SHUCK FACTS

- Returns as manager with the Shuckers after 2 seasons as a Roving Infield Instructor with the Brewers organization.
- Enters 2026 with the 6th-most wins (1,445) among active managers in Minor League Baseball.
- Has managed 71 of the 82 former Shuckers who have gone on to make their MLB debuts... Including Corbin Burnes, Freddy Peralta, Jackson Chourio, Josh Hader and Brice Turang.
- Pitched to former Brewers first baseman Prince Fielder in the 2007 Home Run Derby at AT&T Park in San Francisco.
- Uncle, Mario Guerrero, was a Major League infielder with Boston (1973-74), St. Louis (1975), California (1976-77) and Oakland (1978-80).
- Father, Epy Guerrero, was a renowned scout in the Dominican Republic who unearthed over 50 Major League players for the Astros, Yankees, Blue Jays and Brewers.
- Named after former Major League pitcher Mike Torrez, who was a friend of his father, Eppy.

COACHING CAREER

- Enters 9th season with the Shuckers, 11th in Double-A and 31st in the Brewers organization.
- Is the Shuckers franchise leader in wins (492).
- In 2023, managed a Shuckers team that set the single-season franchise record for runs (786), walks (671), hits (1150) and stolen bases (214)... Finished with the 2nd-most home runs (152) and extra-base hits (394) in a single season.
- Became the 7th active manager in Minor League Baseball to reach 1,400 wins... Reached the mark on June 11, 2023, in a win against the Mississippi Braves.
- Helped the Shuckers become the first Brewers Double-A affiliate to reach the championship series in back-to-back years since the 2006 and 2007 Huntsville Stars... Reached the championship series in 2018 and 2019.
- Set the franchise record for wins in 2018 with 82, the most by a Brewers Double-A affiliate since the 1994 El Paso Diablos.
- Won third and fourth consecutive Southern League South Division half championships in 2019... Reached second consecutive Southern League Championship Series.

- Reached the Southern League Championship Series in 2018... Won the first and second half... Became the first Brewers Double-A affiliate to reach 80 wins in a season since the 1994 El Paso Diablos.
- Named the 2nd manager in Shuckers franchise history prior to the 2016 season.
- Earned the 2013 Mike Coolbaugh Award, presented to an individual who has shown an outstanding baseball work ethic, knowledge of the game and skill in mentoring young players on the field.
- Served as the manager of the Triple-A Nashville Sounds in 2012 and 2013.
- Managed the Surprise Rafters during the 2010 Arizona Fall League season.
- Served as the manager of the High-A Brevard County Manatees in 2008 and 2009.
- Named the 2009 Florida State League Manager of the Year.
- Reached the 2009 Florida State League Division Series... Eliminated by the Tampa Yankees.
- Served as the manager of the West Oahu CaneFires of the Hawaiian Winter League in 2008.
- Served as the manager of the West Virginia Power in 2006 and 2007.
- Reached the 2007 South Atlantic League Championship Series... Lost to the Columbus Catfish.
- Spent the 2003 season as the Hitting Coach with Single-A Beloit.
- Helped capture the Brewers only Dominican Summer League title in 2001... Named the Dominican Summer League Manager of the Year.
- Moved to the Brewers organization as the Dominican Summer League manager in 1996... Served in the role until 2002.
- Began managerial career in 1995 with the DSL Blue Jays.

- Appeared in 664 games across 9 seasons in the Brewers and Royals organizations.
- Appeared in 18 games with the Wei Chuan Dragons of the Chinese Professional Baseball League during the 1994 season.
