OPENING NIGHT ONSLAUGHT: The Somerset Patriots defeated the Portland Sea Dogs by a score of 18-2 on Opening Night of the 2026 season at TD Bank Ballpark on Friday night. The 18 runs, 22 hits and 16-run margin of victory were all the second-most in Somerset Double-A franchise history, trailing only the 22 runs on 23 hits and 19-run margin of victory on 8/18/23 @REA (22-3 win). The 22 hits were tied for the most in Double-A Opening Day history dating back to 2005 (Arkansas, 22 hits on 4/3/05). The Patriots clubbed five home runs in the game, signaling their most in a game since 4/29/25 @RIC.

START THE CARR: Yankees No. 11 prospect Kyle Carr makes his 2026 season debut starting for Somerset on Saturday night. Carr ended last season with three starts in Somerset, after beginning his season in High-A Hudson Valley and earning South Atlantic League Pitcher of the Year and South Atlantic League All-Star honors. With the Renegades, Carr went 8-6 with a 1.96 ERA, 104 K and 47 BB in 119.1 IP.

SETTING THE TONE: Somerset's pitching staff struck out 13 batters on Opening Night, including seven straight strikeouts to start the game by Ben Hess. After Hess earned the win with 5.0 IP, the Patriots' bullpen trio of Bailey Dees, Eric Reyzelman and Geoff Gilbert combined to pitch four hitless innings to end the game.

PUT IT IN THE RECORD BOOKS: George Lombard Jr. started his 2026 season by going 5-for-5 at the plate, setting a Somerset Patriots Double-A single-game record for hits in a game. Lombard began Opening Day by smashing a first inning leadoff home run in his first at-bat of the season. The first inning leadoff home run on Opening Day was Somerset's second in Double-A franchise history and the first since Ben Rice on Opening Day of the 2024 season.

MARCO POLO: Marco Luciano made his Yankees organizational debut on Opening Night by going 4-for-5 with 1 RBI, 5 R, 1 2B, 1 BB and 1 SB. Luciano's 5 R scored were a career-high, coming in his 501st career minor league game. His four hits tied his career high for the fifth time (first time since 5/24/25 @OKC).

MAMBA MOMENT: Coby Morales opened the season with his second career two-home run game (first since 7/20/24 vs. BRD) on Opening Night, including his second career grand slam. His 6 RBI led the team and tied a career-high mark (first time since: 5/5/24 @DUN). His 3 R scored tied a career-high mark for the fifth time (first since 5/22/25 @WS). Morales' two home runs marked the Patriots' first multi-homer game by a player since Roc Riggio on 6/8/25 @BNG. Morales extended Somerset's lead to 18-2 in the eighth inning with his second career grand slam, which was also the Patriots' first grand slam since 8/13/24 @HFD (Jesus Rodriguez).

HARDMAN HAPPENINGS: Tyler Hardman reached base safely five times on Opening Night for the first time in his career by going 4-for-5 with 4 RBI, 1 R, 1 HR, 1 2B, and 1 BB. With his first inning home run, Hardman extended his Somerset Double-A franchise records in HR (55) and RBI (159). The performance marked Hardman's 11th career 4 RBI game.

BIG BEN DOING BIG THINGS: Ben Hess struck out the first seven batters he faced on Opening Day, signaling the most consecutive strikeouts to start a game by a Somerset Patriot in franchise history. The seven consecutive strikeouts in total were one shy of a Somerset Double-A franchise record (Sean Boyle, 8, 5/4/22). Overall, Hess tied his career-high of nine strikeouts for the fifth time in his career and for the first time since 8/23/25 vs. HFD. Dating back to last season, Hess is 4-0 in his last six Double-A starts with a 1.93 ERA, 0.92 WHIP, .155 BAA, 44 K and 13 BB in 32.2 IP.

THE FUTURE FIVE: The Somerset Patriots' starting rotation includes four top-30 Yankees prospects: RHP Ben Hess (No. 5), LHP Kyle Carr (No. 11), RHP Cade Smith (No. 16) and LHP Xavier Rivas (No. 24).

2026 SOMERSET PATRIOTS COACHING STAFF

JAMES COOPER: Manager (1st year)

James Cooper enters his first season as manager of the Somerset Patriots, his fifth overall year in the Yankees organization and his fourth consecutive as a minor league manager. He spent the 2025 season as the manager of the High-A Hudson Valley Renegades, after serving as manager of the Single-A Tampa Tarpons in 2024 and beginning his minor league managerial career with the FCL Yankees in 2023. Under Cooper's leadership in 2025, Hudson Valley finished with a franchise-record 79 wins (79-50), being eliminated from playoff contention on the final day of the regular season. During the season, the Renegades finished second in AVG (.235), H (970), OBP (.336), SLG (.363), OPS (.699), third in R (598) and HR (547). In 2024 at the helm for Tampa, the Tarpons led the FSL in SB, while ranking second in AVG, H and 2B, and fourth in OPS. During Cooper's first assignment with the Yankees organization in 2022, he served as defensive coach for the FCL Yankees, where he helped the team with the 2022 FCL Championship. The following season, Cooper made his managerial debut with the FCL Yankees and was named the Florida Complex League Manager of the Year in 2023, when his team led the FCL in runs, hits, triples, RBIs, AVG, OBP, SLG and OPS.

MIKE FRANSOSO: Hitting Coach (2nd year)

Mike Fransoso enters his second season as a coach in Somerset and within the Yankees organization. Under Fransoso's leadership during the 2025 season, the Patriots' offense ranked among the Eastern League leaders with 129 HR (2nd), a .691 OPS (4th) and 600 R (5th). Fransoso played for the Somerset Patriots (2018-2019) during the team's run as an independent team and also the Pittsburgh Pirates organization (2013-2015). He previously coached in the Seattle Mariners organization (2021-2024), serving as the hitting coach and interim manager for the Double-A Arkansas Travelers in 2024, when he helped manage the team to a Southern League Championship.

DEMETRE KOKORIS: Pitching Coach (1st year)

Demetre Kokoris enters his first season in Somerset and second with the Yankees. He served as the pitching coach in Hudson Valley in 2025 and guided the team to a league-best 2.82 ERA and 20 shutouts. Prior to joining the Yankees, Kokoris, coached in the Texas Rangers (2022-2024) and Toronto Blue Jays (2019-2021) organizations. He spent the 2023 and 2024 seasons as the bullpen coach for the Triple-A Round Rock Express, and was the pitching coach for the Single-A Down East Wood Ducks in 2022. Prior to joining the Rangers, he was the pitching coach for the Short-Season Class-A Vancouver Canadians (2019-20) and was a rehab pitching coach (2021) with the Blue Jays. Before entering the professional coaching ranks, Kokoris was a college pitching coach at Chemeketa Community College, Point Loma Nazarene University, and Santa Barbara City College. He has also served as the pitching coach for the Greek National Team since 2021.

UZIEL VILORIA: Defensive Coach (1st year)

Uziel Viloria enters his second consecutive season as a defensive coach in Somerset and his second season with the Yankees organization. Under his leadership in 2025, the Patriots posted a franchise record .983 fielding percentage. Viloria began his coaching career in 2024 as a coach in the Phillies organization. During his playing career, Viloria signed with the Phillies as an international free agent in 2019 and went on to play 112 games in four seasons as an infielder in the organization (2019-2023), reaching High-A Jersey Shore in 2022 and 2023.

CALEB HAMILTON: Defensive Coach (2nd year)

Caleb Hamilton enters his first season in Somerset and second with the Yankees organization. After a playing career that included MLB experience with the Minnesota Twins (2022) and Boston Red Sox (2023), Hamilton completed his first year in coaching as the defensive coach for High-A Hudson Valley in 2025. During his final season playing in 2024, Hamilton saw time in 39 games for the Rocket City Trash Pandas, the Double-A affiliate of the Los Angeles Angels. He was drafted by Minnesota in the 23rd round of the 2016 MLB Draft out of Oregon State University, where he was an All-Pac-12 performer for the Beavers. Despite not catching in college, Hamilton made 323 of his 574 professional appearances as a catcher, and he played at least one game at all nine positions.

After being traded to the Yankees from the Cubs entering the 2025 season, Arias spent the year on the Yankees' 40-man roster. He broke camp on the 7-day IL for Triple-A SWB, before being reinstated following a minor league rehab assignment on 7/19 and having his option transferred to Double-A Somerset. Ended the season in Somerset with 17 relief appearances in which he went 3-0 with a 2.57 ERA, 2 HLD, 1/3 SV, 15 BB and 29 K in 21.0 IP.

Career Notes

Re-signed with the Yankees as a minor league free agent on 11/26/25 and was extended a non-roster invite to Major League Spring Training. Arias was originally acquired by the Yankees from the Chicago Cubs in exchange for cash considerations on 1/15/25, after he was designated for assignment by the Cubs on 1/12/25. Initially signed an international free agent contract with Blue Jays in 2018, but did not appear in a game before his release in 2020. Signed with the Cubs in 2021 and spent the first four seasons of his career in the Cubs minor league system.

Spent the entire 2025 season with Double-A Somerset, primarily working in a closer role. Austin tied for the team lead with 43 relief appearances and posted a 3-2 record, 2.95 ERA, 28 BB, 37 K and 7 SV in 42.2 IP. Austin's seven saves led the Patriots and tied for second in the Yankees minor league system.

2024

Began his first full season with Single-A Fayetteville in the Astros organization. After allowing 1 ER in 10.0 IP (0.90 ERA) with 14 K and 1 BB, he was transferred to High-A Asheville on May 11. In 18 relief appearances for Asheville, Austin went 2-0 with a 2.70 ERA, 3 SV, 32 K and 6 BB. On July 30, he was traded to the Yankees and assigned to High-A Hudson Valley. In 10 games to end the regular season with the Renegades, he went 3-0 with a 1.29 ERA over 14.0 IP with 19 K and 2 BB.

Made his professional debut on 7/8/23 with the FCL Astros in the Astros organization. Acquired by the Yankees in a trade with the Astros on July 30, 2024 alongside international signing bonus pool money in exchange for LHP Caleb Ferguson. Broke camp with Double-A Somerset, continuing to work as a starter for the beginning of the season, through 5/31. Dees opened the season with nine starts, over which he went 1-4 with a 5.02 ERA, 25 BB and 52 K over 43.0 IP. He made one spot start for High-A HV on 6/6 and pitched 7.0 shutout innings with 1 H, 1 HB, 0 BB and 9 K. Upon his return to Somerset, Dees transitioned back into a (long) relief role from 6/12 - 7/10. In eight relief appearances for the Patriots, Dees went 4-0 (three straight winning decisions from 6/18-6/26) with a 2.37 ERA, 6 BB and 19 K in 19.0 IP.
