TONIGHT'S GAME: Welcome to LoanMart Field for a brief three-game home stand, as your Quakes host the Visalia Rawhide in game one of a three-game set. Tonight's game is our only Monday game of the year, thanks to the way the schedule falls this week surrounding the Fourth of July holiday, which will see the Quakes head to Visalia.

VS THE RAWHIDE: Today's game is the 12th of 30 meetings between the two clubs in 2024 and the sixth of 15 at LoanMart Field. The Quakes are 6-5 against the Rawhide in 2024, 2-3 here at home. Last season, the Quakes went 17-13 against the Rawhide, 7-5 here at home.

LAST GAME: Mother Nature got a big assist on Sunday afternoon, as the Quakes dropped the Lake Elsinore Storm by a final of 5-4 at The Diamond. Trailing 4-2, Rancho got one in the seventh and one in the eighth to tie the game against Storm reliever Will Varmette (2-3). In the ninth, with two on and two away, Samuel Munoz popped a ball up on the infield which should have sent the game to the bottom of the ninth inning all tied up. Instead, Storm third baseman Alain Camou lost the ball in the sunshine and it fell in fair territory, allowing Sean McLain to score the eventual winning run, as Munoz was credited with an infield hit and an RBI. Joseilyn Gonzalez (3-0) pitched his third and final inning in the ninth to close it down and nab the win.

TWO OUT OF SIX NEVER FELT SO GOOD: Sunday's win over the Storm gave the Quakes two of six in the series, which is still a series loss, but Rancho won two of the last three overall. That's an improvement over the last time the Quakes traveled to the Lake Elsinore Diamond, where the Quakes suffered their first six-game series sweep of their franchise's history, since six-game series became the norm in 2021.

WELCOME TO TOWN: The Quakes got an exciting debut from Alexander Albertus last Tuesday night. He saved a run in the fourth inning, when he made a diving catch at third base with a runner at second. He later tied the game with his first hit in a Rancho uniform, a solo blast to left field. He finished the game 1-for-4 and followed it up on Wednesday with two sacrifice flies. On Thursday, he again made a huge impact, as he went 2-for-5 with two runs scored and an RBI. Friday night, he struck out three times, but also had a two-run double. Albertus hit .342 in 32 games in the ACL this year, slugging two homers with 26 RBIs and more walks (27) than strikeouts (20).

SECOND HALF STUFF: In order to make the playoffs in 2024, the Quakes must win the second half, or else finish second in the South Division's second-half race, while having the first-half champion Storm win the division again. The Storm will meet the second-half winner or the team with the next best second-half record. Lake Elsinore last went to the playoffs in 2022, when they won the Cal League title. Modesto won the North Division First Half Title.

ERIQ SWAN: Right-hander Eriq Swan makes his first start against Visalia and his third appearance for the Quakes, his second since he made his pro debut on April 10, when he pitched two scoreless innings in a no-decision against Stockton at LoanMart Field. Swan went on the Injured List immediately after that start and has recently rehabbed a total of three games in the ACL. On Tuesday against the Storm, he tossed three scoreless frames in a no-decision. Swan was a compensation pick, drafted by the Dodgers in the fourth round (#137 overall) in the 2023 draft out of Middle Tennessee State.

CASEY ANDERSON: Right-hander Casey Anderson will make his 12th start of the year and his third against the Quakes. In two starts against Rancho, he's 0-1 with a 10.80 ERA, allowing ten runs on 13 hits over 8.1 innings. In his last start overall, he allowed six runs on four hits with four walks over 2.2 innings in a loss at Inland Empire on June 25. Anderson was drafted by Arizona in the 11th round of the 2023 draft out of Utah Valley University.
