PONIES TRAMPLE CATS IN GAME ONE AS LATE RALLY IS QUASHED: The Fisher Cats mustered only five hits on the evening, despite capitalizing on three Rumble Ponies errors, as the Rumble Ponies picked up their fifth win of the season in a 6-4 decision. A late rally stranted the potential tying run at the plate as the Fisher Cats dropped the series opener.

IT'S MILLER TIME: RHP Troy Miller, who is scheduled to start Thursday's game, threw five full scoreless innings in his Double-A debut against Somerset. After his initial proposed debut was rained out, Miller wound up dealing in the second game of a double-header, recording three strikeouts.

GROOVY, BABY: Austin Martin went two for three last night, recording his fifth multi-hit game. In the last five games, Martin is hitting .313 with 3 RBI. The Blue Jays number 2 overall prospect also made an excellent defensive play, tracking down a deep fly ball into the alley to rob the Rumble Ponies of extra bases.

BOB LIPMAN'S THIS DATE IN FISHER CATS HISTORY: June 2, 2013---We don't often note losses in this segment. Binghamton was here in Manchester on this date eight years ago, and won 7-2. The game was notable because it was the only Delta Dental Stadium start for then 24-year old Jacob deGrom. In what would be his next to last Double-A start, deGrom allowed two runs in 5.1 IP. One of the four hits he allowed was a homer to Fisher Cat Clint Robinson. The two-time Cy Young award winner went 2-5 with a 4.80 ERA in 10 starts for the B-Mets.

MANCHESTER BOSTON REGIONAL AIRPORT FLIGHT TO THE MAJORS: The Blue Jays were 5-1 victors in their return to Buffalo, riding a strong start from Robbie Ray to victory. Vlad Guerrero Jr. hit another home run, his 17th of the season, to lead the Jays to victory. The Buffalo/Trenton Bisons were the only minor league affiliate to pick up a win, walking off the Syracuse Mets 3-2 in the ninth. Vancouver got curb-stomped by Eugene, 7-1. Dunedin fell to Bradenton in their first game back at TD Ballpark, giving up four runs in the top of the ninth to fall 7-5.

COMING UP: The Fisher Cats get their first look at Binghamton (New York Mets) this week before heading to face a familiar foe, the Portland Sea Dogs, next week.

ON THE HILL: Maximo Castillo gets the start for the Fisher Cats. Castillo got shelled in his last outing against the Somerset Patriots, not making it out of the first inning, but can become the second Fisher Cats pitcher to pick up a third win on the season tonight. Opposite Castillo, Luc Rennie will make his fourth start of the year for the Rumble Ponies. Rennie is 0-1 and has given up seven runs in his 11.2 innings of work so far this year. The former Orioles prospect is in his second season with the Rumble Ponies.

Tomorrow's starter

Troy Miller will make his second career Double-A start, and first at home, after being called up from Advanced-A Vancouver. The 24-year old went 2-0 with a 1.84 ERA across three starts this season with Vancouver. In Game 2 of last Thursday's doubleheader at Somerset, in his Fisher Cats debut, Miller worked five scoreless innings, allowing just three hits. He walked three and struck out three. Did not figure in the decision in a game the Patriots would win 2-1.

Miller, a former Michigan Wolverine, is a native of Aptos, California. He was signed to a minor league free agent deal in July of 2018 by Toronto, and has spent time in Vancouver (Short Season-A and A+) and Lansing.
