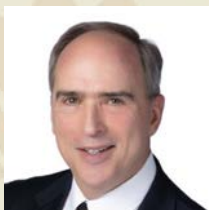
Hope Andrade

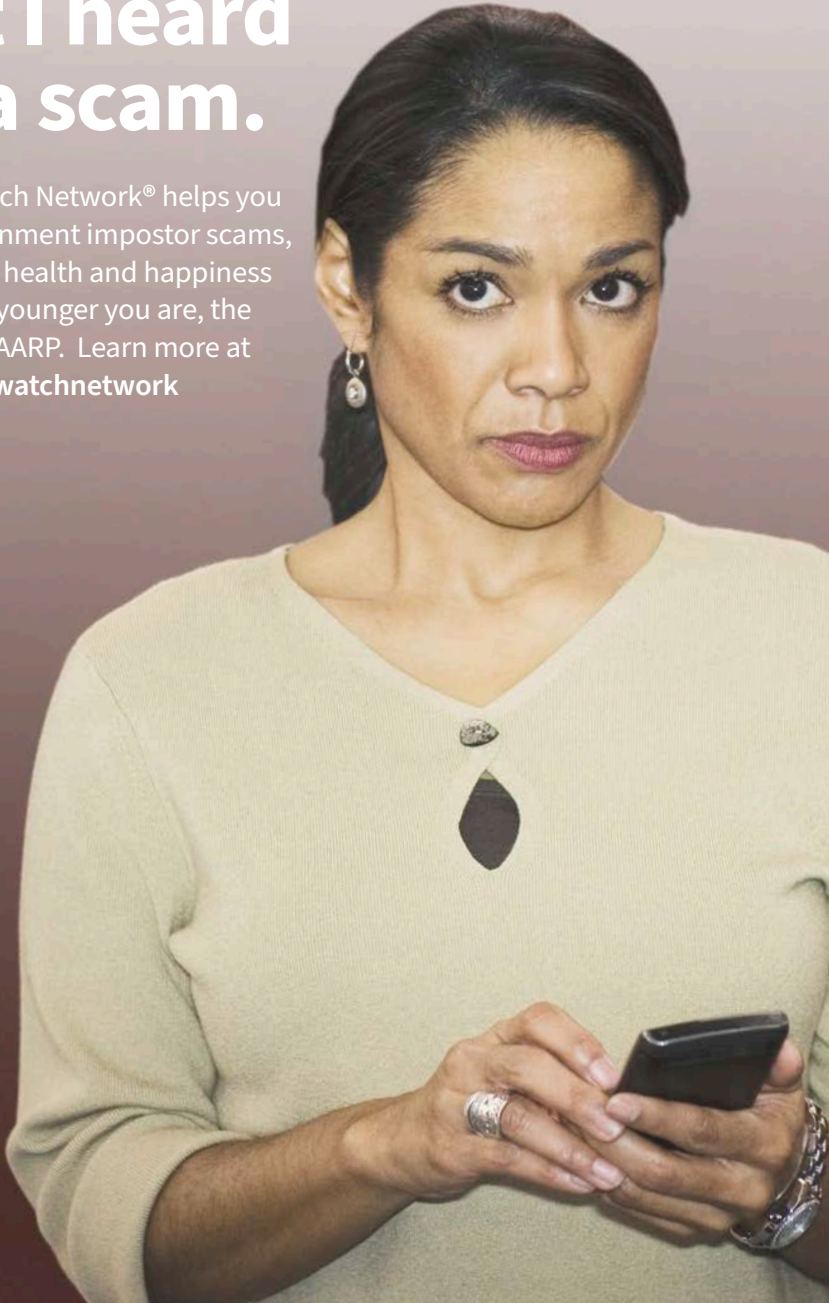

David Gasaway is entering his 37th season in professional sports, his 29th with the Missions and his 23rd as the team's General Manager.

He served as an intern in 1990-91, was the Director of Marketing from 1994-97 and has served in his current capacity since 2004.

He was a group sales executive for the High Desert Mavericks (1992), the Assistant General Manager for the Springfield Cardinals in 1993, the General Manager for the Independent League Somerset Patriots from 1998-2002 and the President of the Utah Grizzlies Hockey Club in 2003 before returning to the Alamo City.

Gasaway is a 1987 graduate of Judson High School and a 1991 graduate of Indiana University, where he was a double major in English Literature and Journalism.

Gasaway and his wife, Leticia, have been married for 32 years and have three adult children: Marie, Diana, and JD.



After 38 years as first General Manager and then President of the San Antonio Missions, Burl Yarbrough, a Texas League Hall of Famer, has transitioned into a new role as senior advisor for the club. Yarbrough will assist with various special projects, including the Missions' upcoming move to a new downtown ballpark.

Yarbrough joined San Antonio for the 1988 season and went on to lead the organization to unmatched heights.

During his tenure, the Missions won six Texas League Championships - 1997, 2002, 2003, 2007, 2011 and 2013.

He guided the Missions to tops in Texas League attendance five times, including a then Texas League record of 411,989 in 1994, the first season of Wolff Stadium. The organization's excellence that season under Yarbrough's leadership was also recognized by Baseball America in being named the Bob Freitas Award winner.

Yarbrough was honored four times with the Bill Valentine Texas League Executive of the Year, winning in 1989, 1994, 2011 and 2018.

In addition to Missions baseball, Yarbrough also served as President of the San Antonio Iguanas Hockey Club of the Central Hockey League from 1998 - 2002.

Prior to San Antonio, Yarbrough worked three years in South Carolina, serving as GM of two of those years for a Class A farm club of the Toronto Blue Jays in the South Atlantic League (SAL). The team was the SAL champions in 1985 and 1987.

Yarbrough hails from Fort Worth, Texas and earned his BBA from the University of Texas-Arlington and a Master's degree in Sports Administration from St. Thomas University in Miami.

Burl and his wife Tracey have two daughters, Taylor and Alex, and five precious grandchildren.

"It's been a wonderful experience here in San Antonio, and I'm looking forward to being part of the future here and helping the front office as they continue to make this one of the best franchises in Minor League Baseball," Yarbrough said.

Missions Manager Chris Tremie

Chris Tremie begins his first season in the San Diego Padres organization and as manager of the San Antonio Missions. He spent 13 seasons as a manager in the Cleveland Guardians organization and the last seven seasons as the minor league field coordinator for the Cincinnati Reds.

“Fans should expect to come out and see a team that’s going to compete on a daily basis,” Tremie said. “It will be a good brand of baseball. We’re going to play the game the right way.”



Tremie debuted as a catcher for the Chicago White Sox in 1995. He later played for the Texas Rangers, Pittsburgh Pirates and Houston Astros across a total of 22 Major League Baseball games. Tremie retired in 2005 as a member of the Round Rock Express, the Astros’ Triple-A affiliate at the time, and began his managing career in 2006 with the Cleveland organization. His time with Cleveland included two years of managing Double-A Akron and six years leading Triple-A Columbus.

The Houston native attended the University of Houston, where he helped lead the Cougars to two 40-win seasons before being drafted by the White Sox in the 39th round of the 1992 MLB Draft. As a minor leaguer in the White Sox organization, Tremie played with NBA legend Michael Jordan on the Double-A Birmingham Barons as Jordan attempted to play professional baseball.

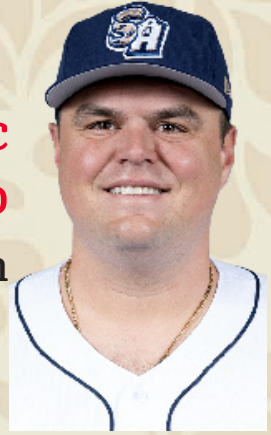

A native of El Segundo, California, Del Prado attended Willamette University and coached for four years at Lewis & Clark College in Oregon.

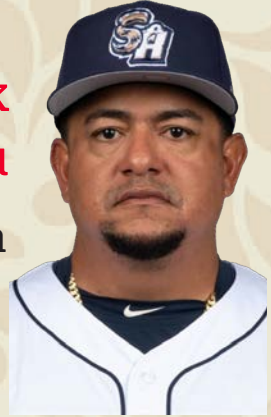

Billy Williams spent the majority of the 1959 season with the Missions and batted .318 with 22 doubles, 7 triples, 10 home runs, and 79 RBI in 94 games. He was inducted into the National Baseball Hall of Fame in 1987.



Joe Morgan spent 1964 with the San Antonio Bullets, the affiliate of the Astros. He was named Texas League Player of the Year after hitting .323 and a league-leading 42 doubles for the league champion Bullets. He was inducted into the National Baseball Hall of Fame in 1990.

FAQs

Accessible Seating: Nelson Wolff Stadium offers six sections for ADA seating: 100, 101, 102, 113, 114 and 115.

Alcohol: There is a limit of two alcoholic beverages per I.D. presented. Alcoholic beverage sales will end at the conclusion of the eighth inning.

Animals: Certified service dogs or service dogs in training for guests with disabilities are welcome. All other animals are prohibited except on select Bark in the Park games.

Baby Changing Areas: Changing stations are located inside every restroom at Nelson Wolff Stadium.

Bags: A new clear bag policy will be implemented beginning May 5, 2026. Small clutches no larger than 5" by 9" will be allowed. Clear totes up to 12" by 12" by 6" are allowed. Any and all bags will be subject to a search upon entrance at Nelson Wolff Stadium for a baseball game or other events. Exceptions to this policy include medical bags or manufactured diaper bags for accompanying infants and young children.

Business Office: The San Antonio Missions administrative office is located on the first base side of the concourse of Nelson Wolff Stadium. Office hours are 9 am-5 pm. during non-game days. On game days, the office opens at 10 a.m. The office number is (210) 675-7275.

Cameras: Individual, single-lens cameras and hand-held video cameras are permitted, but no lens bigger than 200mm is permitted without media credentials.

Cashless: Nelson Wolff Stadium is cashless for Missions games and other events. This includes the Team Store, concessions, parking and Box Office.

Children: Children ages three and under get in free but need to sit in the lap of an accompanying adult. Children ages four and above require a ticket.

Customer Service: Located on the concourse near the center gate. Guests can register for on field promotions, claim prizes, gameday info and find the elevator.

First-Aid: A medic is available at all Missions home games. The medic's office is located on the third base side of the ballpark.

Gates: The gates typically open one hour prior to game time, unless stated otherwise.

Giveaways: On promotional nights, the Missions will allow one giveaway item per person with a ticket. A fan with multiple tickets will still be given one giveaway item.

Lost and Found: Lost articles are held for 30 days. Guests may bring found items to Customer Service and call (210) 675-7275 in an effort to locate missing items.

Media Credentials: Anyone interested in becoming a credentialed media member must email byancelson@samissions.com. The club asks that submissions be submitted at least 24 hours in advance of game time. The Missions reserve the right to deny any media credential requests.

Prohibited Items: Weapons of any kind (even with a permit), non-clear bags (see bag policy), distracting banners/signs, inflatables, glass bottles, fireworks, laser devices, skateboards/rollerblades, toy guns and knives, sticks/clubs, airhorns and artificial noisemakes and unmanned aerial vehicles all prohibited at Nelson Wolff Stadium.

Radios: Personal radios are permitted inside Nelson Wolff Stadium. All Missions games can be heard on KKYX 680 AM/104.9 FM/kkyx.com.

Rainout Policy: In the event five innings of a game are not played, except when the home team is in the lead after 4.5 innings, tickets may be exchanged for a future Missions regular season home game of equal or lesser value.

Scalped Tickets: Tickets may not be re-sold on the property of Nelson Wolff Stadium or in the parking areas that surround it.

Strollers: Strollers are allowed at Nelson Wolff Stadium and may be stored under guests' seats. Strollers may not block rows, aisles, or stairways.
