THINKIN 'BOUT LAST NIGHT: The River Bandits took a no-hitter into the ninth inning as they topped West Michigan 8-1 on Friday night ... the win was Quad Cities' first over the Whitecaps since July 12, 2019 ... Ben Kudrna lead the way for the arms, tossing 6.0 shutout innings without allowing a hit and recording seven strikeouts, while retiring 16 in-a-row to end his night ... A.J. Block put together his second-straight scoreless 2.0-inning performance to keep the shutout and no-hitter in tact through the eighth, but the Whitecaps would eventually break through in the ninth against Ben Sears with Jose Sibrian's leadoff single, followed later by Max Anderson's sac-fly ... Carter Jensen highlighted Quad Cities' bats, going 2-for-2 with a double, three walks, and his first home run of the season.

AN EYE BEYOND HIS YEARS: After working 92 walks last season (the third-most among all minor league catchers), Carter Jensen recorded his first multi-walk game of the season last night, drawing 3 in the 8-1 win ... Jensen, who is only 20 years old, now owns 10 career games with at least 3 walks--4 of those were with Quad Cities last year.

YOU GOTTA RISK IT FOR THE BISCUIT: It's been high-risk, high-reward on the base paths for Quad Cities this season, as the Bandits own a league-high 14 stolen bases, but have also been caught a league-high 5 times ... last year, the River Bandits were one of the most efficient base-stealing teams in the league, posting a .806 SB% (2nd in MWL), but they only totaled the sixth most in the league (154).

SQUANDERED OPPORTUNITIES: Despite last night's win Quad Cities continued to struggle at the plate with runners in scoring position, going just 1-for-11 ... the Bandits are batting just .140 (8-for-57) with runners in scoring position this season, the second-lowest mark in the Midwest League ... their .077 (2-for-26) average with RISP and two outs is the third-lowest in High-A.

HOW IT'S MADE: 18 members of the River Bandits roster return to Davenport after having spent some time with Quad Cities previously in their career ... 18 are former Royals draft picks, 5 were signed as undrafted free agents, 3 were signed as international free agents, and 3 were acquired by Kansas City via trade.

A BANDIT IN THE HALL: During the offseason, former River Bandit Joe Mauer became just the third catcher in baseball history to become a

first-ballot Hall of Famer and was inducted alongside Adrian Beltre and Todd Helton as part of the Class of 2024 ... prior to a 15-year Major League career with Minnesota (which included 6 All-Star selections, 5 gold gloves, 5 Silver Slugger Awards, and 3 batting titles) the 2009 American League MVP spent four seasons in the minor leagues after being selected by the Twins first overall in the 2001 Draft ... with the River Bandits in 2002--his age 19 season-- Mauer batted .302 with 23 doubles, 62 RBIs, and a team-high 61 walks, while also throwing out 42% of baserunners who attempted to steal with him behind the plate.

PROSPECTING THE RIVER: The River Bandits Opening Night roster features eight of the Royals top 30 prospects (MLB Pipeline): Ben Kudrna (4), Frank Mozzicato (5), Carter Jensen (11), Carson Roccaforte (17), Trevor Werner (20), Hunter Owen (23), Steven Zobac (25), and Henry Williams (29), the largest number of organizational top 30 prospects on the River Bandits' Opening Day roster in the team's four-year history as a Royals affiliate.

A CENTURY AND COUNTING: The 2024 season marks the 101st year of professional baseball in Davenport, dating back to the 1897 Davenport Brown Stockings of the Northwestern League ... since then, the franchise has been part of nine different leagues, affiliated with 12 different Major League clubs, and sported 18 different monikers.

THE ROYAL FAMILY: 2024 marks the River Bandits fourth season as an affiliate of the Kansas City Royals ... since joining the Royals organization, nine River Bandits have made their Major League debuts with Kansas City: Angel Zerpa ('21), Michael Massey ('21), Vinnie Pasquantino ('21), Nate Eaton ('21), Maikel Garcia ('21), John McMillon ('23), Nick Loftin ('21), Logan Porter ('21), and Anthony Veneziano ('21).

MANAGER BROOKS CONRAD

Brooks Conrad manages the River Bandits for the third-consecutive season, his eighth (seventh managerial) in the Royals organization, after managing the Columbia Firefiles in their first year as a Royals affiliate in 2021. The 44-year-old led the Lexington Legends to a South Atlantic League Title and was honored with the Dick Howser Award, which is given annually to one Royals player development employee for outstanding contributions to the organization. Conrad was slated to lead Lexington again in 2020 before the MiLB season was canceled. He joined the Royals organization as First Base Coach at Burlington in 2017, before serving as Manager there in 2018.

2024: Opened the season ranked No. 25 on MLB Pipeline's list of top 30 Kansas City Royals prospects.

2023: Split time between both Columbia (A) and Quad Cities (A+) and completed his first professional season with a 3.47 ERA (35 ER in 90.2 IP) across 22 games (18 starts) with 98 strikeouts (9.7 K/9) to just 24 walks (2.4 BB/9) ... won the Carolina League Pitcher of the Month award for April after he allowed just 1 hit and 1 walk with 18 strikeouts across 8.0 innings in 3 games ... was part of a Columbia pitching staff that posted a 3.19 first-half ERA, the top mark in Minor League Baseball ... his twin sister, Kacey, played softball at Cal and led the team with 12 doubles in 2022 while serving as the team's primary catcher.

2022: Went 4-4 with a 4.09 ERA (28 ER in 61.2 IP) and 72 strikeouts (10.5 K/9) in 20 appearances (10 starts) during his junior season at Cal.

2020-21: Attended the University of California (Berkeley), where he was a two-way player and combined for 19 pitching appearances while also playing regularly on offense as an outfielder ... played for the 2021 National Baseball Congress World Series Champion Santa Barbara Foresters, who won the title game in Wichita, Kansas.

2019: Graduated from Valley Christian High School (California), where he earned CCS Player of the Year and WCAL Player of the Year, Rawlings All-American honors, and was a part of 3 CCS championship teams.

2021: Posted a 3.30 ERA (37 ER in 101.0 IP) in his first professional season with competition, the fourth-best among Royals farmhands, making 4 appearances for Columbia (A) and 19 (16 starts) for Quad Cities (A+) ... among Royals minor leaguers, his 124 strikeouts ranked second only to Anthony Veneziano's 127 ... got the start and threw 3.2 one-hit, shutout innings in title-clinching Game 5 of the High-A Central Championship Series for the River Bandits.
