Aviators vs. Aces: The Las Vegas Aviators professional baseball team, Triple-A affiliate of the Athletics, will open a six-game road trip this morning against intrastate rival, the Reno Aces, Triple-A affiliate of the Arizona Diamondbacks, in Pacific Coast League action at Greater Nevada Field (9,154)...Las Vegas, winners of a season-high nine straight games, was 6-0 on the just completed six-game homestand against Tacoma...the series against Reno will conclude on Sunday, May 11...following the off day on Monday, May 12, the Aviators will then host the El Paso Chihuahuas, Triple-A affiliate of the San Diego Padres, in a six-game series from May 13-18.

Las Vegas defeats Tacoma 6-4 to sweep six-game homestand (Sunday, May 4): The Aviators defeated the Rainiers 6-4 in the finale of the six-game series before a crowd of 6,724 on Little League Day at Las Vegas Ballpark.

Las Vegas Offense: The Aviators recorded 11 hits and stranded four runners on base. Las Vegas rallied from a 3-0 deficit to record the series sweep. First baseman **CJ Alexander** was 2-for-3, walk, solo home run, two runs scored. Designated hitter **Willie MacIver** was 2-for-4, 2 RBI, run scored and center fielder **Denzel Clarke** was 2-for-4, run scored.

Tacoma Offense: The Rainiers recorded 8 hits and stranded seven runners on base. Right fielder **Dominic Canzone** was 2-for-4, two home runs, 3 RBI. Shortstop **Cole Young** was 2-for-4, walk, RBI, run scored.

Aviators Starting Pitcher: Right-hander **Mason Barnett** pitched 5.0 innings in the no decision. He allowed 5 hits, 3 runs, walked 3 and struck out 4 on 79 pitches (50 strikes).

Las Vegas defeats Tacoma 10-3 in game three of series (Thursday, May 1): The Aviators defeated the Rainiers 10-3 in game three of the six-game homestand before a crowd of 6,224 at Las Vegas Ballpark.

Las Vegas Offense: The Aviators recorded 11 hits and stranded seven runners on base. Las Vegas built a 4-0 lead after five innings and three players recorded multiple-hit games: center fielder **Denzel Clarke** was 2-for-3, two doubles, HBP, stolen base, RBI, two runs scored. Third baseman **Darell Hernaiz** was 2-for-4, walk, 2 RBI and left fielder **Drew Avans** was 2-for-4, two stolen bases, RBI, two runs scored.

Tacoma Offense: The Rainiers recorded 9 hits and stranded seven runners on base. Right fielder **Colin Davis** was 2-for-4, double, run scored. Center fielder **Jack López** was 2-for-4 and 1B **Tyler Locklear** was 1-for-4, 2 RBI.

Las Vegas defeats Tacoma 8-5 in game five of series (Saturday, May 3): The Aviators defeated the Rainiers 8-5 in game five of the six-game homestand before a sellout crowd of 8,218 on STAR WARS night at Las Vegas Ballpark.

Las Vegas Offense: The Aviators recorded 11 hits and stranded three runners on base. Las Vegas scored seven runs in the first inning and three players recorded multiple-hit games: right fielder **Colby Thomas** was 2-for-4, two doubles, 2 RBI, run scored. AVIATORS INFLIGHT NEWS – Las Vegas opens a six-game road trip this morning in Northern Nevada against intrastate rival, the Reno Aces, Triple-A affiliate of the Arizona Diamondbacks...the Aviators, winners of a season-high nine straight games, was 6-0 on the just completed homestand against Tacoma...marked just the second six-game series sweep at Las Vegas Ballpark (swept Sacramento from May 31 – June 5, 2022)...Las Vegas has the best record (23-10, .697) in the 10-team PCL...the series against Reno will conclude on Sunday, May 11...Reno and Las Vegas will play each other a total of 21 times in '25...following the road trip, Las Vegas will host the El Paso Chihuahuas, Triple-A affiliate of the San Diego Padres, in a six-game series from Tuesday-Sunday, May 13-18...the 2025 season will feature six-game series from Tuesday-Sunday and off days on Mondays (one exception, May 26 Memorial Day at Sugar Land)...the '25 campaign will feature 150 games for the fourth consecutive season (75-home- 75-away).

BEST STARTS IN FRANCHISE HISTORY: The 2003 51s were 24-9 after 33 games (27-13 after 40 games)...2014 51s were 23-10 after 33 games (29-11 after 40 games)...2015 51s were 23-10 after 33 games (26-14 after 40 games).

2025 PCL PITCHER OF THE WEEK: Right-hander **J.T. Ginn** from March 34-30...defeated Reno on March 28 in the season opener at Las Vegas Ballpark...5.0 shutout innings, one hit, one walk, eight strikeouts on 69 pitches (44 strikes).

2025 PCL PLAYER OF THE WEEK: Catcher **Daniel Susac** from April 14-20...in four games, batted .625 (10-for-16) with three doubles, two home runs and 6 RBI, including a season-best 4-for-4 performance with two doubles, 2 RBI and walk-off home run vs. Sugar Land on **Jackie Robinson Day** (April 15).

2025 PCL PITCHER OF THE MONTH (APRIL): Right-hander **Gunnar Hoglund** was named PCL Pitcher of the Month (April) on May 5...he appeared in five starts and posted a 1-2 record with a 2.10 ERA...allowed six earned runs on 20 hits and four walks over 25.2 innings pitched...struck out 27 and held opponents to a .222 average.

42nd SEASON IN THE SILVER STATE (1983-2024) – The Aviators are playing in their 42nd season (43rd calendar season) in the Silver State as a proud member of the Pacific Coast League...**the Las Vegas Aviators have the proud distinction of being Nevada's longest enduring professional sports franchise**...Las Vegas Triple-A baseball was born on April 10, 1983 before a sellout crowd of 10,622 at Cashman Field (Las Vegas defeated Salt Lake City, 11-8)...catcher **Bruce Bochy** has the distinction of hitting the first Triple-A home run in Cashman Field history for the Las Vegas Stars on April 10, 1983.

PACIFIC COAST LEAGUE: The PCL is in its 122nd season (1903-2020, 2022 -) and consists of two divisions for a total of 10 teams. **West Division:** Las Vegas Aviators, Reno Aces, Sacramento River Cats, Salt Lake Bees, Tacoma Rainiers; **East Division:** Albuquerque Isotopes, El Paso Chihuahuas, Oklahoma City Comets, Round Rock Express, Sugar Land Space Cowboys. The 10-team league in 2021 was named Triple-A West and returned as the PCL in 2022!

INTERNATIONAL LEAGUE: The IL consists of two divisions for a total of 20 teams. **East Division:** Buffalo Bisons, Charlotte Knights, Durham Bulls, Jacksonville Jumbo Shrimp, Lehigh Valley IronPigs, Norfolk Tides, Rochester Red Wings, Scranton/Wilkes-Barre RailRiders, Syracuse Mets, Worcester Red Sox. **West Division:** Columbus Clippers, Gwinnett Stripers, Indianapolis Indians, Iowa Cubs, Louisville Bats, Memphis Redbirds, Nashville Sounds, Omaha Storm Chasers, St. Paul Saints, Toledo Mud Hens. The 20-team league in 2021 was named Triple-A East and returned as the IL in 2022.

INTERLEAGUE PLAY IN 2025: The Aviators will host the Iowa Cubs, Triple-A affiliate of the Chicago Cubs, and member of the International League in a six-game series from Tuesday-Sunday, August 26-31 at Las Vegas Ballpark.

2024 SEASON – The Aviators compiled an overall record of 74-75 (.497) and finished in fourth place in the PCL West Division. The Tacoma Rainiers captured the West Division with an overall record of 82-68 (.547). Sugar Land Space Cowboys recorded the best record in the 30-team Triple-A (93-56, .624) and defeated the Reno Aces, 2-games-to-0, to capture the PCL Championship. Sugar Land then defeated the Omaha Storm Chasers, Triple-A affiliate of the Kansas

City Royals, 13-6, in the **Triple-A National Championship** game on September 28 before a crowd of 8,007 at Las Vegas Ballpark.

2023 SEASON – The Aviators compiled an overall record of 75-74 (.503) and finished in third place in the PCL West Division. The Reno Aces captured the West Division with an overall record of 88-62 (.587). Oklahoma City baseball club recorded the best record (90-58, .608) in the 10-team PCL and defeated the Round Rock Express, 2-games-to-0 to capture the PCL Championship. The Norfolk Tides defeated OKC, 7-6, in the **Triple-A National Championship** game on September 30 before a sellout crowd of 8,556 at Las Vegas Ballpark.

2022 SEASON – The Aviators compiled an overall record of 71-79 (.473) and finished in third place in the PCL West Division. The Reno Aces captured the West Division with an overall record of 85-63 (.574). The Aces captured the PCL championship and defeated the El Paso Chihuahuas, Triple-A affiliate of the San Diego Padres, 6-2, on September 30 in the inaugural **Triple-A Triple Championship Weekend** at Las Vegas Ballpark. The Durham Bulls, Triple-A affiliate off the Tampa Bay Rays, captured the Triple-A National Championship and defeated Reno, 10-6, on October 2 at Las Vegas Ballpark. The Bulls defeated the Nashville Sounds, Triple-A affiliate of the Milwaukee Brewers, 13-0, to capture the IL championship on October 1 at Las Vegas Ballpark.

LAS VEGAS 80-WIN SEASONS – The Las Vegas franchise has won 80 or more games in a season six times: **85** (2002, franchise best 85-59 record (.590); **83** (1983 inaugural season, 83-60 (.580); **83** (83-57, .593 in 2019); **81** (81-63, .563 in 2013); **81** (81-63, .563 in 2014); **80** (1986 PCL champions with an 80-62 mark (.563)...Las Vegas recorded back-to-back 80-win seasons for the first time in franchise history (2013 & 2014)...the 83-57 record in 2019 marked a single-season franchise record for winning percentage at .593 (140-game season).

LAS VEGAS BALLPARK HISTORY: Howard Hughes Holdings Inc. (NYSE: HHH) announced on **October 10, 2017** its plans to develop and construct a baseball stadium in Downtown Summerlin® on approximately eight acres just south of City National Arena, the National Hockey League practice facility for the Vegas Golden Knights. The announcement on October 10, followed a vote by the Las Vegas Convention and Visitors Authority Board of Directors approving a marketing partnership that gives **LVCVA** naming rights to the stadium. The Las Vegas Ballpark was designed by HOK, a global architecture firm with an expertise in stadium design and constructed by **HUNT/PENTA**.

The groundbreaking ceremony took place on **Friday, February 23, 2018** before a crowd of several hundred people! The 8,196-fan-capacity stadium blends the distinct architectural style of the Summerlin® community with the aviation legacy of Howard Hughes. The ballpark provides a wide range of seating options including 22 suites, club seats, berm seating, party zones and decks, picnic tables, kids' zone, bars and even a pool beyond the outfield wall. Designed to create a festival-like atmosphere in Downtown Summerlin, the site is landscaped to complement the master planned community. Parking is conveniently located on adjacent sites. The grand opening took place on **Tuesday, April 9, 2019** before a sellout crowd of 11,036 and the Aviators defeated Sacramento, 10-2.

LAS VEGAS AVIATORS LOGO AND INFORMATION HISTORY: Howard Hughes Holdings Inc. (NYSE: HHH), then-owner of the city's professional Triple-A baseball team of the Pacific Coast League, and developer of the Summerlin® master planned community and the Las Vegas Ballpark® located at Downtown Summerlin®, announced on **December 8, 2018** the team's new name - the **Las Vegas Aviators®**.

The name change completed a rebrand that included the team's new two-year Player Development Contract (PDC) with the Athletics (2018) and the opening of the Las Vegas Ballpark, the state-of-the-art Triple-A baseball stadium, that now serves as the home of the Aviators.

The name change (from 51st) pays homage to the company's namesake, **Howard R. Hughes, Jr.**, one of the twentieth century's most successful businessmen whose passion for aviation and legacy of innovation includes significant aviation-related firsts and accomplishments. In the H-1 Racer, a plane he designed and built, Hughes set the land speed record of 352 miles per hour in 1935. Hughes went on to set other records, including the fastest coast-to-coast flight in 1937 and the fastest circumnavigation of the globe in 1938, then acquiring and successfully operating major airlines and aviation companies.

AVIATORS LOGO DESIGN AND CONCEPT:

The color inspiration: the Las Vegas Sunset; the mountain range featured in the Aviators' sunglasses resemble the mountain range found in the Summerlin logo!

Team colors are navy, orange, tangerine, gold, yellow, gray.

SOUTHERN NEVADA AVIATION HISTORY:

Nevada's High-Flying Aviators (from UNLV News) - Nevada has a rich history in Aviation; with 500 miles between the state's two largest cities (Reno and Las Vegas), aviation was ideal for Nevada.

Aviation History in Las Vegas (from Harry Reid Airport) - Aviation grew exponentially throughout the 1900s, bringing more and more travelers to our city.

NEW YORK, NY (AUGUST 1, 2024) – Seaport Entertainment Group Inc. (NYSE American: SEG) (the "Seaport Entertainment Group" or "Company"), a newly formed company positioned at the intersection of entertainment and real estate, announced that it has completed its previously announced separation (the "Separation") from its predecessor **Howard Hughes Holdings Inc.** (NYSE: HHH) ("Howard Hughes") and is now an independent, standalone publicly traded company. The Company began its common stock trading (August 1) on the NYSE American LLC under the ticker symbol SEG.

Seaport Entertainment Group's portfolio is anchored by the historic Seaport neighborhood in Lower Manhattan, which includes 478,000 square feet of primarily retail, restaurant and entertainment offerings, the 3,500-person concert venue on The Rooftop at Pier 17, a mixed-use development site at 250 Water Street, and the Tin Building by Jean-Georges, an immersive culinary marketplace. The Company's portfolio also includes **Las Vegas Ballpark in downtown Summerlin, NV; the Las Vegas Aviators, the Triple-A Minor League Baseball Affiliate of the Athletics**; a 25% ownership interest in Jean-Georges Restaurants; and an interest in and to 80% of the air rights above the Fashion Show mall in Las Vegas.
