7.2 hitless innings, before being lifted at 100 pitches in a scoreless game. In what wound up being a one-hitter for the Patriots, the game ended with a Ben Rice leadoff, walk-off home run in the bottom of the ninth inning for a 1-0 win. Following the outing, Vrieling was named the Eastern League Pitcher of the Week on 4/22/24. Following his first month of professional baseball with Someset, Vrieling was named the Eastern League Pitcher of the Eastern League Pitcher of the Start League Pit

2022-23: Vrieling did not pitch following the 2022 MLB Draft. Following the draft, the Yankees shut him down and put him on a weight-training and diet routine to become stronger. During Spring Training of 2023, he sustained a stress fracture in his pitching elbow and wound up spending the entire 2023 season on the 60-day Injured List. However, following the 2023 season, Vrieling was sent to the Arizona Fall League to pitch for the Mesa Solar Sox. In his first affiliated pitching experience, Vrieling started five games for Mesa, combining for 10.2 IP with 15 K, 6 BB and a 5.06 ERA.

College: Appeared in 42 games over three seasons at Gonzaga from 2020-2022, going 5-7 with a 4.31 ERA and 178 strikeouts in 137.2 innings. Vrieling worked primarily out of the bullpen his first two seasons, including in 2021 when he made 20 of his 22 appearances in relief and was a WCC All-Conference Honorable Mention. In 2022, he transitioned to the starting rotation, when he went 4-4 in 15 starts.

Personal Notes: Born in Lewiston, ID and moved to Kennewick, WA when he was 5-years-old. Attended Kamiakin High School (WA), where he took basketball more seriously than baseball to begin with. He stopped playing basketball as a junior, after he broke his ankle. As a senior on the mound, he posted a 0.56 ERA with 63 strikeouts in 55 innings and was named MCC Pitcher of the Year and First Team pitcher.

Career Notes: Selected by the Yankees in the third round of the 2022 MLB Draft, signing on July 25, 2022 for a slot value bonus of \$611,400. Had been ranked by MLB.com as the No. 71 Draft prospect in 2022.
