LOOKING BACK--Jake Scheiner hit a three-run walk-off home run on Sunday afternoon to push the Travs past Wichita 7-5..Scheiner had two hits and drove in four runs on the day...Travs also started the game with a home run from Austin Shenton...the bullpen delivered three hitless shutout innings to allow for the come back with Darin Gillies getting the win...Alex Phillips blew the save and took the loss for Wichita.

WALK IT OFF--Scheiner's game-ending blast on Sunday was the Travs second walk-off win in three days...Josh Morgan came through with two strikes and two out in the ninth inning on Friday night...Arkansas has four walk-off wins now... these two both came in the ninth inning with the first two coming in the 10th inning...Arkansas has seen the opposition walk off four times this season.

STRYFFELER STIFLING--Reliever Michael Stryffeler threw another scoreless inning Saturday night coming in with two men on base and none out and stranding both runners...has been unscored on in 12 of his last 13 outings...over 13 innings in those games he has allowed just one run on three hits with nine walks and 22 strikeouts.

ROSTER RESHUFFLE--The Mariners made a flurry of moves affecting the Travs roster today...joining the club from High-A Everett are right-handed relievers Dayeison Arias and David Ellingson as well as infielder Patrick Frick and outfielder Jack Larsen...all will be making their Travs and Double-A debuts...on the flip side, RHP Darin Gillies was promoted to Tacoma while RHP Reid Morgan was sent down to Everett... additionally, INF Connor Kopach and OF Connor Lien were released by the Mariners organization and OF Keegan McGovern was placed on the Development List.

HOMER HAPPY--Through 71 games, including 34 in Dickey-Stephens Park, the 2021 Travelers have slugged 83 home runs, 29 at home...they are on pace to hit 140 homers in this year's 120 game season including 51 in their home ballpark...the overall total would be a Travs record for the Dickey-Stephens Park era (2007-present) despite this year's shortened schedule...the most homers by any Travs team in that time is 128 (in 140 games) by the 2008 squad.

OLYMPIC WATCH--The baseball portion of the Olympics begins tonight and the Travs will have ties...pitching coach Alon Leichman is away from the club to pitch for his native country of Israel after helping them qualify during the Fall of 2019...OF Julio Rodriguez will participate for the Dominican Republic after playing for them in both qualifying tournaments earlier this summer...and former Travs OF Eric Filia (now in Triple-A) will be part of the U.S. Team.

PROSPECTING--Arkansas has six of Seattle's top 30 prospects based on MLB pipeline rankings on their active roster...Travs in Seattle's top 30 include LHP Brandon Williamson (#8), OF Zach DeLoach (#11), INF Austin Shenton (#17), RHP Matt Brash (#26), INF Joe Rizzo (#27) and INF Jake Scheiner (#28)...

SCOUTING SPRINGFIELD--The Cardinals (St. Louis Cardinals) come into this series after dropping four of six to the San Antonio Missions on the road last week...managed by Jose Leger...they are second in the league in batting average and on-base percentage... their pitching staff ranks dead last in ERA walks and homers...Springfield features a top prospect in C Ivan Herrera...MLB Pipeline ranks him #3 in the Cardinals system and #80 overall...other players on the Springfield roster among the St. Louis top 30 include INF Malcom Nunez (#13), 1B Luken Baker (#14), OF Alec Burleson (#15), RHP Andre Pallante (#20), OF Justin Toerner (#23), INF Brendan Donovan (#25), INF Delvin Perez (#26) and OF Nick Plummer (#29).

Tonight's Starter - 22 Alejandro Requena

- Alejandro Requena makes his team best 13th start of the year...threw a quality start last Tuesday vs. Wichita (6 IP, 6 H, 2 R, ER, 2 BB, 3 K) in a loss...had his worst start of the year on 7/13 at NW Arkansas giving up eight runs on 13 hits over four innings (BB, 3 K, 2 HR)...pitched six shutout innings on 7/6 vs. Frisco in a win (3 H, BB, 4 K) for his third start this year with 6 IP and no runs (6/22 at NWA, 5/25 vs. TUL)...has worked his season high of six innings six times including four of his last six outings...3-0 with a 2.16 ERA at home in 6 starts with 30 K and 13 BB...1-3 with an 8.78 ERA on the road in 6 starts with 20 K and 16 BB
- Requena has faced Springfield twice...allowed two runs over six innings on 5/11...on 6/8 at Springfield he gave up six runs on eight hits (2 HR) in 4.2 innings
- Alejandro signed with Seattle as a minor league free agent this past winter...previously with the Phillies organization...did not pitch in 2020
- Spent most of 2019 with High-A Clearwater pitching in 22 games (20 starts)...had a 9-10 record and 4.90 ERA over 112 innings with 105 Ks and 38 BB while allowing 12 HR...finished tied for 5th in FSL in wins and 10th in strikeouts...pitched once for Double-A Reading in July (IP, K)
- Limited to 13 games, 12 with Clearwater in an injury shortened 2018 season...posted a 3.60 ERA over 65 innings
- Acquired by the Phillies from the Rockies in July of 2017 with SS Jose Gomez and RHP JD Hammer in exchange for RHP Pat Neshek...opened that season at Asheville going 8-3 with a 2.85 ERA in 117 innings and was a SAL league midseason All-Star...set career high with 10 strikeouts vs. Hickory on July 13...made final two starts with Lakewood giving up just three runs (two earned) with seven strikeouts over 11 innings
- Pitched for Grand Junction in 2016...began pro career by pitching for the Rockies club in the Dominican Summer League 2014-15
- 24-year old was signed by Colorado as an international free agent in September of 2013...resides in Tumero, Venezuela
