LAST WEEK: Dunedin split a six-game set vs. Bradenton last week to begin their 12-game homestand. The Jays won Tuesday, Thursday, and Sunday, highlighted by a 19 strikeout game by Trey Yesavage and Gage Stanifer in the series opening 11-3 win, where Dunedin allowed only five hits and scored 10 unanswered runs between the 2nd and 9th innings.

SAFE TRAVELS: It was officially announced today that RHP Trey Yesavage, RHP Khal Stephen, and RHP Gage Stanifer have been promoted to High-A Vancouver. Yesavage, Toronto's first-round pick in 2024 and MLB Pipeline's No. 2 Blue Jays prospect (No. 71 overall), dominated in seven starts for Dunedin, going 3-0 with a 2.43 ERA and 55 strikeouts over 33.1 innings. He walked just two batters in his final five outings spanning 25.2 IP while striking out 47. The Blue Jays went a perfect 7-0 in games started by Yesavage. Stephen, Toronto's second-round pick in 2024 and the club's No. 10 prospect, went 3-0 with a 2.06 ERA and 48 strikeouts in 39.1 innings across eight outings (seven starts). At home, Stephen posted a 0.95 ERA with 26 strikeouts and just two walks in 19 innings at TD Ballpark. Stanifer transitioned to a relief role this season and posted a 4-0 record with a 0.69 ERA and 38 strikeouts in 26 innings.

MOVIN AND GROOVIN: The Blue Jays system saw a flurry of transactions this weekend. Grant Rogers and Juanon Watts-Brown were promoted to New Hampshire, and CJ Van Eyk, Ryan Jennings, and Ryan McCarty were promoted to Buffalo.

ON THE MEND: Leo Jimenez continues his rehab assignment with Dunedin as he returns from mono. In two games, he is 3-for-7 with a pair of doubles and an RBI. Jimenez opened last season with Triple-A Buffalo where he posted a .847 OPS, fueled by a .416 OBP before he was summoned to make his MLB Debut on July 4th, 2024. He appeared in 63 games over the final three months of the season for Toronto where he batted .229/.329/.358 with four home runs and 19 RBI. Jimenez was optioned to Triple-A Buffalo to begin the 2025 season.

DURAN DURAN: Edward Duran enters Tuesday riding a 13-game hit streak—the longest in the FSL this season. He's batting .377 with a homer and a 1.066 OPS during the stretch, and after hitting .474 with five XBH and five RBI last week, he's now hit safely in 18 of his last 19 games, batting .370 with 17 RBI in that span.

HE HITS EM HARD: Kendry Chirinos scorched eight balls at 100+ MPH last week, including a 109 MPH groundout and two rockets at 107+ MPH in the series opener. He batted .391 with two homers during the set and is slashing .351 with 3 HR and 12 RBI over 15 games in May.

SCOUTING TAMPA: In a tightly contested series when these two teams met April 22-27 at The Tank, Dunedin took five of six, outscoring the Tarpons 31-23. The Tarpons roster includes five Yankees top 30 MLB Pipeline prospects in the form of INF Roderick Arias (No. 5), C Edglen Perez (No. 11), RHP Gage Ziehl (No. 16), LHP Griffin Herring (No. 25), and RHP Greyson Carter (No. 28).

DUNEDIN BLUE JAYS COACHING STAFF

Gil Kim | Manager *Year with Toronto: 10 | Year with D-Jays: 1 | Born: Pottsville, PA*

First-year Manager Gil Kim provides a wealth of experience as a player, coach, and executive to Dunedin. Hired in 2016 as the Blue Jays Director of Player Development, Kim transitioned from the front office to a coaching role with the organization in 2020 when he joined Toronto's major league field staff under the same job title, before becoming the Blue Jay's major league field coordinator in 2022, a position he held until 2024. Before joining Toronto, Kim spent seven seasons with the Texas Rangers in several scouting roles, culminating as Director, International Scouting. A native of Pottsville, PA, Kim also had a six-year international professional playing career as an infielder, which included stops in the Netherlands, China, Australia, Spain and Venezuela. He played one season of collegiate baseball at D3 Middlebury before transferring to Vanderbilt, where he played under Tim Corbin. In 2008 while playing in Venezuela, Kim slept on a mattress in the bathroom in the locker room to save money and learn Spanish.

Cory Riordan | Pitching Coach *Year with Toronto: 5 | Year with D-Jays: 3 | Born: Killingworth, CT*

Cory Riordan enters his third season as Dunedin's Pitching Coach, after he held the same role with the FCL Blue Jays in 2021-22. He joined the Blue Jays organization in 2020, where he spent the 2020 shutdown assisting with the club's pitch design framework. Riordan pitched collegiately at Fordham University and went on to play 13 professional seasons, spending time with the Colorado Rockies and Detroit Tigers organizations, reaching as high as Triple-A. He also spent time in the independent Atlantic League, and played internationally in South Korea and Taiwan, and three winter ball seasons in Venezuela and the Dominican Republic.

Nash Knight | Hitting Coach *Year with Toronto: 2 | Year with D-Jays: 2 | Born: Denton, TX*

Nash Knight enters his second season with the Dunedin Blue Jays and Jays' organization. Under Knight's guidance in 2024, Dunedin ranked among the Florida State League leaders with 101 HR (3rd), 34 3B (T-1st), and a .359 SLG (3rd). Knight made the transition to coaching following a seven-year playing career where he spent six seasons in Toronto's farm system, reaching as high as Triple-A. He also spent time with the Rangers and Twins in his final season on the diamond 2022. A Dallas Baptist University product, Knight hit .245/.350/.352 while playing in 556 career minor league games. Knight suited up for Dunedin in parts of two seasons, playing 105 career games at TD Ballpark in his career, notably playing all nine positions in a game on Sept. 2, 2018 for a team managed by Casey Candaele. Was a member of 2017 FSL Co-Champion Dunedin team which was managed by current Toronto skipper John Schneider and included future big leaguers including Vladimir Guererro Jr, Bo Bichette, Lourdes Gurriel Jr, Jordan Romano, and Ryan Borucki. Majored in kinesiology at DBU. Brother, Austin, has coached at DBU, Texas A&M, and most recently coached in the Mariners organization.

Ashley Stephenson | Position Coach *Year with Toronto: 3 | Year with D-Jays: 1 | Born: Mississauga, ON.*

Stephenson is in her first season as Position Coach, after she spent the prior two seasons with the High-A Vancouver Canadians in the same role, helping to claim a 2023 Northwest League championship. Inducted to the Canadian Baseball Hall of Fame in 2024, Stephenson has enjoyed a storied multi-sport career. Initially a star hockey player at the collegiate level at Wilfrid Laurier, she claimed four conference titles and a CIS National Championship, before joining the pro ranks in the original National Women's Hockey League and the Canadian Women's Hockey League. On the diamond, Stephenson starred for Canada's women's national baseball team from 2004 to 2018. She was twice named the team's MVP, earned an All-Star nod at third base in the 2008 IBAF World Cup Tournament and won the 2011 Baseball Canada Jimmy Rattlesnake Award, which was renamed in her honor. She was tabbed as the 2022 recipient of the Baseball Canada Lionel Ruhr Elite Coach of the Year Award after she became the first woman to manage a Canadian national baseball team when she led the women's national team to two wins over Team USA in the Friendship Series then coached Ontario teams at the Women's Invitational and 16U Girls Championships ahead of joining the Blue Jays organization. Became the second female coach in the Jays system, following Jamie Lever.

Jonathan Davis | Ast. Hitting Coach *Year with Toronto: 1 | Year with D-Jays: 1 | Born: Camden, AR*

Davis enters his first season as a coach after retiring from an 11-year professional playing career this offseason. Davis spent parts of six seasons in MLB, including three with the Blue Jays, and one with the Yankees, Brewers, and Marlins. Davis was initially drafted by the Blue Jays in 2013 and made his MLB Debut in 2018 for the Jays. He spent parts of two seasons with the Dunedin Blue Jays in 2015 and 2016, where he played in a career 167 games for Dunedin with 15 HR, 72 RBI, and 38 RBI. Davis played in 2017 Arizona Fall League, where he hit .295 and helped the Peoria Javelinas win the AFL Championship on a team that included 19-year-old Ronald Acuna Jr. Hit the first cycle in Double-A New Hampshire history on June 16, 2017. Most recently played 34 games for the Marlins in 2023, and spent 2024 with the Marlins Triple-A Jacksonville. In 205 career MLB games, Davis hit .199/.295/.276 with 6 HR, 30 RBI, and 19 SB.

Rodrigo Vigil | Position Coach *Year with Toronto: 3 | Year with D-Jays: 1 | Born: David, Panama*

Vigil joins Dunedin for his first season as a Position Coach. A former catcher, Vigil enjoyed an 11-year professional playing career. He spent 10 seasons in the Miami Marlins farm system before finishing with the Blue Jays in 2021, where he hit .275 in 34 games between Double-A New Hampshire and Triple-A Buffalo. Overall, Vigil played 550 career minor league games, where he hit .251. He began his coaching career as a bench coach for the ACL Mariners in 2022 before returning to the Blue Jays system, where he spent the past two seasons as a rehab position coach.

Antonio Caceres | Bullpen Coach *Year with Toronto: 25 | Year with D-Jays: 1 | Born: Cotui, DR*

Caceres spent the past three years as the Pitching Coach for the FCL Blue Jays. A lifelong member of the Blue Jays organization, Caceres was signed out of the Dominican Republic by Toronto when he was 17. He played in their minor league system from 1995-1998, before he transitioned to a pitching coach role in 2000. He's spent the past 24 years working as a pitching coach at the lower levels of the farm system, mentoring stars over the years including Aaron Sanchez, Noah Syndergaard, Joe Musgrove, Jordan Romano, Daniel Norris, and Roberto Osuna. Has served as Pitching Coach under Dennis Holmberg for 10 seasons, also working under current Blue Jays coaches Brent Lavallee, Jose Mayorga, Cesar Martin, Dallas McPherson, and current Miami Marlins Manager Clayton McCullough.

2024:

- After training for a couple of weeks in Dunedin, was assigned to High-A Vancouver, where he would pitch to a 4.56 ERA, 1.46 WHIP, in 11 starts last season.
- Aside from one blowup game, McElvain held a 3-2 record, 3.11 ERA.
- He was placed on the 7-day injured list on June 30th and would be transferred to the full-season injured list a little over a month later after undergoing Tommy John surgery.

TRADE:

- McElvain, an eighth-round draft pick of the Reds in 2022, had just made one of his final starts of spring training when Reds Minor League Director Jeremy Farrell shot him a text asking if he was still around the facility. "I thought he was just telling me where I was going for the year because that was the person that always told us you were going to start the year 'here'," McElvain recalled to Blue Jays Nation. "He was asking me how I was feeling, asking me how I felt about my outing that day, things like that. "He said, 'Well, I wanted to be the first one to tell you that you just got traded to the Toronto Blue Jays.'"
- McElvain, who was about to enter only his second full season of professional baseball, initially had a blank stare and was a man of few words in response to the news. Before Farrell gave him the next steps, he followed up by saying, 'I will make one thing really clear. You didn't just get traded to the Blue Jays, you got traded for an All-Star major leaguer.' That All-Star major leaguer was Santiago Espinal, a utilityman who had been in Toronto's organization since 2018. With the Blue Jays acquiring then-free agent Isiah Kiner-Falefa that winter, it appeared that the final infield spot was between Espinal and Ernie Clement. The latter was having an outstanding spring, so a transaction of some sort was all but inevitable.
- McElvain spoke highly of both teams during the trade. "He [Farrell] made the transition feel a little more welcoming," McElvain said. "He let it sink in and didn't aggressively tell me, 'You got traded. Get out of here. Your last day is today.'" Shortly thereafter, McElvain got in touch with Charlie Wilson, the Blue Jays' Director of Minor League Operations, and Ricky Meinhold, Toronto's Pitching Development Coordinator, both of whom McElvain said made him feel very welcome and were excited for him to be a part of the organization.
- The next steps were a little frantic for McElvain. Not only did he have a flight to Florida the following afternoon and personal belongings to pack, but (just his luck, as he recalled) he had also driven his truck to Arizona for spring training that year.

COLLEGE:

- With first-round picks Kumar Rocker and Jack Leiter moving on from Vanderbilt, McElvain became the Friday starter for the Commodores in 2022. He showed the qualities of an ace early on by racking up 13 strikeouts over seven innings of two-run ball against Hawaii on March 4. McElvain was named the Southeastern Conference (SEC) Pitcher of the Week for tossing seven innings of a combined no-hitter that included nine strikeouts against Kentucky on April 22. Another strong outing came in the Corvallis Regional when McElvain yielded just one run over seven innings and struck out 11 against New Mexico on June 4. In total, he won six of 11 decisions with a 4.27 ERA and struck out 100 batters over 86-1/3 innings.

- McElvain committed to Vanderbilt before he threw a pitch in high school

EXTRA:

- Has two younger brothers, Ethan and Evan. Ethan has followed Chris's footsteps and is a pitcher at Vanderbilt, currently in his sophomore season, and Evan is a senior catcher at Nolensville High School in Nolensville, TN, where he is currently garnering interest from different post-secondary schools.
- Prepping at Summit High School in Spring Hill, Tennessee, McElvain impressed USA Baseball officials enough that they selected him to pitch for the 15-and-under USA Baseball squad at the Pan American Games in Mexico in 2015. He was 1-0 with a 3.38 earned run average in eight innings to help USA win gold after downing Columbia in the final.

- As a two-way player at Summit, McElvain hit .422 and posted a 0.73 ERA in his four-year career. In his 2019 senior campaign, he struck out 103 batters and only walked 11. McElvain dabbled as a shortstop and catcher in high school and with his travel team but it was decided that his strong arm would go to better use on the mound. He wowed scouts and college recruits as a freshman during a senior high school showcase event.
