TODAY'S HEADLINES

LAST GAME'S RESULT - The St. Paul Saints dropped both ends of a double header on Sunday afternoon against the Columbus Clipper at Huntington Park. They lost game one 5-3 and dropped game two 5-4 in eight innings. In game one Bailey Ober made a Major League rehab start and went 5.0 innings allowing five runs (four earned) on four hits while fanning seven. Jermaine Palacios homered for the Saints. In game two, Curtis Terry's two-run homer gave the Saints a 4-3 lead, but a solo homer in the seventh by Tyler Freeman with two outs tied it up. A sacrifice fly from Oscar Gonzalez in the eighth won it for Columbus.

EVEN STEVEN: The Saints and Storm Chasers battled it out 716 times last year (OK only 30) and the Saints finished .500 in those 30 games. They were 9-9 at CHS Field and 6-6 at Werner Park. Both teams longest winning streak against the other was three games. The Saints outscored the Storm Chasers 181-160 and outslugged them 59-48.

DOUBLE WHAMMY: The St. Paul Saints lost both ends of a doubleheader on Sunday against the Columbus Clippers. It was their first doubleheader of the season and fourth in franchise history. Last season they were 1-1-1 in their three doubleheaders. The only other time they were swept in a double dip was July 11 at Iowa when they failed to collect a hit in game one and were walked off in the seventh. They lost game two 3-2 also being walked off in the bottom of the seventh.

THE WEEK FROM HELLLLLLL: The St. Paul Saints have felt the pain over their last seven games, going 0-7 during that span. It ties their longest losing streak in franchise history. Last season their losing streak started with a loss at home to Iowa on August 22, similar to this one beginning at home against Iowa on May 8. Last year they went to Toledo and lost all six games. This year they were swept in a six game series by Columbus.

ROCKY ROAD: The St. Paul Saints lost for the seventh and eighth consecutive times on the road Sunday afternoon setting the franchise record for most consecutive losses on the road. They were swept in a six-game series by Columbus and lost their last two games in Toledo on April 23 and 24. Their previous lonest losing streak on the road was six when they were swept in a six game series by Toledo from August 24-29, 2021.

OFFENSIVE DEFENSE: The St. Paul Saints were one of the top defensive teams in the International League, but over the last six days they haven't played like it. They have committed an error in a franchise record six straight games, surpassing the five straight from August 26-September 1, 2021. They have committed 11 errors in the last six games, a .950 fielding percentage, the worst in Triple-A during that time. The next closest is Jacksonville at .961

ONE HIT WONDER: Elliot Soto is Mr. Consistency. He had his 12-game hitting streak come to an end on May 13. He has hit safely in 19 of 24 games he's played. In those 19 games he's collected exactly one hit in each of those games.

WAS THAT A BUNT?: It took until game 105 last season before the Saints laid down a sacrifice bunt. On Wednesday, the Saints laid down their first of the season when David Bañuelos dropped one down in game 30 of the season.

WALK THE LINE: The St. Paul Saints drew a season high 11 walks on May 7 vs. Iowa. It's the second most walks in franchise history. Their franchise record is 13 walks on September 26, 2021 against...the Iowa Cubs.

TWINS UPDATE - The Minnesota Twins went into the Oakland Coliseum and took game one of their three-game series 3-1, improving to 4-0 against the Oakland Athletics this season. All four games have been decided by one or two runs. Gary Sánchez homered and the bullpen of Yennier Cano, Griffin Jax, and Tyler Duffey combined to throw 5.0 shutout innings allowing two hits and striking out four.

LAST START: 5/11 @ COL...hurled 6.0 no-hitn shutout innings while walking four and striking out seven...did not receive a decision in a 6-5, 12 inning Clipper victory.

START PRIOR: 5/5 vs. IOW...pitched 5.0 innings allowing three runs on nine hits while walking one and striking out three...did not receive a decision in a 6-3 Saints victory.

AND THE AWARD GOES TO....On May 11 at Columbus González was lights out going 6.0 no-hit, shutout innings throwing a team season high 88 pitches. That impressive performance earned him the International League Pitcher of the Week for the week of May 9-15. It's the first award for the Saints in 2022 and the second Pitcher of the Week award in franchise history. RHP Griffin Jax earned the same honor for the week of May 24-30, 2021.

ALEXANDER THE GREAT: While guys like Cole Sands and Dereck Rodriguez go by their middle name, Alexander González goes by a nickname, Chi Chi. Nickname was given to him by his Great Uncle when he was six-years-old. None of the children in the González family go by their given name, they all go by nicknames. His older sister Lily is Niña and his other sister, Erika, goes by Nene.

FAMOUS CHI CHI'S: Chi Chi González is not the only famous Chi Chi in sports. Of course, many people know Juan "Chi Chi" Rodriguez, the first Puerto Rican to be inducted into the World Golf Hall of Fame, but how many people know Federico Emilio "Chi Chi" Olivo, who pitched three seasons for the Milwaukee Braves (1961, 65-65) and a season for the Atlanta Braves (1966). Other famous Chi Chi's are Govinda Arun Ahuja, a Bollywood actor, comedian, dancer, and former politician, who was given the nickname Chi Chi meaning "little finger" in Punjabi. There is also Chidi "Chi Chi" Osondu, a Nigerian-American record producer and songwriter who frequently collaborates with Lil Baby. Finally, there is Rafael "Chi Chi" Quintero, a CIA operative against the Cuban led Fidel Castro's regime.

ROOKIE'S RAVE REVIEW: In his first Major League start on May 30, 2015 with the Texas Rangers, González dominated the Boston Red Sox. For the first five innings he kept the Red Sox hitless. He finally gave up a leadoff single in the sixth inning to future Hall of Famer, David Ortiz. González recorded two more outs before departing and going 5.2 scoreless. The 5.0 hitless innings was the longest such streak to begin a career for a Rangers pitcher since 1992.

AND FOR AN ENCORE: Following his 5.2 scoreless innings in his first Major League start, González went out in start number two and promptly threw a complete game shutout against the Kansas City Royals on June 5. He became the first Ranger since Len Barker in 1976 to toss a complete game shutout in one of his first two Major League games. Per Elias, González set a Rangers franchise record by beginning his career with 14.2 consecutive scoreless innings. The streak ended with one out in the first inning of his third start on June 11 at Oakland, but that would be the lone run he allowed in his 7.0 innings of work that night.

MAKE IT STOP: Upon joining the Colorado Rockies in 2019, González proceeded to lose six straight decisions while the Rockies lost each of his first nine starts and each of his first 10 appearances. He went 0-6 with a 7.29 ERA (42.0 IP, 34 ER) over that span. He was the first pitcher in franchise history to have the team lose each of his first eight starts. It was the longest such streak in MLB since the Reds lost each of Cory Reed's first 14 starts, June 18, 2016-September 4, 2018. The streak finally came to an end on September 10 vs. St. Louis when he went 6.0 innings allowing one run on four hits while fanning four in a 2-1 Rockies victory.

CAFE ARCANGEL: In 2021 with the Rockies during Spring Training he wanted to make Cuban coffee for his teammates. He learned to make coffee from his Mom while growing up in South Florida. He would make the coffee and deliver a cup to any locker of a player that wanted one. The shot led to a conversation, some gossip and updates on camp, life and the person behind the number. The pandemic made it difficult to deliver the cups of coffee, so instead of delivering the coffee player to player, he set up a shop at his locker. He would then take orders and drop them off at players lockers. However, the Cuban coffee wasn't for everyone as it's very strong and sugary.

- Allowed a home run in 14 of 18 starts and at least one home run in 11 straight from May 19-September 2 for the Rockies in 2021
- Missed the final month of 2021 from September 8-October 2 due to a right oblique strain
- Went 2-0 with a 1.65 ERA (27.1 IP, 5 ER) in five appearances (four starts) in September, 2019 and posted the fourth-lowest ERA in the National League that month
- Made his second relief appearance of the season September 22, 2019 at Dodger Stadium and earned a win. He pitched 5.0 innings and allowed two unearned runs on two hits with one walk and eight strikeouts. The eight strikeouts were a career high and the second most by a Rockies reliever in franchise history (most: nine, Bruce Ruffin, September 14, 1993, game one vs. Houston).
- Started for the Rockies on June 25, 2019 vs. San Francisco. Became the first pitcher to start for the Rockies that made his debut for another team since Tyler Chatwood in 2017, a span of 382 games

- Made two rehab stints with the AZL Rangers and Spokane Indians in 2018. Appeared in three games, two starts, allowing two hits across 10.0 innings with eight strikeouts
- Missed the entire 2017 season due to "Tommy John" surgery on right elbow
- Named the Texas Rangers 2015 Minor League Pitcher of the Year
- Threw a complete-game shutout on June 5, 2015 vs. the Kansas City Royals, his second career start, allowing three hits with two walks and two strikeouts
