STARTING ON TOP: Over the first three games of the season, Dunedin starting pitchers have not allowed an earned run over 14 combined IP with 12 K, 1 BB. Khal Stephen went 5 shutout IP in the season opener on Friday, Daniel Guerra went 4 IP, allowing an unearned run on Saturday, and Austin Cates went 5 shutout IP on Sunday.

RUDD AWAKENING: Jaden Rudd accounted for all 4 RBI in Saturday's first victory of the season on a pair of two-run doubles, coming in the 2nd and 6th innings. Rudd's 4 RBI and 2 2B both marked new career highs for the 22-year-old.

MANNY THE MACHINE: Manuel Beltre had a three-hit night on Saturday including a double and two runs scored. After a two-hit game in the opener with a double, Beltre has back-to-back multi-hit games to begin the season and is 5-for-8 (.625) with 2 R, 2 2B, and an RBI to open 2025. Beltre led Dunedin with 23 multi-hit performances last season. His double on Friday night left the bat at 102.4 MPH, the third hardest hit ball of hid Dunedin career.

KIM K: With the Blue Jays earning their first win of the 2025 season on Saturday, first-year skipper Gil Kim earned his first managerial victory. Kim has spent time with the Blue Jays as the team's Farm Director and Major League Field Coordinator.

YESAVAGE MODE: Blue Jays No. 2 prospect Trey Yesavage makes his professional debut on Tuesday. The 1st round pick (20th) overall out of East Carolina University, as a junior last season Yesavage ranked among Division I leaders with a 2.03 ERA (4th), 145 strikeouts (5th), .154 opponent batting average (2nd), and 11 wins (T-4th). He impressed in the 2025 Spring Breakout game, tossing two scoreless innings with three strikeouts to earn the win and Second Team All-Spring Breakout honors. Yesavage topped out at 97 MPH on the mound as the Blue Jays prospects took down the Twins prospects 10-0 at TD Ballpark on March 15.

2024 FSL RECAP: The Dunedin Blue Jays finished 2024 69-51, the second-best overall record in the FSL West Division. OF Victor Arias was the sole Blue Jays representative on the league's Postseason All-Star Team. Clearwater won the first half of the division, and Lakeland won the second. The Palm Beach Cardinals took home their first FSL Championship, defeating the Lakeland Flying Tigers 2-1 in the FSLCS. Kevin McGonigle (LAK) won the FSL MVP Award, Nestor Lorant (DAY) won Pitcher of the Year, and Gary Kendall (PMB) won Manager of the Year. The Cardinals went a league-best 83-47 and placed four players on the FSL All-Star team.

RHODE TO THE SHOW: Alan Roden became the 279th former Dunedin Blue Jays to go on to make their professional debut when he made Toronto's Opening Day roster and debuted on 3/27 vs. BAL. Roden played 25 games for the D-Jays in 2022, where he batted .233 with 1 HR.

SCOUTING THE HAMMERHEADS: The Hammerheads roster features nine of the Marlins Top 30 prospects per MLB Pipeline, INF Starlyn Caba (No. 2), INF Andrew Salas (No. 5), OF PJ Morlando (No. 6), OF Dillon Head (No. 7), INF Carter Johnson (No. 10), RHP Keyner Benitez (No. 17), OF Andres Valor (No. 19), INF Abraham Ramirez (No. 21), and RHP Aiden May (No. 22). 17-year-old Andrew Salas, the top international signing from 2025 by the Miami Marlins, is the youngest player in full season baseball. Jupiter finished 65-65 in 2024 and missed the playoffs by one game in the first half of the season after winning their first Florida State League championship in 2023.

DUNEDIN BLUE JAYS COACHING STAFF

Gil Kim | Manager *Year with Toronto: 10 | Year with D-Jays: 1 | Born: Pottsville, PA*

First-year Manager Gil Kim provides a wealth of experience as a player, coach, and executive to Dunedin. Hired in 2016 as the Blue Jays Director of Player Development, Kim transitioned from the front office to a coaching role with the organization in 2020 when he joined Toronto's major league field staff under the same job title, before becoming the Blue Jay's major league field coordinator in 2022, a position he held until 2024. Before joining Toronto, Kim spent seven seasons with the Texas Rangers in several scouting roles, culminating as Director, International Scouting. A native of Pottsville, PA, Kim also had a six-year international professional playing career as an infielder, which included stops in the Netherlands, China, Australia, Spain and Venezuela. He played one season of collegiate baseball at D3 Middlebury before transferring to Vanderbilt, where he played under Tim Corbin. In 2008 while playing in Venezuela, Kim slept on a mattress in the bathroom in the locker room to save money and learn Spanish.

Cory Riordan | Pitching Coach *Year with Toronto: 5 | Year with D-Jays: 3 | Born: Killingworth, CT*

Cory Riordan enters his third season as Dunedin's Pitching Coach, after he held the same role with the FCL Blue Jays in 2021-22. He joined the Blue Jays organization in 2020, where he spent the 2020 shutdown assisting with the club's pitch design framework. Riordan pitched collegiately at Fordham University and went on to play 13 professional seasons, spending time with the Colorado Rockies and Detroit Tigers organizations, reaching as high as Triple-A. He also spent time in the independent Atlantic League, and played internationally in South Korea and Taiwan, and three winter ball seasons in Venezuela and the Dominican Republic.

Nash Knight | Hitting Coach *Year with Toronto: 2 | Year with D-Jays: 2 | Born: Denton, TX*

Nash Knight enters his second season with the Dunedin Blue Jays and Jays' organization. Under Knight's guidance in 2024, Dunedin ranked among the Florida State League leaders with 101 HR (3rd), 34 3B (T-1st), and a .359 SLG (3rd). Knight made the transition to coaching following a seven-year playing career where he spent six seasons in Toronto's farm system, reaching as high as Triple-A. He also spent time with the Rangers and Twins in his final season on the diamond 2022. A Dallas Baptist University product, Knight hit .245/.350/.352 while playing in 556 career minor league games. Knight suited up for Dunedin in parts of two seasons, playing 105 career games at TD Ballpark in his career, notably playing all nine positions in a game on Sept. 2, 2018 for a team managed by Casey Candaele. Was a member of 2017 FSL Co-Champion Dunedin team which was managed by current Toronto skipper John Schneider and included future big leaguers including Vladimir Guererro Jr, Bo Bichette, Lourdes Gurriel Jr, Jordan Romano, and Ryan Borucki. Majored in kinesiology at DBU. Brother, Austin, has coached at DBU, Texas A&M, and most recently coached in the Mariners organization.

Ashley Stephenson | Position Coach *Year with Toronto: 3 | Year with D-Jays: 1 | Born: Mississauga, ON.*

Stephenson is in her first season as Position Coach, after she spent the prior two seasons with the High-A Vancouver Canadians in the same role, helping to claim a 2023 Northwest League championship. Inducted to the Canadian Baseball Hall of Fame in 2024, Stephenson has enjoyed a storied multi-sport career. Initially a star hockey player at the collegiate level at Wilfrid Laurier, she claimed four conference titles and a CIS National Championship, before joining the pro ranks in the original National Women's Hockey League and the Canadian Women's Hockey League. On the diamond, Stephenson starred for Canada's women's national baseball team from 2004 to 2018. She was twice named the team's MVP, earned an All-Star nod at third base in the 2008 IBAF World Cup Tournament and won the 2011 Baseball Canada Jimmy Rattlesnake Award, which was renamed in her honor. She was tabbed as the 2022 recipient of the Baseball Canada Lionel Ruhr Elite Coach of the Year Award after she became the first woman to manage a Canadian national baseball team when she led the women's national team to two wins over Team USA in the Friendship Series then coached Ontario teams at the Women's Invitational and 16U Girls Championships ahead of joining the Blue Jays organization. Became the second female coach in the Jays system, following Jamie Lever.

Jonathan Davis | Ast. Hitting Coach *Year with Toronto: 1 | Year with D-Jays: 1 | Born: Camden, AR*

Davis enters his first season as a coach after retiring from an 11-year professional playing career this offseason. Davis spent parts of six seasons in MLB, including three with the Blue Jays, and one with the Yankees, Brewers, and Marlins. Davis was initially drafted by the Blue Jays in 2013 and made his MLB Debut in 2018 for the Jays. He spent parts of two seasons with the Dunedin Blue Jays in 2015 and 2016, where he played in a career 167 games for Dunedin with 15 HR, 72 RBI, and 38 RBI. Davis played in 2017 Arizona Fall League, where he hit .295 and helped the Peoria Javelinas win the AFL Championship on a team that included 19-year-old Ronald Acuna Jr. Hit the first cycle in Double-A New Hampshire history on June 16, 2017. Most recently played 34 games for the Marlins in 2023, and spent 2024 with the Marlins Triple-A Jacksonville. In 205 career MLB games, Davis hit .199/.295/.276 with 6 HR, 30 RBI, and 19 SB.

Rodrigo Vigil | Position Coach *Year with Toronto: 3 | Year with D-Jays: 1 | Born: David, Panama*

Vigil joins Dunedin for his first season as a Position Coach. A former catcher, Vigil enjoyed an 11-year professional playing career. He spent 10 seasons in the Miami Marlins farm system before finishing with the Blue Jays in 2021, where he hit .275 in 34 games between Double-A New Hampshire and Triple-A Buffalo. Overall, Vigil played 550 career minor league games, where he hit .251. He began his coaching career as a bench coach for the ACL Mariners in 2022 before returning to the Blue Jays system, where he spent the past two seasons as a rehab position coach.

Antonio Caceres | Bullpen Coach *Year with Toronto: 25 | Year with D-Jays: 1 | Born: Cotui, DR*

Caceres spent the past three years as the Pitching Coach for the FCL Blue Jays. A lifelong member of the Blue Jays organization, Caceres was signed out of the Dominican Republic by Toronto when he was 17. He played in their minor league system from 1995-1998, before he transitioned to a pitching coach role in 2000. He's spent the past 24 years working as a pitching coach at the lower levels of the farm system, mentoring stars over the years including Aaron Sanchez, Noah Syndergaard, Joe Musgrove, Jordan Romano, Daniel Norris, and Roberto Osuna. Has served as Pitching Coach under Dennis Holmberg for 10 seasons, also working under current Blue Jays coaches Brent Lavallee, Jose Mayorga, Cesar Martin, Dallas McPherson, and current Miami Marlins Manager Clayton McCullough.

SCOUTING REPORT: Fastball (93-97), Slider (87-89), Splitter (83-85), Curveball (80-83)

2025: Made unofficial professional debut in the 2025 Spring Breakout game vs. MIN, where Yesavage earned the win, as he hurled 2 IP, 0 R, 2 H, 3 K, 0 BB, including striking out the side in his second inning of work, and touched 97 MPH in the Jays' 10-0 victory. "When I got out there, my heart was beating like crazy," Yesavage said. "It's my first professional baseball outing, so I kind of expected it, but I was able to settle myself down in the dugout and focus on what I needed to do." It was Yesavage's first time pitching in a game setting in nearly eight months. He was named 1st Team All-Spring Breakout.

College Notes: Pitched three seasons at East Carolina University. Yesavage spent his freshman season in the Pirates bullpen, where he compiled a 4.50 ERA with 45 K over 26 IP in 34 games. Worked his way into the starting rotation as a sophomore in 2023, when he led ECU's staff with a 2.61 ERA and 105 K in 76.0 IP over 16 appearances (14 starts). As a junior in 2024, Yesavage put together an 11-1 record while compiling a 2.02 ERA with 145 K and 32 BB in 93.1 IP. Won the AAC pitching triple crown, pacing the league in ERA, K, and W. Yesavage tied the ECU and AAC single-season record for strikeouts. As a junior he ranked among nation leaders with 145 K (2nd), 0.87 WHIP (2nd), 4.73 H/9 (2nd), 2.02 ERA (3rd), and 13.98 K/9 (9th). Described his key to success in 2024 as adding muscle by "putting some pounds on that squat bar," the development of his cutter and splitter, and mentality on the mound of "I'm better than the hitter in the box and he's not getting past me." Just ahead of the 2024 AAC Tournament in Clearwater, FL, Yesavage suffered a partially collapsed lung which landed him in the hospital for two nights, most likely caused by an accident during a dry needling session, a common form of physical therapy for recovery. Without Yesavage, ECU lost to Wichita State in the AAC Championship, but we're able to secure an at-large bid to the 2024 NCAA playoffs. After dropping the first game of the double-elimination tournament, Yesavage got the start in his return to the mound just a week after his hospital stay vs. Wake Forrest's Chase Burns, and outdueled the eventual No. 2 overall pick in the MLB Draft, throwing 7.1 heroic IP with 1 ER and 6 K to propel ECU past Wake Forest in an elimination game, Yesavage's final collegiate outing. "I wanted to pitch in the Regional in front of our fans, but I also know that the guys look up to me and we just hit a different gear when I'm on the mound," Yesavage told reporters at the 2024 MLB Draft Combine. "So I knew it was in the best interest of the team for me to get back on that mound."

Career Notes: Selected 20th overall by the Blue Jays in the 2024 MLB Draft and signed for \$4,177,500. Was ranked by MLB Pipeline as the draft's No. 11 prospect. MLB Pipeline has 2026 listed as MLB ETA. Was tabbed as the most MLB ready pitcher in the 2025 MLB Draft Class by Keith Law of The Athletic. Participated in 2024 MLB Draft Combine, where he met with 18 teams in three days, and described that part of the draft process as the most grueling. When Yesavage was drafted, the Blue Jays front office told him "we got you at the spot for a reason, keep doing what your doing" and Yesavage has stayed on his pitching program provided by the Blue Jays and not made any major adjustments to his delivery or arsenal since joining the organization. "We picked him for a reason," Blue Jays director of player development Joe Scalfani said. "He has now stuff, as they say. So it's more about getting him out there, getting him in a good routine and focusing on those things so that he pitch hopefully into September. We're still working out the details on how, but we like to let these guys go show what they can do and prove the reason they're here for a little bit." Played for Team USA Collegiate National Team in 2023, and considers one of the top moments in his playing career a walk-off win vs. Chinese Taipei on the 4th of July.

Personal Notes: Native of Boyerstown, PA, a town of just over 4,000 people approximately an hour west of Philadelphia. Yesavage would become the first player from Boyerstown High School to make his major league debut if he does so. Grew up a Philadelphia Eagles and Philadelphia Phillies fan, idolized Ryan Howard. Son of Cheryl and Dave Yesavage, one of three brothers. Cole, is attending Salisbury University in the fall to play football, Chase is attending Stockton University to play lacrosse. Visited Rogers Centre after being drafted, was his first time ever leaving the country. Three days before the draft, he had a feeling he might be going to the Blue Jays, and applied for a passport. Didn't pay to have it expedited faster than normally, but when he got drafted the Blue Jays told him they'd like him to get his passport as soon as possible, so he had to call the service and pay an extra \$100 for rush processing. Spent this past offseason at ECU in Greenville, where he trained and took classes during the fall, describing the fall semester as a fun senior year of college which included working out, going to a couple of classes here and there, and spending time with friends. Yesavage worked out with numerous professional ECU alums, including Blue Jays prospect Carter Cunningham, who was his roommate this offseason. Austin Knight is the Pitching Coach at East Carolina, brother of Dunedin Blue Jays Hitting Coach Nash Knight, and Trey considers Austin as one of his greatest mentors. Has also learned a lot working with Guardians Pitcher Gavin Williams, an ECU alum. Yesavage described ECU Head Coach Cliff Godwin as another great mentor, fun to play for but could kick it into high gear when needed. Met Blue Jays RHP Jeff Hoffman this spring, another ECU alum. Yesavage was an Honor Roll student and Academic All-American at ECU. Yesavage is still enrolled at ECU and in pursuit of his degree, which he hopes to finish by next season. Majored in communications. Yesavage's throwing partner during his time with the Blue Jays has been second round pick Khal Stephen. Yesavage is superstitious during starts and only gives fist bumps with his left hand. Avid hunter and fisherman, owned a kayak in Greenville that he would put in the bed of his truck and take to lakes and kayak out on his own. First thing he bought with his signing bonus upon being drafted was NCAA Football 25, but says he would like to buy a boat. Hobbies include hunting, fishing, and kayaking .
