### "FUN IS GOOD" FACTOIDS

**STORM CHASERS QUIET SAINTS BATS IN OPENER:** The Saints lineup only mustered up two hits and five total baserunners as they were shutout for the second time this season in a 3-0 loss to the Omaha Storm Chasers Tuesday night at CHS Field. The two hits were the fewest the Saints have collected in a game so far this season and Tuesday marked the first time since July 11, 2024 @ Louisville that the Saints were held to two hits or less. It was just the ninth time in franchise history that St. Paul were limited to two hits or fewer at CHS Field with the last instance occurring on July 6 last season vs Gwinnett (the Saints have been no-hit once all-time at home, on April 13, 2022 vs Indianapolis). The lack of offense overshadowed a superb start from Zebby Matthews, who matched a career-high with nine strikeouts while yielding two runs, four hits, and one walk in five innings of work. His 9.0-inning scoreless streak to start the year came to an end after giving up back-to-back two-out hits in the fifth.

**RISP AVERSE:** Since going 9-for-20 in their season-opening win with runners in scoring position on March 28 against Indianapolis, the Saints are hitting just .137 (7-for-51) in such situations since then, the worst in the International League and the **2nd-worst in Triple-A in that span**. The Saints do not have a single extra-base hit with runners in scoring position in that stretch after smacking three doubles and a triple in such situations on Opening Night at CHS Field, an 11-0 drubbing of the Indians.

**KEASCHALL IS KEY:** After drawing a walk in his final plate appearance of the night on Tuesday, Twins No. 3 prospect Luke Keaschall has now gotten on base safely in each of his first seven Triple-A games. He is one of eight hitters in the International League that has reached base in all of their team's games to start the season entering play Wednesday (see below):

**NO CHEAP ONES:** After producing a season-low four "hard hit" balls on Tuesday night against Omaha, the Saints now rank **6th in Triple-A in average exit velocity** with an 88.9 mph average exit velo as a team (they had entered the series 2nd in the Triple-A circuit). In Friday, March 28th's season opener, the Saints lineup produced 14 "hard-hit" balls and have had at least 6 in each of their five road games in Columbus. The Saints have belted a total of 39 batted balls already that have exceeded 100 mph of exit velocity, including 11 in their 11-0 victory in the home opener. Carson McCusker (2x), Emmanuel Rodriguez, and Jair Camargo (2x) have all have peaked with exit velocities over 110 mph already this year, all ranking among the **top-50 hardest hit balls in the International League** this season

**MCCUSKER MASHING:** Saints outfielder Carson McCusker is crushing the ball to open the season and currently ranks 2nd in Triple-A in average exit velocity to start the season, averaging 110.4 mph on his batted balls, trailing only Gwinnett's Chandler Seagle (106.1). McCusker continued to turn heads with another rocket last Wednesday in Columbus, delivering the hardest hit ball of the season so far with a 114.2 mph single in the 6th inning. The hit ranks tied for the ninth hardest hit ball in Saints history (see below). Now just 28 games into his short Triple-A tenure, he already has six batted balls registered at 110 mph or harder (two so far this season) after making his Triple-A debut on August 24 last season.

**MODEL-T GOES YARD:** First baseman Mike Ford touched off for the first home run by a Saints hitter this year with a leadoff blast in the third inning on Tuesday, marking the 125th of his minor league career and the 162nd of his pro career between the minors and Major Leagues (171 longballs incl. 9 HR in the NPB last year). His 125 minor league round-trippers now ranks **t-75th among active players**. At 32 years of age, Ford is the third-oldest player in Saints history to leave the yard, trailing only Elliot Soto and Drew Maggi, who were 33 and 32, respectively, at the time of their last Saints home runs in 2021 & 2022. In each of their first four seasons as a Triple-A club, the first Saints home run of the season came on Opening Day.

**HOME SWEET HOME:** During the past five seasons as a Triple-A club (2021-25), the Saints are **fifth in all of Minor League baseball** with 164 home wins, trailing only Nashville (180), Bowling Green (174), Durham (174), and Tacoma (170). Their .570 Win% at home is fourth-best in Triple-A and third in the IL in that span. Last year's 35-38 record was the 1st season the Saints played below .500 at home in 4 years as a Triple-A club.

**THE STARS OF TOMORROW, TODAY:** The Saints Opening Day roster features nine of Minnesota's Top-30 prospects according to MLB.com and ten according to Baseball America while also touting five of Minnesota's top-10 prospects on the MLB Pipeline list. The Twins prospects in the rankings include OF Emmanuel Rodriguez (No. 2, MLB.com, No. 2 BA), INF Luke Keaschall (3/3), RHP Zebby Matthews (-/4), RHP Marco Raya (6/8), RHP Andrew Morris (9/10), RHP Cory Lewis (11/20), INF Payton Eeles (23/17), RHP Travis Adams (22/22), C Diego Cartaya (24/21), & C Jair Camargo (-/23). Both Rodriguez (19/37) and Keaschall (45/60) rank among the top-100 overall lists of both publications.

**LAST APPEARANCE:** In his first start of the season, became the third Saints starting pitcher in-a-row to throw up five shutout innings (followed David Festa and Zebby Matthews), but took a no-decision as he left a 0-0 game that Columbus went on to win 2-0. Allowed baserunners in each of the first four innings and stranded five baserunners, including wriggling out of a bases-loaded jam in the fourth.

**ON THE FAST TRACK:** In just his second full-season in the minors last year, Morris ascended through three levels of the minor league ladder to finish the year making his first six starts at the Triple-A level. It's not the first time that Morris has accelerated at a faster pace than his peers. He graduated high school at just 16 years old, starting his freshman season of college at just 17. He was born on the cutoff date of September 1 for starting school and his mother chose to start him in kindergarten a year ahead. Not only that, he also skipped second grade as he was being homeschooled in Alaska.

**BUILDING UP TRAVEL POINTS:** Although he was born in New York City, Morris claims Boulder, Colorado as his hometown. He moved from NYC as a child to Oregon, then to Alaska, and then to Colorado, where he attended Monarch High School in Boulder. He tells people Boulder is where he's from as that's where he lived the longest.

**LET'S GET FUNKY:** Lacking the prototypical build of a frontline starter, Morris' unusual delivery has been noted as a reason why hitters have such a hard time picking up his pitches. Fangraphs prospect writer Eric Longenhagen noted in [last year's mid-season report](#) that "Morris' delivery is weird. He has a high front side throughout his delivery and creates a slight crossfire angle with stride direction before throwing out of a high arm slot. It's rare for cross-bodied pitchers to also have a north/south arm slot this extreme and it seems to disorient hitters."

**CLIMBING THE LADDER:** Before transferring to Texas Tech for his senior year, Morris pitched for three years at Division 2 Colorado Mesa University, helping his team reach the DII National Championship Game in 2019 as a freshman (Mesa finished as Runner-up to Tampa that year). Morris was named the Rocky Mountain Athletic Conference Freshman of the Year for his efforts that season and was a Division 2 2nd-Team All-American in 2021 before transferring to Texas Tech as a redshirt junior.

**MAD MORRIS:** Morris' mound routine can involve arguing with himself or talking to himself on the mound. "I'm really just analyzing the last pitch, moving on to the next pitch and what it should be," Morris remarked. "Sometimes there are not-so-nice words involved, but really it's 'Trust it. Throw it to the mask' Other times, 'it's good left side, how can we work off of that? What's next, and then next?' There's lots of things going through my head."

**LAST APPEARANCE:** Appeared in relief behind an Andrew Morris start for his first outing of the season and threw 1.2 scoreless to keep a 0-0 deadlock in Columbus going on Wednesday. Struck out four of the six hitters he faced and walked two (also recorded an out on a caught stealing). Did not allow a ball to be put in play.

**THE KNUCKLEBALL FRATERNITY:** When he debuted on September 19 with the Saints last season, Lewis became just the third pitcher in Triple-A to throw an offering recorded as a knuckleball (not counting position players) by pitch tracking last year, joining El Paso's Matt Waldron and Lehigh Valley's Nick Nelson. Only Waldron threw the knuckleball more than 7% of the time like Lewis (it was Waldron's primary offering at 43%) & neither Waldron nor Nelson's knuckleball averaged more than 80 mph. Lewis' hard-knuckler came in at an average of 83.2 mph, with his hardest of the day clocking in at 85.8 mph. MLB's Statcast system has never in its 17 seasons of existence recorded a knuckleball in the Major Leagues faster than 84.2 mph (thrown by Padres' Matt Waldon in June 2024). In a poll of seven Twins catchers at this year's Spring Training, the group identified Lewis' knuckleball as [the filthiest pitch in camp](#). Saints catcher Patrick Winkel told the Minnesota Star Tribune's Bobby Nightengale that one of the knuckleballs Lewis threw in pregame warm-ups hit him squarely in the mask.

**R.A. DICKEY ON LINE 1:** One of Lewis' secondary offerings is a knuckleball that he picked up when he was 10 years old. He started throwing it at a Pony League All-Star practice and blew away coaches with it. His high school coaches allowed him to stick with it and realized in college that it was for real. Along the way, he has gotten tips from R.A. Dickey on how to throw the pitch, which will average in the mid-80s.

**THE BEST WAY TO CATCH A KNUCKLEBALL? WAIT TIL IT STOPS ROLLING AND PICK IT UP :** When the Twins took Lewis in the ninth round of the 2022 MLB Amateur Draft, Lewis bought an oversized catching mitt, which he passes along to anyone who catches for him. Catchers joke that it looks like a softball first base mitt, but it's absolutely necessary.

**LEWIS KNOWS NO-NO'S:** In Lewis' final Double-A outing last season on September 12, he did not allow a hit until there were two outs in the fifth inning. However, he has been part of a no-hitter in his career. On May 14, 2023 with Fort Myers, Lewis spun 5.2 innings of perfect baseball, retiring all 17 hitters he faced, striking out seven. The Mighty Missels went on to finish the game without allowing a hit or a walk, but lost the perfect game on a wild pitch and a dropped third strike in the eighth inning.
