TODAY'S GAME: The Flying Squirrels play the finale of a six-game series against the Binghamton Rumble Ponies, Double-A affiliate of the New York Mets. This series is the first and only set between the two teams this season. Last year, Richmond and
Binghamton met for a six-game series at The Diamond from June 29-July 4, 2021. The Rumble Ponies won the first three games

TICKET PUNCHED: The Flying Squirrels clinched the Eastern League Southwest Division First-Half title with a win on May 26 paired with a loss by the Akron RubberDucks against the Harrisburg Senators. Richmond finished the first half tied with Akron,

full-season system last year, they returned to the split-season format this year. The Flying Squirrels will play in the Eastern League playoffs for the third' time in franchise history. In 2011 , they swept the Senators in the division series before falling to the
Fisher Cats in the ELCS, three games to one. In 2014, they eliminated the RubberDucks in four games before being swept in the championship series by the Binghamton Mets.
THE FLYING SQUIRRELS have gone $15-28$ in the second half. They are $9-20$ in the last 29 games, including a season-high six-game losing streak from July 14-23. The Flying Squirrels have won seven series, lost eight and split four this year. Richmond
hitters lead the league with 1,215 strikeouts and rank fourth with 141 homers. The Flying Squirrels are $30-25$ at home this year. Richmond is $24-22$ in games decided by two-or-less runs. They are $16-24$ overall against teams from the Northeast Division,

THE RUMBLE PONIES hold the worst-overall record in the Eastern League and are in last place in the Northeast Division second-half standings. After posting a season-high five-game winning streak at Somerset from August 2-5, the Rumble Ponies
are $3-10$ in their last 13 games since August 6 , including dropping four-of-five to the Curve at home last week. Binghamton's roster includes four of MLB.com's top-30 Mets prospects, including SS Ronny Mauricio (3), INF/OF Carlos Cortes (15), C Hayden

FOR RICHMOND: Right-hander Landen Roupp makes his Double-A debut. He last pitched on Tuesday with High-A Eugene at Hillsboro and picked up a win after allowing one run in five innings and tied a career high with nine strikeouts. Over his last six starts with the Emeralds, Roupp went 3-0 with a 0.95 ERA ( 3 ER/28.1 IP) with 45 strikeouts and six walks. Among pitchers with
at least 80.0 innings pitched in MiLB this year, Roupp is ranked sixth in K/9 IP (13.4), fourth in strikeout percentage (37.6) and at least 80.0 innings pitched in MiLB this year, Roupp is ranked sixth in K/9 IP (13.4), fourth in strikeout percentage ( 37.6 and

FOR BINGHAMTON: Right-hander Jesus Vargas makes his 11th Double-A start and his second appearance of the series. He

POWER SURGE: The Richmond offense has hit 141 home runs this season, which is fourth in the Eastern League. On August 7 in the 101st game of the season, Riley Mahan hit a grand slam to give the Flying Squirrels their 128th homer of the season, break passing the previous record of 109 from 2013. SMITH STREAKING: Armani Smith is currently riding a 17-game on-base streak since July 29, which is the fourth-longest active streak by Shane Matheny in May and June. During the streak, Smith is batting .281 ( 18 -for-64) with three doubles, a homer six RBIs and 11 walks. He posted a 12 -game hitting streak from August $4-18$, which was the longest active streak in the league at

MARTY PARTY: Brandon Martorano homered in back-to-back games on Thursday and Friday, slugging a solo shot on Thursday night against Binghamton before adding a two-run homer on Friday night. He now has 10 homers this season, including
three in his last eight starts since August 6 . In his last 13 games since July 28, Martorano is batting .304 (14-for-46) with three nd 10 RBIs.

FITZ ON FIRE: Over his last 29 games since July 10, Tyler Fitzgerald has homered 11 times. He now has 21 homers this season,
