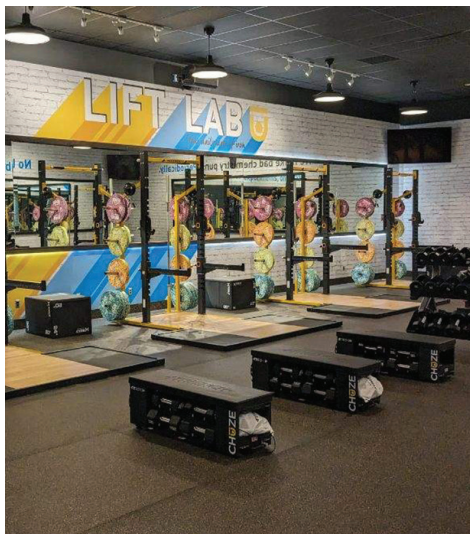

In conjunction with the Miami Marlins, the Jacksonville Jumbo Shrimp have unveiled their on-field coaching staff for the 2025 season. Along with new manager David Carpenter, the field staff features newcomers Jorge Hernandez (bench coach), Rob Marcello (pitching coach) and Mike Marjama (hitting coach). Defensive coach Jose Ceballos is the lone returner and comes back to Jacksonville for his eighth season as either a player or coach.

Boasting an extensive background in baseball as a player, coach and manager, the 2025 season will be Carpenter's first piloting a team in Minor League Baseball. The 39-year-old spent the last two seasons at the helm of the West Virginia Black Bears in the MLB Draft League while also serving as the pitching coach at Division II Fairmont State University from 2021-24. With the Black Bears, he posted an 81-66 (.551) record, steering West Virginia to a league championship in 2023.

Having been born in Morgantown, W.Va. and raised in nearby Fairmont, Carpenter holds deep ties to the Mountain State. He was a catcher at West Virginia University from 2004-06 before being selected by the St. Louis Cardinals in the 12th round of the 2006 draft. After two seasons in the minor leagues as a backstop, Carpenter served as both a pitcher and catcher in 2008 before converting to pitching full-time in 2009. After an August 2010 trade to Houston, Carpenter made his major league debut with the Astros on June 30, 2011 with a scoreless inning of relief against the Texas Rangers.

Carpenter pitched in 222 MLB games over six seasons from 2011-15 and 2019 with the Astros, Toronto Blue Jays, Atlanta Braves, New York Yankees, Washington Nationals and Rangers. He registered a career 3.69 ERA in the big leagues over 214.2 innings before retiring in 2020. Carpenter's ties to the International

League include a stint of eight games pitched with Gwinnett from 2013-14 and 39 games with Nashville, then a Pacific Coast League club, in 2019.

A long-time Marlins coach and manager, Hernandez is set for his first season in Jacksonville. Hernandez's time with the Marlins began as a hitting coach in the minor leagues from 2007-08 with the Rookie-level GCL Marlins (2007) and Low-A Greensboro (2008). He became the GCL Marlins' manager from 2009-12 before serving in the same role with Greensboro (2013), Short Season Class A Batavia (2019), Low-A Jupiter (2021) and High-A Beloit (2022). Hernandez was Miami's infield coordinator from 2014-18 and again from 2023-24.

Hernandez was originally selected by Houston in the ninth round of the 1986 draft but elected to attend Troy State, where he helped the school win the 1987 Division II World Series. He began his coaching career in 1993 as a hitting coach at the University of Mobile and also had stops at the University of West Florida and Texas A&M-Corpus Christi.

Marcello enters his first season in the Marlins' organization. Originally a left-handed pitcher, he was selected by the Philadelphia Phillies in the 17th round of the 2013 draft out of Appalachian State University.

ty. He pitched one season for Short Season Class A Williamsport before beginning his coaching career as a volunteer assistant at Indian River State College, where he had also began his collegiate playing career before transferring to Appalachian State. Marcello broke into the minors as the pitching coach with High-A Modesto in the Seattle Mariners' organization in 2019. He was promoted to Triple-A Tacoma for the 2021 campaign before serving as the San Diego Padres' Director of Pitching from October 2021 until last month.

Marjama joins the Jumbo Shrimp after a season as the hitting coach with High-A Beloit in 2024. A native

of Granite Bay, Calif., Marjama played 15 games with the Mariners in 2017-18 during an eight-year playing career that also saw him log 72 contests with Triple-A Durham in the International League in 2017. Following his playing career, Marjama worked as an ambassador with the National Eating Disorders Association, a speaker for ForCollegeForLife and a team lead for Keller Williams Realty, Inc. before getting into coaching as the manager with the Lincoln Potters (California), a collegiate summer wooden bat league team in the Pacific Empire League.

The 2021 Marlins' Staff Member of the Year, Ceballos returns to Jacksonville for the seventh time in eight years. The 2025 season will mark his 13th campaign in Miami's system. A native of Caracas, Venezuela, Ceballos played in the Marlins' organization from 2007-13, reaching as high then-Double-A Jacksonville for a one-game stint in 2012. He began coaching with the Marlins in 2014 with Greensboro. After two seasons with the Grasshoppers, Ceballos spent the 2016 campaign as a coach with Jupiter before joining the Jumbo Shrimp's staff from 2017-19.

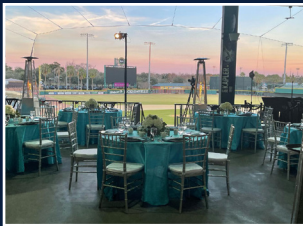

Bragan Field at VyStar Ballpark, which opened in 2003, is one of the premier Minor League ballparks in North America.

The ballpark was the first completed project of the Better Jacksonville Plan. Featuring an old-fashioned design, brick facade and a grass seating berm, VyStar Ballpark reminds fans of the days of yesteryear and preserves all of the wonderful tradition baseball has to offer. The vivid sight lines capture the action up-close while providing fans with comfortable seating and easy access to concessions and restrooms.

VyStar Ballpark features 12 luxury skyboxes, four skydecks, and a one-of-a-kind Tiki Terrace at the left field corner. It also has an HD videoboard and LED fence display in left field and two ribbon displays along the baselines of the suite level.

In 2016, owner Ken Babby invested \$1.8 million into the ballpark to add a new groups area directly behind the home bullpen, a Tiki Terrace near the left-field foul pole, renovations to all 12 private suites and expansion of the suite-level, third-floor lounge to give all fans a climate-controlled space to overlook the playing field.

In conjunction with the City of Jacksonville and ASM Global, the Jumbo Shrimp announced in 2024 a \$31.8 million publicly-funded renovation plan to VyStar Ballpark as part of Project NEXT. The project added a new office structure and seating experience in right field, a new fan-friendly main gate in center field and a new premium space area behind Homeplate. Project NEXT is the first major renovation to the ballpark since its opening in 2003.

The ballpark features nearly 6,000 stadium-style chairs and had accommodated more than 11,000 fans. Ballpark is also completely wheelchair accessible, including the dugouts, camera wells and playing field.

The ballpark has hosted three Major League Baseball exhibitions (2006, 2010, 2015), four ACC Baseball Tournaments (2006–09) and two Southern League All-Star games (2003, 2013). The 2013 Southern League All-Star game boasted a league-record 9,373 fans in attendance.

Since 2007, VyStar Ballpark has hosted a game in the annual college baseball series between in-state rivals, Florida State and Florida. The annual installment brings capacity crowds to VyStar Ballpark for their storied rivalry.

BASEBALL BASICS: HOW TO KEEP SCORE

DIFFERENT FANS have different methods of keeping a scorecard, and many use their own notations. But here's a simple method:

If the hitter grounds out to shortstop, for example, write in "6-3," which shows the shortstop threw him out at first base. If the hitter flies out to left field, write a "7."

If the batter gets a hit, write in the hit according to which base he reached. Each corner of the box represents a base, with the lower-right corner being first.

If he singles, put a "-" in the lower right. If he doubles, write a "=" in the upper right, and so on. For a walk, use "BB" in the lower right. As the runner advances, mark the appropriate symbol in the appropriate corner.

If a runner scores, put a circle at the bottom of the box, and inside the circle put the symbol of the play and/or the player that drove him in. For example, if the No. 5 hitter drives in two runs with a single, mark his single in the bottom right of his box and mark a circle with the number "5" in it in the boxes of the runners who score. (Some people like to use uniform numbers here, so you can tell who did what, even after lineup changes.)

At the end of each inning, total the hits and runs for that inning only. At the end of the game you'll be able to add the innings total to get the game score

JOHNSTON'S OFFSEASON IN THE DOMINICAN REPUBLIC

This conversation has been excerpted from Turn 2 with Scott & Troy, a podcast co-hosted by Jumbo Shrimp broadcaster Scott Kornberg and Jumbo Shrimp outfielder Troy Johnston. Turn 2 with Scott & Troy is an unrivaled glimpse into the baseball world, with Scott and Troy breaking down the biggest stories throughout baseball and welcoming in the sport's players, managers, coaches, writers and other personnel for behind-the-scenes stories and information. Scott: You've had the opportunity to do Winter Ball in the past. It's not just minor leaguers who go down there, but major league guys as well. What is the typical offseason schedule like for someone who goes to play Winter Ball?

Troy: The Dominican (Republic) was absolutely fantastic. It opened up a whole new world for me, like learning a new language, meeting so many different styles of people. I met tourists, I met locals. I had people that lived there all the time, I had people that lived in the (United) States and came down for the LIDOM series. All of that, I can't thank the people enough for welcoming me. They were so nice, all the people with the Toros and with Licey. They were just so kind to me.

There's 50 games in the regular season, and they break it up into halves. I decided to play almost a whole season, because, one, I was having so much fun, and two, as a minor leaguer, the money is good, the experience is good. It just helped me evolve as a baseball player, how I looked at the game of baseball and how I essentially approached my lifestyle and what I want it to look like.

So what happened was, I signed a contract in Spring Training and I'm hoping to sign a contract again in Spring Training for the following season, so for the 2025 Winter Ball season. I flew down, and they have a small "Spring Training." What you have to realize is that you have a mix of a lot of different players. You have players from Japan, you have players from South Korea, you have players from the Dominican (Republic), Cuba, Venezuela, and they're broken up into different categories: you have natives, players who are born



and raised in the Dominican Republic, and then you have imports. And so just like if someone was going to play overseas in Japan or Korea, there's a certain number of imports you can have.

The cool part about it, is you have every level you can think of. You have a Dominican Summer League playing with a major leaguer. You have a Double-A player playing with someone who just got back from Japan. You have someone from Taiwan, playing with a Triple-A player just on the cusp of the major leagues, going up and down. It's not just all big leaguers, it's a mix of every single level you can get. There was one guy who was 19 years old playing with a 40-year-old. That's the age gap, it's not like Triple-A where it's between about 23 (years old) and 30.

It's a very, very different style of baseball. I had two very different experiences.

Scott: We'd love to hear them. This is awesome.

Troy: My first part in the regular season was with Toros del Este, They are in La Romana, and one of the most impressive things, I can't thank them enough for signing me in the first place, because they treated me so well. They flew my wife out a couple times, it was fantastic. The living situation, Casa de Campo in La Romana, it is paradise on Earth.



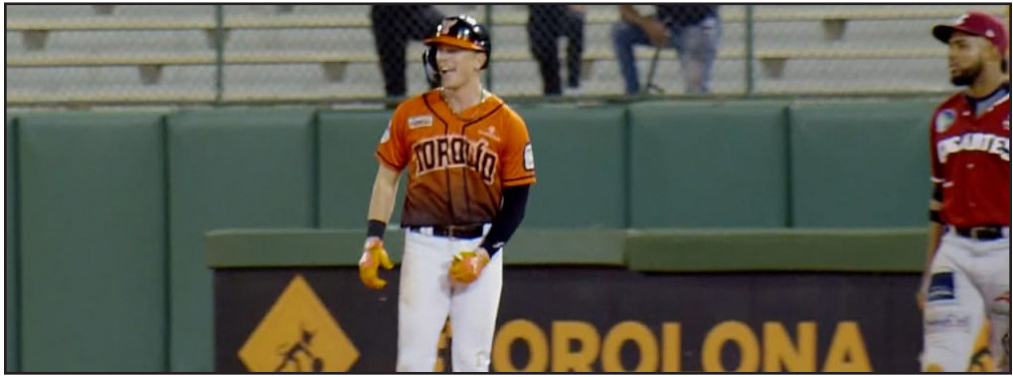
My experience was different when I played with Licey. I was done with Toros, we missed the playoffs. I was then put into a redraft, essentially. I was taken by Los Tigres de Licey. With the Toros, baseball is number one, but my off-days were filled with activities and I could do a bunch of stuff. Whereas with Licey, it's in the heart of Santo Domingo, like I was smackdab in the middle of the capital. Thankfully, I spent some time in the Dominican before. It helped me to know how to speak Spanish and I lived in a hotel. It was very different, where I feel like I focused on baseball a little more.

Scott: A couple things come to mind, and it's so different for an American to picture, in particular if you go to a Minor League Baseball game. We can use Jacksonville as an example — Jacksonville does a great job in Minor League Baseball, the crowds are awesome, they draw really well, they have super fun promotions. All that stuff you're looking for, and that's why they do so well. But I think a lot of people, and I know this as a salesperson here, they're not coming to see you play because you were the Marlins' Minor League Player of the Year (in 2023) or that Deyvison De Los Santos leads the minors in home runs, they don't even know that, probably. There's because there's fireworks after the game or there's some crazy entrée we have or this cool giveaway or a funny promotion. And it's the complete opposite in the Dominican, where, you talked about getting picked up by these teams. If you're not performing, you're cut right off the bat. The fan intensity is like the New York Yankees, Boston Red Sox, Los Angeles Dodgers, it's so different of an environment than it is in Minor League Baseball.

Troy: Yes, you have to realize how important these games are. You play so few games. They are into every single pitch because they know every single pitch matters. And when I was walking down the street, granted, I look a little bit different from the average Dominican, I get singled out every once in a while. They know me and they'll tell me things, just random people on the street. But that's the kind of caliber that the fans are like in the Dominican. They bled their team colors. They are so invested in their team. They're invested in every single pitch, every player and they let you know it. That is the difference, they will let you know it.
