TODAY'S HEADLINES

LAST GAME'S RESULT - The St. Paul Saints got home runs from Mark Contreras and Curtis Terry that plated five of the six runs. Devin Smeltzer tossed 5.0 shutout innings allowing three hits and struck out three as the Saints defeated the Indianapolis Indians 6-4 on Friday night. Contreras went 2-4 with a double, home run, three RBI, and a run scored.

F-R-I-G-I-D - Prior to 2022, the coldest game in the 30-season history of the franchise was 39 degrees on May 19, 2019. The Saints topped that with a 38 degree game on April 13. Then, on April 15, they obliterated that record at 32 degrees. It was the third coldest game in Minnesota professional baseball history, dating back to 1961. The Twins have the two coldest games in the state when they played a 27 degree game on April 7, 2018 vs. Seattle and a 31 degree game on April 17, 2014 in the first game of a doubleheader against Toronto.

LEFT SIDE: Mark Contreras entered play on April 15 with just seven home runs off left-handed pitchers among his 45 career home runs. On April 15 vs. left-hander Blake Weiman, Contreras turned on a pitch and blasted a three-run homer, his eighth home run off a left-hander in 46 career homers.

BANG IT - For the first time since the Saints became the Twins Triple-A affiliate, a game at CHS wasn't played on its scheduled day. Last year, the Saints had one game suspended in the fourth inning on June 20 vs. Iowa. The game was resumed two months later on August 17. The last game not played on its original day at CHS Field was July 31, 2020 when Winnipeg's bus had mechanical issues. The last game not played on its scheduled date due to weather Game 5 of the North Division Championship Series on September 9, 2019. The last regular season game canceled due to rain was May 21, 2019 vs. the Chicago Dogs.

TWO OUT BINGO: It's early, but if last year was any indication then this will become a trend. Mark Contreras leads the team in two-out RBI, with five. Last season, Contreras led the team in 2 Out RBI (27), while posting a .927 OPS with 2 outs (8HR/11DB). The 34 two out hits by Contreras trailed only Tomas Telis (39) and Jimmy Kerrigan (35).

AN ACTUAL NO-HITTER: The St. Paul Saints were no-hit by the Indianapolis Indians on April 13 at CHS Field. It's the first nine inning no-hitter against the Saints in franchise history. Last season, the Saints failed to collect a hit in game one of a doubleheader against the Iowa Cubs in Iowa on July 11. By Major League Baseball logic, the seven inning no-hitter doesn't count as a no-hitter. They deem it a "notable achievement," so technically it's the first time the Saints have been no-hit. It was also the first ever no-hitter at CHS Field since it opened in 2015.

DOUBLE YOUR PLEASURE: The St. Paul Saints slugged seven doubles on April 10 at Louisville, setting a franchise record for most doubles in a game. While the Triple-A franchise is only a little over a year old, it's still an impressive feat. The old record was five, done twice last season.

EXTRA EXTRA READ ALL ABOUT IT: Along with the seven doubles on April 10 at Louisville, the Saints hit four home runs, for a total of 11 extra base hits. That tied a franchise record from June 10, 2021 vs. Omaha.

THE SISCO KID'S FIRST IMPRESSION: Chance Sisco played his first game with the Saints on April 9 and promptly homered in his third at bat. He became the seventh Saints player to homer in their first game. The other six did it in 2021: Ryan Jeffers, Roberto Peña, Alex Kirilloff, Jose Miranda, Jake Cave, and Gilberto Celestino.

Twins Update - Joe Ryan was impressive at Fenway Park. He tossed 6.0 innings allowing one run on five hits while striking out seven. Miguel Sanó ended his 0-19 start with a two-run homer and Luis Arraez collected two hits and two RBI as the Minnesota Twins doubled-up the Boston Red Sox 8-4

OUT OF OPTIONS...NOT SO FAST: It came down to the wire in 2021, but Thorpe was granted a very rare fourth option. About a week before the decision was given in his favor. A fourth option is given if "a player has had their first three options used before he plays five 'full seasons' — defined as at least 90 days on a Major or Minor League roster." Thorpe played in a short-season league that lasted fewer than 90 days in 2013, and missed all of 2015 and 2016 after undergoing TJ. His fifth "full" season would have been 2020, except he was sent to the alternate training site on August 31. The players association and MLB agreed that anyone in the majors for all nine weeks of the pandemic season would be credited with a season of service time, and that time would be prorated for players not on the roster all year. But the two sides neglected to address how to define a "full season" with regard to the fourth-year option rule, apparently overlooking the technicality.

DON'T CALL HIM A PIRATE: Growing up, Thorpe had vision issues. In order to correct those problems, he had to wear an eye patch over his good eye. This forced the bad eye to strengthen on its own.

NOT QUITE THE NEXT GLENN McGRATH: Australia is known for some fantastic cricket bowlers, one of them is the great Glenn McGrath, who has the most wickets in Tests, with 563. Baseball has been around as long as cricket in Australia. An 1868 report in the Quenbeyan Age said "Baseball... is merely a higher kind of rounders, and it has this solitary advantage over cricket, that, a match can be played off in an afternoon." As an amateur, Thorpe trained at the Melbourne Aces Baseball Academy, a six-week period of intense training jointly funded by the Australian Baseball League and the MLB that's held on the Queensland's Gold Coast. In 2011 won the "Golden Arm" award from the Australian Baseball Federation catching the eye of Twins scout Howard Norsetter, renowned for his ability to discover and sign Aussie hurlers such as Liam Hendricks & Grant Balfour.

SKIPPY THE BUSH KANGAROO: Skippy the Bush Kangaroo was an Australian TV series created by Australian actor John McCallum, Lionel (Bob) Austin, and Lee Robinson produced from 1967-69 about the adventures of a young boy and his highly intelligent pet kangaroo, and the various visitors to the fictional Waratah National Park. Perhaps that is where Thorpe got the name for the pet kangaroo, Skippy, he has at his home in Australia.

SELECT COMPANY: When Thorpe made his Major League debut on June 30, 2019 at Chicago, he became the eighth Australian born player to make his debut with the Twins. He joined Brad Thomas (2001), Grant Balfour (2001), Michael Nakamura (2003), Glenn Williams (2005), Luke Hughes (2010), Liam Hendricks (2011), and James Beresford (2016). Since Thorpe made his debut one other Australian has made his Twins debut, Aaron Whitefield in 2020.

SEVENTH HEAVEN: Not only did Thorpe join select Australian company in his debut, he joined select Twins pitching company as well. He became the sixth Twins pitcher to record seven-or-more strikeouts in debut, joining Boof Bonser (8 in 2006), Yohan Pino (7 in 2014), Darrell Jackson (7 in 1978), Bert Blyleven (7 in 1970) and Devin Smeltzer (7 on May 28, 2019). Combined with Smeltzer, marked the first time in Senators/Twins history to have multiple rookies strike out seven-plus batters in their debuts in the same season.
