TODAY'S HEADLINES

LAST TIME OUT: The Saints drew nine walks last night but were unable to capitalize on them in a 4-1 loss to Gwinnett. Aaron Rozek dealt a Triple-A career-high 5.0 innings, allowing three runs. The Saints scored their lone run in the first inning on a bases-loaded walk to Chris Williams. The Saints did not get a runner to third after the first inning, despite a pair of leadoff doubles in the fourth and fifth innings, their only two hits of the game. Scott Blewett and Ryan Jensen combined for 4.0 innings of relief, allowing just one run. The offense went 0-for-11 with runners in scoring position in the loss.

STANDALONE GAME: The Saints are the only International League game on the schedule today and only one of two minor league games taking place. They will be the only minor league game taking place when they start at 2:07, with the only other contest coming at 7:05 tonight in El Paso.

TAKING A WALK OR NINE: The Saints have capitalized on walks all season long, but were unable to on Friday night in their 4-1 loss. Friday marked the eighth time this season the Saints have drawn at least nine walks. In the previous seven games this season, the Saints went 7-0 and scored at least seven runs in each game. It's also the 29th time in franchise history the Saints have drawn at least nine walks. They have scored at least seven runs in 26 of those 29 and gone 26-3 in those previous games.

DOUBLING DOWN: The Saints were held to just two doubles on Friday night, the fourth time they have been held to two-or-fewer hits. It's also their second time this season they have been held without a single, joining April 7 at Nashville. It marks the 13th time the Saints did not hit a single in a game. It is also the second time in franchise history the club has been held to only doubles, matching April 28, 2023, when Rochester held the Saints to only two doubles.

DOBNAK KEEPS THEM DOWN: Randy Dobnak has always been known as a ground ball pitcher, and has lived up to that role this season. He is the Triple-A leader in ground ball rate (per FanGraphs) at 60.7%. He is second among all qualified full-season pitchers, trailing only Rocket City's (AA - LAA) Jack Kochanowicz, who sits at 62.3%. Dobnak's current ground ball rate is the highest since he was in the Big Leagues in 2020, working a 62.1% rate.

WILLIAMS WARMING UP: Chris Williams delivered his seventh career multi-homer game and his first of the season on Friday night, finishing the game with a season-high three hits and four RBI. Williams' three-multi-homer games with the Saints are tied for the second-most in franchise history (with Alex Kirilloff and Matt Wallner) trailing Michael Helman's five games with multiple home runs. Over his last seven games, Williams is hitting 8-for-24 (.333) with a double, five home runs and eight RBI.

NO WALKS FOR YOU! Saints pitchers have limited walks all season long, issuing a Triple-A-best 297 walks this season. Their 2.64 strikeouts per walks is good for second in the circuit, trailing Durham's 2.69 K/BB ratio.

SUMMERTIME SEVERINO: In Yunior Severino's 35 games since May 21, he has hit .383 (49-for-128), with nine home runs, drawing 27 walks to 35 strikeouts, owning a 1.115 OPS. Since June 1, Severino leads the IL in batting average (.409) and on-base percentage, sporting a .521 clip. He's second in OPS, at 1.166, ranking four in slugging percentage at .645. His 22 walks since the start of June are tied for the fifth-most in the league.

TWINS UPDATE: The Twins pounded out nine runs on 14 hits to beat Houston 9-3 on Saturday. Jose Miranda set an MLB record by recording a hit in 12 straight at-bats, going 2-for-3. Brooks Lee connected on his first Major League home run, connecting on a two-run shot in the third inning.

LAST START: 7/2 vGWN...made 15th start of the season and first of the series against Gwinnett...allowed one run on five hits, walking one and striking out two...worked around a pair of two-out singles in the first inning...retired the side in order in the second inning...gave up a leadoff single in the third, advancing the runner to second on a wild pitch...a two-out single from Chadwick Tromp would score the run...retired five of the final seven batters...threw his fourth consecutive start of at least 5.0 innings and one-or-fewer runs...recorded eight of his 15 outs on the ground, including six consecutive from the first to the third innings...received seventh win of the season, the most he's recorded in one year since 12 across three minor league levels in 2019

APPEARANCE PRIOR: 6/27 @ IOW...made 14th start of the season, allowing three unearned runs over 5.0 innings, walking one and striking one out...did not allow a run through the first four innings...worked around a pair of singles in the first inning...allowed a double and a walk in the second inning...retired seven in a row from the second to the fifth inning...had one runner on with two outs in the fifth before the Saints committed errors on back-to-back plays, allowing a pair of runs to score...the surrendered an RBI double to Owen Caissie to score the third of three unearned runs in the fifth inning...Saints held 5-0 lead after the third inning and then a 9-5 lead at the seventh inning stretch...did not factor into the decision in a 11-9 Saints loss.

SAINTS RANDY: In 2023, Dobnak was a workhorse for the Saints, setting a number of single-season records. He set the franchise record for starts (26), innings pitched (126.1 IP), and strikeouts (115). The 2023 season was Dobnak's third with the Saints and consequently he is the franchise leader in two of those three categories as well: his 33 starts are four more than the #2 pitcher, Simeon Woods Richardson, his 164.1 IP are 12.0 more than Ronny Henriquez, and his 147 strikeouts are just eight shy of Ronny Henriquez.

KNOW ANY GOOD PIRATE JOKES? NEITHER DO AYYYYE: Dobnak grew up a huge Pittsburgh Pirates fan and we would often go to PNC Park. His favorite food to get there was nachos with pulled pork and cheese. He finally pitched at PNC Park on August 5, 2020. The irony was no fans were allowed in, not even his parents. He tossed 6.0 shutout innings allowing three hits and striking out one.

A BATTLE(R) OF WILLS: You can be forgiven if you've never heard of the DII school that Dobnak attended from 2014-17. He spent four years at Alderson Broadus (WV) University, located in Phillippi, a town of 3,380. During his time with the Battlers he finished his career as the conference's all-time leader in ERA (2.61) and strikeouts (284). In his sophomore season in 2015, Dobnak threw a no-hitter against Bluefield State.

TWILIGHT SPARKLE MEET BUTTERCUP: Upon graduating from Alderson Broadus, Dobnak went undrafted and was looking for a way to continue his career. He got his break with the Utica Unicorns in the United Shore Professional Baseball League (a four team league where all four teams play in the same ballpark in Utica, MI near Detroit). He signed with them because he caught the eye of manager Jim Essian (a one time Cubs manager in 1981 & also played from 1973-84 in the Majors), whose son played with Dobnak at Alderson Broadus. Dobnak would become the only player to reach the Major League's out of the USPBL.

THERE'S ALWAYS THAT ONE PERSON: In order to make ends meet in the USPBL, Dobnak drove for Uber and Lyft. He began driving for both in October, 2017. His Uber rating was stellar, but not perfect. He had a 4.99/5.0 rating which meant he received all five-star ratings with the exception of one four-star rating. According to Dobnak, "I have one four-star. I'm hoping it was a mistake. I don't remember doing anything bad."

NOT QUITE MIKE ROWE: Just prior to joining the big leagues, Dobnak worked as a consultant for Jordan Tax & Accounting Services in Bethel Park, PA (2017), an accounting clerk at Accountant and Associates in PA (2017), pizza delivery for Italian Village Pizza in South Park, PA (2012-13) and supermarket stocker at Foodland in Pittsburgh (2010-12).

WE'RE BETTER THAN YOU, AND WE KNOW IT: Dobnak got married to Aerial Munson on September 28, 2019, never thinking he'd be in the Major Leagues. He returned home after the Twins finished a series in Detroit and got married on a Saturday. He wasn't exempt from the rookie ritual of having to dress up in a crazy costume. He had to dress up in a Globo Gym outfit and flew commercial home instead of the chartered flight. He showed up to his fiancée in full attire.

CANDLESTICKS MAKE A NICE GIFT: Before getting married, some of Dobnak's wedding registry gifts wound up in the Twins game notes on September 20 (Amazon Echo, 67-inch leaf rake and Pine-Sol). All of it was the handiwork of intern Ian Kraft. The publicity of their registry becoming public made the soon to be married couple ask fans to donate to St. Jude's Children's Research Hospital, which has always been important to Aerial Dobnak due to her lifelong desire to be involved with children and her experience with the loss of a friend to cancer during her freshman year of college at Alderson Broadus University, instead of buying them gifts. Their initial goal was \$2,000 and within 8 hours that goal was met. Eventually they raised \$4,093. But the story didn't end there. A representative of St. Jude reached out to her on social media afterward, wondering if the couple would be willing to engage in more significant involvement with the hospital once the wedding buzz had died down. They jumped at the opportunity, and the Dobnaks were flown to the hospital in Memphis for a weekend in January to meet patients, connect with fundraising coordinators and evaluate their options for continued future engagement.

CAREER NOTES

- T2nd in International League in starts (26), 6th in strikeouts (115) and T7th in innings pitched (126.1 IP) in 2023
- Pitched in 8 games (3 starts) for Saints in 2022 and allowed three runs over final 11.1 IP
- Placed on the 60-day IL with a right middle finger strain on March 21, 2022 and sent to Fort Myers for a rehab appearance on August 15. Transferred to St. Paul on August 28.
- Missed nearly two months of 2021 season from June 24 until making a rehab appearance with Saints on August 21
- Named Bill Boni Award winner for Twins Most Outstanding Rookie for 2020, an award voted on by the Twin Cities Chapter of the BBWAA
- Ranked first among American League rookies in walks per-9.0 IP (2.51), tied for first in wins (6) and sixth in innings pitched (46.2) in 2020
- Won a career-best five consecutive starts July 31-August 22, 2020 going 5-0, 1.71 ERA (26.1 IP, 5 ER) with five walks and 13 strikeouts during that span. Marked longest win streak by a Twins rookie starter since Tyler Duffey won five-straight decisions from August 15-September 26, 2015. Also marked the first time a Twins rookie starter won at least five-straight starts since Francisco Liriano won six starts in a row from June 11-July 8, 2006
- Earned Jim Rantz Award for Twins minor league Pitcher of the Year after combining to go 12-4, 2.07 ERA (135.0 IP, 31 ER) in 24 games (21 starts) across three levels in 2019. Named starting pitcher on Twins MiLB.com organization All-Star team
- Started Game 2 of the ALDS October 5, 2019 at New York-AL, allowing four runs on six hits in 2.0 innings pitched. Became the fourth rookie in Twins history (6th occurrence) to start a Postseason game, 18th to ever pitch in one. Prior to Dobnak, the last Twins rookie to start in the Postseason was Brian Duensing in 2009 in Game 1 of the ALDS at New York-AL. The two other rookies to start in the Postseason for the Twins: Boof Bonser (Game 2, ALDS vs. OAK in 2006) and Les Straker (3 starts in 1987, 1 in ALCS at DET, 2 in WS at/vs. STL)
- Pitched 6.0 innings with just one hit allowed September 25, 2019 at Detroit, becoming the second rookie in Twins/Senators franchise history to throw at least 6.0 innings while allowing no more than one batter to reach safely via hit, walk or hit-by-pitch (previous Twins pitcher was Camilo Pascual on September 14, 1954 at Cleveland)
- Earned first major league win September 20, 2019 vs. Kansas City, allowing one run on three hits in 5.1 innings pitched
- Made major league debut August 9, 2019 vs. Cleveland, pitching 4.0 scoreless innings of relief
- Finished the year third in the Midwest League in ERA (3.14) among qualifying pitchers, tied for third in wins (10) and 10th in innings pitched (129.0 IP) in 2018 with Cedar Rapids
