RANCHO CUCAMONGA QUAKES (7-13, 48-38)

TODAY'S GAME: Welcome to LoanMart Field, as your Rancho Cucamonga Quakes continue their series with the final game of a six-game home stand against the Inland Empire 66ers (Angels). After today's game, kids will "Run the Bases", thanks to San Antonio Regional Hospital. Game time is 2pm. Tickets are available at rcquakes.com.

VS THE 66ERS: Today's game is the last of 24 between these two teams in 2025 and the final of 12 here at home. The Quakes have taken five of six in the first three series so far against the 66ers. Last night's loss gives the 66ers four straight wins over Rancho for the first time this year and a series-win for Inland Empire, leaving the Quakes with a 16-7 mark against the 66ers overall this year. In 2024, Rancho went 7-5 here at home vs Inland Empire, 17-7 overall.

LAST GAME: The 66ers held on for their fourth straight win over Rancho, a 7-6 victory on Saturday night at LoanMart Field over the Quakes. Colin Summerhill clubbed a three-run homer to help Inland grab an early lead against Sterling Patick. After the Quakes came back to take a 4-3 lead, Inland tied it with a run in the fourth, then took the lead for good in the fifth, as Raudi Rodriguez (10) launched his fourth homer of the series, a solo-shot off Patick (1-4). Rancho's Jose Meza smashed a two-run homer in the fifth off Inland Empire starter Chris Clark (2-7), making it a one-run game. That was it for the scoring though, as the Inland Empire bullpen fired four scoreless frames down the stretch, including two from Zach Redner, who earned his first save. Nico Perez hit his first Rancho homer in the loss.

ROAD NOT SO FRIENDLY, LATELY: The Quakes have had a tough go of it recently on the road, as they've dropped seven of their last nine road games overall. The recent San Jose series finished poorly for Rancho, as they dropped decisions of 9-2, 12-4 and 20-2. With Friday night's 15-3 loss at Visalia, they had been outscored by 45 runs (56-11) over a four-game road losing streak. Sunday's loss in Visalia drops Rancho to just 23-22 on the road this year.

ROSTER MOVES: The Quakes made a move on Friday, as infielder Elijah Hainline was promoted to High-A Great Lakes. Hainline was batting .298 with four homers, 29 RBIs and 20 stolen bases in 66 games. No corresponding move was made, so Rancho's 30-man roster stands at 28 active players.

THE FUTURE IS NOW: Saturday's MLB Futures Game in Atlanta was a huge success for a pair of former Quakes. 2024 Quake OF Zahir Hope and 2023/24 OF Josue De Paula both played in the game. Hope collected a single and was on board when De Paula cracked a three-run homer, as the National League downed the American League by a final of 4-2. De Paula was named the game's MVP. Both players have spent the entire 2025 season in Great Lakes of the High-A Midwest League.

NICOLAS CRUZ: 21-year-old Sterling Patick makes his first start of the year and his 22nd overall appearance, his seventh overall appearance against the 66ers. Against the 66ers this year, he's allowed just one run on nine hits with 13 strikeouts over 11 innings. Cruz's last appearance was on Tuesday, July 8, in game one of this series, where he allowed two hits over one scoreless inning in a no-decision. Cruz signed with the Dodgers in January of 2022 out of Venezuela.

FRANCIS TEXIDO: Francis Texido makes his 18th start and his fifth against the Quakes. In four starts against the Quakes, he's 0-4, allowing 19 runs (17 earned) on 22 hits over 16.1 innings. In his last outing overall, he allowed six runs on seven hits over 4.2 innings in a loss on Tuesday in game one of this series. Last year, Texido made 25 appearances (24 starts), going 4-7 with a 6.77 ERA for Inland Empire. Texido signed with the Angels in March of 2023 out of Havana, Cuba.
