Tonight's Game

The Clippers will send RHP **Austin Peterson** to the mound tonight, looking for his first win of the season (last win: 9/9/25 at St. Paul). Scranton/WB will counter with RHP **Brendan Beck**. Columbus is 32-16 (.667) versus right handers this year. Beck has never pitched against Columbus in his career, as tonight will be his 29th career game in Triple-A.

vs. the RailRiders

Since a 14 game win streak over the RailRiders from 4/24/13-8/9/14, the Clippers have gone 17-23 against Scranton/WB (4-2 in last series played, 2023 in Huntington Park). **Kolby Allard** is the only active Clipper to have ever played against Scranton/WB in his career (1G in 2018 with Gwinnett, 2G in 2024 with Lehigh Valley; **George Valera** played in the 2023 series, but is currently on waivers).

Just For Fun

The Memphis win on Sunday eliminated Columbus from playoff contention, as the race for the first half is down to four teams. However, Saturday's win at Indy ensured the Clippers will have a winning record in the first half for the first time since the season was split. In the second half, Columbus has one winning record, clinching the playoffs in 2024 at 48-26 (.649; 2nd in IL history, SWB was 49-26 last year).

Better Late Than Never

Each of the last two Columbus wins have come in the last at bat (both in extras), coming on the heels of three last at bat wins in the last home stand vs. Omaha (two walk-offs). The Clippers now lead the IL with 11 such wins, in addition to pacing the circuit with 111 runs scored from the 8th inning on (.945OPS from the 8th on, +99 on 2nd place). The 24 comeback wins for Columbus also lead the IL.

Close-ing the Gap

Columbus has won five straight 1-run games (Sunday's was the lone game of Indianapolis series not decided by at least five) and seven of the last eight, improving to 9-7 in those games (.562, t-7th in the IL). In addition, the Clippers have gone 12-3 in the last 15G with a margin of three or fewer (26-17, .605, 3rd best). Over the last 25G, in which the Clippers are 17-8, they have a +5 run margin (131-126).

Getting There

Cooper Ingle reached the qualification level for rate statistics in the IL on 6/7 and his current .423OBP ranks 3rd in the IL. Ingle has slumped to a .272OBP over the last 17G (14x71, .197, 8BB, 20K), but since his Triple-A debut on 8/13/25, he has the best OBP in the IL (.409, +8 points on 2nd place) and the 4th most walks (58). As a catcher, Ingle has a 1.164OPS in 30G (.441OPS in 14G elsewhere).

Nayled It

The Clippers are 10-5 with **Bo Naylor** in the lineup, averaging 5.7 runs per game (4.2 per in previous 10G). He has reached base in 14 of 15G, posting a .424OBP (12BB in last 43PA; also has 2HR and 14K, yielding a 65% three true outcome rate). Columbus catchers are hitting .297/.442/.530, leading the IL in all three categories by a wide margin (2nd in all is Memphis: .277/.389/.486).

Struggling Slugging

CJ Kayfus enters today with a .329SLG since getting optioned on 4/13 (5XBH in 22G, all doubles). Last season, Kayfus had 31XBH in 68G for the Clippers, including 13HR (last on 7/19/25 at Iowa, 104AB since). Aside from a 4RBI outing on 4/26 at Buffalo, Kayfus doesn't have any other multi-RBI games in his last 38G, dating to 7/3/25 (18RBI total; had 36RBI in first 52G with Columbus).

Forty Forty

Kody Huff scored for the 40th time this year in his last game (6/13 at Indy), marking his first season with 40 runs and 40RBI. Despite having played only 54G this season, he is just five short of his career high in the runs department (45 in 98G with Akron in 2024) and his next RBI will tie a personal best there (47RBI in 101G with Columbus last year). He already owns career highs in triples (3) and HR (9).

Multi Milan

Milan Tolentino hit a 2-run homer on Sunday (30HR, 101RBI in Columbus career), giving him his second straight multi-RBI game (third of last 6G, once in previous 14G). His multi-hit, multi-score game on Saturday was his first in the hit column since 5/28 at Toledo (11G between) and first in the run column since 5/19 vs. Louisville (18G). In Huntington Park he owns an .855OPS in 88G of his career.

This Date in Clipper History

6/16/2017

Eric Stamets led off the 2nd, 4th and 6th innings with homers to stake Columbus to a 3-1 lead vs. Gwinnett, but the Clippers still needed a 2-run HR from **Richie Shaffer** in the 7th and a walk-off double from **Chris Colabello** in the 9th to triumph 7-6 over the Braves. For Shaffer, it was the 15th of 30HR, as he is one of eight Clippers to reach the 30HR plateau (**Steve Balboni** did it twice).

Huntington (Small) Park

In each of the first 11 seasons after the move downtown (2009-19), Huntington Park ranked among the top two in the IL in homers per game. With the arrival of six new parks to the IL in 2021, Huntington Park finished 4th, 6th and 10th from 2021-23, respectively. The 2024 season saw a return to the top (2.96; 108HR hit by the Clippers, most for the home team in HP's existence), but it dropped back to 7th last year (2.31). Including the postseason, the Clippers have been out-homered over the life of the park (1,438 to 1,386).

Challenging Times

The Clippers are 97-87 (.527) in pitch reviews, with batters going 51-59 (.464) and pitchers/catchers going 46-28 (.622). They have run out of challenges in 34G and have not challenged in 3G. Last season, they were correct 43.1% of the time (2nd worst in the IL).

Extras, Read All About Them

Columbus is 3-3 in extra innings this season, after having gone 5-5 in 2025 and 9-9 in 2024 (most losses since 2013, 12). Since the start of the 2018 season, when baserunners started appearing at second base, the Clippers are 53-36 when playing past regulation (.596, best in the IL; no other team above .570), including 26-17 at home (.605, but 4-7 in last 11G). Of the 89G to require extra play, 70 have been resolved after one frame (including eight DH games) and only one has gone past the 12th (5-4 loss in 13 innings on 9/20/22 at Toledo). From 7/31/19-6/26/21, Columbus played 85 straight within the allotted innings.

On the Runs

Starting with the embiggened 150G schedule in 2022, the Clippers scored over 800 runs in three consecutive seasons from 2022-2024 (855, 808 and 805 runs, respectively; accounting for the 3rd, 4th and 5th best totals in team history). Following a steep decline last season (670, fewest scored in a full season since 2018), Columbus is looking to easily top 800 again, with an outside chance to establish a new team high (on pace for 837, would rank as 4th most all-time; 898 scored in 1983).

On the Run

On the basepaths, the Clippers are making a run at the franchise mark in stolen bases, with 91 through the first 68G (on pace for 199SB). The team record was set in 2024 when Columbus swiped an even 200, but the team speed was throttled last year (129SB; still, the 2nd highest total since the Cleveland affiliation started in 2009). However, with 21CS so far, the Clippers are also pacing for the 4th most times caught stealing of the Cleveland affiliation (46; nabbed 51 times in 2024).

Juiced is Loose

In the Huntington Park Era (since 2009), Columbus leads the IL with 78 grand slams and 1,938RBI (led IL in RBI in 2010, '11, '12, '17, '18 and '22). Collecting an IL-best 10 grand slams last season, it marked their fifth straight season with at least four (118RBI last year; had only 97RBI in 2024, worst in a 140+G season since 2016).

Hits the Spot

When turning in as many or fewer hits than their opponents last season, the Clippers went 18-64 (.220), coming in 13th out of 20 in the IL. The 2024 season saw them post an IL-worst .185 (12-53) winning percentage in such games. When allowing at least 10 hits last year, Columbus was 7-41 (.146, 20th in the IL; started the season 1-20).

In Big Trouble

The Clipper pitching staff is trending toward the worst ERA in club history, sitting at 5.41 through the first 68G. Since the reorganization of the minor leagues in 2021, Columbus has twice finished the season with a 5+ ERA (current record is 5.32, set in 2023), after having done so just once in the first 43 seasons (5.08 in 1983). However, the staff is pacing to give up only 169HR (over 10HR under the average of 182 per season since the Year of the Homer in 2019).

Department of Defense

The Columbus defense is sitting at 10th in the IL this year (.979), following a 2025 that saw a franchise record (.985, led the IL). On 4/10 at Worcester, the defense collapsed for the first 5E game since 8/27/24 (topped out at 3E in a game twice last year and had fewer than 5E in 21 of 26 series). The Clippers have played flawlessly in 36G this season (24-12, .667), after doing so in nearly 60% of games last year (44-42, .512), including 16 straight from 6/20-7/8/25 (longest streak in the IL over the last 20 years).

Key to Victory

From 2022-23, Columbus owned the best record in the IL when holding opponents to three runs or fewer, going 95-8 (.922, no other team was above .880). The Clippers were 43-10 in such games in 2024 (.811, 13th in the IL), accumulating four losses by 4/14, and were just 47-10 (.825, 9th) last year, collecting four losses over 14G from 4/23-5/9 (had four losses total in both 2022 and 2023).

Good Baseball

Milan Tolentino bunted the winning run into scoring position in an extra-inning win at Indianapolis on 6/14. Since the start of the 2018 season, Columbus is 88-23 (.793) in games in which a run is scored after a good bunt attempt, including a 5-2 mark this season (.714, blew 7-run lead in one of the losses; went 23-2 in 2018).

To the End

The Clippers lead the IL in last at bat wins this year (11) while playing in the 2nd most games decided in the last at bat (Scranton/WB has played 20). Since the start of the 2024 season, Columbus has played in 93G decided in the last at bat (2nd most in the IL), going 45-48 (.484, 15th best winning percentage; 3rd most wins, 2nd most losses).

Manager Profile

Andy Tracy made his Clippers debut in 2021, following **Tony Mansolino's** championship rookie year in 2019 (sixth Clipper skipper to win Governors' Cup in first season; **Gene Michael**-'79, **Joe Altobelli**-'80, **Frank Verdi**-'81, **Bucky Dent**-'87 and **Mike Sarbaugh**-'10). This season marks Tracy's sixth year as a manager (first was with Williamsport in the Philadelphia system), as he holds a career record of 424-436 (.493), 394-390 with Columbus (.503).

Starting Now:

Peterson got a late start to the season, starting the year on the shelf with a strained right triceps. Since being activated on 4/28, he is one of 34 pitchers in the IL to accumulate at least 34.0IP, ranking 16th among that group with a 4.50ERA (34.0IP, 17ER) and 25th with a 1.47WHIP.

Love Those Ohio Mounds:

Peterson excels when pitching in Ohio, having appeared in the state 35 times over his short career (12G with Akron, 12G in Columbus, 8G with Lake County, 3G in Toledo). He owns a 13-7 record in the Buckeye State, fashioning a 2.30ERA (200.0IP, 153H, 55R, 51ER, 39BB, 185K). Outside of Ohio, his ERA sits at 4.35 over 52G (256.2IP, 264H, 142R, 124ER, 67BB, 239K).

First and Foremost:

Through his first 8GS, Peterson has allowed a single run in the 1st inning (homer to **Kaelen Culpepper** to lead off the game on 5/15 at St. Paul; opposing hitters are 2x25 with 2BB and 10K in the 1st inning). Despite that early success, the top third of the order has a .979OPS off Peterson (all 5HR). When wrapping around to include the bottom two in the order, Peterson has surrendered a line of .312/.391/.571, while holding batters 4-7 to a line of .160/.295/.160.

In a Jam:

Opposing hitters are batting .309 (17x55) with runners on base (.375, 12x32 with RISP) this year, while going just 15x72 (.208) with the bases empty. Only 15.6% of at bats end in a strikeout with RISP (5K, 32AB), compared to 32.6% in all other scenarios (31K, 95AB). However, of his 253 pitches thrown with runners on base, he has yet to uncork a wild pitch (1WP in 851 pitches with men on base during Clipper career).
