TODAY'S GAME: The Flying Squirrels open the 12th season in the franchise's history against the Bowie Baysox, Double-A affiliate of the Baltimore Orioles. This series is the first of three trips to Prince George's Stadium for the Flying Squirrels. The Baysox will come to Richmond for two series this season.

BACK WHERE IT ALL BEGAN: The Flying Squirrels are opening the season at Prince George's Stadium for the first time since the franchise's first-ever game on April 8, 2010. That night, the Baysox won, 6-4. The Flying Squirrels took a brief lead in the top of the fifth on a two-run double by Jackson Williams, but the Baysox scored five runs over the next three innings to pull away. Zach Britton started on the mound for the Baysox and allowed two runs in 4.1 innings. Mike MacDonald started for Richmond and allowed one run in five innings. Caleb Joseph and Tyler Henson drove in two runs each for the Baysox. Williams, Thomas Neal and Roger Kieschnick each had two hits for Richmond. Brandon Crawford started at shortstop for the Flying Squirrels and went 1-for-4 with a walk. The game was delayed one hour and 17 minutes for rain, the longest Opening Day delay in Richmond franchise history.

OPENING WITH THE BAYSOX: Tonight's game marks the third time the Flying Squirrels and Baysox have faced each other to open the season. Along with the meeting in 2010, the Flying Squirrels hosted the Baysox at The Diamond for the season-opener on April 9, 2015 in front of a sellout crowd of 9,560 fans. Richmond topped Bowie, 3-2, in 14 innings with a walk-off single by Kelby Tomlinson. It is the only Opening Day game for the Flying Squirrels to go to extra innings.

ROAD WOES: The Flying Squirrels have never won an Opening Day game on the road in the franchise's history, posting an 0-5 record. Tonight marks the first season-opener on the road for the Flying Squirrels since 2018. In 2010, the Flying Squirrels lost to the Baysox in Bowie, 6-4. They opened at New Britain in 2012 and lost, 3-2, and returned to New Britain Stadium for the 2014 opener in a 10-2 loss. Richmond opened as the road team in their own stadium in 2016, hosting Hartford while construction continued on Dunkin' Donuts Park, and lost that game, 5-4. The last season-opener on the road for Richmond was in 2018 at Trenton, a 5-2 loss. Richmond is 4-2 in season-openers at home.

OPENING DAY RECORDS: In 2017 against Hartford, the Flying Squirrels' offense set a handful of franchise Opening Day records, including most runs (11), most hits (13) and most triples (2). In that game, starting pitcher Dan Slania set still-standing individual franchise Opening Day records with 6.0 innings pitched and eight strikeouts. The longest Opening Day game for the Flying Squirrels was a 14-inning win over the Bowie Baysox at The Diamond in 2015, which saw the team record for the most offensive strikeouts (16) and walks (8). The team record for most runs allowed occurred in a 10-2 loss at New Britain in 2014. Richmond has thrown one shutout on Opening Day, which came against Hartford in 2019, and have been shut out once, which was in 2013 against New Britain.

GOING DEEP: Five players have homered on Opening Day for the Flying Squirrels. Mario Lisson was the first with a two-run homer in 2014 at New Britain. Ryder Jones and Ricky Oropesa each homered in a loss at Hartford in 2016, the only multi-homer game for Richmond in a season-opener. Chris Shaw hit a two-run homer at The Diamond in 2017 against the Yard Goats. The most recent homer on Opening Day for a Richmond hitter was by Dylan Davis at Trenton in 2018.

THE DENNIS PELFREY ERA: On March 3, Dennis Pelfrey was named the new manager for the Richmond Flying Squirrels. Last year in his first season as a manager in affiliated baseball, he led the Eugene Emeralds to the High-A West championship. Pelfrey, 44, played six professional seasons in independent baseball from 1999-2004. He began his coaching career at South Grand Prairie High School in Texas in 2006, a position he held through 2015. He continued that role as he began his professional coaching career in 2011 with the Gary SouthShore RailCats, where he spent four seasons. Pelfrey landed his first managerial job in 2015 with the Florence Freedom of the independent Frontier League, a role he held for five seasons through 2019. He was hired by the Giants entering the 2020 season to manage High-A San Jose before the season was canceled due to the outbreak of the COVID-19 pandemic. Under his direction last year, the Emeralds went 69-50 before topping Spokane in the High-A West Championship Series.

FOR RICHMOND: Left-hander Jake Dahlberg will take the mound in his Double-A debut. He spent parts of three seasons with the independent Chicago Dogs before signing with the Giants during the 2021 season. Dahlberg joined the High-A Eugene Emeralds in July and made 10 starts, going 2-5 with a 6.60 ERA. He closed the year with two outings with Triple-A Sacramento and tossed 9.0 scoreless innings. After being named Horizon League Pitcher of the Year twice at the University of Illinois-Chicago, he was selected in the 21st round of the 2017 MLB Draft by the St. Louis Cardinals. For more on Dahlberg, see page two.

STARTING WITH DAHLBERG: Tonight marks the first Opening Day start of Jake Dahlberg's professional career. He pitched as a reliever on Opening Day with the short-season State College Spikes in 2018, tossing a scoreless inning at Williamsport. During his college career at the University of Illinois-Chicago, he started the season-opener as a junior in 2016 at Texas Southern in a loss. He also started the Flames' season-opener as a senior in 2017 against Prairie View A&M and allowed one run over 7.0 innings with nine strikeouts en route to being named Horizon League Pitcher of the Year for the second time.

FOR BOWIE: Left-hander Drew Rom makes the first Opening Day start of his professional career. Last year, he began the season with High-A Delmarva, going 8-0 with a 2.79 ERA in 14 outings, including 13 starts. He was promoted to Double-A Bowie on July 31. At the time of his promotion, he ranked tied for seventh in the High-A East with 73 strikeouts. Rom went 3-1 with a 3.83 ERA in nine outings (seven starts) for the Baysox. He started Game 3 of the Double-A Northeast Championship Series at Akron on September 24 and pitched 5.0 scoreless innings with seven strikeouts before the RubberDucks scored six runs over the final two innings to clinch the league title. Rom finished the 2021 season ranked fifth in the Orioles organization with 120 strikeouts, first with 107.2 innings pitched, and first with 11 wins. Overall on the year, he went 11-1 with a 3.18 ERA in 23 outings (20 starts) and was selected as an MiLB.com Orioles Organization All-Star. He faced Richmond twice last year, working 5.0 innings and allowing one run with six strikeouts on July 31 at The Diamond in the first match-up. In his second start against the Flying Squirrels on August 12, he allowed four runs in 5.0 innings and picked up a win at Prince George's Stadium. In 2019, he was a South Atlantic League Mid-Season All-Star with Delmarva. Rom was selected in the fourth round (115th overall) of the 2018 MLB Draft by the Orioles out of Highlands High School in Fort Thomas, Ky.

SQUIRRELS AROUND THE WORLD: The Flying Squirrels' Opening Day roster features players from four different countries, including 25 players who were born in the United States, spanning 14 states. Eight players are from California, three are from Washington, two are from Florida and North Carolina and one each hail from Alabama, Arkansas, Colorado, Connecticut, Georgia, Illinois, Massachusetts, New Jersey, Rhode Island and Texas. Kai-Wei Teng will become the second player born in Taiwan to play for the Flying Squirrels. Franklin Labour is a native of the Dominican Republic and Diego Rincones was born in Venezuela.

FAMILIAR FACES: This year's Opening Day roster includes 12 returning players from last year's squad, including pitchers **Tristan Beck, R.J. Dabovich, Matt Frisbee, Frank Rubio, Patrick Ruotolo** and **Ryan Walker,** catcher **Brandon Martorano,** infielders **Shane Matheny, Frankie Tostado** and **Will Wilson** and outfielders **Jacob Heyward** and **Diego Rincones.**

PROSPECT WATCH: The Flying Squirrels have seven players ranked in *Baseball America*'s Top-40 Giants prospects, including Will Wilson (14), R.J. Dabovich (17), Tristan Beck (30), Tyler Fitzgerald (34), Diego Rincones (36) and Kai-Wei Teng (40). Franklin Labour is rated by *Baseball America* as having the "Best Outfield Arm." MLB.com's Top-30 Giants prospect list includes Dabovich (17), Wilson (22) and Brett Auerbach (28).
