SUNDAY: The Flying Squirrels beat the Curve, 5-3, in Altoona for a series split. **Charlie Szykowny** opened the scoring with an RBI single in the top of the first but Altoona answered with a sacrifice fly by Derek Berg to tie the score in the bottom of the inning. In the top of the second, **Jean Carlos Sio** hit a two-run homer to move Richmond ahead, 3-1. **Parks Harber** hit an RBI double in the fourth to open a 4-1 lead. The Curve closed the score to 4-2 in the seventh with a solo homer by Lonnie White Jr. In the top of the eighth, **Zane Zielinski** brought in a run with a sac bunt for a 5-2 Richmond lead. The Curve pulled back within two in the eighth on an RBI single by Duce Gourson. **Trystan Vrieling** started and allowed one run on one hit over six innings. **Cristian Alvarado** closed out his four save with a 1-2-3 ninth, striking out two.

POSTSEASON BOUND: The June 12 win clinched the Eastern League Southwest Division title for the Flying Squirrels, locking in a postseason berth. The Flying Squirrels will play the second-half division champion in the Division Series. Game 1 will be at the home of the second-half champion on Tues., Sept. 15. Game 2 and, if necessary, Game 3 will be at CarMax Park on Thurs., Sept. 17 and Sat., Sept. 18. If Richmond advances to the EL Championship Series, Game 1 will be at CarMax Park on Sun., Sept. 20. This year marks the fifth postseason appearance in franchise history and the first since 2023.

TODAY'S GAME: The Flying Squirrels resume play after the All-Star Break with the first of three games against the Erie SeaWolves, Double-A affiliate of the Detroit Tigers. It is also the start of a nine-game homestand through July 26. Richmond won two-of-three in Erie to begin the season from April 3-5. The two teams split a six-game set in Erie from May 12-17 and split again at CarMax Park from June 2-7. This is the final series between the two teams this season.

RECORD YEAR: The Flying Squirrels' 10-game win streak from April 4-15 was the longest in franchise history, surpassing an eight-game win streak from May 5-13, 2021, also beginning with the second game of the season. The 53-32 record is the best in team history through 85 games, passing a 50-35 start in 2014. Richmond has won seven series, split six and lost two so far this year. After opening the season with a 27-7 record through May 13, the Flying Squirrels are 25-25 in their last 50 games since.

RELENTLESS: In their 53 wins this year, the Flying Squirrels have come from behind in 26 of them. In 17 of the wins, Richmond has taken the lead in the eighth inning or later. The Flying Squirrels have nine walk-off wins at CarMax Park this season, including at least one in each home series. **Drew Cavanaugh**, **Parks Harber**, **Dayson Croes** and **Diego Velasquez** each have two walk-off winners this year. Richmond has three wins after trailing by five-or-more runs this season.

THE FLYING SQUIRRELS won the Southwest Division first-half title by seven games over second-place Erie and has the Eastern League's best overall record this season. Richmond leads all 30 Double-A teams in batting average (.270) and sacrifice flies (XX) this season and rank third in hits (771) and third in doubles (165). The team has combined for 97 homers this year, surpassing 10 of the franchise's previous 15 season totals. The Flying Squirrels are on pace to set offensive single-season franchise records for batting average, runs, total bases, doubles, RBIs, stolen bases, OBP, SLG, OPS, sacrifice flies and hit by pitches. The Richmond pitching staff has thrown eight shutouts this season, which leads the Eastern League and ranks second in Double-A.

THE SEAWOLVES are in first place in the Southwest Division second-half standings and looking to reach the Eastern League postseason for the fifth consecutive year. If they win the second half, they will match up with the Flying Squirrels in the division series for the third time in the last five seasons. Erie's roster features two players ranked in Baseball America's top-30 Tigers prospects, including 1B/C Josue Briceño (No. 4) and LHP Andrew Sears (No. 14). MLB.com's top-30 Tigers prospects list features two Erie players, including Briceño (No. 3) and Sears (No. 8).

FOR RICHMOND: Right-hander **Yunior Marte** makes his eighth Double-A start and his third against the SeaWolves. He last pitched on July 8 at Altoona and allowed a career-high eight runs over 3.2 innings in a loss. In each of his previous two starts, he worked at least five innings and allowed two runs. Marte made his Double-A debut against the SeaWolves on June 2 and allowed two runs over 4.2 innings with seven strikeouts. He faced Erie again on June 7 and allowed one run over five innings. Marte was promoted from High-A Eugene on June 2, where he went 6-1 with a 3.74 ERA in nine outings (seven starts). With the Emeralds, he led the Northwest League in BAA (.215) and ranked tied for first in wins, third in WHIP (1.22), third in ERA and sixth in innings pitched (43.1). Marte was originally signed by the Kansas City Royals in 2022 as an international free agent. At last year's trade deadline on July 31, Marte was traded from the Royals to the Giants for OF Mike Yastrzemski and finished the season with Low-A Jose. Entering 2026, he was rated by Baseball America as the No. 29 Giants prospect. **For more on Marte, see page two.**

FOR ERIE: Right-hander Kenny Serwa makes his 17th start of the year and the seventh of his career against the Flying Squirrels. In his last start on July 8 against the Senators, he allowed three runs over four innings in a loss, striking out five. Over six starts in his career against the Flying Squirrels, Serwa is 2-1 with a 3.51 ERA (10 ER/25.2 IP). In his first affiliated season in 2025, Serwa began the year with High-A West Michigan and went 3-1 with a 2.75 ERA in 10 outings (five starts). He was promoted to Double-A on June 5 and made 17 starts for the SeaWolves, posting a 6-6 record with a 3.95 ERA. Serwa began his college career with one season at NCAA DII St. Joseph's (ind). College before spending three seasons at SIU Edwardsville. He then pitched one season at the University of Central Florida before spending his final college season at Dayton in 2022. Serwa pitched in independent baseball with the Billings Mustangs in 2022, did not pitch in 2023 and spent the 2024 season with the independent Chicago Dogs.

THE NEW GUYS: The Flying Squirrels added three players from High-A Eugene on Friday set to make their Double-A debuts: **Gavin Kilen**, **Dakota Jordan** and **Trevor Cohen**. Kilen, who was the 13th-overall pick in last summer's MLB Draft, was leading the Northwest League in doubles (27) and also ranked tied for second in extra-base hits (37), fourth in total bases (144), tied for fourth in hits (88), eighth in batting average (.282) and tied for eighth in runs scored (49). Jordan led the Northwest League in RBIs (66), extra-base hits (41) and total bases (171) and ranked tied for first in homers (18), second in SLG (.533), second in hits (93), third in doubles (22), fifth in batting average (.290), fifth in OPS (.879) and seventh in runs (50). Cohen led the league in hits (97) and runs (72) and ranked second in doubles (26), third in stolen bases (26), fourth in batting average (.297), tied for fourth in walks (48), sixth in total bases (136), seventh in extra-base hits (31) and eighth in OBP (.387).

IT'S BO TIME! In his last 34 games with Richmond from June 2-July 12, **Bo Davidson** hit .312 (43-for-138) with 13 homers, six doubles and 27 RBIs, adding 16 walks and 11 stolen bases. From June 4-7, he homered in four consecutive games, a new Flying Squirrels franchise record. From June 2-7, he picked up at least one RBI in six consecutive games, one shy of the franchise record. His 11 homers in June were the most in a calendar month in franchise history, passing eight by Jarrett Parker (May 2013) and Sean Roby (April 2022). His 19 homers are the fourth-most in a season in franchise history, trailing Sean Roby (25, 2022), Tyler Fitzgerald (21, 2022) and David Villar (20, 2021). Davidson has 27 career homers with Richmond since being promoted to Double-A last July, which ranks tied for fifth in franchise history. Davidson was named Eastern League Player of the Month for June. He is the fourth player in team history to win an Eastern League Player of the Month award, joining Mark Miniccozzi (May 2013), Ricky Oropesa (May 2015) and Tyler Fitzgerald (April 2023). He was promoted to Triple-A Sacramento on Friday.

PARKS & WRECK: In last nine games with Richmond from July 2-12, **Parks Harber** hit .351 (13-for-37) with four homers, two doubles and 13 RBIs. On July 3, he had three hits, a homer and four RBIs. Harber hit a pair of homers his next game on July 5 and totaled three RBIs. After going homerless over 13 games from June 18-July 2, he has hit four homers in three games from July 3-7. Harber was promoted to Triple-A Sacramento on Friday.

JACK ATTACK: In his last 26 games since June 5, **Jack Payton** is batting .362 (34-for-94) with a homer, five doubles, a triple, 10 RBIs, eight walks and 12 runs scored. He has 10 multi-hit performances in his last 22 games dating back to June 9, including seven two-hit games and three three-hit games.

GO, DIEGO, GO! In his last 12 games since June 28, **Diego Velasquez** is batting .460 (17-for-37) with a homer, three doubles, six walks, five RBIs and three stolen bases. Since joining the Flying Squirrels in July 2024, Velasquez has played 240 games. In Richmond's franchise history, Velasquez ranks second in sacrifices (18), third in walks (117), sixth in OBP (.371, min. 400 PA), tied for fifth in stolen bases (39) and sixth in hits (236).

TOP SKIPPER: Flying Squirrels manager **Dennis Pelfrey** has led the team to 313 wins in his career, which is a franchise record all-time wins record for a manager. He passed the record with Richmond's 6-1 win at Binghamton on May 23, 2025. From 2011-2013, **Dave Machemer** won 216 games as Richmond's manager, leading the team to the Eastern League postseason for in 2011. Pelfrey, who has been with Richmond since the 2022 season, led the team to back-to-back postseason appearances for the first time in franchise history in 2022 and 2023. He also managed the 2021 Eugene Emeralds to the High-A West championship. Of Richmond managers since 1954, Pelfrey is second in wins behind Eddie Haas (1968, 1981-84), who had 351 wins.

IN THE LEAGUE LEADERS: In the Eastern League, **Bo Davidson** is tied for second in homers (19), fifth in RBIs (53), tied for fifth in total bases (144) and seventh in SLG (.521). **Parks Harber** is tied for fifth in doubles (20), eighth in OPS (.879) and 10th in batting average (.282). **Jonah Cox** is first in triples (5) and fifth in stolen bases (27). **Diego Velasquez** is seventh in OBP (.381) and eighth in batting average (.291). **Tyler Vogel** is tied for first in saves (12). **Trystan Vrieling** is first in shutouts (1), tied for first in complete games (1), sixth in ERA (4.04) and tied for fifth in BAA (.228). **Cesar Perdomo** is first in WHIP (1.11), tied for second in BAA (.216), tied for fourth in strikeouts (89) and fifth in ERA (3.98).

PROSPECT WATCH: Richmond's roster features five players are ranked in Baseball America's top-30 Giants prospects, including **Dakota Jordan** (No. 7), **Gavin Kilen** (No. 8), **Trevor Cohen** (No. 9), **Yunior Marte** (No. 19) and **Diego Velasquez** (No. 29). **Adrián Sugastey** is rated by Baseball America as the top defensive catcher in the Giants organization. MLB.com's top-30 Giants prospects list features five Richmond players, including Kilen (No. 4), Jordan (No. 5), Cohen (No. 8), **Maui Ahuna** (No. 18) and Marte (No. 25).

THIS DATE IN RICHMOND BASEBALL HISTORY

1957: The Richmond Virginians faced the Miami Marlins on the road and played until the ninth inning before rain halted play with no score in the first game of a scheduled seven-inning doubleheader. Both teams loaded the bases with no outs in the eighth but did not score. With two on and no outs in the top of the eighth, Miami brought in Satchel Paige. Harry Chiti placed a bunt, which Paige held onto, loading the bases. After a force at the plate, Paige induced a double play to keep the game scoreless. **1994:** The Richmond Braves beat the Norfolk Tides, 3-2, in 12 innings at Harbor Park. Brian Kowitz hit a go-ahead single in the top of the 12th. An altercation between Richmond's Troy Hughes and Norfolk's Joe Kmak led to the benches clearing. Days later, 35 players were suspended, including 15 from Richmond and 20 from Norfolk. **2015:** The Flying Squirrels swept a doubleheader against the Altoona Curve at The Diamond. Richmond won Game 1, 2-0. Kelvin Marte threw a complete-game, seven-inning shutout, one of two in his Richmond career. He is the only player in franchise history with multiple complete-game shutouts.
