CORPUS CHRISTI, TX – The Northwest Arkansas Naturals exploded early Saturday night, but the Corpus Christi Hooks surged ahead in the middle innings, as the Naturals fell for the fourth time this week, 12-7 to the Hooks.

- Each time the Naturals scored, Corpus Christi had a counter from the very first inning. Northwest Arkansas' first three batters reached and two runs scored, on an RBI single from **Tyler Gentry** and a wild pitch that brought across **Nick Loftin**.
- After the Hooks scored twice in the bottom of the first, **CJ Alexander** and **Jake Means** hit back-to-back home runs, the third time the Naturals have done so this year, and Alexander's first hit with the Naturals, snapping an 0-for-12 start to the week.
- Corpus Christi scored three in the bottom of the second, but the Naturals responded with three in the third to retake the lead, on an RBI double from **Logan Porter** and two-run single from Alexander for a 7-5 lead.
- The remainder of the game was all Corpus Christi, as the Hooks scored seven unanswered runs, including a five-run fourth that knocked starter **Noah Murdock** out of the game.
- Zach Haake** allowed two runs over the next 1.2 innings, then **Christian Chamberlain** fired 2.0 innings of one-run ball with a pair of strikeouts, before **Jonah Dipoto** pitched a scoreless eighth inning.
- Tucker Bradley**, Loftin and Alexander each recorded two hits, with eight of nine Naturals in the starting lineup recording a hit and six players that scored a run.

THIS DAY IN NATURALS HISTORY

The Naturals are 5-8 all-time when playing on July 17

On July 17, 2008, the Northwest Arkansas Naturals beat the Arkansas Travelers 9-4, the sixth win of a six-game winning streak for the Naturals. **Juan Carlos Oviedo** threw two perfect innings to open the game, before **John Bale** pitch 2/3 of an inning on Major League rehab. **Blake Johnson** pitched the final 6.1 innings, tied for the third-most innings thrown by a reliever in Naturals history. Eight of nine Naturals in the starting lineup scored a run and eight had a hit, including a three-hit performance from center fielder **Irving Falu**. Only five of the nine runs came in via an RBI, as the Travelers made five errors in the game.

FOLLOW THE LEADER

Manager Chris Widger enters his first season at the helm of the Naturals, after previous stops in *Advanced Rookie* Burlington (2019) and *High-A* Quad Cities (2021) managing Royals affiliates.

- 18 of the Naturals' 28 active players played for Widger with the Quad Cities River Bandits last season.
- 6 of the Naturals' 28 active players played under Widger with the Burlington Royals, then in Quad Cities and now in Northwest Arkansas: **Dante Biasi**, **Jonah Dipoto**, **Jake Means**, **Noah Murdock**, **Logan Porter** and **Angel Zerpa**.

EXTREME ENDS OF THE SPECTRUM

When looking at the Naturals' numbers one game to the next, it appears rather black and white with what leads to a win or loss.

- When scoring seven runs or more, the Naturals are 30-6, while when scoring six runs or less, just 7-42.
- The Naturals are 24-11 when recording 10 hits or more, but when they get nine hits or less, are just 13-37.
- The Naturals are 34-11 when out-hitting their opponent or hits are tied, but 3-37 when out-hit by their opponent.
- When the Naturals score first, they are 23-16, whereas 14-32 when the opponent scores first.

ONE RUN GOES A LONG WAY

The Naturals are 4-17 in one-run games this season, meaning 17 of their 48 losses (35.4%) this season have been decided by just one run.

- The Naturals have had the tying run at the plate or on base in 19 losses this season (including 13 of their one-run losses).

Yo, YOU WANNA SEE SOME REAL SPEED?

Through 85 games, the Naturals have stolen **119 bases in 144 attempts** (average 1.40 steals/game, 82.6% success rate).

- 119 steals ranks tied for the most in the Texas League, tied fourth in Double-A and tied 22nd in the Minors.
- An 84.8% success rate is the sixth-highest among all Minor League teams with at least 100 attempted steals.
- Maikel Garcia's** 27 steals (in 30 attempts) ranks second in the Texas League and sixth among all Double-A hitters/basestealers.
- The Naturals have stolen at least one base in 56 of 85 games this season (65.9%), including 31 games with two or more steals ... the team stole a season-high six bases on July 6 vs. Tulsa with a pair of five-steal games as well this season.
- The Naturals have pulled off a double steal 16 times, meaning 32 of 119 steals this year (26.9%) have come on a double-steal.
- Naturals players have stolen multiple bases in a game 14 times, SIX of those occasions being Garcia ... **Tucker Bradley** had the first three-steal game of the season (and of his career) on July 9 vs. Tulsa.

HOMECOMING KING

Naturals utility player **Nick Loftin** returns home this week, playing in his hometown of Corpus Christi, Texas for the first time in professional ball.

- The 23-year-old was born and raised in Corpus Christi, where he attended W. B. Ray High School, a 4.7 mile or 15 minute drive south of Whataburger Field ... as a senior in 2017, Loftin was the 2017 All-South Texas Player of the Year, as he batted .465 with three home runs, while serving as the ace of the pitching staff, going 11-4 with a 1.10 ERA on the mound.
- Loftin originally committed to play college baseball at Texas A&M University-Corpus Christi, but later switched his commitment to Baylor University, where he enrolled after going undrafted in the 2017 MLB Draft.
- This week, Loftin is 8-for-19 (.421) at the plate with eight runs scored, three extra-base hits, two runs batted in and four walks and two steals.*
- On Friday, Loftin went 4-for-5 with two doubles and a home run, his first four-hit game of the season and his second game of the season with three extra-base hits ... the home run was his 11th of the season, a new single-season record, after he hit 10 last season.

ROCKIN' ROBBIE

After slumping for much of June, first baseman **Robbie Glendinning** has returned to form, with a hot stretch that has carried from late June to July.

- In 13 games this month, Glendinning is hitting .315 (17-for-54) with eight extra-base hits and 14 runs batted in ... his 35 total bases are tied for the fifth-most in the Texas League this month, while 14 runs batted in are tied for the sixth-most.
- He has reached base in 66 of 74 games he's played this season (89.2%), reaching multiple times in 35 games this season ... he has hits in 50 of 74 games, including 24 multi-hit games this season, which is tied with Maikel Garcia for the most among Naturals hitters ... 22 of his multi-hit games are two-hit games and a pair of three-hit games, both coming during his recent hitting streak.
- Between June 24 and July 6, the Western Australian compiled an 11-game hitting streak, over which he hit .468 (22-for-47) with five doubles, seven home runs and a 1.549 OPS, including homers in his last four games at Amarillo ... in that period, he collected 9 multi-hit games, including four straight to start the streak and five straight to start the month of July, at the end of the streak ... his stretch of four straight games with a home run is just the fifth four-game homer streak in Naturals history, the second this year, after Nick Loftin opened the series in Amarillo with homers in four consecutive games.

TYLER, THE CREATOR (OF RUNS)

Naturals outfielder **Tyler Gentry** has been one of the best hitters in the Kansas City Royals' system this season, with an incredible impact since joining the Naturals last month.

- He is the Royals' organization leader in batting average (.329) and OPS (.974), while ranking second in on-base percentage (.413) and slugging percentage (.561) ... his 50 runs batted in between Quad Cities and Northwest Arkansas rank fifth, while 13 total home runs is tied sixth.
- Among qualified full-season Minor League hitters, Gentry ranks EIGHTH in batting average, while tied 16th in OPS.
- Since his call-up to Double-A on June 14, Gentry is batting .320 (32-for-100) over 26 games with six doubles, eight home runs and 27 runs batted (1.04 RBI per game) and a 1.005 OPS ... he's driven in at least one run in 15 of 26 games, with 7 multi-RBI games.
- He has hits in 18 of his first 26 games with the Naturals and has reached base in 23 of 26 games, including 17 straight.
- Over 13 games in the month of July, Gentry is hitting .353 (18-for-51) with six extra-base hits and 16 runs batted in, while he has scored 13 runs as well ... his 16 RBI this month rank third among Texas League hitters.
- Between June 26 and July 8, Gentry recorded a 10-game hitting streak, where he hit .474 (18-for-38) with three doubles, four home runs and 13 runs batted in ... with seven walks as well, he compiled a 1.400 OPS in that window ... the 10-game hitting streak was the longest of his career, topping a pair of seven-game streaks he had this season in High-A with Quad Cities, his first seven games and last seven games with River Bandits.

PUSHIN P(ORTER)

Catcher **Logan Porter** has quietly flown under the radar as one of the top hitters in the Royals system so far in 2022.

- Among qualified full-season Minor League hitters, Porter ranks FOURTH in on-base percentage (.446) ... he is third among all Double-A hitters in OBP and ninth in OPS (.951) ... in the Texas League, he is third in OBP, seventh in OPS and ninth in batting average (.308).
- Among qualified Royals minor league hitters, Porter's .446 OBP is the highest on-base percentage in the system, while he ranks second in OPS, third in batting average and fourth in slugging percentage (.505) ... his 49 walks are second in the system, behind Nick Pratto's 51.
- Porter has reached base in 57 of 64 games he's played this season (89.1%), with hits in 53 of 64 and 20 multi-hit games, nine of which came in May.
- Porter's 17-game on-base streak between May 31 and June 23 is tied with Robbie Glendinning and Tyler Gentry for the longest on the team this season, a stretch where he hit .321 (17-for-53) with 15 walks and a .493 OBP.

Pitchers of the Month (1)

☛ **May: LHP Drew Parrish** ... started five games and went 3-1 with a 0.59 ERA (2 ER in 30.2 IP) ... only allowed 15 hits and four walks, while striking out 29 opposing hitters ... among qualified Texas League pitchers, threw the most innings and had the lowest ERA and WHIP (0.62), while holding opponents to a .144 average.

Players of the Week (3)

- ☛ **April 25 to May 1: 2B Michael Massey** ... hit .417 (10-for-28) across six games with a league-best 19 total bases and nine runs batted in, while tied for the Texas League lead with 10 hits. His 1.221 OPS ranked third among players with at least 20 at-bats, while his .417 average tied for second among that same group.
- ☛ **May 23 to May 29: 2B Michael Massey** ... hit a league-best .481 (13-for-27) across six games in Midland, while tied for the league lead with 19 total bases. He drove in nine runs as well, doubling three times with one home run, a go-ahead grand slam on May 24 and collected multiple hits in each of the first five games of the series.
- ☛ **June 27 to July 3: OF Tyler Gentry** ... hit .435 (10-for-23) with two doubles, four home runs and 11 runs batted in, which was tied for the most in the league. Recorded 24 total bases with a 1.043 slugging percentage 1.543 OPS.

Pitchers of the Week (3)

- ☛ **May 2 to May 8: LHP Drew Parrish** ... threw 7.0 scoreless innings on May 7 @ Springfield ... held the Cardinals to just two hits and one walk while striking out four. He retired the first eight he faced and the final five, with five 1-2-3 frames.
- ☛ **May 9 to May 15: LHP Drew Parrish** ... threw 7.0 scoreless innings on May 13 vs. Wichita ... held the Wind Surge to just three hits and no walks while striking out nine. Between the second and sixth innings, he retired 13 straight batters, retiring the side 1-2-3 in the first inning, as well as the third through sixth.
- ☛ **June 6 to June 12: LHP Anthony Veneziano** ... threw 7.0 scoreless innings in a complete-game shutout on June 9 @ Tulsa ... held the Drillers to just three hits and one walk while striking out five, on 79 pitches. Retired the final eight hitters he faced and 11 of the last 12, only needing five pitches for a 1-2-3 seventh inning to end the night.

TOOLS TEAM

Three Naturals players were listed in *Baseball America's* 2022 Best Tools Survey of the Kansas City Royals' organization.

- ☛ CF **Nick Loftin** is rated as having the "*Best Strike-Zone Discipline*" in the system.
- ☛ RF **Seuly Matias** is rated as having the "*Best Outfield Arm*" in the system.

- Widger and his wife, Whitney, reside in Pennsville, N.J., with their children: C.J., Ashlynn and Skylar.



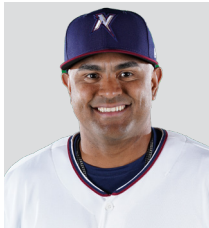
#43 DERRICK LEWIS • PITCHING COACH

#24 CHRISTIAN COLÓN • ASSISTANT HITTING COACH

- Christian Colón returns to the organization as the Naturals Assistant Hitting Coach in 2022, following a 12-year professional career.
- He was the Royals first-round pick in the 2010 MLB Draft, scored the winning run in the 2014 AL Wild Card game and had the game-winning hit in the title-clinching Game 5 of the 2015 World Series.
- After being drafted in 2010, Colón ascended to Northwest Arkansas by 2011 and between 2011, 2012 and 2014, played 202 games for the Naturals ... in 2011, Colón led the Texas League in sacrifices (21), while leading the team in at-bats (491) and hits (126). His 21 sacrifices that season are the most a Naturals player has ever recorded in a single season, while 28 overall are tied for the club record.
- During his playing career, he made stops in Miami (2017) and Cincinnati (2019-20) ... spent 2021 with the Rich Baseball-owned Buffalo Bisons (Triple-A, Toronto) before announcing his retirement.
- He also played in parts of four seasons in the Puerto Rican Winter League.
- Christian lives in Cave Springs, Ark. (15 minutes North of Arvest Ballpark) with his wife, Kayla, and three daughters, Marley, Mia and Lucy.



#23 MIKE JIRSCHOLE • BENCH COACH

- Mike Jirschele enters his first season as the Bench Coach for Northwest Arkansas after spending last season in the same role for Manager Chris Widger in Quad Cities.
- He served as a Special Assistant to the General Manager in 2020 and was on the Royals coaching staff as the Third Base Coach from 2014-19 and won the World Series in 2015.

- Prior to his 11-year stint with Omaha, he served as the Royals Minor League Infield Coordinator for four years (1998-2002), while he held managerial positions with Omaha (1995-97), Wilmington (1994), Rockford (1993) and the Gulf Coast Royals (1992).
- Jirschele was originally selected by the Texas Rangers in the fifth round of the 1977 MLB Draft and played in 999 minor league games over 13-plus seasons in the Rangers and Royals systems.

- Danny Accola is entering his seventh season with the Royals organization and first as the certified athletic trainer with the Naturals, after serving in the same role with the Quad Cities in 2021.
