YESTERDAY: The Flying Squirrels lost to the Senators, 4-2. **Trevor Cohen** hit an RBI single in the second and **Dayson Croes** drove in a run with a groundout for a 2-0 Richmond lead. In the bottom of the second, Ethan Petry plated a run with a groundout to close the score to 2-1. In the bottom of the fourth, Elijah Green hit a solo homer to tie the score and Petry hit a two-run homer for a 4-2 Harrisburg lead. **Greg Farone** tied his longest outing of the year, allowing four runs (two earned) over six innings. **Marques Johnson** threw two scoreless innings. Richmond went 3-for-14 with runners in scoring position and left 12 on base.

POSTSEASON BOUND: The June 12 win clinched the Eastern League Southwest Division title for the Flying Squirrels, locking in a postseason berth. The Flying Squirrels will play the second-half division champion in the Division Series. Game 1 will be at the home of the second-half champion on Tues., Sept. 15. Game 2 and, if necessary, Game 3 will be at CarMax Park on Thurs., Sept. 17 and Sat., Sept. 18. If Richmond advances to the EL Championship Series, Game 1 will be at CarMax Park on Sun., Sept. 20. This year marks the fifth postseason appearance in franchise history and the first since 2023.

TODAY'S GAME: The Flying Squirrels face the Harrisburg Senators, Double-A affiliate of the Washington Nationals, in the second and third of a seven-game, six-day series. This is the third and final series between the two teams this season. Richmond went 4-2 against Harrisburg at CarMax Park from June 9-14. The Senators won three-of-five in Harrisburg from June 30-July 5, the second of three series losses this year for the Flying Squirrels. The doubleheader serves as a make-up for the July 4 rainout.

RECORD YEAR: The Flying Squirrels' 10-game win streak from April 4-15 was the longest in franchise history, surpassing an eight-game win streak from May 5-13, 2021, also beginning with the second game of the season. The 63-44 record the second-best in team history through 107 games, trailing only a 65-42 record in 2014. Richmond has won seven series, split nine and lost three so far this year. After opening the season with a 27-7 record through May 13, the Flying Squirrels are 36-37 in their last 73 games since.

RELENTLESS: In their 63 wins this year, the Flying Squirrels have come from behind in 31 of them. In 19 of the wins, Richmond has taken the lead in the eighth inning or later. The Flying Squirrels have 11 walk-off wins at CarMax Park this season, including at least one in all but one home series. **Diego Velasquez** has three walk-off hits this year, all in 10th innings. **Drew Cavanaugh**, **Parks Harber** and **Dayson Croes** each have two walk-off winners this year. Richmond has four wins after trailing by five-or-more runs this season. The Flying Squirrels are batting .284 in the ninth inning this year, which leads the EL and is fifth in MiLB.

THE FLYING SQUIRRELS won the Southwest Division first-half title by seven games over second-place Erie and has the Eastern League's best overall record this season. For the year, Richmond is first among all 30 Double-A teams in batting average (.271), second in sacrifice flies (41), third in doubles (201) and third in hits (964). The team has combined for 107 homers this year, surpassing 11 of the franchise's previous 15 season totals. The Flying Squirrels are on pace to set offensive single-season franchise records for batting average, runs, total bases, doubles, RBIs, stolen bases, OBP, SLG, OPS and sacrifice flies. The Richmond pitching staff has thrown nine shutouts this season, which is tied for first in the Eastern League and tied for second in Double-A. Richmond's No. 9 batters have combined to hit .328 this year, which leads the minors. The Flying Squirrels have scored 10-or-more runs 12 times this year, passing 2023 (11) for the most in a season in franchise history.

THE SENATORS are 4-6 in their 10 August games. They went 3-4 in seven games at Chesapeake last week, closing the series with a 1-0 shutout on Sunday, tying Richmond for the most shutouts in the EL this season. Harrisburg's roster features seven players ranked in Baseball America's top-30 Nationals prospects list, including 2B/SS Devin Fitz-Gerald (No. 4), RHP Jack Cebert (No. 17), LHP Alex Clemmey (No. 19), RHP Ben Grable (No. 20), RHP Yoel Tejada (No. 23), OF Ethan Petry (No. 25) and LHP Josh Hartle (No. 26). MLB.com's top-30 Nationals prospects list features eight Harrisburg players, including Fitz-Gerald (No. 6), Cebert (No. 13), Clemmey (No. 14), Petry (No. 15), Tejada (No. 16), C Caleb Lomavita (No. 24), Grable (No. 25) and Hartle (No. 28).

FOR RICHMOND: Right-hander **Trystan Vrieling** makes his 21st start of the season and the third of his career against the Senators in Game 1. He last pitched last Thursday and allowed three unearned runs over five innings with a season-high eight strikeouts. In his last six starts since June 30, Vrieling is 3-0 with a 2.56 ERA. On June 12, he threw a five-inning, complete-game shutout in a rain-shortened win over the Senators as the Flying Squirrels clinched the first-half title. Last year, he missed the start of the season before joining Double-A Somerset in May. After going 1-2 with a 4.50 ERA in 12 outings, he was traded at the deadline on August 1 to the Giants from the Yankees as part of the deal for reliever Camilo Doval. The trade happened in the middle of a Richmond series at Somerset. In 2024, he made professional debut against the Flying Squirrels on April 7 at TD Bank Ballpark to close opening weekend and threw five scoreless innings, allowing two hits with six strikeouts. Vrieling was selected by the Yankees in the third round of the 2022 MLB Draft out of Gonzaga. **For more on Vrieling, see page two.**

Left-hander **Jack Choate** makes his second start of the season. He last pitched on Sunday and threw a scoreless first inning. He has thrown 23 relief appearances this year. Among Eastern League relievers (min. 35 IP), Choate ranks eighth in ERA (3.11). He began the year picking up a winning decision in each of his first five appearances. In his first 18 outings of the season from April 4-June 27, he went 6-1 with a 1.84 ERA (6 ER/29.1 IP) before allowing five runs in one outing on July 1. In his five appearances since, he has posted a 2.00 ERA (2 ER/9.0 IP). If you remove his July 1 outing, Choate is 6-1 with a 1.93 ERA (8 ER/37.1 IP) this season. Choate is in his third season with Richmond and has gone 11-12 with a 3.87 ERA in 60 Double-A appearances, including 32 starts, dating back to 2024. Choate was selected by the Giants in the ninth round of the 2022 MLB Draft out of Assumption University. **For more on Choate, see page three.**

FOR HARRISBURG: Right-hander Holden Powell makes his third start of the season and his 26th Double-A appearance this year in Game 1. He last pitched in a two-inning start on Saturday and allowed one run. He has made three appearances this year against Richmond, totaling three scoreless innings. Powell was selected by the Nationals in the third round of the 2020 MLB Draft out of UCLA. He is in his fourth season with the Senators and has gone 6-7 with a 3.98 ERA in 79 appearances.

Left-hander Josh Hartle makes his 21st Eastern League start of the season and his second with the Senators. In his Nationals organization debut last Thursday, he allowed one run over 5.1 innings with seven strikeouts in a no-decision at Chesapeake. Hartle was selected in the third round of the 2024 MLB Draft by the Pittsburgh Pirates. He was traded to the Cleveland Guardians on December 10, 2024, along with Luis Ortiz and Michael Kennedy for Spencer Horwitz. He was traded from Cleveland to Washington on August 3 along with Will Dion, Nick Mitchell and Kennedy Virguez for LHP Foster Griffin. Hartle faced the Flying Squirrels with Akron in his second Double-A start on August 28, 2025 at The Diamond and allowed two runs over six innings in a loss. He made three starts against Richmond with Akron earlier this season. In his career in four starts against Richmond, Hartle is 0-2 with a 1.77 ERA (4 ER/20.1 IP).

NICE GOIN', COHEN: **Trevor Cohen** went hitless in last Thursday's doubleheader to snap a streak of eight consecutive games with multiple hits but has eight hits over his last four games since. Over his last 15 games since July 26, Cohen is batting .422 (27-for-64) with two homers, three doubles, 11 RBIs and 11 stolen bases, raising his Double-A batting average from .212 to .351. On July 31, he went 4-for-5 to tie his career high for hits and matched it with another 4-for-5 outing on Tuesday.

KILEN IT: In his first 21 Double-A games, **Gavin Kilen** is batting .325 (26-for-80) with a homer, eight doubles, a triple and 13 RBIs. For the season, he is tied for first among all MiLB hitters with 35 doubles. He is tied for first among all Giants minor league hitters with 78 RBIs this year. Kilen is riding a team-high nine-game hit streak since July 31, batting .361 (13-for-36). After playing in the All-Star Futures Game in Philadelphia, Kilen was promoted to Double-A on July 17. He has at least one hit in 18 of his 21 games in the Eastern League. Kilen was selected by the Giants last year out of the University of Tennessee with the 13th overall pick in the MLB Draft. He is tied for the third-highest pick in the MLB Draft in Flying Squirrels franchise history with Patrick Bailey (2020) and trailing only Joey Bart (2, 2018) and Hunter Bishop (10, 2019).

JACK ATTACK: In his last 41 games since June 5, **Jack Payton** is batting .348 (49-for-141) with two homers, eight doubles, a triple, 19 RBIs, 16 walks and 19 runs scored. He has 14 multi-hit performances in that span, including 10 two-hit games and four three-hit games. On August 1, he hit the first grand slam of the season for the Flying Squirrels and the second of his professional career. Payton has reached base 17 times in his current nine-game on-base streak dating back to July 29, the longest active streak for the Flying Squirrels.

SIZZLING: In his eight August games, **Charlie Szykowny** is batting .343 (12-for-35) with a homer, a double, two RBIs, two walks and two stolen bases. He clubbed a solo homer last Wednesday, his 12th of the year and his first since June 30. On Sunday, he went 4-for-5, setting a new seasons high for hits and tying his career high. For the year, he leads the Flying Squirrels in his (.97), extra-base hits (36) and total bases (161).

TOP SKIPPER: Flying Squirrels manager **Dennis Pelfrey** has led the team to 323 wins in his career, which is a franchise record all-time wins record for a manager. He passed the record with Richmond's 6-1 win at Binghamton on May 23, 2025. From 2011-2013, **Dave Machemer** won 216 games as Richmond's manager, leading the team to the Eastern League postseason for in 2011. Pelfrey, who has been with Richmond since the 2022 season, led the team to back-to-back postseason appearances for the first time in franchise history in 2022 and 2023. He also managed the 2021 Eugene Emeralds to the High-A West championship. Of Richmond managers since 1954, Pelfrey is second in wins behind Eddie Haas (1968, 1981-84), who had 351 wins.

IN THE LEAGUE LEADERS: In the Eastern League, **Diego Velasquez** is fifth in batting average (.295) and sixth in OBP (.384). **Charlie Szykowny** is tied for second in triples (4) and ninth in hits (97). **Bo Davidson** is tied for fifth in homers (19), fifth in SLG (.521) and 10th in OPS (.861). **Parks Harber** is ninth in batting average (.284), sixth in OPS (.879) and seventh in SLG (.510). **Jonah Cox** is first in triples (5) and ninth in stolen bases (27). **Tyler Vogel** is first in saves (13) and tied for eighth in wins (7). **Trystan Vrieling** is first in shutouts (1), tied for first in complete games (1), sixth in ERA (3.99) and fourth in BAA (.236).

PROSPECT WATCH: Richmond's roster features four players ranked in Baseball America's top-30 Giants prospects, including **Dakota Jordan** (No. 8), **Gavin Kilen** (No. 9), **Trevor Cohen** (No. 11) and RHP **Yuniur Marte** (No. 23). Jordan is rated as the organization's best athlete. MLB.com's top-30 Giants prospects list features five Richmond players, including Kilen (No. 4), Jordan (No. 5), Cohen (No. 11), **Jancel Villarroel** (No. 25), Marte (No. 27).

THIS DATE IN RICHMOND BASEBALL HISTORY

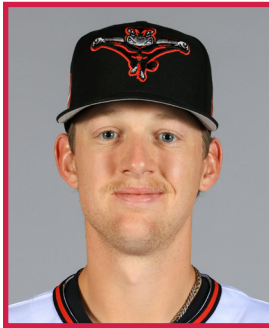
1971: The Richmond Braves beat the Tidewater Tides, 10-9, at Parker Field. After Richmond led by six runs at one time, the Tides evened the score with four runs in the seventh to tie the score, 7-7, capped with a homer by Chico Diaz. In the bottom of the ninth, Hank McGraw knocked a bases-loaded single to win the game.

1990: The Richmond Braves beat the Columbus Clippers, 6-5, at The Diamond. Bruce Crabbe won the game with a line drive off the left-field wall with one out. **2012:** The Flying Squirrels beat the Bowie Baysox, 1-0, at The Diamond. Juan Perez won the game with a one-out single in the bottom of the 10th inning, bringing in Ryan Cavan after hit leadoff double. Richmond pitchers Chris Heston and Brett Bochy combined to hold the Baysox to one hit. Heston threw 7.2 innings and struck out 11 batters. Bochy covered the final seven outs.

- Attended Kamiakin HS in Kennewick, where he was named MCC Pitcher of the Year and also played outfield
- Played basketball (shooting guard) in high school and played football (wide receiver) growing up
- Attended Gonzaga University, where he was teammates with former Flying Squirrels pitcher William Kempner
- Selected by the Yankees in the third round (100th overall) of the 2022 MLB Draft out of Gonzaga
- Traded from the Yankees to the Giants on July 31, 2025 along with C Jesus Rodriguez, INF Parks Harber and LHP Carlos De La Rosa in exchange for RHP Camilo Doval
- Had 14 wins with Somerset over two seasons, setting the record for the most career wins in the franchise's Double-A history
