### LHP Jackson Wolf (2-6, 7.07) vs. LHP Kyle Freeland (NR)

**TODAY'S GAME**: The Isotopes evened the series last night at a game apiece with a 13-6 triumph over El Paso ... Rockies left-hander Kyle Freeland is expected to make an MLB rehab start tonight with Noah Davis to piggyback while Jackson Wolf is slated to toe the rubber for El Paso.

JONESY: In his 12th rehab game with the Isotopes last night, Nolan Jones went 2-for-5 with a double. Over 12 games, Jones is 9-for-42 with six RBI, five walks, 12 punchouts and one home run. Has reached by in 11 of 12 contests.

**DINGERS**: Albuquerque's five home runs last night were the second-most in a contest this season, behind six on May 9 at El Paso. It was their most in a home game since May 3, 2023 vs. Sugar Land (six).

**TWO HOMER GAME**: Willie MacIver's two-homer contest yesterday was the fifth this year for an Isotope (also: Hunter Goodman, Michael Toglia twice, Sean Bouchard).

**TALLIES**: Last night marked the third-most runs for the Isotopes in a contest at home in 2024. They plated 15 tallies in losses to El Paso (March 31) and Oklahoma City (April 23).

**XBH**: Albuquerque tallied nine extra-base hits yesterday, tied for their second most in a game this season (also: March 31 vs. El Paso, April 10 vs. Sugar Land). Their best output (11) came in the aforementioned May 9 triumph in western Texas.

**DINGERS IN A FRAME**: The Isotopes bashed three home runs in the sixth inning last night for the second time in 2024 (also: Jones, Toglia, Romo, 6/1 vs. OKC in the fifth).

**TURN IT**: Albuquerque's infield turned three double plays last night, tying a season-best reached on two previous occassions, most recently May 15 vs. Sugar Land.

**BULLPEN SHUTTY**: Over 4.0 innings last night, the Isotopes bullpen (Austin Kitchen, Chance Adams, Evan Justice) did not permit a run for the ninth time this season (last: May 24 at Salt Lake, 2.2 innings).

**ATTENDANCE**: Over 35 home openings, the Isotopes have tallied the fifth-highest total attendance in all of Minor League Baseball (228,228).

**DOUBLE-DIGITS**: The Isotopes have scored double-digit runs in just two of their previous 22 contests: June 12 vs. El Paso, 13 runs and June 1 vs. Oklahoma City, 10 runs ... Scored double-digits in four of previous nine prior to 22 game stretch.

BIG WILLIE STYLE: Willie MacIver produced the fourth multihomer game of his pro career last night, first since July 3, 2021, when he belted a trio for Double-A Hartford. It was also MacIver's third contest with multiple extra-base hits this season (March 31 vs. El Paso, May 26 at Salt Lake).

**FAN FAVORITE**: Coco Montes recorded two hits, double and homer, and four RBI last night, for his first multi-hit game since June 2 ... His four RBI matched a season high, three times (last: May 17 vs. Sugar Land).

**SAM I AM:** Sam Hilliard knocked his first homer last night since May 19 vs. Sugar Land, snapping a string of 78 at-bats without. ... Recorded 23rd multi-hit game of the season, but only second since May 25 at Salt Lake. Additionally, Hilliard produced three hits for the first time since April 25 vs. Oklahoma City.

**BOONIE**: Trevor Boone went 2-for-4 yesterdat and recorded back-to-back multi-hit games for the first time since May 23-25, 2023 vs. Round Rock when he rattled off three in a row ... Reached base in 16 of 17 contests started at Triple-A this season.

**STOVIE:** Hunter Stovall bashed his third clout of the season yesterday, all coming at home (also: May 17 vs. Sugar Land, June 2 vs. Oklahoma City).

**REAL SLIM SCHUNKY**: Aaron Schunk is 5-for-11 with two doubles and an RBI over his last three games ... His 21 doubles is T-3rd-most in all of Triple-A.

HIS NAME IS DREW: Drew Romo went 0-for-4 Tuesday night, his sixth hitless contest in his last nine games.

**COOLIN' OFF**: From April 21-May 18, Romo slashed .450/.459/.725 with eight doubles, four homers, 20 RBI ... Last 13 games, hitting .163 (8x49) with a double, triple, two homers.

PCL LEADERBOARD: Drew Romo is 3rd in average (.316) ... Aaron Schunk is T-2nd in doubles (21) and 9th in XBH (27) ... Coco Montes is 2nd in average (.329), 3rd in hits (74), T-4th in walks (35), 6th in OPS (.943) and OBP (.414), T-6th in triples (4), and 9th in total bases (119) ... Sam Hilliard is T-3rd in runs (47), T-4th in XBH (31), 5th in total bases (126), T-6th in triples (4), T-7th in homers (12), 8th in hits (67), 9th in slugging (.529) and 10th in OPS (.894) ... Julio Carreras is T-5th in stolen bases (18).

**TEAM STATS**: Offensively in MiLB, the club is 2nd in triples (29), hits (628), and total bases (1,077), 3rd in slugging (.472), OPS (.828) and average (.275) 4th in doubles (139), 9th in runs (371).

#### **NUCLEI NOTES**

**SKIPPER**: Pedro Lopez enters his 20th year as a minor league manager and second guiding the Isotopes, the eighth manager in club history ... Spent 2021 as Albuquerque's hitting coach and 2022 as its bench coach ... Notched his 1,000th career managerial victory June 4, 2023 at Salt Lake, 7-1. Managed in the Texas Rangers (2001-05, 2007) and New York Mets (2011-19) organizations while claiming the 2014 Eastern League Championship with Double-A Binghamton. Lopez was drafted in the 21st round by the San Diego Padres in the 1988 MLB Draft and spent 13 years in the minor leagues, reaching Triple-A on four occasions.

**HOMETOWN KID:** Jordan Pacheco begins his third season as the Isotopes hitting coach ... An Albuquerque native and 2004 graduate of La Cueva High School, Pacheco then attended the University of New Mexico (2005-07), where he was one of the most prolific offensive players in school history (.384, 59 2B, 25 HR, 145 RBI) ... Drafted by Rockies in the 9th round in 2007 and made his MLB debut with Colorado in 2011.

CHRIS MICHALAK: Begins his second season as Isotopes pitching coach ... Pitched for the Albuquerque Dukes in 2000, followed by stints with the Isotopes in 2004 and 2008 ... Started second-to-last game in Dukes history, giving up two runs in 6.0 innings during Game 4 of a PCL First Round playoff series at Memphis Sept. 9, 2000 ... Appeared in 61 Major League games (24 starts) over five season with the Arizona Diamondbacks (1998), Toronto Blue Jays (2001) Texas Rangers (2001-02) and Cincinnati Reds (2006) ... 12th round selection by the Athletics in 1993 ... Has been in the coaching ranks since 2009, including stops as the pitching coach for the Hagerstown Suns (2010-11), Potomac Nationals (2012-13) and Harrisburg Senators (2014-17). He was also the Minor League pitching coordinator for the Miami Marlins form 2018-20 and coached in the Washington Nationals organization from 2021-22.

MICHAEL RYAN: Enters his first year with the Rockies organization as the Isotopes bench coach ... It's his second stop in Albuquerque after the former outfielder played in 33 games for the club and hit nine homers during the 2008 campaign. He and Michalak were teammates on that squad for four days in late July ... Entered the coaching ranks in 2012 as a coach for the Double-A Altoona Curve (Pirates). He then managed in the Pirates organization at three levels for seven seasons with stops at Single-A West Virginia (2013-14), High-A Bradenton (2015-16) and Double-A Altoona (2017-19), while winning the Florida State League in 2016 and Eastern League in 2017. Ryan compiled a 221-197 managerial record with Altoona—the most wins for a manager in Curve history ... He also managed in the Cubs organization (High-A South Bend, 2021 and Double-A Tennessee, 2022-June 2023) ... A 5th round draft pick by the Minnesota Twins in 1996, played in 149 MLB games over parts of five seasons with the Twins (2002-05) and Angels (2010) ... Last Angels player to wear 27 prior to Mike Trout's call-up in 2011.

SPLIT-SEASON PLAYOFF FORMAT: For the second-straight year, the Pacific Coast League will use a split-season format to determine playoff participants. With one 10 team division, the first half winner (concluding June 23) will host the second half winner (beginning June 25) in a three-game set. The winner will then face the International League champion for the Triple-A Championship in Las Vegas, NV, Sept. 28.

**BALLS AND STRIKES**: The Automated Ball-Strike System (ABS), now in its third year in the Pacific Coast League, will be used for all Monday-Thursday games while the Challenge System, second year in the PCL, will be used for all Friday-Sunday contests. Each team has three challenges per game, retaining one for each successful challenge.

- Seventh in club history with a 4.80 home ERA among Rockies with 50 or more starts in Denver.
- Leads the NL with 103 opponent grounded into double plays over the past six seasons (2018-23).
- Finished fourth in 2018 NL Cy Young Award voting, the second Rockies pitcher to ever finish among
- the top five in balloting, joining Ubaldo Jiménez (third, 2010).
- His 2018 ERA of 2.85 ERA (202.1 IP, 64 ER) was the lowest in a full season in franchise history and
- the fifth-lowest in the NL for the season.
- Pitched 8.1 no-hit innings on July 9, 2017 vs. Chicago-AL, the longest no-hit bid for a Rockies pitcher
- at Coors Field in franchise history.

Has faced the Chihuahuas four times, once in 2021 and three times in 2016 ... Totalled a 3.81 ERA (26 IP, 11 ER) ... Made rehab start on May 15, 2021, tossing 4.0 innings of one run ball ... Tossed 6.0 shutout innings Sept. 2, 2016

#### 2024

- Rogers' start May 4 vs. Round Rock was first Isotopes starter to complete seven full innings since Tanner Gordon Sept. 22, 2023 vs. Oklahoma City (zero runs)
- It was the 26th time Rogers has gotten through at least 7.0 frames and first since Aug. 16, 2022 for Triple-A Jacksonville (vs. Nashville).

#### 2023

- Led all qualified starting pitchers on the club with a 5.03 ERA (155.2 IP, 87 ER) over his 29 starts
   ... went 6-14, a new career high for losses in a season.

   ... opponents slashed .328/.382/.492 in the first frame ... 42 hits allowed in the first inning were
   the third-most in the Majors.
