Tonight's Game

The Clippers will send RHP **Justin Campbell** to the mound tonight, looking to avoid an 0-4 series start for the first time since 7/29-8/1/25 at Jacksonville. The Indians will counter with RHP **Antwone Kelly**. Columbus is 52-39 (.571) versus right handers this year. Kelly has pitched against Columbus twice in his career, going 0-1 with a 7.88ERA (8.0IP, 13H, 7R, 7ER, 4BB, 4K).

vs. the Indians

Columbus is 7-11 against Indianapolis this year, posting a -25 run margin (9-9, +13 in 2025; 12-5, +45 in 2024; 10-8, -23 in 2023; 12-8, +53 in 2022). Since the start of the 2022 season, the Clippers are 18-10 (.643) in games against Indianapolis that are decided by at least five. Individually, **Cooper Ingle** is 21x75 (.280) with 3HR, 9RBI in 21G vs. Indy in his career (**Milan Tolentino** has 6HR, 21RBI in 35G).

Start with a Bang

Over the last 25G, the Clippers have plated 185 runs (most in the IL, 7.4 per), with 126 (68%) tallied in the first four innings of the game, including nine innings of 5+. The opposition has only 61 in the first four innings of the last 25G, but is outscoring the Clippers 93-59 thereafter. Columbus is the only undefeated team in the IL when leading after the 7th (48-0, 58 straight since 8/22/25 vs. Omaha).

Not Enough

Last night marked the seventh straight game in which the Clippers took a multi-run lead, but they have gone 2-5 in those contests (3rd fewest blown multi-run leads in the IL prior to 8/20, going 58-11 in such games). Among those lost leads was a 5-run advantage on 8/22 vs. St. Paul (Columbus is 32-5, .865, with a lead of 5+; rest of IL is 527-22, .960). When scoring first, Columbus is 37-25 (.597, 17th).

Ingle is Back

In 35G since his option, **Cooper Ingle** is 44x137 (.321), drawing 30BB (.440OBP) with 16XBH (6HR, .526SLG; 0XBH in last 11G). He dropped below .300 on Wednesday (10x57, .175, in last 16G, but has 19BB for a .382OBP) for the first time since 7/22 (went 23x48 over next 11G to get back to .328 on 8/4). At catcher, Ingle has a 1.255OPS (15HR) in 47G (.627OPS, 3HR in 38G between DH and LF).

Master of the Universe

Daniel Schnee-mann has seven multi-hit games since 8/15 (16x33, .485) and, dating to 4/25/24, he has played 54G in the IL, batting .333/.452/.595 with 52 runs scored (23 runs in last 18G) and 38RBI. Since getting optioned at the end of July, Schneemann has drawn 20BB in 22G (20% of PA), while reaching base in 20 of 22 (.455OBP, 4th in the IL; current 12G on base streak: .527OBP since 8/12).

Big Time Production

Kyle Manzardo has hit safely in each of 10G since 8/15 (.325, 13x40, 2HR), but saw his RBI streak snapped at 5G (9RBI) last night. In his Columbus career, Manzardo has played only 121G (531PA), but he has still managed 66XBH (.560SLG), including 30HR, against just 50 singles. Additionally, he has scored 95 times with 83RBI, while keeping his strikeout rate under 20% (101K, 19%; 82BB, 15%).

King Ralph

Dating to 7/28, **Ralph Velazquez** leads the IL in HR (16, +5), RBI (35, +7) and SLG (.880, +144), but saw his on base streak snapped at 17G last night (.461OBP from 8/4-8/26). He is the reigning IL Batter of the Week (.455, 6HR, 12RBI vs. St. Paul) and, aside from going 0x21 in 6G at St. Paul (7/21-7/26), is hitting .333/.405/.690 since 6/18 (19HR, 49RBI). He is 2RBI away from a career high (85RBI in '25).

All or Nothing

Over his last 24G, since 7/25, **Kody Huff** is mired in a 17x84 (.202) slump, though he has connected for 6HR (19HR on the season; had 18HR in career prior). He leads the team in runs (73) and RBI (69) and is set to become the fourth 70-70 Clipper since 2019 (**Johnathan Rodriguez**, **Jhonkensy Noel**, **Juan Brito**). Tonight will set his career high in games played (102; one double from tying personal best).

Rough Stuff

In the last 12 days, **Milan Tolentino** (.091, 3x33), **Blake Perkins** (.148, 4x27), **Alfonsin Rosario** (.208, 5x24) and **Dayan Frias** (.048, 1x21) have combined to hit .124 (13x105), though Tolentino has a pair of bombs (38 since start of '25, 2nd most in IL). The quartet has managed only 9BB (8%) against 48K (42%) in 97PA, but they were 5x16 with 4XBH last night (Rosario was 3x4 with two doubles).

This Date in Clipper History

8/28/2013

Columbus erased a 4-0 deficit, scoring seven times in the 6th (**Chun-Hsiu Chen** grand slam) on the way to a 7-4 win vs. Louisville. It was third time that year that the Clippers played a game in which they had a 7-run inning, while failing to score in any other inning. Overall in 2013, they played in 29 games with only a single run-scoring inning, but still managed to win 10 of them.

First Half Wrap

Despite being eliminated from playoff contention on the penultimate Sunday of the first half, the Clippers were 41-33 and finished with their first winning record in the front half since the season was split in 2023 (averaged 32 wins from 2023-25, topping out at 34-38, .472, last season). From 4/22-6/17, they spent every day between 3.0 and 6.0 games off the lead, while occupying anywhere between 4th and 13th in the standings. A late push (15-6 from 5/16-6/9) got them to within 2.5 before derailing with a 3G losing streak at Indy to seal their fate. On the back half, Columbus has posted just one winning record, clinching a playoff berth in 2024 with a mark of 48-26 (.649).

Huntington (Small) Park

In each of the first 11 seasons after the move downtown (2009-19), Huntington Park ranked among the top two in the IL in homers per game. With the arrival of six new parks to the IL in 2021, Huntington Park finished 4th, 6th and 10th from 2021-23, respectively. The 2024 season saw a return to the top (2.96; 108HR hit by the Clippers, most for the home team in HP's existence), but it dropped back to 7th last year (2.31). Including the postseason, the Clippers have been out-homered over the life of the park (1,494 to 1,439).

Challenging Times

The Clippers are 178-141 (.558) in pitch reviews, with batters going 92-85 (.520) and pitchers/catchers going 86-56 (.606). They have run out of challenges in 47G and have not challenged in 8G. Last season, they were correct 43.1% of the time (2nd worst in the IL).

Extras, Read All About Them

Columbus is 5-4 in extra innings this year, after having gone .500 in each of the last two seasons. Since the start of the 2018 season, when baserunners started appearing at second base, the Clippers are 55-37 when playing past regulation (.598, best in the IL; no other team above .570), including 27-17 at home (.614; 5-7 in last 12G). Of the 92G to require extra play, 73 have been resolved after one frame (including nine DH games) and only one has gone past the 12th (5-4 loss in 13 on 9/20/22 at Toledo).

On the Runs

Starting with the embiggened 150G schedule in 2022, the Clippers scored over 800 runs in three consecutive seasons from 2022-2024 (855, 808 and 805 runs, respectively; accounting for the 3rd, 4th and 5th best totals in team history). Following a steep decline last season (670, fewest scored in a full season since 2018), Columbus is looking to top 800 again (on pace for 841, would rank as 4th most all-time; record is 898 scored in 1983).

On the Run

On the basepaths, the Clippers are making a run at the franchise mark in stolen bases, with 149 through 126G (on pace for 174SB). The team record was set in 2024 when Columbus swiped an even 200, but the team speed was throttled last year (129SB; still, the 2nd highest total since the Cleveland affiliation started in 2009). However, with 44CS so far, the Clippers are also pacing for the most times caught stealing of the Cleveland affiliation (51; nabbed 51 times in 2024).

Crazy Eighthths

From the 8th inning on, the Clippers have scored an IL-best 175 runs while crafting a .882OPS (over 60 points better than all other teams). On the flipside, Columbus has given up 118 runs from the 8th on, resulting in a +57 run differential (Clippers are getting outscored 293-184 from innings 5-7).

Juiced is Loose

In the Huntington Park Era (since 2009), Columbus leads the IL with 80 grand slams and 1,989RBI (led IL in RBI in 2010, '11, '12, '17, '18 and '22). Collecting an IL-best 10 grand slams last season, it marked their fifth straight season with at least four (118RBI last year; had only 97RBI in 2024, worst in a 140+G season since 2016).

In Big Trouble

The Clipper pitching staff is trending toward the worst ERA in club history, sitting at 5.51 through 126G. Since the reorganization of the minor leagues in 2021, Columbus has twice finished the season with a 5+ ERA (current record is 5.32, set in 2023), after having done so just once in the first 43 seasons (5.08 in 1983). Additionally, the staff is pacing to give up 214HR (would tie for most in franchise history; 214HR allowed in 2023).

Department of Defense

The Columbus defense is sitting at 7th in the IL this year (.981), following a 2025 that saw a franchise record (.985, led the IL). On 4/10 at Worcester, the defense collapsed for the first 5E game since 8/27/24 (topped out at 3E in a game twice last year and had fewer than 5E in 21 of 26 series). The Clippers have played flawlessly in 69G this season (40-29, .580), after doing so in nearly 60% of games last year (44-42, .512), including 16 straight from 6/20-7/8/25 (longest streak in the IL over the last 20 years).

Good Baseball

CJ Kayfus bunted a runner into scoring position with a single on 7/5 vs. Louisville, with that runner kicking off a 5-run inning that led the Clippers to victory. Since the start of the 2018 season, Columbus is 90-23 (.796) in games in which a run is scored after a good bunt attempt, including a 7-2 mark this season (.778, blew 7-run lead in one of the losses; went 23-2 in 2018).

To the End

The Clippers have the 8th most last at bat wins this year (14, four off the lead) while playing in the 12th most games decided in the last at bat (27, Norfolk has 39). Since the start of the 2024 season, Columbus has played in 101G decided in the last at bat (2nd most in the IL), going 48-53 (.475, 16th best winning percentage; 3rd most wins, 2nd most losses).

Manager Profile

Andy Tracy made his Clippers debut in 2021, following **Tony Mansolino's** championship rookie year in 2019 (sixth Clipper skipper to win Governors' Cup in first season; **Gene Michael**-'79, **Joe Altobelli**-'80, **Frank Verdi**-'81, **Bucky Dent**-'87 and **Mike Sarbaugh**-'10). This season marks Tracy's seventh year as a manager (first with Williamsport in the Philadelphia system), as he holds a career record of 452-466 (.492), 422-420 with Columbus (.501).

Worth the Wait:

Campbell made his professional debut on 4/2 vs. West Michigan, 1,355 days after being taken in the supplemental 1st round of the 2022 draft. His career was delayed by surgeries on his right elbow in both May of 2023 and April of 2024 (also had surgery on right wrist in October of 2024). He proceeded to allow 1ER in his first 6GS (13.1IP, 38.2 pitches per start), while walking just a pair of 48BF (4%; also had 18K, 38%). Campbell was promoted to Triple-A on 7/1, but injured his oblique during warmups and left the game before it started (eventually placed on the DL).

Wilding Out:

In his final start with Lake County, Campbell issued 3BB (11BF) and then surrendered 22BB across 9GS with Akron (152BF, 15%), including a pair of outings with 5BB each. His strikeout rate dipped to 29% in that stretch (48K), but he snagged a career high with 8K on 6/6 at Chesapeake (0BB).

No Homers Club (You're Allowed to Have One):

Among all full season minor league pitchers with at least 200BF this season, Campbell is one of 21 (one of four starters) that has allowed a single longball (no pitchers have 0HR). That shot came on 6/13 at Erie, snapping a streak of 158BF without a homer to start his career (59BF since).

Buckling Down:

Opposing hitters have had 84 chances with runners on base against Campbell this season, batting .120 (9x75) with only 3XBH (all doubles, .160SLG) and 9BB (.214OBP). Campbell has whiffed 37% of those hitters (31K), while inducing 4GIDP. With the bases empty, opponents have fared a little better, slashing .217/.328/.296 with a HR in 115AB (36K in 134BF, 27%).

Starting Now:

Peterson got a late start to the season, beginning the year on the shelf with a strained right triceps. Since being activated on 4/28, he is one of 57 pitchers in the IL to accumulate at least 60.0IP, ranking 25th among that group with a 4.58ERA (90.1IP, 46ER) and 28th with a 1.43WHIP. He ranks 2nd with 98K thanks to a 12K outing on 6/16 vs. Scranton/WB (one off career high of 13K with Lake County at Cedar Rapids on 5/29/24; had second career 0K game on 7/9 at Lehigh Valley).

That's Over:

From 5/9-7/23, the Clippers went 1-12 in Peterson's 13G, as he personally went 0-8 (longest losing streak of career, had 10 losses in previous two seasons combined). He registered a 5.52ERA (58.2IP, 36ER) over the stretch, while the bullpen produced a 6.99ERA (47.2IP, 37ER) and blew three saves. In 5G beginning with 7/29 vs. Toledo, he is 4-0 and owns a 3.28ERA (24.2IP, 9ER), as the Clippers have been victorious in each game.

Love Those Ohio Mounds:

Peterson excels when pitching in Ohio, having appeared in the state 42 times over his short career (19G with Columbus, 12G with Akron, 8G with Lake County, 3G in Toledo). He owns a 16-10 record in the Buckeye State, fashioning a 2.57ERA (234.2IP, 187H, 71R, 67ER, 51BB, 232K). Outside of Ohio, his ERA sits at 4.43 over 57G (278.1IP, 294H, 158R, 137ER, 70BB, 254K).

First and Foremost:

Through his first 12GS, Peterson allowed a single run in the 1st inning (homer to **Kaelen Culpepper** to lead off the game on 5/15 at St. Paul; opposing hitters were 3x38 with 3BB and 16K in the 1st inning). That all changed in his 13th start, at Lehigh Valley on 7/9, when he labored through the opening frame on 41 pitches, allowing a trio of runs (3x6, 2BB). In 7G since, including his two relief outings, Peterson has held the opposition to 4ER in his first inning of work (9x31, 1BB, 8K). Despite that early success, the top third of the order has a .961OPS off Peterson (9HR in 137AB), while batters 4-9 produce a .661OPS (4HR in 213AB).

In a Jam:

Opposing hitters are batting .312 (44x141) with runners on base (.313, 25x80 with RISP) this year, while going just 52x209 (.249) with the bases empty. He did not uncork a wild pitch this season until his 410th offering with men on base, 7/9 at Lehigh Valley (had another wild pitch in next outing, 7/18 vs. Indy; 3WP in 1,232 pitches with men on base during Clipper career).

From the 'Pen:

Peterson made his third career relief appearance on 7/18 vs. Indianapolis, picking up a suspended game in the 4th inning against the Indians. Pitching on his regular day of rest, he threw 72 pitches over 4.0IP, while allowing 4ER (15.0IP, 11ER in relief career). He then made his fourth career appearance (all with Columbus) on 8/23 vs. St. Paul, piggybacking off **Justin Campbell** (82 pitches, 4.2IP, 6H, 3R, 3ER, 0BB, 7K).
