Opening Day: The Binghamton Rumble Ponies fell to the Portland Sea Dogs on Thursday night, 7-5, in the 2023 season opener. RHP Troy Miller started for the Ponies and allowed three runs over three and two thirds innings in his first appearance since June 29, 2021. Garrett Whitlock, making an MLB rehab start, allowed just one run over six innings with one walk and eight strikeouts. The Ponies had two players hit home runs, a solo shot from Luke Ritter in the fifth and a grand slam from Matt Rudick in the seventh.

Grand Opening: Outfielder Matt Rudick belted a grand slam in the top of the seventh inning of Thursday night's season opener that cut a 7-1 Portland lead to 7-5. The Ponies have now hit a grand slam in each of the last two season-opening series. Matt Winaker hit one on Sunday April 10th, 2022 in the opening weekend series at Hartford. The Rumble Ponies had two grand slams last season, as Brett Baty hit the other on July 29, 2022 to cap off a 7 RBI night vs. New Hampshire.

Rumble Ponies Roster: The Rumble Ponies 2023 Opening Day roster features three of the Mets top 30 prospects as ranked by mlb.com, and two that are listed in the top 15: **RHP Dominic Hamel (9)**, **RHP Mike Vasil (11)**, and **RHP Junior Santos (19)**. **1B JT Schwartz** also makes his Double-A debut after being drafted by the Mets in the 4th round of the 2021 Major League Baseball draft out of UCLA.

Heralded Hamel: Tonight's starter RHP Dominic Hamel was named by the Mets as their 2022 Minor League Pitcher of the Year. He led all Mets minor leaguers with 10 wins and 145 strikeouts in his first full season with the Mets organization. He also just played in this year's World Baseball Classic for Team Puerto Rico.

Reid Returns: Reid Brignac returns for a second season as manager of the Rumble Ponies. Brignac led a team in 2022 that saw five players start the year with Binghamton and make their MLB debut with the New York Mets later in the season (Francisco Álvarez, Brett Baty, José Butto, Nate Fisher, and Bryce Montes de Oca). That is tied for the second most in Binghamton franchise history. This past fall, Brignac was one of two Mets staff members selected to be a part of the Arizona Fall League coaching staff, serving as the manager of the Peoria Javelinas.

WBC: Hamel represented Team Puerto Rico in the 2023 World Baseball Classic. He honored his late mother, who passed away 11 days before the Mets selected him in the 2021 MLB Draft. He was WBC teammates with current New York Mets, Francisco Lindor and Edwin Díaz.

2022: Was named the 2022 New York Mets Minor League Pitcher of the Year. He led all Mets minor leaguers with 10 wins and 145 strikeouts. Began the season with St. Lucie (A) and pitched to a 5-2 record with a 3.84 ERA in 14 appearances and 13 starts. He tossed 63.1 innings and struck out 71 batters, before he was assigned to Brooklyn (A+) on July 4. He went 5-1 on the mound with a 2.59 ERA in 11 starts for the Cyclones. He struck out 74 hitters over 55.2 innings and opponents hit just .180 against him.

BACKGROUND: Begins the 2023 season ranked as the Mets' No. 2 pitching prospect and No. 9 overall prospect by MLB Pipeline. He was drafted out of Dallas Baptist University in the 3rd round (81st overall) by the Mets in 2021. Hamel went 13-2 on the mound and racked up 136 strikeouts in his final year at DBU in 2021. He spent his first two years at Yavapai College in Arizona.

Reid Brignac - Manager - 2nd season with Binghamton - 4th year in the Mets organization.

In 2022, Brignac led a team that saw five players make their major league debut with the Mets after starting the season with the Rumble Ponies (Francisco Álvarez, Brett Baty, Jose Butto, Nate Fisher, and Bryce Montes de Oca), tied for the second-most in franchise history. This past fall, Brignac was one of two Mets staff members selected to be a part of the Arizona Fall League coaching staff, serving as the manager of the Peoria Javelinas. Following his retirement as an active player in 2018, Brignac was the manager of the St. Lucie Mets (Low-A) in 2021 before coming to Binghamton last year. As a player, Brignac appeared in parts of nine seasons in the major leagues with the Tampa Bay Rays, Colorado Rockies, Atlanta Braves, Philadelphia Phillies, New York Yankees, and Miami Marlins. He was drafted by the Rays in the second round of the 2004 MLB Draft.

AJ Sager - Pitching Coach - 1st season with Binghamton - 2nd year in the Mets organization. Sager served in the same role for the Brooklyn Cyclones (High-A) last season. Sager previously spent twenty seasons with the Detroit Tigers organization, including six seasons as the pitching coach with Triple-A Toledo. He pitched for parts of five seasons in the major leagues, playing for the San Diego Padres, Colorado Rockies, and Detroit Tigers as part of a 12-year professional career. In 123 major league appearances, the right-hander was 12-15, with five career saves and a 5.36 ERA.

Darin Everson- Hitting Coach - 1st season with Binghamton - 2nd year in the Mets organization. Everson spent the previous five seasons as the Colorado Rockies Hitting Coordinator. He also served as the organization's Triple-A hitting coach in 2017, Double-A hitting coach from 2013-2014 and as the club's Double-A manager from 2015-2016. He previously was part of the Marlins organization for four years and served as an Associate Scout with the Baltimore Orioles from 2003-04. Everson played professionally as a catcher and first basemen for seven seasons with the Montreal Expos, Pittsburgh Pirates, and Boston Red Sox organizations.

Mariano Duncan - Bench Coach - 2nd season with Binghamton - 5th year with Mets organization. Duncan returns to the Southern Tier to begin his second year as Bench Coach with the Rumble Ponies. He previously served as the bench coach for the Brooklyn Cyclones (High-A) in 2021. He is entering his fifth year in the Mets organization. The former infielder played 12 major league seasons with the Los Angeles Dodgers, Cincinnati Reds, Philadelphia Phillies, New York Yankees, and Toronto Blue Jays. He was a member of two World Series championship teams (1990 Cincinnati Reds, 1996 New York Yankees) and was inducted into the Dominican Republic Baseball Hall of Fame in 2008.

Jeremy Cologna - Development Coach - 1st season with Binghamton - 1st year with Mets organization. Cologna comes to the Mets organization from Missouri State University, where he spent the previous two seasons on the Bears coaching staff. He most recently served as the program's Director of Player Development. Cologna was a catcher and pitcher at Avila University from 2017-18 and began his collegiate baseball career at St. Charles Community College.
