TODAY'S GAME: Oklahoma City evened the series at two games apiece last night with a 9-6 triumph ... The clubs have split the first 10 games of the season series ... Mason Albright is expected to start for the Isotopes while Kyle Funkhouser is slated to take the hill for the Comets.

BROADCAST: Tonight's Isotopes game will air on True Crime Network, which can be found on channel 7.3 throughout the state of New Mexico and locally on Xfinity 387 and Sparklight 29.

SERIES: Out of 11 scheduled six-game series Albuquerque has played in 2025 this is the tenth time the first four contests have been split (lone exception: May 20-22 at Reno, lost first three games). The Isotopes have split five of those prior sets, lost four and won one (the series finale May 4 vs. Salt Lake was not played due to inclement weather).

FIRST SEVEN: Albuquerque surrendered runs in the first seven frames last night for the first time since April 11, 2018, vs. Las Vegas, a 17-11 win.

VS. OKC: Nine of the 10 meetings between the Isotopes and Comets this season have been decided by three runs or fewer with six one-run games.

ERROR FREE: The Isotopes were not charged with an error for a third-straight game Friday, the first three-game error free streak since May 17-20.

STEAL OF HOME: Hunter Feduccia stole home yesterday on a double steal, the second steal of home by an opponent this season (other: Bryce Teodosio, April 3 vs. Salt Lake, pickoff attempt to first).

-The last Comet to steal home against Albuquerque was Andy Pages on April 4, 2024, at Oklahoma City, double steal.

OPENING FRAME: The Isotopes permitted three runs in the first frame Friday, tied for the second-most relented in the opening frame (three times; last: May 20 at Reno).

-The club has allowed runs in the first inning in two-straight, three of their last five and six of 10.

PUNCHOUTS: Offensively, Albuquerque struck out just three times yesterday, the second-fewest punchouts in a game in 2025 (low: one, April 5 vs. Salt Lake).

XBH: The Isotopes allowed six extra-base hits last night and have permitted 13 extra-base knocks in the last two contests.

BIG MIKE: Michael Toglia has recorded an RBI in six-straight contests, the longest streak of his career (15 total). Tied for the second-longest active streak in the PCL ... Has reached base in nine of 10 games played with Albuquerque.

MILLER TIME: Owen Miller recorded a double Friday to extend his hit streak to nine games (16x40 with four doubles, two homers and six RBI) ... Four of his eight doubles have come in his last six contests ... Drew his first walk in 12 Triple-A games ... Has scored a run in six-straight games, the longest active streak in the PCL.

WARMIN' UP: Warming Bernabel recorded two knocks last night for his team-leading 22nd multi-hit contest of the year ... Extended his hit streak to nine games (16x33 with a double, homer and four RBI).

-Posted a .402/.452/.549 slash line with six doubles, two homers and 11 RBI in his last 21 contests, raising his batting average from .258 to .316 in the span.

REAL SLIM SCHUNKY: Aaron Schunk belted his fifth homer of the year yesterday, a three-run shot, his second homer in his last five games ... Recorded his fourth game with at least three RBI (last: May 29 vs. Sugar Land, four) ... Has a five-game hit streak (6x21 with two homers and seven RBI).

YF: Yanquiel Fernandez tallied two singles Friday for his 19th multi-hit game of the season and fourth-straight. During stretch is 9-for-17 with two doubles, one homer and three RBI. Second time in 2025 with four-straight multi-hit contests (other: May 16-21).

IT'S DREW: Drew Romo went 2-for-4 last night with his first homer of 2025 and second RBI of the season (other: May 29 at Reno). Has a three-game XBH streak (two doubles and a homer).

AMADOR: Adael Amador went 3-for-5 Thursday with a three-run homer, his fourth on the year, to extend his hit streak to eight games (13x32 with two doubles, two homers and seven RBI). Tallied first three-hit game of 2025 and seventh multi-hit game of year and fourth in his last six games ... Has at least one hit in 18 of 21 Triple-A contests in 2025.

STERLIN: Sterlin Thompson went 0-for-5 Friday, ending his eight-game hit streak (13x30 with two double, three homers and six RBI).

-Slashing .379/.482/.695 with eight doubles, two triples, six homers and 18 RBI over his last 25 contests, with 11 multi-hit performances ... Has 12 hit-by-pitch this season, second-most in Triple-A.

NUCLEI NOTES

SKIPPER: Pedro Lopez enters his 21st year as a minor league manager and third guiding the Isotopes. He is the eighth manager in club history ... Spent 2021 as Albuquerque's hitting coach and 2022 as its bench coach ... Notched his 1,000th career managerial victory June 4, 2023 at Salt Lake, 7-1 ... Managed in the Texas Rangers (2001-05, 2007) and New York Mets (2011-19) organizations while claiming the 2014 Eastern League Championship with Double-A Binghamton. Lopez was drafted in the 21st round by the San Diego Padres in the 1988 MLB Draft and spent 13 years in the minor leagues, reaching Triple-A on four occasions.

CHRIS MICHALAK: Begins his third season as Isotopes pitching coach ... Pitched for the Albuquerque Dukes in 2000, followed by stints with the Isotopes in 2004 and 2008 ... Started second-to-last game in Dukes history, giving up two runs in 6.0 innings during Game 4 of a PCL First Round playoff series at Memphis Sept. 9, 2000 ... Appeared in 61 Major League games (24 starts) over five seasons with the Arizona Diamondbacks (1998), Toronto Blue Jays (2001) Texas Rangers (2001-02) and Cincinnati Reds (2006) ... 12th round selection by the Athletics in 1993 ... Has been in the coaching ranks since 2009, including stops as the pitching coach for the Hagerstown Suns (2010-11), Potomac Nationals (2012-13) and Harrisburg Senators (2014-17). He was also the Minor League pitching coordinator for the Miami Marlins from 2018-20 and coached in the Washington Nationals organization from 2021-22.

MICHAEL RYAN: Enters his second year with the Rockies organization as the Isotopes bench coach ... The former outfielder played in 33 games for the Isotopes and hit nine homers during the 2008 campaign. He and Michalak were teammates on that squad for four days in late July ... Entered the coaching ranks in 2012 as a coach for the Double-A Altoona Curve (Pirates). He then managed in the Pirates organization at three levels for seven seasons with stops at Single-A West Virginia (2013-14), High-A Bradenton (2015-16) and Double-A Altoona (2017-19), while winning the Florida State League in 2016 and Eastern League in 2017. Ryan compiled a 221-197 managerial record with Altoona—the most wins for a manager in Curve history ... He also managed in the Cubs organization (High-A South Bend, 2021 and Double-A Tennessee, 2022-June 2023) ... A 5th round draft pick by the Minnesota Twins in 1996, played in 149 MLB games over parts of five seasons with the Twins (2002-05) and Angels (2010) ... Last Angels player to wear 27 prior to Mike Trout's call-up in 2011.

AARON MUNOZ: Takes over as Isotopes hitting coach after Jordan Pacheco was named one of two new hitting coaches for the Colorado Rockies on May 12 ... Began the 2025 season as the hitting coach for the ACL Rockies ... Spent nine seasons (2016-2024) as the Rockies bullpen catcher ... Was Isotopes bullpen catcher in 2015 ... Originally drafted by the Blue Jays in the 34th round of the MLB Draft ... Played parts of four seasons in the Minor Leagues (2011-14), making it to Double-A.

SPLIT-SEASON PLAYOFF FORMAT: For the third-straight year, the Pacific Coast League will use a split-season format to determine playoff participants. With one 10 team division, the first half winner (concluding June 22) will host the second half winner (beginning June 24) in a three-game set. The winner will then face the International League champion for the Triple-A Championship in Las Vegas, NV, on September 27.

BALLS AND STRIKES: The Challenge System, in it's third full year in the PCL, will be used exclusively for every game this season. Under this system, the home plate umpire will call balls or strikes while each team has the opportunity to challenge the umpire's call with two challenges per game, retaining one for each successful challenge.
