Tonight's Game

The Clippers will send RHP **Trenton Denholm** to the mound tonight looking to snap a 5G losing streak (last 6G: 7/24-8/1/25). The Saints will counter with RHP **Matt Bowman**. Columbus is 39-28 (.582) versus right handers this year. Bowman has pitched against the Clippers 13 times in his career, going 2-1 with a save and a 1.02ERA (17.2IP, 17H, 5R, 2ER, 9BB, 21K).

vs. the Saints

Columbus went 4-2 against the Saints in Minnesota last year, on the way to a 9-7 series record, and has won 48 of the last 77 overall opposing the Saints (419-332 run differential; 13 of 29 losses by a single run, only 10 losses by more than two runs). Individually, **Angel Genao** has hit .304 (7x23) with 2HR and 5RBI in 6G against St. Paul in his career.

Outliers

The Clippers reached 50 wins on 7/10, having done so with negative differentials in runs (-29; of eight teams with at least 50 wins, only team in the red, all others at least +32 and averaging +53), homers (-6; only team in the red, all others average +23) and hits (-23, others average +42; St. Paul brings up the rear, -49). In the second half, Columbus is being outscored 118-95 and outhomered 31-20.

Ingle is Back

Cooper Ingle was slumping heading into a two week stint in the Majors, hitting .214/.281/.429 over 14G with the Clippers from 6/5-6/24, before slashing .095/.208/.095 in 7G with Cleveland (6/26-7/8). In 6G since his option, Ingle is 9x24 (.375), drawing 4BB (.464OBP) with 6XBH (1HR, .708SLG). At catcher, Ingle has a 1.289OPS (11HR) in 32G (.625OPS and 2HR in 24G between DH and LF).

Angel Ascendant

Angel Genao saw his 14G hitting streak snapped on Sunday (.480, 24x50 from 6/27-7/18), but managed to reach base with a walk to extend his on base streak to 15G (.557OBP). Since 6/18, he owns a 1.093OPS in 24G, drawing 19BB in 107PA (18%; 11BB in 139PA, 8%, in first 35G with Columbus). Genao has only 6K in the last 24G (1K in each of 3G from 6/19-6/21 and 7/4-7/7; 29K in 139PA prior).

Tough Way to Go

Ralph Velazquez was pulled from Friday's game after 1AB (K), snapping his career best on base streak at 30G (.383OBP, 6/3-7/10). His streak is the 3rd longest in the IL and, from its start, he watched his OBP balloon by 79 points, his average jump 66 points and his SLG climb 137 points (6XBH in first 8G, 1XBH in middle 16G, 4XBH in last 6G). He has hit in 18 of his last 22G (.329, 27x82, 3HR).

Stepping Up

Alfonsin Rosario made his Triple-A debut on Friday (300th career game, played 99G in Double-A), bringing with him 53HR and 50SB in his career. Beginning with consecutive multi-hit games to end May, Rosario hit .331/.399/.676 in his last 36G with Akron, collecting 10HR and 35RBI (led EL in SLG and RBI over that stretch). He has 2SB in 3G with Columbus (successful on 15 straight since 9/12/25).

In a Slump

Since doubling twice on 6/25 at Omaha, **George Valera** is hitting .107 (6x56, all singles), while scoring twice and driving in a trio over his last 15G. He has drawn only 6BB during the slump (3BB on 7/5) against 14K in 62PA. Valera has not homered since 5/19 vs. Louisville (106AB since) and has just 2HR in his last 47G (168AB, .292SLG). Additionally, he has no multi-RBI games since 5/30 (26G).

Rare Company

Dating to the nightcap vs. Scranton/WB on 6/19, **Milan Tolentino** is 22x71 (.310) in his last 22G, collecting 11XBH (.563SLG) and 13RBI (was 5x39, .128, in 13G prior). Over his last 15G, Tolentino has drawn 13BB to only 13K (58PA; had 8BB and 42K in previous 33G, 114PA). He played in his 200th game as a Clipper on 7/9 and is one of five with at least 30HR and 30SB (only two are 40-40).

Rough Relief

Columbus is 1-6 in the last 7G, with the bullpen producing an 8.91ERA over that span (34.1IP, 34ER; at least 4ER on six occasions, had at least 4ER twice in previous 16G). However, the bullpen has blown only one lead in that time (7/9 at Lehigh Valley). During the 5G losing streak, the Clippers have led by a single run after three innings (7/17 vs. Indy) while trailing after 36 innings (tied for four).

This Date in Clipper History

7/21/1998

The Clippers beat the Buffalo Bisons by a score of 7-3 on the power of 2HR from **Ivan Cruz**. Cruz hit 13HR for the Clippers during an injury shortened season in 1998, his 3rd with the Clippers. The 1997 co-Clipper of the Year, Cruz finished his Clipper career with 65HR (5th all-time) and 227RBI (8th). In addition, he was selected to play in two Triple-A All-Star Games ('96 & '97).

First Half Wrap

Despite being eliminated from playoff contention on the penultimate Sunday of the first half, the Clippers were 41-33 and finished with their first winning record in the front half since the season was split in 2023 (averaged 32 wins from 2023-25, topping out at 34-38, .472, last season). From 4/22-6/17, they spent every day between 3.0 and 6.0 games off the lead, while occupying anywhere between 4th and 13th in the standings. A late push (15-6 from 5/16-6/9) got them to within 2.5 before derailing with a 3G losing streak at Indy to seal their fate. On the back half, Columbus has posted just one winning record, clinching a playoff berth in 2024 with a mark of 48-26 (.649).

Huntington (Small) Park

In each of the first 11 seasons after the move downtown (2009-19), Huntington Park ranked among the top two in the IL in homers per game. With the arrival of six new parks to the IL in 2021, Huntington Park finished 4th, 6th and 10th from 2021-23, respectively. The 2024 season saw a return to the top (2.96; 108HR hit by the Clippers, most for the home team in HP's existence), but it dropped back to 7th last year (2.31). Including the postseason, the Clippers have been out-homered over the life of the park (1,458 to 1,401).

Challenging Times

The Clippers are 138-113 (.550) in pitch reviews, with batters going 72-73 (.497) and pitchers/catchers going 66-40 (.623). They have run out of challenges in 40G and have not challenged in 4G. Last season, they were correct 43.1% of the time (2nd worst in the IL).

Extras, Read All About Them

Columbus is 5-4 in extra innings this year, after having gone .500 in each of the last two seasons. Since the start of the 2018 season, when baserunners started appearing at second base, the Clippers are 55-37 when playing past regulation (.598, best in the IL; no other team above .571), including 27-17 at home (.614; 5-7 in last 12G). Of the 92G to require extra play, 73 have been resolved after one frame (including nine DH games) and only one has gone past the 12th (5-4 loss in 13 on 9/20/22 at Toledo).

On the Runs

Starting with the embiggened 150G schedule in 2022, the Clippers scored over 800 runs in three consecutive seasons from 2022-2024 (855, 808 and 805 runs, respectively; accounting for the 3rd, 4th and 5th best totals in team history). Following a steep decline last season (670, fewest scored in a full season since 2018), Columbus is looking to top 800 again (on pace for 800, would rank as 6th most all-time; record is 898 scored in 1983).

On the Run

On the basepaths, the Clippers are making a run at the franchise mark in stolen bases, with 115 through 95G (on pace for 180SB). The team record was set in 2024 when Columbus swiped an even 200, but the team speed was throttled last year (129SB; still, the 2nd highest total since the Cleveland affiliation started in 2009). However, with 31CS so far, the Clippers are also pacing for the 2nd most times caught stealing of the Cleveland affiliation (49; nabbed 51 times in 2024).

Crazy Eighth's

From the 8th inning on, the Clippers have scored an IL-best 146 runs while crafting a .918OPS (nearly 100 points better than all other teams). On the flipside, Columbus has given up 75 runs from the 8th on, resulting in a +69 run differential (Clippers are getting outscored 230-139 from innings 5-7).

Juiced is Loose

In the Huntington Park Era (since 2009), Columbus leads the IL with 79 grand slams and 1,961RBI (led IL in RBI in 2010, '11, '12, '17, '18 and '22). Collecting an IL-best 10 grand slams last season, it marked their fifth straight season with at least four (118RBI last year; had only 97RBI in 2024, worst in a 140+G season since 2016).

In Big Trouble

The Clipper pitching staff is trending toward the worst ERA in club history, sitting at 5.40 through the first 95G. Since the reorganization of the minor leagues in 2021, Columbus has twice finished the season with a 5+ ERA (current record is 5.32, set in 2023), after having done so just once in the first 43 seasons (5.08 in 1983). However, the staff is pacing to give up only 184HR (average of 182 per season since the Year of the Homer in 2019).

Department of Defense

The Columbus defense is sitting at 7th in the IL this year (.980), following a 2025 that saw a franchise record (.985, led the IL). On 4/10 at Worcester, the defense collapsed for the first 5E game since 8/27/24 (topped out at 3E in a game twice last year and had fewer than 5E in 21 of 26 series). The Clippers have played flawlessly in 51G this season (30-21, .588), after doing so in nearly 60% of games last year (44-42, .512), including 16 straight from 6/20-7/8/25 (longest streak in the IL over the last 20 years).

Good Baseball

CJ Kayfus bunted a runner into scoring position with a single on 7/5 vs. Louisville, with that runner kicking off a 5-run inning that led the Clippers to victory. Since the start of the 2018 season, Columbus is 90-23 (.796) in games in which a run is scored after a good bunt attempt, including a 7-2 mark this season (.778, blew 7-run lead in one of the losses; went 23-2 in 2018).

To the End

The Clippers have the most last at bat wins this year (14, tied with Syracuse) while playing in the 2nd most games decided in the last at bat (25, Memphis has 27). Since the start of the 2024 season, Columbus has played in 98G decided in the last at bat (2nd most in the IL), going 48-50 (.490, 14th best winning percentage; 3rd most wins, 2nd most losses).

Manager Profile

Andy Tracy made his Clippers debut in 2021, following **Tony Mansolino's** championship rookie year in 2019 (sixth Clipper skipper to win Governors' Cup in first season; **Gene Michael**-'79, **Joe Altobelli**-'80, **Frank Verdi**-'81, **Bucky Dent**-'87 and **Mike Sarbaugh**-'10). This season marks Tracy's sixth year as a manager (first was with Williamsport in the Philadelphia system), as he holds a career record of 436-451 (.492), 406-405 with Columbus (.501).

Great Start:

Denholm's season debut, 4/1 vs. Indianapolis, was his 100th career game and his second at the Triple-A level (367 days between Triple-A games). He needed only 69 pitches to record a quality start (6.0IP, 1ER), giving the Clippers their first of the season (5th game, did not have a quality start until 41st game last season). Columbus has 14QS on the season (12QS through this point last year, on the way to 23), with **Rorik Maltrud** (5), **Logan Allen** (4) and Denholm (3) accounting for 86%.

In Relief:

Denholm pitched exclusively in relief during May and June, but each appearance came on starter's rest, as he averaged 56.0 pitches per outing (ranged from 38-84, while recording 2.0-5.0IP). In total, he was 7-0 with a 1.95ERA over 9G (32.1IP, 30H, 9R, 7ER, 5BB, 35K). He led the IL in wins from May-June and, among 76 pitchers with at least 30.0IP, his ERA was 2nd best (also 2nd with 7.00K/BB and 6th with a 1.08WHIP). On 5/20 vs. Louisville, Denholm notched his first save in Triple-A (4.0IP, 1ER) and the fifth of his pro career.

Tough Ones:

On 4/12, Worcester hung 7ER on Denholm, tying a career high (third time), while also connecting for 2HR (eighth career game giving up 2HR, first time allowing both to same batter, Allan Castro). He followed up with a quality outing next time out, 4/18 vs. Iowa (6.0IP, 3ER), throwing a season high of 92 pitches. Denholm closed out April by giving up 7ER again (fourth time), this time to Toledo on 4/30, while giving up 3HR for the first time in his career.

Limiting the Longballs:

From 4/12-4/30, Denholm surrendered 7HR to 90BF (one per 12.9BF), accounting for 15 of 19ER (6HR with men on base, including a grand slam on 4/12 at Worcester). He allowed only 2HR to the next 188BF from 5/7-7/12 (94.0BF per) before surrendering a pair in the 3rd inning at Lehigh Valley on 7/12.
