War Eagle: Including his six innings of two-run ball from last night, giving him the victory, **Samuel Dutton** can boast the following achievements in his first full pro season:

- leads all of High-A in innings (114 1/3) and double plays induced (15)
- allowing .232 avg. with runners on base • 8 starts of at least 6 IP, 2 starts of at least 7 IP • 3 additional starts of at least 5 IP, 0 ER

Who's Hot: 18-year-old **Breyson Guede** is 8-for-19 (.421 avg.) in his last four games and batting .309 in his first 14 games in High-A. **Pedro Pineda** has a 1.157 OPS in August: 17-for-48, six doubles, two triples, three homers, .354 avg., .407 OBP, .750 slugging pct.

Who's Streaking: **Jake Reinisch** went 1-for-3 with walk last night to extend his team-high on-base streak to 31 games. Reinisch is batting .299 with a .436 OBP and a .514 slugging pct. during the streak, with 32 base hits and 24 walks.

No Place Like Home: With yesterday's win, the Lugnuts are 11-1 in their last 12 home games. For the year, the Nuts are 6-2-2 in home series and are averaging 6.27 runs/game, the best run-scoring home rate in the Midwest League. Lansing's overall 32-23 home record trails only South Bend (33-21) among MWL teams.

High Five: Second baseman **Jared Davis** collected hits in his first five Lugnuts at-bats, going 2-for-2 with a single, double, walk and sacrifice on Wednesday before notching a double, a single and a second single yesterday. A lineup to second in the seventh inning ended Davis' remarkable stretch. The Athletics' 17th-round selection in 2025 out of Virginia Tech, Davis joined the Nuts on Tuesday from the Arizona Complex League Athletics. His older brother, Austin, is currently in his second year as a regular for Sioux City (American Association).

Transaction: Earlier today, pitcher **Ryan Brown** was placed on the 7-day IL retroactive to August 20, leaving the Lugnuts' roster at 26 active players and two players (**Brown** and **Jack Mahoney**) on the IL.

Welcome Aboard: Infielder **Tanner Marsh** and starting pitcher **Jose Parra** both flew in last night from the Arizona Complex League Athletics, joining the Nuts in their full-season debuts. Southpaw Parra will start Tuesday at Great Lakes, while infielder Marsh, the A's ninth-round selection in the 2026 draft from Liberty, awaits his debut in the starting lineup.

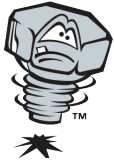

AUGUST 21 IN LUGNUTS HISTORY

2017: Nick Sinay eclipsed the Midwest League record for HBPs on a seventh-inning fastball from Yapson Gomez, his 37th HBP (on his way to 39 total for the year), and then the Lugnuts and South Bend Cubs paused six minutes to view partial solar eclipse in a Monday matinee at Cooley Law School Stadium. The Lugnuts fell 8-7 in 11 innings. The 10th inning ended on a peculiar play: J.B. Woodman hit a fly to deep right-center that was dropped by a leaping Chris Pieters. Runner Mitch Nay proceeded cautiously, with Woodman nearly catching up with him between first and second. Nay attempted to to score, but was thrown out (by a lot) at home plate. Woodman then tried to advance to third, but was thrown out to end the inning.

2022: In Veronica Alvarez's final game as interim manager, the host Lugnuts used a five-run sixth inning to rally past the Great Lakes Loons, 11-7, on a Sunday afternoon. Alvarez, Team USA Baseball's Women's National Team manager, went 2-4 in her six-game stint against the powerful Loons while Pohl took his scheduled vacation.

In a Nutshell: Dico replaces the released Devin Kirby-Williams in the Lugnuts' rotation, getting the spot start tonight... he becomes the Lugnuts' 15th different starting pitcher this year... this is his 49th career Lansing appearance and 15th career Lugnuts start, but his first since April 18, 2024, against Dayton.

Glory Days: Boasting a 96 mph fastball, Dicochea was highly regarded coming out of Sahuarita High School, ranked the No. 1 prep prospect in Arizona by Baseball America entering the 2019 draft... twirled a no-hitter in the state semifinals... signed for \$400,000... signed away from commitment to University of Arizona... senior year stats: 1.30 ERA, 54 IP, 24 H, 10 ER, 11 BB, 86 K... in addition to pitching, starred at shortstop... also from Tucson: Alex Verdugo, four-time All-Star Ian Kinsler, two-time All-Star J.J. Hardy, Cardinals All-Star catcher Tom Pagnozzi and Ron Hassey... in all, Tucson ranks second behind Phoenix in producing Major Leaguers from the Grand Canyon State.

Minor League Path: Dicochea opened his professional career in the 2019 Arizona League after signing, but his 2021 campaign was halted in Single-A Stockton due to injury on June 6 after only six appearances, five starts... returned from Tommy John surgery on August 12, 2022... opened 2023 as the Ports' No. 4 starter... promoted from Single-A Stockton to Lansing on June 13, 2023, to replace Jack Perkins and finished the season in the Lugnuts' starting rotation... opened the 2024 season on the Nuts' roster but was transferred back to Stockton on April 30 after four appearances... spent all of 2025 in Stockton.

From the Archives: When Dicochea first joined the Nuts in June 2023 had just been written by MLB.com A's beat writer Martin Gallegos a day earlier, quoting A's GM David Forst in including Dicochea's name among the top pitching prospects in the system (Royber Salinas, Gunnar Hoglund, J.T. Ginn and Joey Estes). Wrote Gallegos about Dicochea, "Dicochea, an eighth-round selection by the A's in the 2019 MLB Draft out of Sahuarita (Ariz.) High School, ranks just outside Oakland's Top 30 Prospects list. But his inclusion in that group from Forst speaks volumes about how highly he is viewed... Dicochea's development hit a snag early in his pro career after he underwent Tommy John surgery in 2021. Since his return from injury, the 22-year-old right-hander is taking a big step forward this season, showing off a fastball that consistently hits 95 mph along with a solid slider and a changeup he's recently added to his mix. A's assistant general manager and director of player personnel Billy Owens added, "He's off to a promising start. Averaging well over a strikeout per inning. Overall, his command has taken a step forward. He's definitely an interesting arm on the horizon."
