### RHP VALENTE BELLOZO (0-4, 7.63) vs. RHP BRETT KERRY (2-3, 5.86)

**TODAY'S GAME:** The Isotopes and Bees meet for the first of three sets on the year and only series in Salt Lake ... Albuquerque is expected to start Valente Bellozo, while Brett Kerry is slated to take the hill for Salt Lake.

**PCL STANDINGS:** The Isotopes (32-25) are in fourth place in the PCL, trailing first place Sacramento (33-22) by 2.0 games. The club is 1.5 games behind second place Oklahoma City (33-23) and 1.0 game behind third place Las Vegas (32-23).

**LAST WEEK:** The Isotopes claimed their fourth series victory of the year after taking four of six from El Paso ... Won two series in 2025, while in 2024, won fourth series on Aug. 11 vs. Sacramento.

**COMEBACK KIDS:** Albuquerque won a game when trailing by four or more runs for the fourth time this season Sunday (last: May 20 at Las Vegas – plated six runs in the ninth to win 6-5).

**GEORGIA BOY:** Charlie Condon went 2-for-4 Sunday with his eighth homer of the year (walk-off blast), his seventh-straight game with an extra-base hit (four homers and two doubles) and second-straight with a homer.

-Extended his hitting streak to 12 games, tied for the 6th-longest active streak in Triple-A. Slashing .356/.453/.778 with seven doubles, four homers and eight RBI ... Eleven of his 21 extra-base hits have come in his last 10 games.

-Has 57 hard hit balls on the year—tied for 15th-most in the PCL—with an average exit velocity of 90.0 MPH, 10th-highest in PCL (min. 150 at bats).

**CC:** Cole Carrigg went 1-for-3 Sunday with an RBI double, two stolen bases and two walks ... 11th time he reached base at least three times in 2026 and seventh contest with multiple swipes.

-Is one steal away from becoming the 10th Isotopes player with 30 stolen bases in a season (11th instance: Dee Gordon did it in two different years; last: Braiden Ward, 35, 2025).

-Drew two walks Sunday, fourth time in his last 10 games with multiple walks, did so just once in first 41 contests of the season.

-Among MiLB leaders, is T-3rd in stolen bases (29), T-5th in hits (70) & triples (5), T-6th in runs (49) & 12th in AVG (.345) ... Has 66 hard hit balls on the year, tied for fifth-most in the PCL.

**TRIPLE-A LEADERS:** The Isotopes lead all Triple-A clubs in AVG (.293), runs (398), BB (309), RBI (369), OBP (.394) & OPS (.868), second in hits (574) and fourth in SB (92).

**VEEN, VEEN:** Zac Veen went 1-for-4 Sunday with a two-run homer ... Has homered in three consecutive games for the second time in his pro career (also: July 14-17, 2021, at Stockton, four homers in three-game span)

-Is 12-for-21 with two doubles, three homers and six RBI in his last five games, raising his average from .268 to .305.

-His 23 walks in May were the most in a month for his career (previous: 19, June 2021 with Single-A Fresno).

**EL MACHIN:** Vimael Machin went 1-for-4 Sunday with a stolen base ... Over his last three contests is 6-for-13 with a double, homer four RBI after a 1-for-13 three-game stretch.

**SUPERMAN:** Nic Kent went 1-for-3 Sunday with a double and two walks ... All five of his homers have come in his last 13 games.

-Over his last eight games, is 12-for-27 with three doubles, two homers and seven RBI.

-Fourteen of his 23 hits in 2026 have gone for extra bases (eight doubles, one triple and five homers) ... Fourteen of his 20 RBI in 2026 have come in his last 13 contests.

**KIZZ:** Andrew Knizner belted his sixth homer of the year Sunday ... In his last 10 contests is slashing .340/.367/.681 with seven doubles, three homers and eight RBI.

**KYLE CAN:** Kyle McCann recorded two hits Saturday for his fourth-straight multi-hit contest ... Over five games with the Isotopes, is 9-for-18 with two doubles, two homers and eight RBI. Has reached in 13 of his 22 plate appearances.

**ADAEL:** Over 23 games in May, Adael Amador slashed .306/.439/.494 with five doubles, one triple, three homers, 20 RBI and 20 walks ... Has reached base at least once in 37 of his last 39 contests.

**PCL LEADERS:** Cole Carrigg is 1st in SB (29), T-2nd in hits (70), 3B (5) & runs (47), 3rd in AVG (.345), T-5th in TB (108), 7th in RBI (40), T-8th in XBH (32), 10th in SLG (.532) & 11th in OPS (.944).

-Vimael Machin is 3rd in OPS (.998), 4th in OBP (.433), 5th in SLG (.565) & AVG (.335), T-9th in hits (57), T-10th in XBH (22) & T-11th in 2B (13) & TB (96) ... Charlie Condon is T-5th in runs (43) & T-6th in BB (34) & T-12th in XBH (21) and HR (8).

-Zac Veen is 5th in walks (35), 9th in OBP (.420), 10th in SB (11) & T11th in RBI (36) ... Adael Amador is T-10th in BB (33).

## NUCLEI NOTES

**SKIPPER:** Pedro Lopez enters his 22nd year as a minor league manager and fourth guiding the Isotopes. He is the eighth manager in club history and is in his sixth year overall with the club, becoming the longest-tenured coaching staff member in franchise history. Spent 2021 as Albuquerque's hitting coach and 2022 as its bench coach ... Notched his 1,000th career managerial victory June 4, 2023 at Salt Lake, when the Isotopes defeated the Bees 7-1 ... Managed in the Texas Rangers (2001-05, 2007) and New York Mets (2011-19) organizations while claiming the 2014 Eastern League Championship with Double-A Binghamton. Lopez was drafted in the 21st round by the San Diego Padres in the 1988 MLB Draft and spent 13 years in the minor leagues, reaching Triple-A on four occasions.

**CRAIG BJORNSON:** Begins his first season as Isotopes pitching coach, and 27th year in the professional coaching ranks ... Was previously in the Rockies organization from 2009-11 as the pitching coach for the Casper Ghosts of the Rookie Level Pioneer League ... Most recently spent three seasons in the Braves organization as a pitching coach (Triple-A Gwinnett, 2023), roving pitching instructor (2024) and bullpen coach (Gwinnett, 2025). Was in the Major Leagues as a bullpen coach for the Houston Astros (2012, 14-17) and Boston Red Sox (2018-20) ... Won back-to-back World Series championships with the Astros in 2017 and Red Sox in 2018 ... Spent a total of 13 seasons as a Minor League pitching coach from 1999-2011 in the Montreal/Washington, Kansas City, Los Angeles (NL), and Colorado organizations. Signed as a free agent by the Astros in 1991 and pitched for parts of three seasons in their Minor League system. Attended Arizona Western Junior College where he was teammates with Pedro Lopez, and also played collegiately at Nicholls State University.

**LUIS LOPEZ:** Joins Albuquerque as bench coach after spending the past four seasons in the same role with the Double-A Hartford Yard Goats ... Began his coaching career as a Minor League hitting coach in the Red Sox organization from 2008-11. Was the Braves' Minor League infield coordinator from 2012-17, then managed the Gulf Coast League Tigers in 2018 and 2019. Appeared in parts of 11 MLB seasons from 1993-2005 with San Diego, New York (NL), Milwaukee, Baltimore and Cincinnati.

**MATT SNYDER:** Enters his first season in the Colorado Rockies organization as the Isotopes hitting coach ... Previously had stints in the Marlins system as hitting coach with High-A Beloit (2021-22) and Double-A Pensacola (2023) before serving as Minor League hitting coordinator in 2024. Last season, he was the hitting coach for the High-A Jersey Shore Blue Claws in the Phillies organization ... Was a 10th round pick by the Yankees in 2012 and played eight Minor League seasons with New York-AL (2012-18) and Miami (2019). Reached Triple-A with New Orleans in 2019.

**CHECK-SWING CHALLENGE:** Starting May 5, the Check-Swing Challenge will be used in the PCL. In addition to being able to challenge ball/strike calls, players will also be able to challenge the umpire's call of swing or no-swing. A batter will be judged to have offered at a pitch when the bat head gets ahead of the knob and creates an angle greater than 45 degrees. The 45-degree threshold allows umpires to use the baselines as a visible point of reference.

**SPLIT-SEASON PLAYOFF FORMAT:** For the fourth-straight year, the Pacific Coast League will use a split-season format to determine playoff participants. With one 10 team division, the first half winner (concluding June 21) will host the second half winner (beginning June 23) in a three-game set. The winner will then face the International League champion for the Triple-A Championship in Las Vegas, NV, on September 26. The Isotopes have not reached the playoffs since 2012, tied with Charlotte for the second-longest drought among all 30 Triple-A teams. Only Louisville has gone longer without reaching the postseason, as they last qualified in 2010.
