#### Abstract

THINKIN’ ‘BOUT LAST WEEK: The River Bandits took a 4-0 lead into the bottom of the fifth inning on Sunday, but were outscored 9-0 over the final four innings and fell to Wisconsin 9-4 ... the loss cemented Quad Cities' tenth series Ioss of the season ... starter Luinder Avila came one out away from completing 5.0 scoreless innings, but ended up with the loss, allowing five runs with two outs in the fifth inning ... Carter Jensen led the bats with his 10th homer of the season, while Juan Carlos Negret chipped in a double and a pair of RBIs.

SWEPT UP: In their last meeting with Peoria, the River Bandits ( $8 / 1-8 / 6$ ) suffered their only six-game series sweep of the season and were outscored 26-12 ... Quad Cities batted just . 204 (39-for-191) over the week and was shutout in back to back games on August 4 and 5 as part of a 30.0 -inning scoreless streak.


HE GETS ON BASE: Eric Kennedy reached in exactly half of his plate appearances last week, posting a .500 OBP in five games against the Timber Rattlers ... the former Texas Longhorn owns a . 448 OBP. including 14 walks through his first 14 games as a River Bandit.

THE KC KID: With a home run on Sunday, Carter Jensen has recorded a hit in five-straight games, including multi-hit efforts in four of his last seven ... last week, the Royals' No. 7 prospect slashed .364/.444/.818 with five extra-base hits and five RBIs ... the 20 -year-old also worked four walks, making him one of one of three players in the Midwest League with 80 or more this season ... Jensen's $18.1 \%$ walk rate ranks fourth-best in High-A.

KING JUAN CARLOS: Despite failing to leave the yard last week, Juan Carlos Negret remains tied for the Midwest League-lead with 18 homers ... the outfielder's total matches his 2022 total with Quad Cities ... since debuting at the level last season, Negret leads High-A with 36 home runs and 130 RBls over 190 games as a River Bandit.

CONGRATS ON THE PROMOTION: LHP Rylan Kaufman and RHP Eric Cerantola were both promoted to NW Arkansas (AA) on Monday, making them the 14th and 15th Naturals to have spent time in Quad Cities this season ... in their place, right-handers Shane Panzini and Marcus Olivarez were both join the Bandits from Columbia (A) ... Panzini, the Royals fourth-round selection in the 2021 draft, made 20 starts with the Fireflies this season and pitched to a 4.47

ERA with 98 strikeouts in 90.2 IP ... Olivarez, a 2022 free agent signee, made 28 relief appearances for Columbia (A) and posted a $11.9 \mathrm{SO} / 9$ over 40.0 IP.

SHERVYEN UP THE OFFENSE: After posting just a . 495 OPS in the first half, Shervyen Newton has been one of Quad Cities' top bats in the second half, cranking eight of his season's 12 homers and swinging to an . 859 OPS since June 23 ... the infielder has notched hits in 22 of his last 24 games, owns a team-best 24-game on base streak (the longest active mark in the Midwest League), and is slashing .325/.388/.597 with 13 extra-base hits and 15 RBIs in August (21 games).

PROSPECTING THE RIVER: The River Bandits roster features five of the Royals top 30 prospects (MLB Pipeline): Ben Kudrna (3), Frank Mozzicato (4), Carter Jensen (7), David Sandlin (21), and Luinder Avila (30) ... Quad Cities roster has featured 13 of the Royals' top 30 prospects at some point this season, including Cayden Wallace (2), Gavin Cross (6), and Javier Vaz (15).

A CENTURY OF BASEBALL: The 2023 season marks the 100th year of professional baseball in Davenport, dating back to the 1897 Davenport Brown Stockings of the Northwestern League ... since then, the franchise has been part of nine different leagues, affiliated with 12 different Major League clubs, and sported 18 different monikers.

PART OF THE ROYAL FAMILY: 2023 marks the River Bandits third season as an affiliate of the Kansas City Royals ... since joining the Royals organization, six River Bandits have made their Major League debuts with Kansas City: Angel Zerpa ('21), Michael Massey ('21), Vinnie Pasquantino ('21), Nate Eaton ('21), Maikel Garcia ('21), and John McMillon ('23).

## MANIGER BROOKS CONRID

Brooks Conrad manages the River Bandits for the second-consecutive season, his seventh (sixth managerial) in the Royals organization, after managing the Columbia Firefiles in their first year as a Royals affiliate in 2021. The 43-year-old led the Lexington Legends to a South Atlantic League Title and was honored with the Dick Howser Award, which is given annually to one Royals player development employee for outstanding contributions to the organization. Conrad was slated to lead Lexington again in 2020 before the MiLB season was canceled. He joined the Royals organization as First Base Coach at Burlington in 2017, before serving as Manager there in 2018.

- LAST TIME OUT: The left-hander didn't factor into the decision against the Wisconsin Timber Rattlers August 22 at Fox Cities Stadium ... pitched 5.0 innings, allowing two runs (one earned) on two hits, three walks, and seven strikeouts ... threw 53 of 90 total pitches for a strike (58.8\%).
2023: Began the season with Columbia (A) and posted a 3.04 ERA (19 ER in 56.1 IP) across 12 starts with 85 strikeouts ( $13.6 \mathrm{~S} 0 / 9$ ) prior to his promotion to Quad Cities (A+) on July 2 ... departed the Carolina League as the Fireflies' all-time strikeout leader with 174 in innings 125.1 innings over his 31 Single-A outings, including the club's single-game record 13 against Fayetteville on April 18.
- 2022: Spent his first professional season with Columbia (A), where he pitched to a 4.30 ERA ( 33 ER in 69.0 IP) and recorded 89 strikeouts ( $11.6 \mathrm{SO} / 9$ ).
- 2021: Graduated from East Catholic High School (Connecticut) where as a senior, he led the Eagles to the 2021 Class M State Championship with a 17 -strikeout performance in the title game ... recorded 30.1 consecutive innings without allowing a hit during his senior season, including four consecutive no-hitters ... became the fifth Connecticut high school player selected in the 1st round of the Draft, and was committed to the University of Connecticut before signing with Kansas City ... also became the second-highest Connecticut based prep player selected in the history of the Draft, following Bobby Valentine (5th overall to Dodgers in 1968) ... he was the second-youngest player selected in the 1st round, six days older than IF Carson Williams (28th overall by Tampa Bay).
- Acquired: Selected in the 1st round (7th) of the 2021 MLB Draft from East Catholic High School (Connecticut).
